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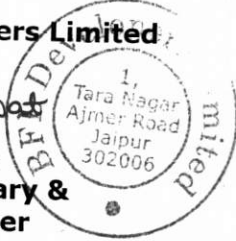

Sub: Scrutinizer's Report on Passing of Resolutions through Postal Ballot

Pursuant to the resolution passed by the Board of Directors of **BFL DEVELOPERS LIMITED** (hereinafter referred to as "Company") on Wednesday, May 03, 2017, I had been appointed as the scrutinizer to receive, process and scrutinize the postal ballot forms along with e-votes in respect of the Resolutions as circulated in the Postal Ballot Notice dated May 03, 2017 in fair and transparent manner and ascertaining the requisite majority in respect of the Resolutions contained in the Postal Ballot Notice.

To enable wider participation of equity shareholders, pursuant to the provisions of Section 108 of the Companies Act, 2013 and the rules framed thereunder vide The Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014 including The Companies (Management and Administration) Amendment Rules, 2015, dated March 19, 2015 and Regulation 44 of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 (hereinafter referred to as "Regulations"), every company having its equity shares listed on Recognized Stock Exchange(s), is required to provide e-voting facility to their shareholders on all shareholders' resolutions to be passed at general meetings or through postal ballot. Since the Company falls within the requirements as specified in the Companies Act, 2013 and the above mentioned Regulations, e-voting which has been made applicable, the company provided for the same.

The Company accordingly made arrangements with the system provider Central Depository Services (India) Limited (herein after referred to as "CDSL"), Depository for providing a system of recording votes of the shareholders electronically through remote e-voting. The company has also accordingly made arrangements through its Registrar and Transfer Agent, MCS Share Transfer Agent Limited. (Herein after referred to as "RTA") to set up the e-voting facility on the CDSL e-voting Website <https://www.evotingindia.com>

The Company through RTA has also uploaded the resolution in which e-voting is required and for generating Electronic Voting Sequence Number (EVSN) by the system provider. All necessary formalities in compliance with the requirements specified by CDSL, the system provider has been done by the company through its RTA. Necessary instructions in this regard to be followed by the shareholders had also been duly mentioned in the Notice of Postal Ballot and E-voting dated May 03, 2017 sent to all the shareholders by courier and by electronic means via e-mail along with the self-addressed prepaid Business Reply Envelope on or before May 22, 2017. The shareholders of the Company as on the cut-off date i.e. Friday, April 28, 2017 were entitled to vote on the resolutions contained in the Postal Ballot Notice. As stated in the Postal Ballot Notice, the Company fixed 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, June 21, 2017 as the last date for receipt of Postal Ballot Forms and remote e-voting.

- 1) That the Postal Ballot Notice dated May 03, 2017, under section 101 of the Companies Act, 2013 was dispatched to all shareholders i.e. 576 (Five Hundred and Seventy Six) as on cut-off date by means of courier to 536 (Five Hundred and Thirty Six) shareholders and to 40 (Forty) shareholders by means of E-mail on or before May 22, 2017. As confirmed by management, there were no such envelopes containing Postal Ballot Notice which were returned undelivered.
- 2) As stated in Rule 22 of The Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014 (as amended), an advertisement was published by the company on May 23, 2017 in "Financial Express", English newspaper in English language and in "Nafa Nuksan" vernacular language newspaper in vernacular language, informing about the completion of the dispatch of the Postal Ballot and e-voting Notice, by means of courier and e-mail to the shareholders along with other related matters mentioned therein.

- 4) I have received nil Postal Ballot Forms from the shareholders during the period starting from Tuesday, May 23, 2017 at 10.00 a.m. and ended on Wednesday, June 21, 2017 at 5.00 P.M.
- 5) The total number of fully paid up shares of the company outstanding as on Friday, April 28, 2017 were 51,03,500. As on cut-off date, out of 576 (Five Hundred and Seventy Six) shareholders, 22 (Twenty Two) shareholders have exercised their votes through remote e-voting and nil shareholders exercised their vote through Postal Ballot.

To carry on the business as promoters, dealers, owners, investors, agents, brokers of land, buildings, estates, hereditament, roads, highways docks, bridges, canals, dams, ports, reservoir or any other structural or architectural work of any kind whatsoever, whether rural or urban, residential, commercial or industrial, and to acquire or purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire or by any other means obtain ownership of and/or options over any rights, privileges or easements over or in respect of any property, land or building, to improve, alter, furnish, construct, promote, develop finance or subsidise the same and to dispose of or maintain, assist in sale of the same, to build townships, buildings, residential, factories, industries, warehouses, godowns, shops, cultural, sports, residential, commercial complexes, including restaurants and hotels, markets or conveniences thereon and to equip the same or any part thereof with all or any amenities or conveniences, drainage, sanitation facility, electricity, air conditioning, telegraph water, telephone and television installations and to deal with the same in any manner whatsoever, and to build, take on lease and/or rent, purchase or acquire in any manner whatsoever any apartments, house, flats, rooms, floors or other accommodation and to let or dispose of the same on instalment basis, hire purchase basis deferred payment basis or by outright sale whether by private treaty or by public auction or in any other mode of disposition all or any integral part thereof.
 2. To carry on the business of farming, horticulture, floriculture, tissuculture, green houses, red houses, drip irrigation, dairies, sericulture, cultivation of all kinds of food grains, seeds, oil-seeds, fruits, flowers, zozoba, proprietors of orchards and traders, importers, exporters, sellers, buyers and dealers in products of farming, horticulture, floriculture, sericulture and fishing and to carry on the business of growers, manufacturers, traders, grinders, rollers, processors, cold storers, canners and preservers and dealers of poultry products, fodder, fruits, dehydrated, mushroom, canned or converted agricultural products, provisions, foods, vegetables, herbs, flowers and to extract by-products and derivatives whether edible, pharmaceutical, medicinal or of any kind or nature whatsoever and food preparations of every kind and description and to carry on the business of tissue culture laboratories, production of plant, manufacturing of agro products and extraction of oils, floriculture activities and providing consultancy for the above referred objects, whether in India or elsewhere.
 3. To carry on the business of purchasing, selling whether on payment of full amount or on instalment basis, exchanging, planning, managing, running, improving, developing, protecting, maintaining, controlling, supervising, disposing off, reclaiming, letting or getting on hire, lease contract or otherwise dealing agriculture farms, resorts, forests, gardens, forest, products, nursery, pastures, crops, trees, leaves, orchards, estates, fields, plantations, farm houses, wastelands, barrenland, arid lands, live stock and planning, managing, running, improving, developing, maintaining, protecting, controlling, supervising, re-claiming, letting or getting on lease, hire, contract or otherwise dealing in deserts, water resources, environment and any other properties or any rights, privileges or easements therein whether belonging to company or not or whether for others or on own account and to carry on technical researches, experiments, developments, tests, inventions and provide consultancy services in agriculture, animal husbandry pollution control and forest, environment and land development.
 4. To produce, purchase, sell, import, export or otherwise deal aas dairy man and to carry on the business of milk contractors, dairy farmers, milers, surveyors and vendors of milk and milk products, condensed milk and powder milk, cream, cheese, butter, buttermilk and to buy, sell and trade in any goods usually traded in any of the above business inclusive of estate goods and medicinal products or any substitute for any of them.
 5. To carry on the business as investment holding company and for that purpose to invest in shares, debentures or any other securities under prevalent laws and use the moneys and properties of the company in such manner as the directors may think fit. To advance, deposit or lend moneys, securities and property to or with such persons, companies and corporations on such security or without security and on such terms and conditions as to directors seem fit and expedient and to issue on commission, subscribe for take, acquire, hold, sell, and exchange shares, stocks, bonds, obligations, debentures, mortgages or securities of any government or other competent authority, company or persons.
 6. To carry on the business of purchasing and letting on hire or lease in any part of India or abroad all kind of movable and immovable property and to assist in financing of all and of every kind and description of hire purchase on deferred payment or similar transaction.
 7. To carry on the business of trading, broking, hedging in agricultural products, metals, including precious metals, precious stones, diamonds, petroleum and energy products and all other commodities, in spot markets and in futures and all kinds of derivatives of all the above commodities, in India and abroad for and on behalf of the company as well as for others.
 8. To carry on business as brokers, sub-brokers, market makers, arbitrageurs, traders, underwriters, investors and/or hedgers including commodity warehousing, processing and consumption in agricultural products, metals, including precious metals, precious stones, diamonds, petroleum and energy products and all other commodities, in spot markets and in futures and all kinds of derivatives of all the above commodities and securities shares permitted under the laws of India.
 9. To become members and participate in trading, settlement and other activities of commodity exchange (including national multi-commodity exchange/s) facilitating, for itself or for clients, traders and clearing/settlement of trades in spots, in futures for itself or for clients, traders and clearing/settlement or trades in spots, in futures and in derivatives of all the above commodities permitted under the laws of India.

(B) THE OBJECTS INCIDENTAL OR ANCILLARY to the attainment of the Main objects are :-

1. To buy, sell, manufacture, repair, alter and exchange, let on hire, export, import and deal in all kinds of articles and things which may be required for the purpose of any of the main business in this Memorandum contained or which may seem capable of being profitably dealt with in connection with any of the said businesses covered in the main object.
2. To invest in, subscribe for, purchase or otherwise acquire and sell, dispose of, exchange, hold and deal in shares, stocks, bonds, debentures, debenture-stock, public securities or other securities issued by any authority, Central, State, Municipal, Local or otherwise and to invest in immovable and other properties.
3. To advance, deposit or lend money, securities and property (not amounting to the business of banking as defined under the Banking Regulations Act, 1949) to or with such persons, firms or bodies corporate as the company may think fit and in particular to customers and others having dealing with the company and on such terms as may seem expedient and to discount, buy, sell and deal in bills, notes, warrants, coupons and other negotiable or transferable securities or documents and to guarantee performance of any contract by any such person.
4. To guarantee the payment of money secured by or payable under or in respect of bonds, debentures, debenture-stock, contracts, mortgages, charges, obligations and other securities of any company or any authority, Central, State, Municipal, Local or otherwise or of any person whatsoever, whether, incorporated or not incorporated and to transact all kinds to guarantee business and to further transact all kinds of trust and agency.
5. To purchase or otherwise acquire and sell, exchange, surrender, lease, mortgage, charge, convert, hold, turn to account, dispose of and deal in real and personal property and rights of all kinds and in particular, mines, quarries, land, building, hereditaments, business concerns and undertakings, debenture-stocks, mortgages, debentures, produce, concessions, options, contracts, patents, annuities, licences, stocks, shares, securities, bonds, policies, bookdebts, and claims, privileges and choses-in-action of all kinds, including any interest in real or personal property and any claims, against such property or against any persons or company and to carry on any business, concern or undertaking so acquired in connection with the business of the company.

6. To receive money, securities, valuables of all kinds on deposit or safe custody (not amounting to the business of banking as defined under the Banking Regulations Act, 1949) and to borrow or raise money in such manner as the Company shall think fit and in particular by issue of debenture or debenture-stocks (perpetual or otherwise) and to secure the repayment of any money so borrowed, raised or owing by mortgage, charge or lien upon all or any of the Company's property (both present and future) including its uncalled capital and also by a similar mortgage, charge or lien to secure and guarantee the performance by the company or any other company or body corporate of and any obligation undertaken by the Company or any other person or Company, as the case may be.
7. To draw, make, accept, endorse, discount, execute and issue promissory notes, hundies, bills of exchange, bills of lading, warrants, debentures and other negotiable and transferable instruments.
8. To invest and deal with the money of the Company not immediately required in such manner as the Company may deem fit.
9. To communicate with chambers of commerce and other mercantile and public bodies throughout the world and concert and promote measures for the protection of the trade, industry and persons engaged therein.
10. To subscribe to, become a member of, subsidise and cooperate with any other association, whether incorporated or not, whose objects are altogether or in part similar to those of the Company and to procure from and communicate to and such association, such information as may be likely to further the objects of the Company.
11. To build, construct, alter, enlarge, remove, pull down, replace, maintain, improve, develop, work, control and manage any buildings, offices, factories, mills, ships, machinery, engines, water-works, gasworks, bridges, wharves, reservoirs, roads, tramways, railways, branches or sidings, electric power, heat and light supply work, telephone works, hotels, clubs, restaurants, baths, places of worship, places of amusements, pleasure grounds, park, gardens, reading rooms, stores, shops, dairies and other works and conveniences which the company may think directly or indirectly conducive to its objects and connected with the main line of business which the company will carry on or advance the interests of the company and to contribute or otherwise assist or take part in the construction, maintenance, development, working, control and management thereof and to join with any other person or company doing any of these things.
12. To improve, manage, develop, grant rights or privileges in respect of otherwise deal with all or any part of the property and rights of the company.
13. To vest any real or personal property rights or interest acquired by or belonging to the company in any person or company on behalf of or for the benefit of the company and with or without any declared trust in favour of the company.

14. To purchase take on lease, exchange, hire or otherwise acquire any movable or immovable property and any rights or privileges which the company may think necessary or convenient for the purpose of its business.
15. To apply for, purchase or otherwise acquire, protect and renew in any part of the world, patents, licences, concessions, patent rights, trade marks, designs and the like, conferring any exclusive or non-exclusive or limited right to their use, any secret or other information regarding any invention or research which may seem capable of being used for any of the purposes of the company or the acquisition of which may seem calculated directly or indirectly to benefit the company and to use develop or grant licence in respect thereof or otherwise turn to account the right of information so acquired and to expend money in experimenting upon, testing or improving any such patents, rights or inventions.
16. To acquire and undertake the whole or any part of the business property or liabilities of any person, firm or body corporate, carrying on or proposing to carry on any business which the company is authorised to carry on or having property suitable for the purposes of the company or which can be carried on in conjunction therewith or which is capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit the Company.
17. To enter into any arrangements with any Government or any Authority, supreme, municipal, local or otherwise that may seem beneficial to any of the Company's objects and to apply for, promote and obtain any Act of Parliament, privilege concession, licence or authorisation of the Government or any other authority local or otherwise for enabling the Company to carry on any of its objects into effect or for extending any of the powers of the Company and to carry out, exercise and comply with any such Act, privilege, concession, licence or authorisation.
18. To pay for any rights or property acquired by the Company and to remunerate any person, company or public bodies whether by cash payment or by allotment of shares, debentures or other securities of the Company credited as paid up in full or in part or otherwise.
19. To amalgamate, enter into partnership or into any arrangement for sharing profits, union of interests, cooperation, joint venture or reciprocal concession or for limiting competition with any person, firm or body corporate whether in India or outside carrying on or engaged in or about to carry on or engage in any business or transaction which the Company is authorised to carry on or engage in or which can be carried on in conjunction therewith or which is capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit the company and further to enter into any arrangement or contract with any person, association or body corporate whether in India or outside for technical collaboration, technical know-how or for such other purpose that may seem calculated beneficial and conducive to the objects of the Company.

20. To establish, promote or concur in establishing or promoting any company or companies for the purpose of acquiring all or any of the rights liabilities and properties of the company or for any other purpose which may seem directly calculated to benefit the Company and to place or guarantee the placing of, underwrite, subscribe for or otherwise acquire all or any part of the shares, debentures or other securities of any such other company or companies.
21. To lease, let out on hire, mortgage, pledge, hypothecate, sell or otherwise dispose of the whole or any part of the undertaking of the Company or any land, business, property, rights or assets of any kind of the Company or any share of interest therein respectively in such manner and for such consideration as the Company may think fit and in particular for shares, debentures or securities of any other body corporate having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Company.
22. To establish and equip laboratories and carry on analytical experimental and other work or undertaking and search in relation of the objects of the Company.
23. To pay any premium or salaries and to pay for any property, rights or privileges acquired by the Company or for services rendered or to be rendered in connection with the promotion, formation of or the business, of the company or for services rendered or to be rendered by any person, firm or body corporate in placing or assisting to place or guaranteeing the placing of any of the shares of the Company or any debentures debenture-stock or other securities of the Company or otherwise either wholly or partly in cash or in shares, bonds, debentures or other securities of the Company and to issue any such shares either as fully-paid up or with such amount credited as paid up thereon as may be agreed upon and to charge any such bonds, debentures or other securities upon all or any part of the property of the Company.
24. To pay out of the funds of the Company all costs, charges and expenses preliminary and incidental to the promotion, formation, establishment and registration of the Company and to take into consideration and to approve and confirm all acts, deeds and things that may be done or entered into with any person, firm or body corporate by the promoters of the company and further to enter into any agreement, arrangement or contract with the promoters and to reimburse them for all costs and expenses that may be incurred by them in or in connection with the formation or promotion of the Company.
25. To adopt such means of making known the products, business and interests of the Company as it may deem expedient and in particular by advertising in the press, radio, television and cinema, by circulars, by purchase, construction and exhibitions of work of art or general interest, by publication of books and by granting prizes, rewards and donations subject to the provisions of law.

26. To procure the company to be registered or recognised in any part of the world outside the Union of India.
27. To establish and maintain or procure the establishment and maintenance of any provident fund or any contributory or non-contributory pension or superannuation fund and to give or procure the giving of donations, gratuities, pension, allowances, emoluments, bonus, profit, sharing bonus, benefits or any other payment to any person who are or were at any time in the employment or service of the Company or its predecessors in business or of any company which is a subsidiary of the Company or is allied to or associated with the Company or any such subsidiary or who are or were at any time Directors or officers of the Company or any of such other company as aforesaid and the wives, widows, families, dependents or connections of any such persons and to provide for the welfare of all or any of the aforesaid person from time to time by subscribing, subsidising or contributing to any institutions, associations, funds, clubs, trusts, profits sharing or other schemes and by building or contributing to the building of dwelling houses or quarters and by providing, subscribing or contributing towards places of instructions and recreation, hospitals and dispensaries medical and other attendance and to make payments to or towards the insurance of any such person as aforesaid and to do and of the matters aforesaid either alone or in conjunction with any such other company as aforesaid,
28. To aid pecuniarily or otherwise any association, body or movement having for its objects any solution, settlement or surmounting of industrial labour problems or the promotion of industry or trade.
29. To subscribe in or donate to or guarantee money for national philanthropic, charitable, benevolent, public, general or useful object, fund or organisation, association or institution or for any exhibition or for any purpose which may be likely directly or indirectly to further the objects of the Company or the interest of its members subject to the provisions of the Companies Act, 1956.
30. To make arrangements with persons engaged in any trade, business or profession for the concession to the company's members, ticket-holders and their friends, of any special rights, privileges and advantages and is particular in regard to the supply of goods.
31. On winding up of the company, to distribute all or any of the property of the company amongst the members in specie or in kind or proceeds of sale or disposal of any property of the company but so that no distribution amounting to a reduction of capital be made except with the sanction (if any) for the time being required by law and subject further to Section 205 of the Companies Act, 1956.
32. To do all or any of the above things in any part of the world as principals, agents, contractors, trustees, attorney, agents or otherwise and either alone or in conjunction with others and to establish offices, agencies or branches for carrying on any of the aforesaid objects in India or

elsewhere in the world and to undertake the management of any company or companies having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Company.

33. To carry on the business of transport and any other business whether being conveniently be carried on in connection with the objects in this Memorandum contained or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the Company's property or rights of which it may be advisable to undertake with a view to improving, developing, rendering valuable or turning to account any property real or personal belonging to the Company or in which the company may be interested.

(C) OTHER OBJECTS :

1. To carry on the business of manufacturers, processors, importers, exporters, buyers, sellers, stockists and distributors of and dealers in

Elastomers, synthetic resins, carbon black, leather, hides and skins, plastics, latexes and formulations thereof and other kinds of resins and plastic products and goods.

All types of compounds, drugs, dyewares, disinfectants and of electrical, photographic, surgical and scientific apparatus and materials.

Colours, paints, varnishes, lacquers, pigments.

Paper, newsprint, paper board, strawboard, hardboard, fibre-board, chip-board, corrugated paper, transparent paper, craft paper, carbons, inks, parchment and corks.

2. To carry on the business of buyers, sellers, importers, exporters, distributors, stockists, agents or otherwise dealers in stones, packing materials, all kinds of metals, whether ferrous or non-ferrous, all kinds of chemicals, all kinds of industrial and agricultural products whatsoever, all kinds of agricultural, industrial, scientific implements tools, apparatus machineries and their accessories and to manufacture, process, buy, sell, import, export or otherwise deal in such products, their raw materials, machines, stores, packing materials and by-products.
3. To purchase, acquire and hold with absolute or limited rights or on lease or otherwise and to erect, construct, repair and maintain land, building, houses, factories, mills, godowns, sheds and to sell, buy, exchange, barter, let or otherwise deal in land, buildings and other properties, to provide services related to property as property dealer.

4. To carry on the business of industrial, financial and investment advisors and to invest in, subscribe purchase or otherwise deal in shares, stocks, bond, debentures, debenture stock, public securities, issued by any authority, Central, State, Municipal, Local or otherwise and to carry on the business carried on by finance and investment companies, finance and investment advisors.

5. To plant, cultivate, produce, raise, make marketable, import, export, sell, buy, act as agents, stockists, distributors or otherwise deal in all kinds of food-grains, oil cakes, tea, coffee, jute, sugar, sugar cane and other types of produce of land to manufacture, process, import, export, sell or otherwise deal in fertilizers of all varieties, D.D.T. and other insecticidal and fungicidal sprays.

6. To carry on the business of manufacturers, processors, importers, buyers, sellers, stockists and distributors of and dealers in

Tarpaulines, stainless steel utensils.

Automobile workshop, engine reconditioning workshops, automobiles, agriculture and engineering tools and machines, earth movers, tractors, road rollers and spare parts.

7. To carry on the business of suppliers of plant, machinery and equipments, stores tools, gadgets, devices, contraptions, instruments, spares, and components to develop, acquire, supply plans, drawings, estimates, project reports and know-how for industries, business, companies, services and public bodies and Governments.

8. To carry on the business of transport by any means through road, sea, air and to act as transport-agents, travel agent-cargos, shipping agents, couriers and booking agents.

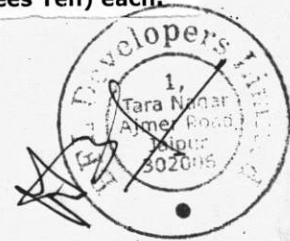
9. To carry on the business of all or any of iron and steel founders, steel melters, steel makers, steel shapers and mechanical, civil, electrical and general engineers and fabricators, contractors, tool makers, brass founders, metal workers, manufacturers of steel, metal and malleable grey castings including ferrous, non-ferrous, special and alloy steel, spring steel, forging quality steel manufacturers/processors of all types of automobile components, forged components, railway track and wagon components, signal equipments and all other types of railway components and accessories, alloys, nut-bolts, steel rounds, nails, tools, all types of hard-ware items, all types of springs, spring washers, grease cups, grease nipples, oil cups and cones, heavy and light machinery, boilers, architectural fittings, sanitary fittings, pipe and pipe fittings, metallurgists, gas and electrical engineers and manufacturers, plate-makers, wire-drawers, tube manufacturers, galvanizers, Japaners, re-rollers, annealers, enamellers and electro-platers and to buy, take on lease or hire, sell, import, export, manufacture, process, repair, convert, let on hire or otherwise deal in such products, their raw materials, stores, packing materials, by-products and allied commodities, machineries, rolling stock, implements, tools, utensils, ground tools, materials and conveniences of all kinds.

10. To manufacture, repair, convert, alter, process, import, export, buy, sell or deal in all sorts of automatic controls, thermal, hydraulic, magnetic, all types of tools, dies, relays, agricultural, industrial and scientific instruments, appliances and apparatus, electrical parts and accessories, plants and all other materials required for planning, processing, finishing, machining and packing of all such products and to manufacture, process, buy, sell, import, export or otherwise deal in such products, their raw materials, stores, packing materials by-products and allied commodities.
11. To search, prospect, win, work, get, raise, quarry, smelt, refine, dress, manufacture, manipulate, convert, make merchantable, sell, buy, import, export or otherwise, deal in iron, iron ore, copper, gypsum, lead, nickel, platinum, zinc bauxite, tungsten, ores metals, silicon and manganese.
12. To carry on the business of financial and investment advisors, finance brokers, under-writers subject to regulations of the Stock Exchange and provisions of the concerned Acts in force.
13. To carry on the business of Wine, Spirit and Liquor merchants, Brewers, Distillers, Importers, exporters and Manufacturers of Aerated Mineral and artificial waters or caterers for public amusement or entertainment.
14. To carry on the business of cinematograph and talkies, films, exhibitors and distributors, theatrical performances, circus play, open air theatres, dances, musical and other entertainments of all kinds, games, sports, dramatic and other performances of all kinds, whatsoever and activities relating to stage performances and letting of the same.
15. To carry on the business of operators of training and teaching schools, colleges, workshops, institutes and classes for various trades, professions, crafts, arts and university or institute courses.
16. To carry on the business of printers in all the branches, newspapers, journals, magazines, books and other literature, stationary and other articles to serve as stationers, lithographers, chromo lithographers, block makers, draftsmen, envelope manufacturers, paper bag and account books makers, numerical printers, box makers and book sellers.
17. To carry on the business of manufacturers, processors, traders, dealers, distributors, buyers, sellers, importers, exporters, programmers, managers, operators and agents or to deal in any other manner (including loan licencing basis, branding) in any of or all types and varieties of computers, data processors, word processors, electronic printers, all types of entertainment electronics and accessories, computer hardware, computer software, accessories, equipments, intermediates, spares salvageable parts, audiovisual media, demonstration machines, electronic typewriters, allied office equipments and stationery.

18. To manufacture, buy, sell exchange, alter, improve, manipulate, prepare, for market, import, export or otherwise deal in all kinds of Cycles, Mopeds, Scooters, Motor Cycles, Auto Rikshaw, Motor Cars, Motor Trucks, Buses, Tractors, Vans, Jeeps, Lorries, Motor Launches, Aeroplanes, Sea-Planes and Vehicles and conveyances of all kinds and their Automobile Control Cables and speedometers, cables and its assemblies and spare parts.
19. To carry on the business as Merchants and Agents for petrol, Oils, Lubricants, greases, spirit, Kerosene, gas, electricity and other motive powers.
20. To carry on the business as importers, exporters, manufacturers of and dealers in all kinds of household appliances including refrigerators, stove, wick stove, dryers, heaters, pressure cookers, ovens, cooking ranges, hot plates, other cooking utensils of all types, containers, buckets, toasters, mixers, washing machines and other electric appliances including radios, televisions, transformers and electric motors of every kind.
21. To manufacture, buy, sell, import, export or otherwise deal in all kinds of soaps, soap chips, soap powders, detergents and toileteries.
22. To carry on the business of manufacturing, trading, dealing, marketing, importing, exporting, converting, synthesising, refining, extracting and preserving of all kinds of dyes, dyes intermediates, colours, polishes and varnishes, soda, caustic soda, organic dyestuffs, synthetic organic paints, derivatives, organic surface active agents, glycerines, heavy water chemicals, salts and all other kinds of organic and inorganic chemicals and also from the residue of substances obtained in the process of manufacture of the chemicals and preparations aforesaid and deal in such by products.
23. To produce, quarry, mine, excavate, cut, hew, carve, draw, crush, saw, dress, finish, polish, set, glaze, grind, process, wash, screen, wax, manufacture, craft, treat, alter, improve, extract from mines, refine, import, export, purchase, sell or otherwise deal in and to act as brokers, agents, stockists, distributors and suppliers of all kinds of marbles, marble chips, tiles, granites, laterites, lime stones, soap stones, felspar, corundum, quartz, artificial stones, slate stones, sand stones, silica stones, building stones and all other kinds of stones.
24. To carry on the business of manufacturing, trading, marketing, Distributing, dealing, importing, exporting, Chemically treating, refining and preserving of all kinds of Ayurvedic, allopathic, homeopathic, Unani medicines, drugs Contraceptives, sera, Vaccines, surgical and scientific equipments, appliances, hospital equipments, Cosmetics, toilet requisites and all kinds of medicated products and formulations.

25. To manage and deal in land, building and other properties, to collect rents and income and to supply tenants and occupiers and other refreshments, attendance, messages, light, waiting-rooms, reading rooms, meeting rooms, lavatories or laundry, conveniences, electric conveniences, stables and other advantages.
26. To process and manufacture, buy, sell or otherwise deal in jewellery and semi precious stones of all varieties, articles of handicrafts and architects and curios, garments and readymade clothes, wool and other fabrics, durries and pile carpets.
27. Forfeited shares may be sold, etc.
- (2) At any time before a sale, re-allotment or disposal as aforesaid, the Board may cancel the forfeiture on such terms as it thinks fit. Cancellation of forfeiture
48. (1) A person whose shares have been forfeited shall cease to be a member in respect of the forfeited shares, but shall, notwithstanding the forfeiture, remain liable to pay, and shall pay, to the Company all monies which, at the date of forfeiture, were presently payable by him to the Company in respect of the shares. Members still liable to pay money owing at the time of forfeiture
- (2) All such monies payable shall be paid together with interest thereon at such rate as the Board may determine, from the time of forfeiture until payment or realisation. Alteration of capital

55. Subject to the provisions of the Act, the Company may, by ordinary resolution - Power to alter share capital

 - (b) consolidate and divide all or any of its share capital into shares of larger amount than its existing shares:
Provided that any consolidation and division which results in changes in the voting percentage of members shall require applicable approvals under the Act;
 - (c) convert all or any of its fully paid-up shares into stock, and reconvert that stock into fully paid-up shares of any denomination;
 - (d) sub-divide its existing shares or any of them into shares of smaller amount than is fixed by the memorandum;
 - (e) cancel any shares which, at the date of the passing of the resolution, have not been taken or agreed to be taken by any person.
56. Where shares are converted into stock: Shares may be converted into stock
- (a) the holders of stock may transfer the same or any part thereof in the same manner as, and subject to the same Articles under which, the shares from which the stock arose might before the conversion have been transferred, or as near thereto as circumstances admit:
Provided that the Board may, from time to time, fix the minimum amount of stock transferable, so, however, that such minimum shall not exceed the nominal amount of the shares from which the stock arose;
 - (b) the holders of stock shall, according to the amount of stock held by them, have the same rights, privileges and advantages as regards dividends, voting at meetings of the Company, and other matters, as if they held the shares from which the stock arose; but no such privilege or advantage (except participation in the dividends and profits of the Company and in the assets on winding up) shall be conferred by an amount of stock which would not, if existing in shares, have conferred that privilege or advantage; Right of stockholders
 - (c) such of these Articles of the Company as are applicable to paid-up shares shall apply to stock and the words "share" and "shareholder"/"member" shall include "stock" and "stock-holder", respectively.
57. The Company may, by resolution as prescribed by the Act, reduce in any manner and in accordance with the provisions of the Act and the Rules, - Reduction of capital
- (a) its share capital; and/or
 - (b) any capital redemption reserve account; and/or
 - (c) any securities premium account; and/or
 - (d) any other reserve in the nature of share capital.

Joint Holders

58. Where two or more persons are registered as joint holders (not more than three) of any share, they shall be deemed (so far as the Company is concerned) to hold the same as joint tenants with benefits of survivorship, subject to the following and other provisions contained in these Articles:
- Joint-holders
- Liability of Joint-holders
- Death of one or more joint-holders
- Receipt of one sufficient
- Delivery of certificate and giving of notice to first named holder
- Vote of joint-holders
- Executors or administrators as joint holders
- Provisions as to joint holders as to shares to apply *mutatis mutandis* to debentures, etc.
- (a) The joint-holders of any share shall be liable severally as well as jointly for and in respect of all calls or installments and other payments which ought to be made in respect of such share.
 - (b) On the death of any one or more of such joint-holders, the survivor or survivors shall be the only person or persons recognized by the Company as having any title to the share but the Directors may require such evidence of death as they may deem fit, and nothing herein contained shall be taken to release the estate of a deceased joint-holder from any liability on shares held by him jointly with any other person.
 - (c) Any one of such joint holders may give effectual receipts of any dividends, interests or other moneys payable in respect of such share.
 - (d) Only the person whose name stands first in the register of members as one of the joint-holders of any share shall be entitled to the delivery of certificate, if any, relating to such share or to receive notice (which term shall be deemed to include all relevant documents) and any notice served on or sent to such person shall be deemed service on all the joint-holders.
 - (e) (i) Any one of two or more joint-holders may vote at any meeting either personally or by attorney or by proxy in respect of such shares as if he were solely entitled thereto and if more than one of such joint-holders be present at any meeting personally or by proxy or by attorney then that one of such persons so present whose name stands first or higher (as the case may be) on the register in respect of such shares shall alone be entitled to vote in respect thereof.
(ii) Several executors or administrators of a deceased member in whose (deceased member) sole name any share stands, shall for the purpose of this clause be deemed joint-holders.
 - (f) The provisions of these Articles relating to joint holders of shares shall *mutatis mutandis* apply to any other securities including debentures of the Company registered in joint names.

Capitalisation of profits

59. (1) The Company by ordinary resolution in general meeting may, upon the recommendation of the Board, resolve – **Capitalisation**
- (a) that it is desirable to capitalise any part of the amount for the time being standing to the credit of any of the Company's reserve accounts, or to the credit of the profit and loss account, or otherwise available for distribution; and
 - (b) that such sum be accordingly set free for distribution in the manner specified in clause (2) below amongst the members who would have been entitled thereto, if distributed by way of dividend and in the same proportions.
- (2) The sum aforesaid shall not be paid in cash but shall be applied, subject to the provision contained in clause (3) below, either in or towards : **Sum how applied**
- (A) paying up any amounts for the time being unpaid on any shares held by such members respectively;
 - (B) paying up in full, unissued shares or other securities of the Company to be allotted and distributed, credited as fully paid-up, to and amongst such members in the proportions aforesaid;
 - (C) partly in the way specified in sub-clause (A) and partly in that specified in sub-clause (B).
- (3) A securities premium account and a capital redemption reserve account or any other permissible reserve account may, for the purposes of this Article, be applied in the paying up of unissued shares to be issued to members of the Company as fully paid bonus shares;
- (4) The Board shall give effect to the resolution passed by the Company in pursuance of this Article.
60. (1) Whenever such a resolution as aforesaid shall have been passed, the Board shall - **Powers of the Board for capitalisation**
- (a) make all appropriations and applications of the amounts resolved to be capitalised thereby, and all allotments and issues of fully paid shares or other securities, if any; and
 - (b) generally do all acts and things required to give effect thereto.
- (2) The Board shall have power— **Board's power to issue fractional certificate/coupon etc.**
- (a) to make such provisions, by the issue of fractional certificates/coupons or by payment in cash or otherwise as it thinks fit, for the case of shares or other securities becoming distributable in fractions; and
 - (b) to authorise any person to enter, on behalf of all the members entitled thereto, into an agreement with the Company providing for the allotment to them respectively, credited as fully paid-up, of any further shares or other securities to which they may be entitled upon such capitalisation, or as the case may require, for the payment by the Company on their behalf, by the application thereto of their respective proportions of profits resolved to be capitalised, of the amount or any part of the amounts remaining unpaid on their existing shares.
- (3) Any agreement made under such authority shall be effective and binding on such members. **Agreement binding on members**

Buy-back of shares

- Buy-back of shares 61. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Articles but subject to all applicable provisions of the Act or any other law for the time being in force, the Company may purchase its own shares or other specified securities.

General meetings

- Extraordinary general meeting 62. All general meetings other than annual general meeting shall be called extraordinary general meeting. Notice for calling general meeting(s) to be in consonance with the provisions as laid down in the Act.
- Powers of Board to call extraordinary general meeting 63. The Board may, whenever it thinks fit, call an extraordinary general meeting.

Proceedings at general meetings

- Presence of Quorum 64. (1) No business shall be transacted at any general meeting unless a quorum of members is present at the time when the meeting proceeds to business.
- Business confined to election of Chairperson whilst chair vacant (2) No business shall be discussed or transacted at any general meeting except election of Chairperson whilst the chair is vacant.
- Quorum for general meeting (3) The quorum for a general meeting shall be as provided in the Act.
- Chairperson of the meetings 65. The Chairperson of the Company shall preside as Chairperson at every general meeting of the Company.
- Directors to elect a Chairperson 66. If there is no such Chairperson, or if he is not present within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for holding the meeting, or is unwilling to act as chairperson of the meeting, the directors present shall elect one of their members to be Chairperson of the meeting.
- Members to elect a Chairperson 67. If at any meeting no director is willing to act as Chairperson or if no director is present within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for holding the meeting, the members present shall, by poll or electronically, choose one of their members to be Chairperson of the meeting.
- Casting vote of Chairperson at general meeting 68. On any business at any general meeting, in case of an equality of votes, whether on a show of hands or electronically or on a poll, the Chairperson shall have a second or casting vote.
- Minutes of proceedings of meetings and resolutions passed by postal ballot 69. (1) The Company shall cause minutes of the proceedings of every general meeting of any class of members or creditors and every resolution passed by postal ballot to be prepared and signed in such manner as may be prescribed by the Rules and kept by making within thirty days of the conclusion of every such meeting concerned or passing of resolution by postal ballot entries thereof in books kept for that purpose with their pages consecutively numbered.

- (2) There shall not be included in the minutes any matter which, in the opinion of the Chairperson of the meeting -
- (a) is, or could reasonably be regarded, as defamatory of any person; or
 - (b) is irrelevant or immaterial to the proceedings; or
 - (c) is detrimental to the interests of the Company.
- (3) The Chairperson shall exercise an absolute discretion in regard to the inclusion or non-inclusion of any matter in the minutes on the grounds specified in the aforesaid clause.
- (4) The minutes of the meeting kept in accordance with the provisions of the Act shall be evidence of the proceedings recorded therein.
70. (1) The books containing the minutes of the proceedings of any general meeting of the Company or a resolution passed by postal ballot shall:
- (a) be kept at the registered office of the Company; and
 - (b) be open to inspection of any member without charge, during 11.00 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. on all working days other than Saturdays.
- (2) Any member shall be entitled to be furnished, within the time prescribed by the Act, after he has made a request in writing in that behalf to the Company and on payment of such fees as may be fixed by the Board, with a copy of any minutes referred to in clause (1) above:
- Provided that a member who has made a request for provision of a soft copy of the minutes of any previous general meeting held during the period immediately preceding three financial years, shall be entitled to be furnished with the same free of cost.
71. The Board, and also any person(s) authorised by it, may take any action before the commencement of any general meeting, or any meeting of a class of members in the Company, which they may think fit to ensure the security of the meeting, the safety of people attending the meeting, and the future orderly conduct of the meeting. Any decision made in good faith under this Article shall be final, and rights to attend and participate in the meeting concerned shall be subject to such decision.

Adjournment of meeting

72. (1) The Chairperson may, *suo motu*, adjourn the meeting from time to time and from place to place.
- (2) No business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place.
- (3) When a meeting is adjourned for thirty days or more, notice of the adjourned meeting shall be given as in the case of an original meeting.
- (4) Save as aforesaid, and save as provided in the Act, it shall not be necessary to give any notice of an adjournment or of the business to be transacted at an adjourned meeting.

Voting rights

- Entitlement to vote on show of hands and on poll 73. Subject to any rights or restrictions for the time being attached to any class or classes of shares -
- (a) on a show of hands, every member present in person shall have one vote; and
 - (b) on a poll, the voting rights of members shall be in proportion to his share in the paid-up equity share capital of the company.
- Voting through electronic means 74. A member may exercise his vote at a meeting by electronic means in accordance with the Act and shall vote only once.
- Vote of joint-holders 75. (1) In the case of joint holders, the vote of the senior who tenders a vote, whether in person or by proxy, shall be accepted to the exclusion of the votes of the other joint holders.
- Seniority of names (2) For this purpose, seniority shall be determined by the order in which the names stand in the register of members.
- How members *non compos mentis* and minor may vote 76. A member of unsound mind, or in respect of whom an order has been made by any court having jurisdiction in lunacy, may vote, whether on a show of hands or on a poll, by his committee or other legal guardian, and any such committee or guardian may, on a poll, vote by proxy. If any member be a minor, the vote in respect of his share or shares shall be by his guardian or any one of his guardians.
- Votes in respect of shares of deceased or insolvent members, etc. 77. Subject to the provisions of the Act and other provisions of these Articles, any person entitled under the Transmission Clause to any shares may vote at any general meeting in respect thereof as if he was the registered holder of such shares, provided that at least 48 (forty eight) hours before the time of holding the meeting or adjourned meeting, as the case may be, at which he proposes to vote, he shall duly satisfy the Board of his right to such shares unless the Board shall have previously admitted his right to vote at such meeting in respect thereof.
- Business may proceed pending poll 78. Any business other than that upon which a poll has been demanded may be proceeded with, pending the taking of the poll.
- Restriction on voting rights 79. No member shall be entitled to vote either personally or by proxy for another member at any general meeting unless all calls or other sums presently payable by him in respect of shares in the Company have been paid or in regard to which the Company has exercised any right of lien.
- Restriction on exercise of voting rights in other cases to be void 80. A member is not prohibited from exercising his voting on the ground that he has not held his share or other interest in the Company for any specified period preceding the date on which the vote is taken, or on any other ground not being a ground set out in the preceding Article.
- Equal rights of members 81. Any member whose name is entered in the register of members of the Company shall enjoy the same rights and be subject to the same liabilities as all other members of the same class.

Proxy

82. (1) Any member entitled to attend and vote at a general meeting may do so either personally or through his constituted attorney or through another person as a proxy on his behalf, for that meeting. A Proxy so appointed shall not have any right to speak at the meeting and shall not be entitled to vote except on a poll. A person appointed as proxy shall act on behalf of such member or such number of members and such number of shares as prescribed under the Act. Member may vote in person or otherwise
- (2) The instrument appointing a proxy and the power-of-attorney or other authority, if any, under which it is signed or a notarised copy of that power or authority, shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than 48 hours before the time for holding the meeting or adjourned meeting at which the person named in the instrument proposes to vote, and in default the instrument of proxy shall not be treated as valid. Proxies when to be deposited
83. An instrument appointing a proxy shall be in the form as prescribed in the Rules. Form of proxy
84. A vote given in accordance with the terms of an instrument of proxy shall be valid, notwithstanding the previous death or insanity of the principal or the revocation of the proxy or of the authority under which the proxy was executed, or the transfer of the shares in respect of which the proxy is given: Proxy to be valid notwithstanding death of the principal
- Provided that no intimation in writing of such death, insanity, revocation or transfer shall have been received by the Company at its office before the commencement of the meeting or adjourned meeting at which the proxy is used.

Board of Directors, their remuneration

85. (1) Unless otherwise determined by the Company in general meeting, the number of directors shall not be less than 3 (three) and shall not be more than 15 (fifteen). Board of Directors
- (2) The First Directors of the Company are : Shri Panna Lal Baid, Smt. Sobhag Devi Baid and Shri Mahendra Kumar Baid. First Directors
86. (1) The Board shall have the power to determine the directors whose period of office is or is not liable to determination by retirement of directors by rotation. Directors not liable to retire by rotation
- (2) The same individual may, at the same time, be appointed as the Chairperson of the Company as well as the Managing Director or Chief Executive Officer of the Company. Same individual may be Chairperson and Managing Director/ Chief Executive Officer
87. (1) The remuneration of the directors shall, in so far as it consists of a monthly payment, be deemed to accrue from day-to-day. Remuneration of directors
- (2) The remuneration payable to the directors, including any managing or whole-time director or manager, if any, shall be determined in accordance with and subject to the provisions of the Act. Remuneration to require members' consent

- Sitting fee,
Travelling and
other expenses
- (3) In addition to the remuneration payable to them in pursuance of the Act, the directors may be paid sitting fee, as the Board from time to time deems fit, subject to the limit as prescribed by the Act, all travelling, hotel and other expenses properly incurred by them—
- (a) in attending and returning from meetings of the Board of Directors or any committee thereof or general meetings of the Company; or
- (b) in connection with the business of the Company.
- Execution of negotiable instruments
88. All cheques, promissory notes, drafts, *hundis*, bills of exchange and other negotiable instruments, and all receipts for monies paid to the Company, shall be signed, drawn, accepted, endorsed, or otherwise executed, as the case may be, by such person and in such manner as the Board shall from time to time by resolution determine.
- Appointment of additional directors
89. (1) Subject to the provisions of the Act, the Board shall have power at any time, and from time to time, to appoint a person as an additional director, provided the number of the directors and additional directors together shall not at any time exceed the maximum strength fixed for the Board by the Articles.
- (2) Such person shall hold office only up to the date of the next annual general meeting of the Company but shall be eligible for appointment by the Company as a director at that meeting subject to the provisions of the Act.
- Duration of office of additional director
90. (1) The Board may appoint an alternate director to act for a director (hereinafter in this Article called "the Original Director") during his absence for a period of not less than three months from India. A Director appointed under this Article is herein referred as "Nominee Director" means any director for time being in office under this Article. The deed aforesaid may contain ancillary provisions as may be arranged between the Company and the lending corporation and all such provisions shall have effect notwithstanding any of the other provisions herein contained.

100. All acts done in any meeting of the Board or of a Committee thereof or by any person acting as a director, shall, notwithstanding that it may be afterwards discovered that there was some defect in the appointment of any one or more of such directors or of any person acting as aforesaid, or that they or any of them were disqualified or that his or their appointment had terminated, be as valid as if every such director or such person had been duly appointed and was qualified to be a director.
101. Save as otherwise expressly provided in the Act, a resolution in writing, signed, whether manually or by secure electronic mode, by a majority of the members of the Board or of a Committee thereof, for the time being entitled to receive notice of a meeting of the Board or Committee, shall be valid and effective as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Board or Committee, duly convened and held.

**Chief Executive Officer, Manager, Company Secretary

102. (a) Subject to the provisions of the Act,— Chief Executive
Officer, etc.
- A chief executive officer, manager, company secretary and chief financial officer may be appointed by the Board for such term, at such remuneration and upon such conditions as it may think fit; and any chief executive officer, manager, company secretary and chief financial officer so appointed may be removed by means of a resolution of the Board; the Board may appoint one or more chief executive officers for its multiple businesses.

Registers

103. Statutory registers
- The Company shall keep and maintain at its registered office all statutory registers namely, register of charges, register of members, register of debenture holders, register of any other security holders, the register and index of beneficial owners and annual return, register of loans, guarantees, security and acquisitions, register of investments not held in its own name and register of contracts and arrangements for such duration as the Board may, unless otherwise prescribed, decide, and in such manner and containing such particulars as prescribed by the Act and the Rules. The registers and copies of annual return shall be open for inspection during on all working days, other than Saturdays, at the registered office of the Company by the persons entitled thereto on payment, where required, of such fees as may be fixed by the Board but not exceeding the limits prescribed by the Rules.
104. (a) Foreign register
- The Company may exercise the powers conferred on it by the Act with regard to the keeping of a foreign register; and the Board may (subject to the provisions of the Act) make and vary such regulations as it may think fit respecting the keeping of any such register.
- (b) The foreign register shall be open for inspection and may be closed, and extracts may be taken therefrom and copies thereof may be required, in the same manner, *mutatis mutandis*, as is applicable to the register of members.

105. (1) The seal, its

- The Board shall provide for the safe custody of the seal.
- (2) Affixation of seal
- The seal of the Company shall not be affixed to any instrument except by the authority of a resolution of the Board or of a Committee of the Board authorised by it in that behalf, and except in the presence of at least one director or the manager, if any, or of the secretary or such other person as the Board may appoint for the purpose; and such director or manager or the secretary or other person aforesaid shall sign every instrument to which the seal of the Company is so affixed in their presence.

 - (c) The liquidator may, with the like sanction, vest the whole or any part of such assets in trustees upon such trusts for the benefit of the contributories if he considers necessary, but so that no member shall be compelled to accept any shares or other securities whereon there is any liability.

117. (a) Subject to the provisions of the Act, every director, managing director, whole-time director, manager, company secretary and other officer of the Company shall be indemnified by the Company out of the funds of the Company, to pay all costs, losses and expenses (including travelling expense) which such director, manager, company secretary and officer may incur or become liable for by reason of any contract entered into or act or deed done by him in his capacity as such director, manager, company secretary or officer or in any way in the discharge of his duties in such capacity including expenses.
- (b) Subject as aforesaid, every director, managing director, manager, company secretary or other officer of the Company shall be indemnified against any liability incurred by him in defending any proceedings, whether civil or criminal in which judgement is given in his favour or in which he is acquitted or discharged or in connection with any application under applicable provisions of the Act in which relief is given to him by the Court.
- (c) The Company may take and maintain any insurance as the Board may think fit on behalf of its present and/or former directors and key managerial personnel for indemnifying all or any of them against any liability for any acts in relation to the Company for which they may be liable but have acted honestly and reasonably.

- (d) No member shall be entitled to visit or inspect any works of the Company without the permission of the Directors or to require discovery of or any information respecting any detail of the Company's trading or any matter which is or may be in the nature of the trade secret, mystery of trade, secret process or any other matter which may relate to the conduct of the business of the Company and which in the opinion of the Directors would be in-expended in the interest of the Company to discover.

Reconstruction

- (c) On any sale of the undertaking of the Company the Directors or the liquidators on a winding up may, if paid up shares, debentures, or securities of any other company whether incorporated in India or not, other than existing or to be formed for the purchase in whole or in part of the property of the Company, and the Directors (if the profits of the Company permit), of the liquidators (in a winding up) may distribute such shares or securities or any other property of the Company amongst the members without realization or vest the same in trustees and any special resolution may provide for the distribution or appropriations of the cash, shares or other securities, benefits or property otherwise than in accordance with the strict legal rights of the members or contributories of the Company and for the valuation of any such securities or property at such price and in such price and in such manner as the meeting may approve and all holders of shares shall be bound to accept and shall be bound by any valuation or distribution so authorised and waive all rights in relation thereto save only in case the Company, is proposed to be or is in the course of being wound up, such statutory right, if any under section 319 of the Act, as are incapable of being varied or excluded by these presents.

General Power

118.

Wherever in the Act, it has been provided that the Company shall have any right, privilege or authority or that the Company could carry out any transaction only if the Company is so authorized by its articles, then and in that case this Article authorizes and empowers the Company to have such rights, privileges or authorities and to carry out such transactions as have been permitted by the Act, without there being any specific Article in that behalf herein provided.
