- 1 A MEMBER ENTITLED TO ATTEND AND VOTE AT THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE COMPANY IS ENTITLED TO APPOINT A PROXY TO ATTEND AND VOTE INSTEAD OF HIMSELF. A PROXY NEED NOT BE A MEMBER OF THE COMPANY. A person can act as proxy on behalf of members not exceeding 50 (fifty) and holding in aggregate not more than 10% (ten percent.) of the total share capital of the Company. However, a member holding more than 10% (ten percent.) of the total share capital of the Company may appoint a single person as proxy and such person shall not act as proxy for any other member.
- 2 A proxy form is sent herewith. In case a member wants to appoint a proxy, duly completed and stamped proxy form, must reach the Registered Office of the Company not later than 48 hours before the time for holding the aforesaid meeting.
- 3 Corporate members intending to send their authorised representatives to attend the meeting are requested to send a certified copy of the Board resolution to the Company, authorising their representative to attend and vote on their behalf at the meeting.
- 4 Members/ proxies / authorised representatives are requested to bring the Attendance Slip sent herewith, duly filled in, for attending the meeting.
- 5 In case of joint holders attending the Meeting, only such joint holder who is higher in the order of names will be entitled to vote.
6. In terms of Section 152 of the Companies Act, 2013, **Smt. Kavita N. Mandan** (holding DIN: 07419972) **retires by rotation** at this AGM and being eligible, is proposed for re-appointment. Smt. Kavita N. Mandan has expressed her intention to act as a Director, if reappointed. The Board of Directors of the Company recommend her re-appointment. Details of Directors proposed to be re-appointed as required in terms of SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 ("SEBI Listing Regulations, 2015") entered with the Stock Exchanges and Secretarial Standards on General Meeting issued by The Institute of Company Secretaries of India, are provided in the Report on Corporate Governance forming part of the Annual Report.

- 8 The Statements pursuant to Section 102 of the Companies Act, 2013 and/ or Regulation 36 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosures Requirements) Regulations, 2015 is annexed hereto and forms part of this Notice.
- 9 The Companies Act, 2013 provides nomination facility to the members. As a member of the Company, you have an option to nominate any person as your nominee to whom your shares shall vest in the unfortunate event of your death. It is advisable to avail of this facility especially by the members who currently hold shares in their single name. Nomination can avoid the process of acquiring right in shares through transmission by law. In case of nomination for the shares held by the joint holders, such nomination will be effective only on death of all the holders. - 16 Members who hold shares in physical form in multiple folios in identical names or joint holding in the same order of names are requested to send the share certificates to MCS Share Transfer Agent Limited for consolidation into a single folio.
- 17 Voting rights shall be reckoned on the paid-up value of shares registered in the name of the member / beneficial owner (in case of electronic shareholding) as on the cut-off date i.e. 14th July 2017.

- 21 The Scrutinizer shall within a period not exceeding three (3) working days from the conclusion of the AGM make a Consolidated Scrutinizer’s Report of the votes cast in favour or against, if any, and submit the same to the Chairman of the meeting or a person so authorised by him in writing, who shall countersign the same.

YEAR UNDER REVIEW

It may be observed from the Statement of Profit and Loss that total Income during the year is Rs 2.39 lacs which mainly includes Interest on bank deposits of Rs 1.18 lacs, as against Rs 3.17 lacs by way of interest on bank deposit income, profit on sale of current investment of Rs 1.18 lacs as against Rs 0.17 lacs and profit on sale of part office at Baroda for the previous year.

GLFL has no source of income other than interest on Bank deposits, while it has to meet the administrative expenses to run the company. Major expenses include Securities Listing Fees to stock exchanges and custodian fees to CDSL & NSDL, remuneration to Key Managerial Personnel appointed in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013, Printing & Postage of Annual Reports and professional and Legal expenses.

After meeting the expenses, the Company incurred loss of Rs 26.37 lacs against the loss of Rs 15.15 lacs in the previous year.

Your company is not accepting the Public deposit since 1999-2000. During the year 2010-11, Reserve Bank of India (RBI) changed Certificate of Registration from Category 'A' as Deposit Accepting Company to Category 'B' as Non Deposit Accepting Company.

Board of Directors at its meeting held on 23rd June, 2016 had decided to surrender voluntarily a Certificate of Registration (CoR) under category "B" as Non-Banking Finance Company (NBFC) issued by Reserve Bank of India as the Company, at present, was not in a position to comply the requirements of NBFCs Regulations.

We have received a letter bearing no. DNBS(AH)No.1315/01.10.234/2016-17 dated 22nd March, 2017 from RBI advising that in exercise of its powers conferred under sub-section (6) of Section 45-IA of the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934, the Certificate of Registration No. B.01.00503 dated December 23, 2011 issued to GLFL, has been cancelled. In terms of this order the company now onwards, is not eligible to transact the business as Non-Banking Financial Institution as defined in clause (a) of Section 45-IA of the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934. RBI has further advised that company would invite penal provisions contained in Chapter V of the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934, in case the company undertakes any NBFC activity after cancellation of Certificate of Registration.

RBI has issued public notice on 26th March, 2017 in the Newspaper advising that the Certificate of Registration under category "B" as NBFC has been Cancelled with effect from 8th March, 2017.

During the year 2004-05, the Hon'ble High Court of Gujarat had sanctioned the scheme of Compromise and Arrangement under section 391 of the Companies Act to discharge the liability of the Banks. Your company had released payment as per the court order. Approval in respect of deed of assignment of receivables is still awaited from the banks.

As per the Court's order, the income received pertaining to assigned assets after July, 2004 is transferred to the consortium of Banks. Subsequent to the court's order, GLFL has recovered Rs.475 lacs till date from the charged assets and deposited with the member banks.

It is worthwhile to note that the company has **no external debt at the end of the year.**

2. FINANCE

PARTICULARS OF CONTRACTS OR ARRANGEMENTS WITH RELATED PARTIES

FIXED DEPOSITS

The company has discontinued accepting fixed deposits since September, 2000. There was no outstanding liability of fixed deposit as on 31st March, 2017.

3. TRANSFER TO THE INVESTOR EDUCATION AND PROTECTION FUND

The company does not have any liability towards unclaimed Fixed Deposits, Debentures and other liabilities. The liability have been discharged / transferred on completion of prescribed period to the Investor Education and Protection Fund.

4. SUBSIDIARIES

The Company has three subsidiary companies viz. GLFL Housing Finance Limited, GLFL Securities Limited and GLFL International Limited.

GLFL Housing Finance Limited

After disinvestments of the major Housing Loan Portfolio, along with liabilities, in favour of LIC Housing Finance Ltd., recovery from balance accounts has been the main thrust area. During the year there was recovery of Rs 1.25 lacs. The company has incurred the loss of Rs 2.51 lacs against the loss of Rs 4.81 lacs, during the previous year.

GLFL Securities Limited

The company has earned marginal profit of Rs 0.17 lacs due to dividend income on investment.

GLFL International Limited

The Company has yet not commenced business.

Chartered Accountant, Ahmedabad (FRN:101895W) to be appointed as the Statutory Auditors of the company in place of the retiring Auditors M/s. C.C. Chokshi & Co., Chartered Accountants, Ahmedabad for the period of Five years from the F.Y. 2017-18 upto F.Y. 2021-22. M/s. G.K. Choksi & Co. Chartered Accountant are willing to act as the Statutory Auditors of the company for the period of five years with effect from the financial year 2017-18 to 2021-22, subject to the recommendation by the Audit Committee and the Board and the approval of the members at the ensuing Annual General Meeting of the Company including the remuneration and out of pocket expenses to be incurred by the Statutory Auditors shall be determined by the Director-in-Charge of the company after consultation with the Statutory Auditors. The new government at the center has infused optimism in the sentiments in general. The Reserve Bank of India has managed to bring down the CPI inflation to 2.36% from the 6.37% of inflation which persisted over the previous two years. Report on the Standalone Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying standalone financial statements of GUJARAT LEASE FINANCING LIMITED ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st March, 2017, the Statement of Profit and Loss and the Cash Flow Statement for the year then ended, and a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's Responsibility for the Standalone Financial Statements

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the matters stated in Section 134(5) of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") with respect to the preparation of these standalone financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance and cash flows of the Company in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the Accounting Standards prescribed under section 133 of the Act.

This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the standalone financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Attention is invited to the Note 2.21(c) regarding non-recognition of income of Rs. 1060.94 lacs (Previous year ended 31st March, 2016: Rs.1,060.94 lacs) being interest on income-tax refunds received in earlier years by the Company and consequential short provision of tax of Rs. 277.21 lacs (Previous year ended 31st March, 2016: Rs. 277.21 lacs) for the reasons stated in the said note.

Had the aforesaid amount of interest on income-tax refunds been accounted for in the books of account, the accumulated losses as at 31st March, 2017 would have been Rs. 16,793.92 lacs (Previous year ended 31st March, 2016: Rs. 16,767.55 lacs) as against reported figure of Rs. 17,577.65 lacs (Previous year ended 31st March, 2016: Rs. 17,551.28 lacs), provision for taxation (net of advance tax) would have been converted to advance tax net of provision Rs. 1.47 lacs (Previous year ended 31st March, 2016: Rs. 1.67 lacs) as against reported figure of Rs. 782.26 lacs (Previous year ended 31st March, 2016: Rs. 782.06 lacs)

This matter was also qualified in our report on the standalone financial statements for the year ended 31st March 2016.

Qualified Opinion

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, except for the effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph above, the aforesaid standalone financial statements give the information required by the Act in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at 31st March, 2017, and its loss and its cash flows for the year ended on that date.

Emphasis of Matters

We draw attention to Note 1 to the standalone financial statements, which indicates that the Company incurred a net loss of Rs. 26.37 lacs for the year ended 31st March, 2017, and as at that date the accumulated losses exceeded its net worth and the Company's current liabilities exceeded its current assets. These conditions, along with other matters set forth in Note 1

indicate the existence of a material uncertainty that may cast significant doubt about the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, . However, the financial statements of the Company have been prepared on a going concern basis for the reasons stated in the said Note.

Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

1. As required by Section 143 (3) of the Act, based on our audit we report, to the extent applicable that:
 - a) We have sought and obtained all the information and explanations which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purposes of our audit.
 - b) Except for the effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion Paragraph above, in our opinion, proper books of account as required by law have been kept by the Company so far as it appears from our examination of those books.
 - c) The Balance Sheet, the Statement of Profit and Loss, and the Cash Flow Statement dealt with by this Report are in agreement with the books of account.
 - d) Except for the effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion Paragraph above, in our opinion, the aforesaid standalone financial statements comply with the Accounting Standards prescribed under section 133 of the Act.
 - e) The matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion Paragraph above and the going concern matter described in the Emphasis of Matters paragraph above, in our opinion, may have an adverse effect on the functioning of the Company.
 - f) On the basis of the written representations received from the directors as on 31st March, 2017 taken on record by the Board of Directors, none of the directors is disqualified as on 31st March, 2017 from being appointed as a director in terms of Section 164 (2) of the Act.
 - g) The qualification relating to the maintenance of accounts and other matters connected therewith are as stated in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph above.
 - h) With respect to the adequacy of the internal financial controls over financial reporting of the Company and the operating effectiveness of such controls, refer to our separate Report in "Annexure A". Our report expresses a qualified opinion on the adequacy and operating effectiveness of the Company's internal financial controls over financial reporting.
 - i) With respect to the other matters to be included in the Auditor's Report in accordance with Rule 11 of the Companies (Audit and Auditors) Rules, 2014, as amended, in our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us:

NOTES FORMING PART OF STANDALONE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1) Corporate Information

The Company is a registered Non-Banking Finance Company ("NBFC"). However, the Company has ceased to carry on business as NBFC since 1999-2000. During the year, the Company has earned income from fixed deposits and sale of mutual fund units.

The Board of Directors at its meeting held on 23rd June, 2016 had decided to surrender voluntarily a Certificate of Registration (CoR) under category "B" as Non-Banking Finance Company (NBFC) issued by Reserve Bank of India as the Company at present, was not in a position to comply the requirements of NBFCs Regulations.

Based on the Company's request RBI has issued order cancelling Certificate of Registration (CoR) under category "B" with effect from 8th March, 2017 vide its letter no. DNBS (AHO) No. 1315/01.10.234/2016-17 dated 22nd March, 2017. The standalone financial statements for the year ended 31st March, 2017 have been prepared as Non-Banking Finance Company since the company continued to hold the CoR for most part of the year.

During the year the Company continued to not have any significant business operations. The Company has also surrendered its license as stated above. It has incurred losses amounting to Rs. 26.37 lacs (2015-16: Rs.15.15 lacs) and as at March 31, 2017, its accumulated losses exceed its paid-up capital and reserves by Rs. 2,986.11 Lacs (March 31, 2016: Rs. 2,959.74 Lacs). These conditions may cast a doubt on the Company's ability to continue as a going concern.

However, the Company is exploring avenues for restructuring of its capital and operations. In terms of the scheme of Compromise and arrangement (refer note 2.20) sanctioned by High Court of Gujarat in 2004 borrowings from a promoter group company of Rs. 1,500 Lacs (March 31, 2016: Rs. 1,500 Lacs), would not be repaid before repayment of all other liabilities. Further, the said promoter group company continues to provide support to the Company. The assets of the Company continue to be stated at least at their realisable values and the Company would continue its current activities at least till such time it realises its dues and settles its obligations.

In view of the above, the financial statements have been prepared on going concern basis and do not include any adjustments relating to recorded amounts and the classification of assets and liabilities that might be necessary should the Company be unable to continue as a going concern.

2) Significant Accounting Policies

a) Basis of preparation

The standalone financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in India (Indian GAAP) to comply with the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act"). The standalone financial statements have been prepared on accrual basis under the historical cost convention. The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the standalone financial statements are consistent with those followed in the previous year.

b) Use of estimates

The preparation of the standalone financial statements in conformity with Indian GAAP requires the Management to make estimates and assumptions considered in the reported amounts of assets and liabilities (including contingent liabilities) and the reported income and expenses during the year. The Management believes that the estimates used in preparation of the standalone financial statements are prudent and reasonable. Future results could differ due to these estimates and the differences between the actual results and the estimates are recognised in the periods in which the results are known / materialise.

c) Fixed Assets

Tangible assets (Property plant & equipment) are carried at cost less accumulated depreciation / amortization and impairment losses, if any. The cost of assets comprises its purchase price net of any trade discounts and rebates, any import duties and other taxes (other than those subsequently recoverable from the tax authorities), any directly attributable expenditure on making the asset ready for its intended use and other incidental expenses. Subsequent expenditure on the assets after its purchase is capitalized only if it is probable that the future economic benefits will flow to the enterprise and the cost of the item can be measured reliably.

Intangible assets are stated at cost less accumulated amortization and impairment.

d) Depreciation and amortization

Depreciable amount for assets is the cost of an asset, or other amount substituted for cost, less its estimated residual value.

Depreciation on tangible assets (property, plant & equipment) has been provided on the straight-line method as per the useful life prescribed in Schedule II to the Act. In respect of property, plant & equipment purchased or put to use during the year, depreciation is provided on pro-rata basis from the date on which such asset purchased is put to use.

Intangible assets i.e. computer software are stated at cost and are amortized equally over a period of three years from the date on which such asset is purchased or put to use.

NOTES FORMING PART OF STANDALONE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

e) **Investments**

Long-term investments are carried individually at cost less provision for diminution, other than temporary, in the value of such investments.

Current investments are carried individually, at the lower of cost and fair value. Cost of investments include acquisition charges such as brokerage, fees and duties.

f) **Other income**

Interest income is accounted on an accrual basis. Dividend income is accounted for when the right to receive it is established.

g) **Employee benefits**

Employee benefits include provident fund, gratuity fund and compensated absences.

Defined contribution plans

The Company's contribution to provident fund are considered as defined contribution plans and are charged as an expense based on the amount of contribution required to be made and when services are rendered by the employees.

Defined benefit plans

The company has taken policy with the Life Insurance Corporation of India which covers the liability of gratuity to employees accruing under the Payment of Gratuity Act 1972. However, currently none of the Company's employees are eligible for gratuity.

Short-term employee benefits

The undiscounted amount of short-term employee benefits expected to be paid in exchange for the services rendered by employees are recognized during the year when the employees render the service. These benefits include compensated absences which are expected to occur within twelve months after the end of the period in which the employee renders the related service.

The cost of short-term compensated absences is accounted as under:

- (a) in case of accumulated compensated absences, when employees render the services that increase their entitlement of future compensated absences; and
- (b) in case of non-accumulating compensated absences, when the absences occur.

h) **Borrowing Costs**

Borrowing costs include interest and amortization of other ancillary costs incurred in connection with borrowings. Costs incurred in connection with borrowing of funds to the extent not directly related to acquisition of qualifying asset are charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss over the tenure of the loan.

i) **Earnings per share**

Basic earnings per share is computed by dividing the profit / (loss) after tax (including the post-tax effect of extraordinary items, if any) by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year. Diluted earnings per share is computed by dividing the profit / (loss) after tax (including the post-tax effect of extraordinary items, if any) as adjusted for dividend, interest and other charges to expense or income (net of any attributable taxes) relating to the dilutive potential equity shares, by the weighted average number of equity shares considered for deriving basic earnings per share and the weighted average number of equity shares which could have been issued on the conversion of all dilutive potential equity shares.

j) **Taxes on income**

Current tax is the amount of tax payable on the taxable income for the period as determined in accordance with the applicable tax rates and the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961.

Deferred tax is recognized on timing differences, being the differences between the taxable income and the accounting income that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods. Deferred tax is measured using the tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantively enacted as at the reporting date. Deferred tax liabilities are recognized for all timing differences. Deferred tax assets are recognized for timing differences of items other than unabsorbed depreciation and carry forward losses only to the extent that reasonable certainty exists that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which these can be realized. However, if there are unabsorbed depreciation and carry forward of losses and item relating to capital losses, deferred tax assets are recognized only if there is virtual certainty supported by convincing evidence that there will be sufficient future taxable income available to realize the assets. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset if such items relate to taxes on income levied by the same governing tax laws and the Company has a legally enforceable right for such set off. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at each balance sheet date for their realisability.

Current and deferred tax relating to items directly recognized in reserves are recognized in reserves and not in the standalone statement of profit and loss.

k) **Impairment of assets**

The carrying values of assets / cash generating units at each balance sheet date are reviewed for impairment. If any indication of impairment exists, the recoverable amount of such assets is estimated and if the carrying amount of the assets exceed the estimated recoverable amount, an impairment is recognized for such excess amount. The recoverable amount is the greater of the net selling price and their value in use. Value in use is arrived at by discounting the future cash flows to their present value based on an appropriate discount factor. When there is indication that an impairment loss recognized for an asset in earlier accounting periods no longer exists or may have decreased, such reversal of impairment loss is recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss, to the extent the amount was previously charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss.

l) **Provisions and contingencies**

A provision is recognized when the Company has a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions (excluding retirement benefits) are not discounted to their present value and are determined based on the best estimate required to settle the obligation at the balance sheet date. These are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates. Contingent liabilities are disclosed in the Notes. Contingent assets are not recognized in the standalone financial statements.

m) **Operating cycle**

Based on the activities of the Company and the normal time between acquisition of assets and their realisation in cash or cash equivalents, the Company has determined its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of classification of its assets and liabilities as current and non-current.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF GUJARAT LEASE FINANCING LIMITED

Report on the Consolidated Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying consolidated financial statements of GUJARAT LEASE FINANCING LIMITED (hereinafter referred to as "the Holding Company") and its subsidiaries (the Holding Company and its subsidiaries together referred to as "the Group") comprising of the Consolidated Balance Sheet as at 31st March, 2017, the Consolidated Statement of Profit and Loss, the Consolidated Cash Flow Statement for the year then ended, and a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as "the consolidated financial statements").

Management's Responsibility for the Consolidated Financial Statements

The Holding Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the preparation of these consolidated financial statements in terms of the requirements of the Companies Act, 2013 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") that give a true and fair view of the consolidated financial position, consolidated financial performance and consolidated cash flows of the Group in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the Accounting Standards prescribed under Section 133 of the Act. The respective Board of Directors of the companies included in the Group are responsible for maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding the assets of the Group and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; the selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and the design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, which have been used for the purpose of preparation of the consolidated financial statements by the Directors of the Holding Company, as aforesaid.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these consolidated financial statements based on our audit. In conducting our audit, we have taken into account the provisions of the Act, the accounting and auditing standards and matters which are required to be included in the audit report under the provisions of the Act and the Rules made thereunder.

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing specified under Section 143(10) of the Act. Those Standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the consolidated financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and the disclosures in the consolidated financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the consolidated financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal financial control relevant to the Holding Company's preparation of the consolidated financial statements that give a true and fair view in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of the accounting policies used and the reasonableness of the accounting estimates made by the Holding Company's Board of Directors, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the consolidated financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence obtained by us and the audit evidence obtained by the other auditors in terms of their reports referred to in the Other Matters paragraph below, is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified audit opinion on the consolidated financial statements.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

Attention is invited to the Note 2.22-3(c) regarding non-recognition of income of interest on income-tax refunds received in earlier years amounting to Rs.1,060.94 lacs (Previous year ended 31st March, 2016: Rs. 1,060.94 lacs) and short provision of tax of Rs.277.21 lacs (Previous year ended 31st March, 2016: Rs.277.21 lacs) for the reasons stated in the said note.

Had the aforesaid amount of interest on income-tax refund been accounted for in the books of account, the accumulated losses of the Group as at 31st March, 2017 would have been Rs. 16,798.89 lacs (Previous year ended 31st March, 2016: Rs. 16,769.96 lacs) as against reported figure of Rs. 17,582.62 lacs (Previous year ended 31st March, 2016: Rs. 17,553.69 lacs), the Group provision for taxation net of advance tax would have been converted to

advance tax net of provision Rs.1.47 lacs (Previous year ended 31st March, 2016: Rs. 1.67 lacs) as against reported figure of Rs.782.26 lacs (Previous year ended 31st March, 2016: Rs. 782.06 lacs)

This matter was also qualified in our report on the consolidated financial statements for the year ended 31st March 2016.

Qualified Opinion

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, and based on the consideration of reports of the other auditors on separate financial statements of the subsidiaries referred to in the Other Matters paragraph below, except for the effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph above, the aforesaid consolidated financial statements give the information required by the Act in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the consolidated state of affairs of the Group as at 31st March, 2017, and their consolidated loss and their consolidated cash flows for the year ended on that date.

Emphasis of Matters

We draw attention to Note 1 to the consolidated financial statements which indicates that the Group incurred a net loss of Rs. 28.93 lacs for the year ended 31st March, 2017, and as at that date the accumulated losses exceeded its networth and the Company's current liabilities exceeded its current assets. These conditions, along with other matters set forth in Note 1 indicate the existence of a material uncertainty that may cast significant doubt about the Group's ability to continue as a going concern. However, the financial statements of the Group have been prepared on a going concern basis for the reasons stated in the said Note.

Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

Other Matters

We did not audit the financial statements of three subsidiaries whose financial statements reflect total assets of Rs. 1873.70 lacs as at 31st March, 2017, total revenues of Rs. 7.63 lacs and net cash inflows amounting to Rs. 0.25 lacs for the year ended on that date, as considered in the consolidated financial statements. These financial statements have been audited by other auditors whose reports have been furnished to us by the Management and our opinion on the consolidated financial statements, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of these subsidiaries and our report in terms of subsection (3) of Section 143 of the Act, in so far as it relates to the aforesaid subsidiaries, is based solely on the reports of the other auditors.

Our opinion on the consolidated financial statements, and our report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements below is not modified in respect of the above matters with respect to our reliance on the work done and the reports of the other auditors and the financial statements certified by the Management.

Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

1. As required by Section 143(3) of the Act, based on our audit and on the consideration of the report of the branch auditors and other auditors on separate financial statements of subsidiaries referred in the Other Matters paragraph above, we report, to the extent applicable, that:
 - (a) We have sought and obtained all the information and explanations which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purposes of our audit of the aforesaid consolidated financial statements.
 - (b) In our opinion, except for the effect of the matters described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph above, proper books of account as required by law relating to preparation of the aforesaid consolidated financial statements have been kept so far as it appears from our examination of those books and the reports of the other auditors.
 - (c) The Consolidated Balance Sheet, the Consolidated Statement of Profit and Loss, and the Consolidated Cash Flow Statement dealt with by this Report are in agreement with the relevant books of account maintained for the purpose of preparation of the consolidated financial statements.
 - (d) In our opinion, except for the effect of the matters described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph above, the aforesaid consolidated financial statements comply with the Accounting Standards prescribed under Section 133 of the Act.
 - (e) The matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph above and the going concern matter described in the Emphasis of matter paragraph above, in our opinion, may have an adverse effect on the functioning of the Group.

- (f) On the basis of the written representations received from the directors of the Holding Company as on 31st March, 2017 taken on record by the Board of Directors of the Holding Company and the reports of the statutory auditors of its subsidiary companies, none of the directors of the Group's companies is disqualified as on 31st March, 2017 from being appointed as a director in terms of Section 164 (2) of the Act.
- (g) The qualification relating to maintenance of accounts and other matters connected therewith are as stated in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph above.
- (h) With respect to the adequacy of the internal financial controls over financial reporting and the operating effectiveness of such controls, refer to our Report in "Annexure A", which is based on the auditors' reports of the Holding company and the subsidiary companies. Our report expresses qualified opinion on the adequacy and operating effectiveness of the Holding company's internal financial controls over financial reporting.
- (i) With respect to the other matters to be included in the Auditor's Report in accordance with Rule 11 of the Companies (Audit and Auditor's) Rules, 2014, as amended, in our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us:
- i. The consolidated financial statements disclose the impact of pending litigations on the consolidated financial position of the Group;
 - ii. The Group did not have any long-term contracts including derivative contracts for which there were any material foreseeable losses;
 - iii. There were no amounts which were required to be transferred to the Investor Education and Protection Fund by the Holding Company and its subsidiary companies.

A company's internal financial control over financial reporting includes those policies and procedures that (1) pertain to the maintenance of records that, in reasonable detail, accurately and fairly reflect the transactions and dispositions of the assets of the company; (2) provide reasonable assurance that transactions are recorded as necessary to permit preparation of financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, and that receipts and expenditures of the company are being made only in accordance with authorisations of management and directors of the company; and (3) provide reasonable assurance regarding prevention or timely detection of unauthorised acquisition, use, or disposition of the company's assets that could have a material effect on the financial statements.

Inherent Limitations of Internal Financial Controls Over Financial Reporting

Because of the inherent limitations of internal financial controls over financial reporting, including the possibility of collusion or improper management override of controls, material misstatements due to error or fraud may occur and not be detected. Also, projections of any evaluation of the internal financial controls over financial reporting to future periods are subject to the risk that the internal financial control over financial reporting may become inadequate because of changes in conditions, or that the degree of compliance with the policies or procedures may deteriorate.

Basis for Qualified opinion

With respect to the Holding Company, according to the information and explanations given to us and based on our audit, a material weakness has been identified in the Company's internal financial controls over financial reporting as at 31st March, 2017 with respect to the recognition of interest income on income tax refunds.

A 'material weakness' is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal financial control over financial reporting, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the company's annual or interim financial statements will not be prevented or detected on a timely basis.

Qualified Opinion

In our opinion, to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us and based on the consideration of the reports of the other auditors referred to in the Other Matters paragraph below, the Holding Company and its subsidiary companies have, in all material respects, maintained adequate internal financial controls over financial reporting as of 31st March, 2017, based on the internal control over financial reporting criteria established by the respective companies considering the essential components of internal control stated in the Guidance Note on Audit of Internal Financial Controls Over Financial Reporting issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, and except for the effects of the material weakness described in Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph above on the achievement of the objectives of the control criteria, the Holding Company's and its subsidiary companies internal financial controls over financial reporting were operating effectively as of 31st March, 2017.

We have considered the material weakness identified and reported above in determining the nature, timing, and extent of audit tests applied in our audit of the consolidated financial statements of the Company for the year ended 31st March, 2017, and the material weakness has affected our opinion on the said consolidated financial statements of the Company and we have issued qualified opinion on the consolidated financial statements of the Company.

Other Matters

Our aforesaid report under Section 143(3)(i) of the Act on the adequacy and operating effectiveness of the internal financial controls over financial reporting insofar as it relates to three subsidiary companies, is based solely on the corresponding reports of the auditors of such companies incorporated in India.

Our opinion is not modified in respect of the above matters.

NOTES FORMING PART OF THE CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1) Corporate Information

Gujarat Lease Financing Limited ("the Company") together with its subsidiaries GLFL Housing Finance Limited, GLFL Securities Limited, GLFL International Limited is herein after referred to as ("the Group") were engaged in the various spheres of financial services. However, the Group has ceased to carry out business since 1999-2000.

The Board of Directors at its meeting held on 23rd June, 2016 had decided to surrender voluntarily a Certificate of Registration (CoR) under category "B" as Non-Banking Finance Company (NBFC) issued by Reserve Bank of India as the Company, at present, was not in a position to comply the requirements of NBFCs Regulations.

Based on the Company's request RBI has issued order cancelling Certificate of Registration (CoR) under category "B" with effect from 8th March, 2017 vide its letter no. DNBS (AH0) No. 1315/01.10.234/2016-17 dated 22nd March, 2017. The financial statements for the year ended 31st March, 2017 have been prepared as Non-Banking Finance Company since the company continued to hold the CoR for most part of the year.

During the year the Group continued to not have any significant business operations. The Company has also surrendered its Certificate of Registration as a Non-Banking Finance Company as stated above. The Group has incurred losses amounting to Rs. 28.93 lacs (2015-16: Rs.19.72 lacs) and as at March 31, 2017, its accumulated losses exceed its paid-up capital and reserves by Rs. 2,234.99 Lacs (March 31, 2016: Rs. 2,206.06 Lacs). These conditions may cast a doubt on the Group's ability to continue as a going concern.

However, the Group is exploring avenues for restructuring of its capital and operations. In terms of the scheme of Compromise and arrangement (refere note 2.22-2) sanctioned by High Court of Gujarat in 2004 borrowings from a promoter group company of Rs. 1,500 Lacs (March 31, 2016: Rs. 1,500 Lacs), would not be repaid before repayment of all other liabilities. Further, the said promoter group company continues to provide support to the Group. The assets of the Group continue to be stated at-least at their realisable values and the Group would continue its current activities atleast till such time it realises its dues and settles its obligations.

In view of the above, the consolidated financial statements have been prepared on going concern basis and do not include any adjustments relating to recorded amounts and the classification of assets and liabilities that might be necessary should the Group be unable to continue as a going concern.

2) BASIS OF CONSOLIDATION AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Basis of preparation

The consolidated financial statements of the Group have been prepared in accordance with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in India (Indian GAAP) to comply with the Accounting Standards notified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act"). The consolidated financial statements have been prepared on accrual basis under the historical cost convention. The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the consolidated financial statements are consistent with those followed in the previous year.

b) Principles of Consolidation

The consolidated financial statements relate to Gujarat Lease Financing Limited (the 'Company') and its subsidiary companies. The consolidated financial statements have been prepared on the following basis:

- i) The financial statements of the subsidiary companies used in the consolidation are drawn up to the same reporting date as that of the Company i.e., 31 March, 2017.
- ii) The financial statements of the Company and its subsidiary companies have been combined on a line-by-line basis by adding together like items of assets, liabilities, income and expenses, after eliminating intra-group balances and intra-group transactions in accordance with Accounting Standard (AS) 21, "Consolidated Financial Statements".
- iii) Following subsidiary companies have been considered in the preparation of the consolidated financial statements:

iv) The consolidated financial statements have been prepared using uniform accounting policies for like transactions and other events in similar circumstances and are presented to the extent possible, in the same manner as the Company's separate financial statements.

c) **Use of estimates**

The preparation of the consolidated financial statements in conformity with Indian GAAP requires the Management to make estimates and assumptions considered in the reported amounts of assets and liabilities (including contingent liabilities) and the reported income and expenses during the year. The Management believes that the estimates used in preparation of the financial statements are prudent and reasonable. Future results could differ due to these estimates and the differences between the actual results and the estimates are recognized in the periods in which the results are known / materialize.

d) **Fixed Assets**

Tangible assets (Property plant & equipment) are carried at cost less accumulated depreciation / amortization and impairment losses, if any. The cost of fixed assets comprises its purchase price net of any trade discounts and rebates, any import duties and other taxes (other than those subsequently recoverable from the tax authorities), any directly attributable expenditure on making the asset ready for its intended use and other incidental expenses. Subsequent expenditure on the assets after its purchase is capitalized only if it is probable that the future economic benefits will flow to the enterprise and the cost of the item can be measured reliably.

Intangible assets are stated at cost less accumulated amortization and impairment.

e) **Depreciation and amortization**

Depreciable amount for assets is the cost of an asset, or other amount substituted for cost, less its estimated residual value.

Depreciation on tangible assets (property plant & equipment) has been provided on the straight-line method as per the useful life prescribed in Schedule II to the Act. In respect of property plant & equipment purchased or put to use during the year, depreciation is provided on pro-rata basis from the date on which such asset purchased is put to use.

Intangible assets i.e. computer software are stated at cost and are amortized equally over a period of three years from the date on which such asset is purchased or put to use.

f) **Revenue Recognition**

Revenue is recognized when no significant uncertainty as to the measurability or collectability exists.

g) **Other income**

Interest income is accounted on an accrual basis. Dividend income is accounted for when the right to receive it is established.

h) **Investments**

Long-term investments are carried individually at cost less provision for diminution, other than temporary, in the value of such investments.

Current investments are carried individually, at the lower of cost and fair value. Cost of investments include acquisition charges such as brokerage, fees and duties.

i) **Inventories (Stock-in-trade)**

Stock-in-trade is valued at the lower of cost and the net realizable value.

j) **Employee benefits**

Employee benefits include provident fund, gratuity fund and compensated absences.

Defined contribution plans

The Group's contribution to provident fund are considered as defined contribution plans and are charged as an expense based on the amount of contribution required to be made and when services are rendered by the employees.

Defined benefit plans

The group has taken policy with the Life Insurance Corporation of India which covers the liability of gratuity to employees accruing under the Payment of Gratuity Act 1972. However, currently none of the Company's employees are eligible for gratuity.

Short-term employee benefits

The undiscounted amount of short-term employee benefits expected to be paid in exchange for the services rendered by employees are recognized during the year when the employees render the service. These benefits include compensated absences which are expected to occur within twelve months after the end of the period in which the employee renders the related service.

The cost of short-term compensated absences is accounted as under:

- (a) in case of accumulated compensated absences, when employees render the services that increase their entitlement of future compensated absences; and
- (b) in case of non-accumulating compensated absences, when the absences occur.

k) **Borrowing Costs**

Borrowing costs include interest and amortization of other ancillary costs incurred in connection with borrowings. Costs incurred in connection with borrowing of funds to the extent not directly related to acquisition of qualifying asset are charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss over the tenure of the loan.

l) **Earnings per share**

Basic earnings per share is computed by dividing the profit / (loss) after tax (including the post-tax effect of extraordinary items, if any) by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year. Diluted earnings per share is computed by dividing the profit / (loss) after tax (including the post-tax effect of extraordinary items, if any) as adjusted for dividend, interest and other charges to expense or income (net of any attributable taxes) relating to the dilutive potential equity shares, by the weighted average number of equity shares considered for deriving basic earnings per share and the weighted average number of equity shares which could have been issued on the conversion of all dilutive potential equity shares.

m) **Taxes on income**

Current tax is the amount of tax payable on the taxable income for each of the entities in the Group as determined in accordance with the applicable tax rates and the provisions of the Income tax Act, 1961.

Deferred tax is recognized on timing differences, being the differences between the taxable income and the accounting income that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods. Deferred tax is measured using the tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantively enacted as at the reporting date. Deferred tax liabilities are recognized for all timing differences. Deferred tax assets are recognized for timing differences of items other than unabsorbed depreciation and carry forward losses only to the extent that reasonable certainty exists that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which these can be realized. However, if there are unabsorbed depreciation and carry forward of losses and item relating to capital losses, deferred tax assets are recognized only if there is virtual certainty supported by convincing evidence that there will be sufficient future taxable income available to realize the assets. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset if such items relate to taxes on income levied by the same governing tax laws and the Company has a legally enforceable right for such set off. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at each balance sheet date for their realisability.

The Group offsets deferred tax assets and deferred tax liabilities, and advance income tax and provision for tax, if it has a legally enforceable right for such set off and these relate to taxes on income levied by the same governing taxation laws.

Current and deferred tax relating to items directly recognized in reserves are recognized in reserves and not in the consolidated statement of profit and loss.

n) **Impairment of assets**

The carrying values of assets / cash generating units at each balance sheet date are reviewed for impairment. If any indication of impairment exists, the recoverable amount of such assets is estimated and if the carrying amount of the assets exceed the estimated recoverable amount, an impairment is recognized for such excess amount. The recoverable amount is the greater of the net selling price and their value in use. Value in use is arrived at by discounting the future cash flows to their present value based on an appropriate discount factor. When there is indication that an impairment loss recognized for an asset in earlier accounting periods no longer exists or may have decreased, such reversal of impairment loss is recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss, to the extent the amount was previously charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss.

o) **Provisions and contingencies**

A provision is recognized when the Group has a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions (excluding retirement benefits) are not discounted to their present value and are determined based on the best estimate required to settle the obligation at the balance sheet date. These are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates. Contingent liabilities are disclosed in the Notes. Contingent assets are not recognized in the financial statements.

p) **Operating cycle**

Based on the activities of the Company and the normal time between acquisition of assets and their realisation in cash or cash equivalents, the Company has determined its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of classification of its assets and liabilities as current and non-current.

1. Contingent Liabilities

- (a) Uncalled/unpaid liability for partly paid-up shares amounts to Rs 66.08 lacs (As at March 31, 2016 Rs. 66.08 lacs).
- (b) Disputed income tax amounting to Rs. 277.21 lacs (As at March 31, 2016 Rs. 277.21 lacs). (Ref. Note No. 3 below)

Future cash outflows in respect of the above matters are determinable only on receipt of judgments / decisions pending at various forums / authorities.

2. Hon'ble High Court of Gujarat had sanctioned the scheme of compromise and arrangement between GLFL and consortium of 16 banks on 27th July, 2004 under section 391 of the Companies Act, 1956 and the Holding Company has made the payment in the accounting year 2004-05 to banks as per High Court order. However, the final Deed of Assignment of the charged assets in favor of banks is yet to be entered into.

3. Income Tax

- (a) In view of unabsorbed losses and in the absence of taxable income under the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961 in the current year, the Group believes that there will be no tax liability including the tax liability u/s 115J(B). Accordingly, no provision for income tax for the year has been made in the accounts.
- (b) The Group has unabsorbed depreciation and carry forward losses under the Income Tax Act, 1961. In the absence of virtual certainty supported by convincing evidence of sufficient future taxable income, net deferred tax assets are not recognized in the accounts.
- (c) The Company has already received refund of tax pertaining to earlier assessment year amounting to Rs.3,102.74 lacs (As at March 31, 2016 Rs. 3,102.74 lacs) which includes interest on refund amounting to Rs.1,060.94 lacs (As at March 31, 2016 Rs. 1,060.94 lacs). In view of opinion received from the Tax Consultants and pendency of appeals, the Company has, as a matter of prudence neither adjusted the short provision of tax of Rs.277.21 lacs (As at March 31, 2016 Rs. 277.21 lacs) nor recognized the interest received on tax refund amounting to Rs.1,060.94 lacs (As at March 31, 2016 Rs. 1,060.94 lacs). Necessary entries for the same shall be made on settlement of pending matters/disputes with the tax/appellate authorities.

4. In respect of Gujarat Lease Financing Limited, as the net-worth of the Company has been fully eroded, the Company had not been able to meet with the requirements that were stipulated under the Non-Systemically Important Non-Banking Financial (Non-Deposit Accepting or Holding) Companies Prudential Norms (Reserve Bank) Directions, 2015 relating to Capital Adequacy and Concentration of Credit/Investment. As per the Revised Regulatory Framework for NBFC issued by RBI in November 2014, the Company being an NBFC - ND (Non-Deposit Accepting) having asset size of less than Rs. 500 crore is exempted from the requirement of maintaining CRAR and complying with Credit Concentration Norms.

The Board of Directors at its meeting held on 23rd June, 2016 had decided to surrender voluntarily a Certificate of Registration (CoR) issued by Reserve Bank of India as the Company at present, was not in a position to comply the requirements of NBFCs Regulations and based on the Company's request RBI has issued order cancelling Certificate of Registration (CoR) with effect from 8th March, 2017. Also refer Note 1 to the consolidated financial statements.

For the current year the relevant disclosures are made as at 31st March, 2017 since the company continued to hold the CoR for most part of the year.

The Company however continues to recover its dues from the remaining loan portfolio in the normal course of business.
