

Nitish raps Mulayam for his pep talk on secularism

Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar reacted sharply to Mulayam Singh Yadav's warning his secular credentials over being with BJP for 12 years, asking if the latter was "the Vice Chancellor of the University of Secularism". "Am I a research scholar and he (Mulayam) a Vice Chancellor of University of Secularism that I am asking for a certificate of Secularism from him?" Nitish asked in a hard-hitting comment on the SP chief while speaking at a function of the private national TV channel here on Tuesday.

While Nitish was scathing in his remarks on the SP chief, RJD president Lalu Prasad was not so harsh but scolded his challenge in Bihar polls. "Anybody can contest election anywhere. But does his party have any standing in Bihar? It's like RJD contesting 200 seats in



Uttar Pradesh. Can it (SP) win even one MLA seat?" Prasad quipped. Refraining from harsh comments on Mulayam, he described the SP patriarch as "an elderly sandwich" Prasad's daughter Raj Lakshmi is married to Mulayam's grand nephew and MP Tej Pratap Yadav.

Third Front to form Bihar government: Akhilesh Yadav

The Third Front led by the Samajwadi Party will form the next government in Bihar, Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Akhilesh Yadav said on Tuesday.

"Some people promised to develop Bihar and change its face but nothing happened," said Yadav, obliquely refer-

ring to Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar. Yadav said his government had worked for the development of Uttar Pradesh "but there is no talk about it in the media, I feel about it". He said if the Third Front took power in Bihar, the Lohia Awas Scheme for construction of houses for the poor would be implemented in Bihar in a

Uttar Pradesh. Six parties - Samajwadi Party, Nationalist Congress Party, Janadikhari Party, Samras Samaj Party, Nationalist Peoples Party and Samajwadi Janata Party - have floated the Third Front, reports IANS. Ruling in UP, Samajwadi Party was earlier offered only five seats by the alliance led by JD(U) and K.D.

Mulayam thanks PM Modi for his praise and slams him for 'lies' too

In the backdrop of praises showered on him by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, SP supreme Mulayam Singh Yadav said it was matter of honour for him and his party but it attacked the BJP saying it has "cheated" Modi by telling "lies".

Yadav said, "BJP has cheated the people by telling lies and they (people) have realised its reality. They promised to bring back black money and deposit Rs 15 lakh in every individual's bank account, but did it happen?"

The SP supreme also said that though the party has only five members in Lok Sabha, it had conferred the Centre on several issues and forced it to step back. He said that SP believed in the politics of change and it has already brought the changes in UP, "reports IANS".

Left MLAs protest in Bengal Assembly brandishing toy guns

Left Front legislators on Tuesday protested in the Assembly with toy guns against Monday's incident during a procession march in which a few persons were allegedly seen brandishing pistols and flags of Trinamool Congress (TMC) were also spotted. The protest drew sharp reaction from Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee who termed it as undemocratic and a reflection of political frustration of the Left parties in Bengal, reports PTI.

Gujarat has most diabetics in India, Rajasthan comes next, says report

According to the National Health Profile 2015, released by Health Minister J.P. Nadda on Tuesday, Gujarat also has the highest burden of hypertension with 159,150 cases reported as on March 31, 2014, working out to about 22 per cent. Maharashtra had 96,278 cases, Punjab 86,273 and Rajasthan 61,576.

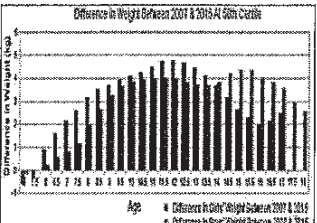
Figures from these two diseases were not available for many states including Delhi and Manipur. India has also shown an increase in cases of Acute Respiratory Infection (ARI). As per the report by the Central Bureau of Health Intelligence, nearly 3,000 people have died due to ARI in 2014. The data showed that 34,34,536 cases of respiratory disease were reported in 2014, out of which 18,79,438 were females while the total number of deaths were 2,892.

The number of deaths due to ARI in 2014 was much higher as it stood at 3,513. The number of reported ARI cases in 2013 was 48,423.

Girls today taller by 1 cm and boys by 3 cm

New charts are based on contemporary data on growth and development of 33,991 children in 14 Indian cities

Compared to eight years ago, 18-year-old boys are 1 cm taller from India's middle and upper classes are 3 cm and 1 cm taller, respectively, according to the latest growth charts published this year for children aged five to 18. The growth figures - last updated in 2007, using data collected more than two decades ago - reveal updates and downsides. The new charts reflect the rise of taller and heavier urban children. Girls are taller earlier but stop growing once they hit puberty, which is happening sooner.



Growth charts answer questions that often plague parents: Is my child growing well or not? Is she gaining enough weight and height? The problem with these questions is, no matter how large the hospital and convoyer of the Indian Academy of Pediatrics (IAP) growth-chart committees, convened in January 2014, the committee works on the revisions and published its findings and charts in the journal Indian Pediatrics in 2015. The new charts are based on contemporary data on growth and development of 33,991 children of upper and middle socio-economic groups living in 14 Indian cities, reports IANS.

and the huge burden of lifestyle diseases that tag along have become rampant, as India-based doctors reported. We do not have options other than to use one of these charts, said Neelam Kler, chairperson, Department of Neonatology, Institute of Child Health, Sir Gangaram Hospital, New Delhi. Wazir cautioned, "Given the limitation of ideal growth charts, the IAP charts are our best bet," said Wazir. Hence, the need for country-specific growth charts. Many paediatricians appear to agree with this view. In an unrelated study, Vijayalakshmi Bhatia, pediatric endocrinologist, at Sanjay Gandhi Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow, advises against using WHO charts for five to 10-year-olds as they are derived from a "group of children who are ethnically taller and heavier than our own high socio-economic group children". Some paediatricians differ. The methodology used for the IAP charts is "not very robust," said Kler, who said it has the advantage of "recent data and accounts for change in growth pattern in a developing country with changing economic conditions".
