During the period under Report, the Company's sales and other income were Rs.30,994 lacs and cash loss is Rs. 0.32 lacs as compared to last year's figures of Rs. 24,309 lacs and cash profit of Rs. 501 lacs respectively. After depreciation, the loss for the year is Rs. 488.88 lacs as compared to the profit of Rs. 128.45 lacs in the previous year.

MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

Industry Structure and Development

The Indian Dairy Industry is rapidly growing, trying to keep pace with the galloping progress around the world. India is the leading producer of milk in the world. The Dairy Industry is recognized as one of the largest and most important of food industry. A boom is forecast in the market of dairy products because of their uses as raw material in pharmaceutical and allied industries.

Opportunities and Threats

Although milk production has grown at a fast pace during the last three decades, milk yield per animal is very low due to lack of use of scientific practices in milking, inadequate availability of fodder in all seasons and unavailability of veterinary health services. However, increased productivity of animals, better health care and breeding facilities and management of dairy animals can reduce the cost of milk production. The Government and Dairy Industry can play a vital role in this direction.

To make the significant entrance in the global market significant investment has to be made in milk procurement, equipments, chilling and refrigeration facilities.

Internal Control System

Management is taking the effective steps to reduce the cost of production. Establishment of milk collection centers and chilling centers has enhanced the life of raw milk and has enabled the minimization of wastage due to spoiled milk. Company has developed a strong market and



distribution network for selling its products. However, due to the less availability of raw milk as compared to the demand by the Dairy Industry and tough competition in the Industry. Company procures the quality milk at a very high price and it has affected the profitability of the Company adversely.

Segment wise /Product wise Reporting

The Company is operating in the single segment and engaged in the manufacture and sales of dairy products i.e. ghee, skimmed milk powder, whole milk powder, casein, whey powder and dairy whitener. Therefore, segment wise information has not been disclosed.

Financial Performance of the Company has been given separately in the Directors' Report.

Human Resources

The success of any organization depends on the quality, dedication, devotion, determination, discipline and dynamism of its employees. Company firmly believes that motivated employees are its major asset. The Company maintained a cordial relationship with its personnel during the year. The management places its sincere appreciation for the useful contribution made by its employees during the year.

 - (vi) In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanation given to us, the said accounts give the information required by the Companies Act, 1956 in the manner so required and read with Note 7 regarding accounting of income, 11(a) & (b) regarding assets at Gurgaon, Note No.12 regarding investment, Note 14 regarding impairment of Assets subject to note No.8 of Schedule 18B regarding non provision of gratuity amounting to Rs.184.72 lacs of which Rs.NIL relate to current year and Note No.12 regarding Managerial Remuneration of Schedule 18A.
 - (a) in the case of the Balance sheet, of the state of affairs of the company as at 31st March 2010;
 - (b) in the case of the Profit and loss account, of the loss for the year ended on that date; and
 - (c) in the case of the Cash flow statement, of the cash flows for the year ended on that date.
 - give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India;
 - (d) We further report that had the remarks given by us in para (vi) above regarding non provision of gratuity has been considered, the reserve surplus would have been Rs. 2964.29 lacs (against the reported figure of Rs. 3149.01 lacs) Net Current Assets would have been Rs. 2121.59 lacs (as against reported figure of Rs. 2306.31 lacs).

Annexure to the Auditors' Report

Referred to in paragraph 3 of our report of even date to the members of Milkfood Limited on the accounts as at and for the year ended March 31, 2010.

- 1. (a) The Company has maintained list of fixed assets acquired by it. However the same is required to be updated substantially with regard to quantitative detail/location, identification etc.
 - (b) The fixed assets are physically verified by the management according to a phased programme designed to cover all the items over a period of two years, which in our opinion, is reasonable having regard to the size of the company and the nature of its assets. During the year no physical verification of the fixed assets is done.
 - (c) In our opinion and according to the information and explanations given to us, substantial part of fixed assets has not been disposed of by the company during the year.
- (a) The inventory has been physically verified during the year by the management. In our opinion, the frequency of verification is reasonable.
 - (b) The procedures of physical verification of inventories followed by the management are reasonable and adequate in relation to the size of the company and the nature of its business.
 - (c) on the basis of our examination of the records of inventory, we are of the opinion that the company is maintaining proper records of inventory. The discrepancies noticed on verification between the physical stocks and the book records were not material.
- 3. (a) The company has not granted loans to companies covered in the register maintained under section 301 of the Companies Act, 1956. However, company has incurred expenses on behalf of the subsidiary company. Company has granted loans to its wholly owned subsidiary for setting up IT Park and amount outstanding at the year end is Rs.342.12 lacs.
 - The Company has taken in previous year loans from companies/parties, covered in the register maintained under section 301 of the Companies Act, 1956. The amount outstanding at the year end is Rs. 600 lacs.
 - (b) In our opinion the terms and conditions of such loans are not prima facie prejudicial to the interest of the company. The other terms of repayment in respect of the loans taken/ given are not stipulated.
- 4. In our opinion and according to the information and explanations given to us, there are adequate internal control procedures commensurate with the size of the company and the nature of its business with regard to purchase of inventory, fixed assets and sale of goods. Further, on the basis of our examination of the books and records of the company and according to the information and explanations given to us, we have neither come across, nor have been informed of any continuing failure to correct major weaknesses in the aforesaid internal control procedures and adjustments thereof except that internal control procedures in the case of advances to staff need to be strengthened.
- 5. In our opinion and according to explanations given to us and as certified the transactions that need to be entered into the register maintained under section 301 have been so entered.
- 6. In our opinion and according to the information and explanations given to us and the transactions of purchases/ sales made in pursuance of contracts or arrangements entered in the registers maintained under section 301 and exceeding the value of five lakh rupees in respect of any party during the year have been made at prices which are reasonable having regard to prevailing market prices at the relevant time. With regard to financial arrangements processing charges/ other contingencies we are informed that these all represent specific and specialized services for which market prices are not available. However considering the cost and benefits available & other factors payments made/ received are reasonable.
- 7. In our opinion and according to the information and explanations given to us and read with note no.5 of schedule 18B the company has complied with the directives issued by the RBI and provisions of sections 58A and 58AA of the Companies Act, 1956 and the rules framed thereunder with regard to the deposits accepted from the public. According to information and explanations given to us no order has been passed by the National Company Law Tribunal or Company Law Board or RBI or any Court or any other Tribunal relevant to sections 58A, 58AA or the other relevant provisions of the Act.
- 8. It has been informed to us that Company has inbuilt mechanism of internal checks and all the Plants have been visited by Internal Chartered Accountant to verify the operational systems and for safety of its Assets and other matters required by the Management. In our opinion the Internal Audit needs to be formalized and further strengthened in terms of scope, coverage and reporting.



- In terms of Notification No.GSR 661(E) dated 8th October 2004 regarding Cost Accounting Records (Milk Food) (Amendment) Rules, 2004 – requirement of maintaining records as prescribed under section 209 (1) (d) of the Companies Act, 1956 has been dispensed with.
- 10. 18. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND NOTES TO ACCOUNTS

A) SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. Basis of Preparation of Accounts

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with historical cost convention, applicable accounting standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India and relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 1956 following accrual method of accounting except for gratuity and leave encashment which are being accounted for on payment basis.

2. Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost. All direct expenses incurred for bringing the assets to their present location are debited to the respective assets. In regard to new projects expenditure incurred till the date of commencement of commercial productions are charged to the respective assets i.e. Building, Plant & Machinery proportionately. Replacement of various parts of fixed assets are also capitalized considering the benefit of enduring nature.

3. Depreciation on Fixed Assets

Depreciation on fixed assets is provided on the straight-line method at the rates and manner as specified in schedule XIV of the Companies Act, 1956. Depreciation in respect of stores capitalized in plant and machinery is charged on the basis of estimated useful life of the respective assets following written down method. In respect of Assets held for disposal for discontinued operations, depreciation is provided if the net realizable value is less than the carrying amount.

4. Investments

Long Term Investments are stated at cost, less provision if any for diminution in the value of such investments, other than temporary.

5. Inventories

Inventories are valued at lower of cost or net realisable value except in case of Casein which is valued at net realizable value determined on the basis of prevalent international market prices. Cost is determined on a weighted average basis. In case of finished goods, Fixed, Variable and Administrative overheads are loaded on absorption costing basis. Net realizable value is determined by taking average of market prices of goods sold subsequent to the date of balance sheet.

6. Retirement Benefits (Revised)

Company follows AS-15 (revised) as detailed below:-

- (1) Short-term benefits are recognized as expense at the undiscounted amount in the Profit & Loss Account of the year in which the related service is rendered.
- (2) Leave encashments are not carried forward on year to year basis and facility is granted to employees only in the year of determination of service. Therefore no provision of leave encashment is made on year to year basis.
- (3) Company provides bonus to eligible employees as per Bonus Act, 1965 and accordingly liability is provided on actual cost at the end of the year.
- (4) The Company has an obligation towards gratuity a defined benefit retirement plan covering all employees including the Directors in the wholetime employment of company. The plan provides for a lumpsum payment to employees at retirement/ determination of service on the basis of 15 days terminal salary for each completed year of service subject to maximum amount of Rs. 3.50 lakh. Company accounts for gratuity in the books on actual payment basis. Vide Government of India Notification published in the Official Gazette the limit of Rs. 3.50 lakhs has been increased to Rs. 10.00 Lakhs.

(5) Provident Fund:

The eligible employees of the company are entitled to receive benefits under the Provident Fund, a defined contribution plan in which both employees and the company make monthly contributions at a specified percentage of the covered employee's salary. The contributions as specified under the law are paid to the respective Regional Provident Fund Commissioner and the Central Provident Fund under the State Pension Scheme.

7 Revenue Recognition

- (i) Sales are recognized at the point of despatch to customers and are net of sales return. Export sales are recognized on the basis of date of bill of lading.
- (ii) Export entitlements i.e. duty free scrips are accounted for on the basis of export of goods on FOB value determined for custom purpose.
- (iii) In respect of entitlements under clear development mechanism (CDM) of Kyoto Protocol Income is accounted on the basis of estimated valuation made by the Consultant appointed by the Company for the final registration with UNFCCC. The expenditure incurred representing payments made for Registration are charged over a period of 2 years during which benefit is likely to accrue.

8. Deferred Tax

The tax expense consists of current tax and deferred tax. Provision for the current tax is based on tax liability computed in accordance with relevant provisions of the Income Tax Act. Provisions for deferred tax are made for all timing differences arising between taxable incomes and accounting income at Income Tax rates that have been enacted or substantially enacted as of the balance sheet date. Deferred Tax Assets are recognised and carried forward only if there is convincing evidence that they will be realised in future against future taxable income. The carrying amounts of Deferred Tax Asset are reviewed for the appropriateness of their respective carrying values at each balance sheet date (also refer Note 17 of Schedule 18 B).

9. Borrowing Costs

Interest and other cost that are directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of a qualifying asset (including trial

run) and for product development (under AS-26) within the meaning of Accounting Standard-16 are capitalized as part of the cost of that asset till the assets are ready for intended use or for producing on commercial scale/sale. Other borrowing costs are recognized as an expense in the period in which they are incurred.

10. Foreign Currency Transactions

Foreign Currency Transactions involving export sales are recorded in the reporting currency, by applying to the foreign currency amount the exchange rate between the reporting currency and the foreign currency on estimated rate on the date of despatch of goods. The difference between the rates recorded and the rates on the date of actual realization is transferred to difference in exchange fluctuation account. At the year end, the balances are converted at the year end rate and difference if any between the book balance and converted amount are transferred to the exchange fluctuation account.

11. Intangible Assets

In accordance with AS-26 – expenses incurred on development/defining the manufacturing process of any product to meet the required standards is recognized as Intangible Asset and is amortized over a period of 10 years. The amount amortised during the year is Rs. 59.67 lakhs (Previous Year Rs. 4.30 lakhs).

12. Managerial Remuneration:

Company has paid remuneration of Rs. 69.74 lakhs to its Managerial Personnel. Company is of the view and has taken legal opinion that in view of inadequacy of profits u/s 198 read with section 349 of Companies Act, 1956 remuneration paid during the year is within the prescribed limit of Section II of part II of Schedule XIII of Companies Act, 1956 computed on yearly basis of combined entitlements of Managerial Personnel during the year.

The Bank has also extended supply line of credit to the extent of Rs. 8 crores against which company has created a charge on its immovable assets.
 - (ii) Vehicles Loans are secured against hypothecation of vehicles.
 - (iii) Term Loans payable within one year are Rs. 859 lacs (Previous Year 1016.27 lacs).
- 5. Unsecured Loans (Schedule 3) include deposits of Rs. 3.13 lacs (Previous year -
 - Rs. 0.70 lacs) matured but not claimed. Deposits for Rs. 2.23 lac have since been renewed.
- 6. Loans and advances (Schedule 9) includes amount due from Directors of the Company as at 31st March, 2010 Rs. 0.24 lacs (Previous Year Rs. 1.39 lacs). Maximum amount due at any time during the year Rs. 4.07 lacs (Previous year Rs. 3.95 lacs). Current Liabilities (Schedule 10) includes Rs. 0.11 lacs due to directors of the Company (Previous Year Rs. 1.20 lacs). Maximum amount due during the year Rs. 0.11 lacs.
- Loans and Advances/sales include Rs. 3.20 crores towards sale of Carbon credits under clean development mechanism (CDM) of Kyoto Protocol pending final registration with UNFCCC and actual sales in the International market.
- 8. No provision for gratuity liability as on 31st March, 2010 amounting to Rs. 184.72 lacs (Previous year Rs. 213.67 lacs) calculated in accordance with actuarial valuation as per AS-15 (Revised), of which Rs. NIL relates to current year (Previous year Rs. 46.03 lacs) has been made in these accounts. Above calculations are based upon the limit of Gratuity of Rs. 3.5 lakhs instead of revised limit of Rs. 10.00 lakhs per employee under the payment of Gratuity Act, 1972.
- As per information available with the company there is no amount due to any party under Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises
 Development Act, 2007.
- 10. Land purchased at Moradabad includes Land valued at Rs. 85.09 lacs (previous year Rs. 85.09 lacs) for which agreement to purchase has been entered and steps are being taken to register the land in the name of the company.
- 11. Assets at Gurgaon:
 - (a) Plant and Machinery and furniture and fixtures held for disposal have been depreciated at the rates prescribed under Schedule XIV of the Companies Act. The aggregate written down value of such assets is Rs. 26.44 lacs (Previous year Rs. 31.78 lacs).
 - (b) A sum of Rs. 4.00 lacs has been charged to Profit and Loss Account on account of reduction in estimated realizable value in respect of general stores of Rs. 40.79 lacs (previous year Rs. 44.79 lacs).
- 12. The Company had invested Rs. 425 lacs in the preference share capital of M/s Grand Regency Hospitality Pvt Ltd. The investee company has stopped the business as the lease of the premises occupied by it could not be renewed. The investee company is finalizing new lease and other options to carry on the business. Considering the estimated fair value of the brand of the investee company and other net realizable value of the assets, the company is of the view that no provision is required in this year as the dimunition in the value of investment due to suspension of business by the investee company is temporary in nature.



- 13. (i) Stocks on consignment of Rs. 1.08 crores remains unconfirmed at the year end.
 - (ii) Miscellaneous receipts includes Rs. 17.70 lacs representing differential amount on account of revision of rates of sales.
- 14. In conformity with Accounting Standard AS-28 issued by the ICAI, the total carrying amount of assets including intangible assets is Rs. 4027 lacs of Casein Plant. The Company in the year 2008-09 had projected the future cash inflow of 4 years from the said plant and calculated the present value @12% of Rs. 5646 lacs. Company has made sales of Rs. 6.77 crores during the financial year 2009-10 against the projected sales of Rs. 35.17 crores. Company has reprojected the future cash flow of 10 years based upon the current and likely economic scenario and has recalculated the present value @ 12% of Rs. 4844 lacs against the carrying amount of Rs. 4027 lacs. Therefore in the opinion of Management there is no impairement of assets within the meaning of AS-28.
- 15. Current Liabilities includes Rs. 9.00 crores received from a Company as interest free deposit for short term purposes.
- 16. Loans & Advances include Rs. 8.75 lacs recoverable on account of Sales Tax of earlier years which are outstanding from earlier years;

17. Deferred Tax

As per Accounting Standard (AS-22), "Accounting for Taxes on Income" issued by the ICAI, Deferred Tax Asset (Net) for the year has been accounted for at Rs. 121.42 lacs as income (Previous Year Rs. 223.91 Lacs as income) in the Profit & Loss Account.

Deferred Tax Liability (Net) as at 31st March 2010 is net of deferred tax asset in respect of unabsorbed depreciation of Rs. 2620.47 lacs (Previous Year Rs. 1844.01 lacs). Deferred Tax Asset has been recognized in cases where the company has been allowed relief in first appeal in respect of addition/disallowances made in assessment proceedings of Income Tax.

18. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND NOTES TO ACCOUNTS

A) SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. Basis of Preparation of Accounts

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with historical cost convention, applicable accounting standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India and relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 1956 following accrual method of accounting except for gratuity and leave encashment which are being accounted for on payment basis.

2. Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost. All direct expenses incurred for bringing the assets to their present location are debited to the respective assets. In regard to new projects expenditure incurred till the date of commencement of commercial productions are charged to the respective assets i.e. Building, Plant & Machinery proportionately. Replacement of various parts of fixed assets are also capitalized considering the benefit of enduring nature.

3. Depreciation on Fixed Assets

Depreciation on fixed assets is provided on the straight-line method at the rates and manner as specified in schedule XIV of the Companies Act, 1956. Depreciation in respect of stores capitalized in plant and machinery is charged on the basis of estimated useful life of the respective assets following written down method. In respect of Assets held for disposal for discontinued operations, depreciation is provided if the net realizable value is less than the carrying amount.

4. Investments

Long Term Investments are stated at cost, less provision if any for diminution in the value of such investments, other than temporary.

5. Inventories

Inventories are valued at lower of cost or net realisable value except in case of Casein which is valued at net realizable value determined on the basis of prevalent international market prices. Cost is determined on a weighted average basis. In case of finished goods, Fixed, Variable and Administrative overheads are loaded on absorption costing basis. Net realizable value is determined by taking average of market prices of goods sold subsequent to the date of balance sheet.

6. Retirement Benefits (Revised)

Company follows AS-15 (revised) as detailed below:-

- (1) Short-term benefits are recognized as expense at the undiscounted amount in the Profit & Loss Account of the year in which the related service is rendered.
- (2) Leave encashments are not carried forward on year to year basis and facility is granted to employees only in the year of determination of service. Therefore no provision of leave encashment is made on year to year basis.
- (3) Company provides bonus to eligible employees as per Bonus Act 1965 and accordingly liability is provided on actual cost at the end of the year.
- (4) The Company has an obligation towards gratuity a defined benefit retirement plan covering all employees including the Directors in the wholetime employment of company. The-plan provides for a lumpsum payment to employees at retirement/determination of service on the basis of 15 days terminal salary for each completed year of service subject to maximum amount of Rs. 3.50 lakhs. Company accounts for gratuity in the books on actual payment basis. Vide Government of India Notification published in the Official Gazette the limit of Rs. 3.50 lakhs has been increased to Rs. 10.00 Lakhs.

(5) Provident Fund:

The eligible employees of the company are entitled to receive benefits under the Provident Fund, a defined contribution plan in which both employees and the company make monthly contributions at a specified percentage of the covered employee's salary. The contributions as specified under the law are paid to the respective Regional Provident Fund Commissioner and the Central Provident Fund under the State Pension Scheme.

7. Revenue Recognition

- (i) Sales are recognized at the point of despatch to customers and are net of sales return. Export sales are recognized on the basis of date of bill of lading.
- (ii) Export entitlements i.e. duty free scrips are accounted for on the basis of export of goods on FOB value determined for custom purpose.

(iii) In respect of entitlements under clear development mechanism (CDM) of Kyoto Protocol Income is accounted on the basis of estimated valuation made by the Consultant appointed by the Company for the final registration with UNFCCC. The expenditure incurred representing payments made for Registration are charged over a period of 2 years during which benefit is likely to accrue.

8. Deferred Tax

The tax expense consists of current tax and deferred tax. Provision for the current tax is based on tax liability computed in accordance with relevant provisions of the Income Tax Act. Provisions for deferred tax are made for all timing differences arising between taxable incomes and accounting income at Income Tax rates that have been enacted or substantially enacted as of the balance sheet date. Deferred Tax Assets are recognised and carried forward only if there is convincing evidence that they will be realised in future against future taxable income. The carrying amounts of Deferred Tax Asset are reviewed for the appropriateness of their respective carrying values at each balance sheet date (also refer Note 17 of Schedule 18 B).

9. Borrowing Costs

Interest and other cost that are directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of a qualifying asset (including trial run) and for product development (under AS-26) within the meaning of Accounting Standard-16 are capitalized as part of the cost of that asset till the assets are ready for intended use or for producing on commercial scale/sale. Other borrowing costs are recognized as an expense in the period in which they are incurred.

10. Foreign Currency Transactions

Foreign Currency Transactions involving export sales are recorded in the reporting currency, by applying to the foreign currency amount the exchange rate between the reporting currency and the foreign currency on estimated rate on the date of despatch of goods. The difference between the rates recorded and the rates on the date of actual realization is transferred to difference in exchange fluctuation account. At the year end, the balances are converted at the year end rate and difference if any between the book balance and converted amount are transferred to the exchange fluctuation account.

11. Intangible Assets

In accordance with AS-26 – expenses incurred on development/defining the manufacturing process of any product to meet the required standards is recognized as Intangible Asset and is amortized over a period of 10 years. The amount amortised during the year is Rs. 59.67 lakhs (Previous Year Rs. 4.30 lakhs).

12. Managerial Remuneration:

Company has paid remuneration of Rs. 69.74 lakhs to its Managerial Personnel. Company is of the view and has taken legal opinion that in view of inadequacy of profits u/s 198 read with section 349 of Companies Act, 1956 remuneration paid during the year is within the prescribed limit of Section II of part II of Schedule XIII of Companies Act, 1956 computed on yearly basis of combined entitlements of Managerial Personnel during the year.

The Bank has also extended supply line of credit to the extent of Rs. 8 crores against which company has created a charge on its immovable assets.
 - (ii) Vehicles Loans are secured against hypothecation of vehicles.
 - (iii) Term Loans payable within one year are Rs. 859 lacs (Previous Year 1016.27 lacs).
- 5. Unsecured Loans (Schedule 3) include deposits of Rs. 3.13 lacs (Previous year Rs. 0.70 lacs) matured but not claimed. Deposits for Rs. 2.23 lac have since been renewed.



- 6. Loans and advances (Schedule 9) includes amount due from Directors of the Company as at 31st March, 2010 Rs. 0.24 lacs (Previous Year Rs. 1.39 lacs). Maximum amount due at any time during the year Rs. 4.07 lacs (Previous year Rs. 3.95 lacs). Current Liabilities (Schedule 10) includes Rs. 0.11 lacs due to directors of the Company (Previous Year Rs. 1.20 lacs). Maximum amount due during the year Rs. 0.11 lacs.
- Loans and Advances/sales include Rs. 3.20 crores towards sale of Carbon credits under Clean development mechanism (CDM) of Kyoto Protocol pending final registration with UNFCCC and actual sales in the International market.
- 8. No provision for gratuity liability as on 31st March, 2010 amounting to Rs. 184.72 lacs (Previous year Rs. 213.67 lacs) calculated in accordance with actuarial valuation as per AS-15 (Revised), of which Rs. NIL relates to current year (Previous year Rs. 46.03 lacs) has been made in these accounts. Above calculations are based upon the limit of Gratuity of Rs. 3.5 lakhs instead of revised limit of Rs. 10.00 lakhs per employee under the payment of Gratuity Act, 1972.
- As per information available with the company there is no amount due to any party under Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises Development Act, 2007.
- 10. Land purchased at Moradabad includes Land valued at Rs. 85.09 lacs (previous year Rs. 85.09 lacs) for which agreement to purchase has been entered and steps are being taken to register the land in the name of the company.
- 11. Assets at Gurgaon:
 - (a) Plant and Machinery and furniture and fixtures held for disposal have been depreciated at the rates prescribed under Schedule XIV of the Companies Act. The aggregate written down value of such assets is Rs. 26.44 lacs (Previous year Rs. 31.78 lacs).
 - (b) A sum of Rs. 4.00 lacs has been charged to Profit and Loss Account on account of reduction in estimated realizable value in respect of general stores of Rs. 40.79 lacs (previous year Rs. 44.79).
- 12. The Company had invested Rs. 425 lacs in the preference share capital of M/s Grand Regency Hospitality Pvt Ltd. The investee company has stopped the business as the lease of the premises occupied by it could not be renewed. The investee company is finalizing new lease and other options to carry on the business. Considering the estimated fair value of the brand of the investee company and other net realizable value of the assets, the company is of the view that no provision is required in this year as the dimunition in the value of investment due to suspension of business by the investee company is temporary in nature.
- 13. (i) Stocks on consignment of Rs. 1.08 crores remains unconfirmed at the year end.
 - (ii) Miscellaneous receipts includes Rs. 17.70 lakhs representing differential amount on account of revision of rates of sales.
- 14. In conformity with Accounting Standard AS-28 issued by the ICAI, the total carrying amount of assets including intangible assets is Rs. 4027 lacs of Casein Plant. The Company in the year 2008-09 had projected the future cash inflow of 4 years from the said plant and calculated the present value @12% of Rs. 5646 lacs. Company has made sales of Rs. 6.77 crores during the financial year 2009-10 against the projected sales of Rs. 35.17 crores. Company has reprojected the future cash flow of 10 years based upon the current and likely economic scenario and has recalculated the present value @ 12% of Rs. 4844 lacs against the carrying amount of Rs. 4027 lacs. Therefore in the opinion of Management there is no impairement of assets within the meaning of AS-28.
- 15. Current Liabilities includes Rs. 9.00 crores received from a Company as interest free deposit for short term purposes.
- 16. Loans & Advances include Rs. 8.75 lacs recoverable on account of Sales Tax of earlier years which are outstanding from earlier years:
- 17. Deferred Tax

As per Accounting Standard (AS-22), "Accounting for Taxes on Income" issued by the ICAI, Deferred Tax Asset (Net) for the year has been accounted for at Rs. 121.42 lacs as income (Previous Year Rs. 223.91 Lacs as income) in the Profit & Loss Account.

Deferred Tax Liability (Net) as at 31st March 2010 is net of deferred tax asset in respect of unabsorbed depreciation of Rs. 2620.47 lacs (Previous Year Rs. 1844.01 lacs). Deferred Tax Asset has been recognized in cases where the company has been allowed relief in first appeal in respect of addition/disallowances made in assessment proceedings of Income Tax.
