We have reviewed the consolidated results of Tata Global Beverages Limited, its subsidiaries, jointly controlled entities and associate companies hereinafter referred to as the "Group" which are included in the accompanying 'Unaudited Consolidated Financial Results for the three months ended June 30, 2014', except for the disclosures regarding 'Public Shareholding' and 'Promoter and Promoter Group Shareholding' in Tata Global Beverages Limited (the "Company") which have been traced from disclosures made by the Management but have neither been reviewed nor been audited by us. The Statement has been prepared by the Group's Management pursuant to Clause 41 of the Listing Agreement with the Stock Exchanges in India, which has been initialled by us for identification purposes. This Statement is the responsibility of the Group's Management and has been approved by the Board of Directors of Tata Global Beverages Limited. Our responsibility is to issue a report on the Statement based on our review.
- 2. We conducted our review in accordance with the Standard on Review Engagement (SRE) 2410, "Review of Interim Financial Information Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity" issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. This Standard requires that we plan and perform the review to obtain moderate assurance as to whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement.
- 3. A review is limited primarily to inquiries of group's personnel and analytical procedures applied to group's financial data and thus provides less assurance than an audit. We have not performed an audit and, accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.
- 4. We have only traced the disclosures regarding 'Public Shareholding' and 'Promoter and Promoter Group Shareholding' in Tata Global Beverages Limited in the Statement from the disclosures made by the Group's Management and are, therefore, not expressing a review opinion thereon.
- 5. We did not review the financial results of: (i) 2 controlled entities which constitute total revenue of Rs. 3,283 lakhs and net loss of Rs. 970 lakhs for the quarter ended June 30, 2014; and (ii) 4 associate companies included in the consolidated financial results, which constitute net loss of Rs. 30 lakhs for the period from April 1, 2014 to June 30, 2014. The unaudited financial results has been provided to us by the management, and our opinion on the consolidated financial results to the extent they relate to these jointly controlled entities and associate companies is based solely on such unaudited financial information furnished to us.
- 6. We did not review the financial results of (i) 38 subsidiaries and 4 jointly controlled entities considered in the preparation of the Statement and which constitute total revenue of Rs. 121,619 lakhs and net profit of Rs.4,665 lakhs for the quarter ended June 30, 2014; and (ii) 1 associate company which constitute net loss of Rs.32 lakhs for the quarter period then ended. These financial results/ statements and other financial information have been reviewed by other auditors whose reports have been furnished to us, and our opinion on the Statement to the extent they have been derived from such financial results/ statements is based solely on the report of such other auditors.
- 7. Based on our review conducted as above read with the proviso and the effect of the matter referred to in paragraph 8 below, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the Statement has not been prepared in all material respects in accordance with the applicable Accounting Standards notified pursuant to the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006 as per Section 211(3C) of the Companies Act, 1956 read with the General Circular 15/2013 dated September 13, 2013 of the Ministry of Corporate Affairs in respect of Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 and other recognised accounting practices and policies, and has not disclosed the information required to be disclosed in terms of Clause 41 of the Listing Agreement including the manner in which it is to be disclosed, or that it contains any material misstatement.

- 8. As mentioned in Note 5 to the Statement, the overseas subsidiaries of the group have defined benefit schemes relating to which the actuarial gains or losses are allowed to be recognised in the Reserves as per the local generally accepted accounting practices followed in those respective jurisdictions. For the purpose of consolidated financial results the holding company has adopted the accounting policy in respect of actuarial gains or losses for its overseas defined benefit schemes to reflect the applicable accounting framework of the respective jurisdictions and consequently accounted it in the Reserves instead of in the Statement of Profit and Loss. Had the Company followed the practice of recognition of actuarial gains/ losses on the aforesaid defined benefit plans in the Statement of Profit and Loss as per Accounting Standard 15 (AS 15) on Employee Benefits for the quarter ended June 30, 2014, the charge to employee benefits expense would have been lower by Rs.99 lakhs, deferred tax credit would have been lower by Rs.21 lakhs, profit from ordinary activities before tax would have been higher by Rs.78 lakhs and the group consolidated net profit would have been higher by Rs.69 lakhs, respectively.
- 9. We draw your attention to the following emphasis of matter paragraphs included in the review report of Tata Coffee Ltd, a subsidiary of the Company, vide report dated July 22, 2014 issued by an independent firm of chartered accountants, reproduced by us as under: "Without qualifying our opinion, we draw attention to,
 - a) Note No.4(b) (Reference to Consolidated Financial Statements under this report) related to change in the method of accounting in respect of extracted trees, by valuing such trees based on management's estimates of net realizable values resulting in profit before tax and profit after tax for the quarter being higher by Rs. 530 lakhs and Rs. 494 lakhs respectively.
 - b) Note No.4(b) (Reference to Consolidated Financial Statements under this report) regarding depreciation being provided based on the existing method pending evaluation of estimated useful life as required under Schedule II of Companies Act 2013". Our conclusion is not qualified in respect of these matters.

In terms of the scheme, till such date the scheme becomes effective, the merging entity's business operations are being carried out in trust on behalf of TCL.
- 8. During the month of May'2014, an overseas subsidiary of the Holding Company acquired a 100% stake in the equity capital of Earth Rules Pty Ltd., Australia, engaged in coffee business under the 'MAP' brand, with presence in Roast & Ground coffee and coffee in Pods (single serve portions) segment in Australia.
- 9. The major part of the Holding Company's business arises from operations outside India and through its subsidiaries. In view of this the Company has opted to publish only consolidated results for the year as permitted under SEBI guidelines. The standalone results shall be available on the Company's website as well as on the website of the stock exchanges where the Company's shares are listed. The Total Income from Operations, Net Profit for the period and Earnings per share of the Holding Company's standalone financial results are given below:
