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INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TATA METALIKS LIMITED

1. We have audited the accompanying Statement of Financial Results of **TATA METALIKS LIMITED** ("the Company"), for the year ended March 31, 2017 ("the Statement"), being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as modified by Circular No. CIR/CFD/FAC/62/2016 dated July 5, 2016.

This Statement, which is the responsibility of the Company's Management and approved by the Board of Directors, has been compiled from the related Ind AS financial statements which has been prepared in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with relevant rules issued thereunder ('Ind AS') and other accounting principles generally accepted in India. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the Statement based on our audit of such financial statements.

2. We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. Those Standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the Statement is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and the disclosures in the Statement. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the Statement, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the Company's preparation and fair presentation of the Statement in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Company's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of the accounting policies used and the reasonableness of the accounting estimates made by the Management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the Statement.

- The above results were reviewed by the Audit Committee on April 20, 2017 and taken on record by the Board of Directors at its meeting held on April 21, 2017.
- 2. The High Court of Judicature at Calcutta vide its order dated November 07, 2016 has approved the Scheme of Amalgamation ("Scheme") between Tata Metaliks DI Pipes Limited ("TMDIPL") and the Company. The scheme has become effective from December 22, 2016 with appointed date from April 01, 2016. As this is a common control transaction, the amalgamation has been accounted using the 'pooling of interest' method and figures for all the reported previous periods have been recast as if the amalgamation had occurred from the beginning of the preceding period in accordance with the requirements of Appendix C of Ind AS 103 on Business Combinations.

On amalgamation, Equity share capital and Non-Cumulative Preference share capital of erstwhile TMDIPL have been cancelled against investments made by the Company in it and the resultant difference of Rs. 8759 lakhs has been accounted as Capital Reserve as per the approved scheme.

3. The loss from discontinuing operation is totally attributable to the ordinary activities and do not include gain/loss on disposal of assets or settlement of liabilities.

The Company adopted Indian Accounting Standard ("Ind AS") from April 01, 2016 and accordingly these financial results have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles stated there in, prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with the relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India. Financial results for all the periods presented have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles of Ind AS.
