**Sub: Intimation regarding submission of Standalone Financial Statements for the financial year 2016-17**  
**Ref: Regulation 33(3)(a) of SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 (Listing Regulations)**

In continuation to our previous correspondence dated June 13<sup>th</sup>, 2016, we would like to inform that the Company is holding 33% stake in "Supercor Industries Limited", Nigeria as a Joint Venture between the Company and other shareholders including State Government of Bauchi.

The said Joint Venture was set up in the year 1979 as per the laws of Nigeria to take up the business of manufacturing Asbestos Sheets and selling the same in Nigerian markets. With change in market conditions and expecting non-asbestos products will attract better demand as compared to asbestos product, Supercor Industries Limited had changed its product mix and converted its product range from asbestos to non-asbestos based products in the year 2014 post which, the revenue of the Company fell drastically due to inability to recover the increase cost of the non-asbestos product from the market and thereby reported cash losses for the year 2014. The situation further deteriorated in the year 2015 causing severe cash crisis and could not meet their routine obligation of paying salaries / wages to their employees /workers which hampered the operation and forced them to suspend the operations since August 2015. In view of the same none of the employees/works resumed their offices and all the basic facilities such as power, internet and other connections were discontinued due to non-payment of the dues and the said Joint Venture is under winding up proceedings under the Courts of Nigeria. (Court Order Enclosed).

In view of the above mentioned reasons, Company is unable to consolidate the financial statements of its overseas Joint Venture with the financial statements of Company and the Board of Directors vide a circular resolution passed on the 13<sup>th</sup> February, 2017 have decided to make an application to the Central Government/Registrar of Companies under section 459 read with section 129 seeking exemption from consolidating the financial statements of the Overseas Joint Venture from the financial statements of the Company and filed e-Form GLN-1 vide SRN G35594076, the said form was approved by the concern authority on 14<sup>th</sup> February, 2017.

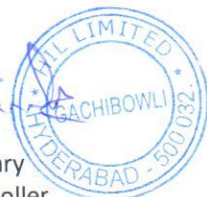

# Insecurity: FG warns intelligence agencies against lapses

... says shoddy job will earn severe sanctions

The Federal Government threatened yesterday to sanction defence, security and intelligence agencies, if they fail to evolve novel, actionable and effective strategies on sustainable solution to the burgeoning security challenges in the country.

Defence Minister, Brig-General Muhammad Mansur Dan-Ali (rtd), read the riot act, while declaring open the 2016 Defence Advisers/Attaches (DAs) Annual Conference tagged 'Harnessing the Potentials of Defence Attache System for Improved National Security in Nigeria', at the Defence Intelligence Agency (DIA) Headquarters, Abuja.

Dan-Ali warned the DAs and concerned authorities that the Federal Govern-

ment would no longer tolerate any form of shoddiness and lack of creativity in handling of national security matters.

He called for innovation, noting that "given the complexity and uncertainty of today's security environment, our defence architecture and thought process would have to significantly provide sustainable military and political outcomes".

"Hitherto whereby we send Defence Advisers and they don't bring a concrete report, we will throw it back at them. They should know what is happening at their environment, advice us and we will then take it from there. I believe that with this type of conference they will tighten up their belt and have a better understanding of what's required of them," he said.

The minister stated that the conference would pro-

vide the opportunity "to generate meaningful dialogue to determine assessment of strategic landscape and the prospect to harness the best ideas and innovations for a comprehensive improvement to our joint readiness and the capability to project decisive force against our adversaries".

Dan-Ali said that added to these national security challenges, is the economic recession the country is currently facing, as well as the global security environment, which is also under relentless and vicious attacks by terrorists and criminals who are opposed to the existing world order.

Therefore, he said, the consequences of these emerging scenarios necessitated our military professionals to articulate new and effective means of tackling these prevailing challenges in the face of reduced resources.

# Fani-Kayode released from prisons after perfecting bail conditions

Former Minister of Aviation, Femi Fani-Kayode, was Monday released from Kuje Prisons custody after perfecting all his bail conditions.

Fani-Kayode, who was flanked by his wife at the premises of the Federal High Court in Abuja where he perfected his bail conditions, told newsmen that he gave thanks to God and Nigerians who were with him during the travail.

Fani-Kayode, who spent about twenty four days in the custody of the Economic and Financial Crimes Commission, EFCC, as well as Kuje prisons said he will focus on his health challenge, but however did not disclose the nature of his ailment.

Answering questions on his experience in the EFCC custody, Fani-Kayode said that as one of their consistent customers, the experience was no longer new to him.

It would be recalled that Justice John Tsoho of the Federal High Court sitting in Abuja had last week admitted the former Aviation Minister and Director of Media and Publicity in the Campaign Organisation of former President Gooluck Jonathan to bail in the sum of N50million.

Fani-Kayode, who was arraigned before the court by EFCC on a five-count charge bordering on money laundering to the tune of N26million however pleaded not guilty to all the five-count charges.

His trial in another case before a Federal High Court in Lagos was stalled yesterday following his remand at the Kuje prisons.

Fani-Kayode is charged alongside a former Minister of Finance, Nenandi Usman, and Danjuma Yusuf.

They are charged by EFCC on 17 counts bordering on the offence and had all pleaded not guilty to the charges.

At the resumed hearing of the case yesterday, Fani-

Kayode's lawyer, Wale Balogun informed the court that his client was still languishing in Kuje prisons.

Responding, EFCC lawyer, Rotimi Oyedepo, told the court that he was aware of the arraignment of the second accused, but added that his arraignment before the Abuja division of the court had nothing to do with the instant case.

He maintained that the subsequent arrest of the accused was with a view to serving him with the charge and not to disrespect the court.

He, therefore, urged the court to grant an adjournment so as to allow the accused to appear and stand trial.

The first defendant in the suit, Nenandi Usman prayed the court to separate her trial from that of Fani-Kayode and others.

Speaking through her counsel, EO Orhif (SAN), the former minister also urged the court to transfer her trial to Abuja division of the court.
