

SIT REPORTS ON OVER THE CONDITION OF FEMALE PRISONS IN THE STATE

A three member special investigation team (SIT) formed by the State Women Commission (SWC), submitted its report over the custodial death of Manjula Shetye to Chief Minister Devendra Fadnis on Monday in Maratraya. The SIT has recommended several measures to improve the conditions of the prisons of the state. Reducing the numbers of female inmates and sensitizing the prison staffs and officials, providing sanitary pads, bangles and bindi are few suggestions among others.

The State Women Commission (SWC) chairman Vijaya Babbar said that the immediate cause of death of Manjula Shetye was the amenities and facilities. Next time, such incident will not repeat in the state, hence, the SIT was formed to understand the problems of the prisons. "The SIT has visited the Byculla prison and studied thoroughly. They have also spoken with all administrative heads of the prisons of the state and prepared their reports. The report will help government to improve the conditions of the inmates of the state," she added. She said that the human rights of inmates will not be



violated and such measures will be suggested. SWC chairman said, "Several steps have been suggested so that female inmates could avail psycho-

logical peace. The steps include showing the motivational movies and organizing many plays, conducting a competition on national festivals." The SIT has also suggested that those (female inmates) who have been educated to class 8 to 10th, shall be given further education. Skill will be imparted to them so that they could stand on their feet. The committee also suggested to empower female inmates through NGO, provide them legal aid, female nurses and regular health check-ups and a mechanism to register complaints through live video conferencing. The committee also suggested to install

CCTV cameras in female prison and plug several security loopholes. In July 2017, taking a suo moto cognizance of the custodial death of Manjula Shetye, the SWC constituted an SIT to further probe her death. The SIT comprises of retired judge Arant Nirugade, former Director General of Police (DGP) Praveen Dixit and a representative of an NGO. An inmate Manjula Shetye died on June 23 after being allegedly beaten up by the Byculla Jail officials and staff as she failed to account for two eggs and five bread (paav), which were distributed by her to the inmates.

Maharashtra to push for e-bikes for delivery of food, goods

The state transport department plans to push for electric bikes for delivery of food and other goods here to reduce pollution on roads. Transport ministry sources said the government will come out with an elaborate policy on promoting e-vehicles in Mumbai region and a notification will be issued. The government has encouraged electric buses, with BEST introducing battery operated buses a few days back. It now proposes to encourage fast food joints, restaurants, hotels and those running mobile apps and online marketing portals to use electric bikes for deliveries. "We want to minimise emissions and reduce pollution on roads. The Union government has emphasised a mass shift for electric vehicles in 2030 and Maharashtra will be among the leading states in making this possible," said a senior official from Maratraya.

Disakar Baote favoured more electric vehicles in Maharashtra, at a weekend meeting. Thackeray said the minister 'promised concrete steps in few days to promote electric/hybrid zero-emission transport across the state. Seeing the benefit of electric buses of BEST, I requested the minister to encourage electric buses on Mumbai, Pune, Pune-Nagar and Pune-Kolhapur routes to promote emission-free transport. Moreover, in the case of delivery bikes for food and goods deliveries, electric bikes must be promoted by the government. We must do everything we can to keep our world clean and green'. Sources said 23,000 electric two-wheelers have been sold in India in the fiscal that ended on March 31, 2017. It is up from 18,000 e-bikes in the country last year, and there is a likelihood of nearly 36,000 being sold in the present fiscal, the sources said. Some e-bike models have a waiting period of one-and-a-half months, they said. While hinting that the country was moving towards electric vehicles, the goods and service tax (GST) council had in May set a 12% tax rate for them, compared to 28% plus cess for petrol and diesel cars. Sources said the entry of new models of e-bikes could help bring down the cost of battery technology. The cost of an e-bike (100cc) could be anywhere Rs35,000-50,000, sources said, while one can ride 70-100km on a single charge.

Office bearers of APMC booked for producing false documents

The city police today booked the Chairman and Secretary of an Agricultural and Market Produce committee for alleged submission of fabricated documents to the Bombay High Court during the hearing of a case. A police spokesman said that the Chairman Ravindra Godvande and the Secretary Shyamkar Chowdhari of the Kalyan Agricultural Market Produce Committee have been booked under sections 465, 468, 471 and 34 of the IPC and offences registered against them at the Bazarph police station of Kalyan division police said. According to the complaint by a flourist who had his business and stall in the Market the development work of the market was undertaken by the committee. For the same the office bearers sought a nod from the occupants but some of them including the complainant Siddhant Kadam, had sought alternate arrangement for their busi-

ness till the completion of the renovation. They wanted the same in writing from the office bearers which they refused to give and held a meeting on May 11, 2017 and took signatures of some of the occupants of their consent. However some others did not give their consent to the same till the demands were fulfilled by them. Meanwhile a petition was filed in the Bombay high court by the aggrieved occupants including the complainant which came up for hearing in the High Court on July 01, 2017 and during the hearing the alleged accused submitted that all the occupants had agreed for the development. According to the complainant the office bearers had fabricated the documents and made the submissions in the court while they had not agreed to the same. Hence the complaint was filed with the police who registered an offence against the office bearers and the case is being probed by the police as of now now said the police officer.
