NOTES :

1. The Company's Statutory Auditors, Pranav R. Shah & Associates, Chartered Accountants (Firm Registration No. 0132072W), were appointed as Statutory Auditors of the Company for a period of five consecutive years at the Annual General Meeting ("AGM") of the Members held on September 27, 2017 on a remuneration mutually agreed upon by the Board of Directors and the Statutory Auditors.

Their appointment was subject to ratification by the Members at every subsequent AGM held after the AGM held on September 27, 2017. Pursuant to the amendments made to Section 139 of the Companies Act, 2013 by the Companies (Amendment) Act, 2017 effective from May 7, 2018, the requirement of seeking ratification of the Members for the appointment of the Statutory Auditors has been withdrawn from the Statute.

In view of the above, ratification by the Members for continuance of their appointment at this AGM is not being sought. The Statutory Auditors have given a confirmation to the effect that they are eligible to continue with their appointment and that they have not been disqualified in any manner from continuing as Statutory Auditors. The remuneration payable to the Statutory Auditors shall be determined by the Board of Directors based on the recommendation of the Audit Committee.

2. In view of the massive outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic, social distancing is a norm to be followed and pursuant to the Circular No. 14/2020 dated April 08, 2020, Circular No.17/2020 dated April 13, 2020 issued by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs followed by Circular No. 20/2020 dated May 05, 2020 and Circular No. 02/2021 dated 13th January, 2021 physical attendance of the Members to the AGM venue is not required and annual general meeting (AGM) be held through video conferencing (VC) or other audio visual means (OAVM). Hence, Members can attend and participate in the ensuing AGM through VC/OAVM and participate thereat and cast their votes through e-voting.
3. Corporate members intending to send their authorized representative to attend the meeting pursuant to the section 113 of the Companies Act, 2013 are requested to send to the company a certified true copy of the relevant board resolution

- together with their respective specimen signatures authorizing their representative(s) to attend and vote on their behalf at the meeting.
4. The Members can join the AGM in the VC/OAVM mode 15 minutes before and after the scheduled time of the commencement of the Meeting by following the procedure mentioned in the Notice. The facility of participation at the AGM through VC/OAVM will be made available for 1000 members on first come first served basis. This will not include large Shareholders (Shareholders holding 2% or more shareholding), Promoters, Institutional Investors, Directors, Key Managerial Personnel, the Chairpersons of the Audit Committee, Nomination and Remuneration Committee and Stakeholders Relationship Committee, Auditors etc. who are allowed to attend the AGM without restriction on account of first come first served basis.
 5. The attendance of the Members attending the AGM through VC/OAVM will be counted for the purpose of reckoning the quorum under Section 103 of the Companies Act, 2013.
 6. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 108 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 20 of the Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014 (as amended) and Regulation 44 of SEBI (Listing Obligations & Disclosure Requirements) Regulations 2015 (as amended), and the Circulars issued by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs dated April 08, 2020, April 13, 2020, May 05, 2020 and January 13, 2021, the Company is providing facility of remote e-voting to its Members in respect of the business to be transacted at the AGM. For this purpose, the Company has entered into an agreement with National Securities Depository Limited (NSDL) for facilitating voting through electronic means, as the authorized agency. The facility of casting votes by a member using remote e-voting system as well as venue voting on the date of the AGM will be provided by NSDL.
 7. In line with the Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) Circular No. 17/2020 dated April 13, 2020, the Notice calling the AGM has been uploaded on the website of the Company at www.rmhil.com. The Notice can also be accessed from the websites of the Stock Exchanges i.e. BSE Limited at www.bseindia.com and the AGM Notice is also available on the website of NSDL i.e. www.evoting.nsdl.com.
 8. AGM has been convened through VC/OAVM in compliance with applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 read with MCA Circular No. 14/2020 dated April 08, 2020 and MCA Circular No. 17/2020 dated April 13, 2020 and MCA Circular No. 20/2020 dated May 05, 2020 and MCA Circular No. 2-2021 dated January 13, 2021
 9. A Statement pursuant to Section 102(1) of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act"), relating to the Special Business to be transacted at the Annual General Meeting ("Meeting") is annexed hereto.
 10. The Register of Members and Share Transfer Books of the Company will remain closed from 24th September, 2021 to 30th September, 2021 (both days inclusive).
 11. The requisite Registers as required under the Act will be available electronically for inspection by the members during the AGM. All documents referred to in the Notice will also be available for electronic inspection without any fee by the members from the date of circulation of this Notice up to the date of AGM. Members seeking to inspect such document scan send an email to royalemanorhotels@rediffmail.com.
 12. Pursuant to Section 101 and Section 136 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with relevant Rules made there under, Companies can serve Annual Reports and other communications through electronic mode to those Members who have registered their e-mail address either with the Company or with the Depository. Members holding shares in demat form are requested to register their e-mail address with their Depository Participant(s) only. Members of the Company, who have registered their e-mail address, are entitled to receive such communication in physical form upon request.
 13. Securities and Exchange Board of India ("SEBI") has mandated that securities of listed companies can be transferred only in dematerialized form w.e.f. April 1, 2019. Accordingly, the Company/MCS has stopped accepting any fresh lodgment of transfer of shares in physical form. Members holding shares in physical form are advised to avail of the facility of dematerialization.
 14. In compliance with the aforesaid MCA Circulars, Notice of the AGM along with the Annual Report and Audited Financial Statements for the financial year 2020-21 is being sent only through electronic mode to those Members whose email addresses are registered with the Company or the Depository Participant(s). In view of the said MCA Circulars, the Company has published a notice in Western Times (English language) and Western Times (Gujarati language) inter alia, advising the Shareholders whose e-mail address are not registered with the Company or the Depository Participant(s), as the case may be, to register their e-mail address.
 15. Members holding shares in demat form are hereby informed that bank particulars registered with their respective Depository Participant(s), with whom they maintain their demat accounts; will be used by the Company for payment of dividend. The

Company or its Registrar cannot act on any request received directly from the Members holding shares in demat form for any change in bank particulars. Members holding shares in demat form are requested to intimate any change in their address and / or bank mandate to their Depository Participants immediately.

16. Members holding shares in physical form are requested to intimate any change of address and / or bank mandate to MCS Share Transfer Agent Limited - Registrar and Share Transfer agent of the Company immediately.
17. Members are requested to note that the company does not have any amount which required to be transferred to the Investor Education and Protection Fund (IEPF).
18. The Securities and Exchange Board of India has mandated submission of Permanent Account Number (PAN) by every participant in securities market. Members holding shares in demat form are, therefore, requested to submit PAN details to the Depository Participants with whom they have demat accounts. Members holding shares in physical form can submit their PAN details to MCS Share Transfer Agent Limited, Ahmedabad, Registrar and Share Transfer agent of the Company.
19. Members desiring any information relating to the accounts are requested to write to the Company well in advance so as to enable the management to keep the information ready.
20. The Board of Directors of the Company has appointed Ms. Rupal Patel, practicing Company Secretary as Scrutinizer to scrutinize the voting and remote e-voting process in a fair & transparent manner and they have communicated their willingness to the said appointment and will be available for same purpose.
21. The voting period begins on 27th September, 2021 from 9:00 a.m. and ends on 29th September, 2021 to 05:00 pm. During this period, the shareholders' of the Company, holding shares either in physical form or in dematerialized form, as on the cut-off date 22nd September, 2021 may cast their vote electronically.
22. Shareholders who have already voted prior to the meeting date would not be entitled to vote during the meeting.
23. Voting rights shall be reckoned on the paid up value of shares registered in the name of the member / beneficial owner (in case of electronic shareholding) as on the cut-off date i.e. 22nd September, 2021.
24. The Scrutinizer, after scrutinizing the votes cast at the meeting and through remote e-voting, will, not later than 48 (forty eight) hours from the conclusion of the Meeting, make a consolidated scrutinizer's report and submit the same to the Chairman or a person authorized by him in writing. The results declared along with the scrutinizer's report shall be placed on the website of the Company www.rmhil.com. The results shall simultaneously be communicated to the Stock Exchanges.

THE INSTRUCTIONS FOR MEMBERS FOR REMOTE E-VOTING AND JOINING GENERAL MEETING ARE AS UNDER:-

The remote e-voting period begins on **27th September, 2021 at 9:00 A.M.** and ends on **29th September, 2021 at 05:00 P.M.** The remote e-voting module shall be disabled by NSDL for voting thereafter. The Members, whose names appear in the Register of Members / Beneficial Owners as on the record date (cut-off date) i.e. **22nd September, 2021**, may cast their vote electronically. The voting right of shareholders shall be in proportion to their share in the paid-up equity share capital of the Company as on the cut-off date.

How do I vote electronically using NSDL e-Voting system?





The way to vote electronically on NSDL e-Voting system consists of “Two Steps” which are mentioned below:

Step 1: Access to NSDL e-Voting system

A) Login method for e-Voting and joining virtual meeting for Individual shareholders holding securities in demat mode

In terms of SEBI circular dated December 9, 2020 on e-Voting facility provided by Listed Companies, Individual shareholders holding securities in demat mode are allowed to vote through their demat account maintained with Depositories and Depository Participants. Shareholders are advised to update their mobile number and email Id in their demat accounts in order to access e-Voting facility.

How to Log-in to NSDL e-Voting website?

- Once the home page of e-Voting system is launched, click on the icon "Login" which is available under 'Shareholder/Member' section.

Step 2: Cast your vote electronically and join General Meeting on NSDL e-Voting system.

How to cast your vote electronically and join General Meeting on NSDL e-Voting system?

- After successful login at Step 1, you will be able to see all the companies "EVEN" in which you are holding shares and whose voting cycle and General Meeting is in active status.
- Select "EVEN" of company for which you wish to cast your vote during the remote e-Voting period and casting your vote during the General Meeting. For joining virtual meeting, you need to click on "VC/OAVM" link placed under "Join General Meeting".
- Now you are ready for e-Voting as the Voting page opens.
- Cast your vote by selecting appropriate options i.e. assent or dissent, verify/modify the number of shares for

which you wish to cast your vote and click on “Submit” and also “Confirm” when prompted.

5. Upon confirmation, the message “Vote cast successfully” will be displayed.
6. You can also take the printout of the votes cast by you by clicking on the print option on the confirmation page.
7. Once you confirm your vote on the resolution, you will not be allowed to modify your vote.

General Guidelines for shareholders

1. 2. It is strongly recommended not to share your password with any other person and take utmost care to keep your password confidential. Login to the e-voting website will be disabled upon five unsuccessful attempts to key in the correct password. In such an event, you will need to go through the “[Forgot User Details/Password?](#)” or “[Physical User Reset Password?](#)” option available on www.evoting.nsdl.com to reset the password.
3. 2. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE COMPANY'S WORKING DURING THE YEAR/STATE OF COMPANY'S AFFAIR:

India is a large market for travel and tourism. It offers a diverse portfolio of niche tourism products -

cruises, adventure, medical, wellness, sports, MICE, eco-tourism, film, rural and religious tourism. India has been recognized as a destination for spiritual tourism for domestic and international tourists. In his Independence speech from Red Fort, Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi urged people to visit 15 domestic tourist destinations in India by 2022 to promote tourism. India ranked 34 in the Travel & Tourism Competitiveness Report 2019 published by the World Economic Forum. For the travel and tourism sector, the end of the decade saw greater emphasis on the industry as a significant contributor to the overall global economy and employment. A strong economy, rising global consumer purchasing power and digital disruption was paving the way for a bright future.

As per the Federation of Hotel & Restaurant Associations of India (FHRAI), in FY21, the Indian hotel industry has taken a hit of >Rs. 1.30 lakh crore (US\$ 17.81 billion) in revenue due to impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. However, this buoyant sentiment was upended by as sudden out break of a pandemic that has had no parallels in recent history in terms of scale and impact. The world was placed under suspended animation, and the industry was brought to a halt, with estimated losses at trillions and millions of jobs at risk. With the very foundation of the world altered, the need of the hour is to see our industry, and our Hotel, through the crisis with greater urgency, revised strategy and more storability. It also calls for a greater need for communities to unite and support one another in this time of need. Guided by our values as a RHMIL company, our priority besides ensuring the safety and security of our guests and employees, was to help the community in any manner we could.

During the year under review, continuing from the disastrous effect owing to the pandemic, Ahmedabad hotels faced a further decline in occupancy and room rate. The Average Occupancy of the hotel for 2020-21 has been decreased to 35% from 63.12% and the Average Room Rates of the hotel for the year 2020-21 has been noted as Rs.3034 as compared to Rs. 5,077 in the previous year 2019-20.

However, during the financial year 2020-21, Company had been in a position to achieve a turnover of Rs. 900.55 Lacs in comparison to Rs. 2,215.83 Lacs in the previous year 2019-20. The profit before tax and profit after tax for the year under review were Rs. 28.49 Lacs and Rs. 27.90 Lacs respectively. Your directors are hopeful that with recovery in the economy, there would be a marked improvement in the performance of the company.

The hotel unit of the Company "The Ummed Ahmedabad" is an ISO 22000:2005 certified hotel

with the highest levels of Hygiene and Food Safety criteria. Further, the hotel has established superior ambience, interior decorations, services and loyal clientele retained its' market leadership in the city of Ahmedabad and has placed the hotel ahead of its Competitors.

3. CHANGE IN THE NATURE OF BUSINESS:

The Company is engaged in the activities of Hotels business.

There was no change in the nature of the business of the Company during the year under review.

4. SHARE CAPITAL:

The paid-up Equity Share Capital as on March 31, 2021 was Rs. 16.93 crores.

During the year under review, the Company has not issued any shares with differential voting rights.

(hereinafter called “the company”) for the audit period covering the financial year ended on 31st March, 2021. Secretarial Audit was conducted in a manner that provided us a reasonable basis for evaluating the corporate conducts/statutory compliances and expressing our opinion thereon.

Based on our verification of company’s books, papers, minute books, forms and returns filed and other records maintained by the company and also the information provided by the Company, its officers, agents and authorized representatives during the conduct of secretarial audit, we hereby report that in our opinion, the company has, during the audit period covering the financial year ended on 31st March, 2021 complied with the statutory provisions listed hereunder and also that the Company has proper Board-processes and compliance-mechanism in place to the extent, in the manner and subject to the reporting made hereinafter:

1. We have examined the books, papers, minute books, forms and returns filed and other records maintained by the Company, for the financial year ended on 31st March, 2021, according to the provisions of:
 - (i) The Companies Act, 2013 (the Act) and the rules made thereunder and the Companies Act, 1956, to the extent it is applicable.
 - (ii) The Securities Contracts (Regulation) Act, 1956 ('SCRA') and the rules made thereunder;
 - (iii) The Depositories Act, 1996 and the Regulations and Bye-laws framed thereunder;
 - (iv) Foreign Exchange Management Act, 1999 and the rules and regulations made thereunder to the extent of Foreign Direct Investment, Overseas Direct Investment and External Commercial Borrowings;
 - (v) The following Regulations and Guidelines prescribed under the Securities and Exchange Board of India Act, 1992 ('SEBI Act'):-
 - (a) The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Substantial Acquisition of Shares and Takeovers) Regulations, 2011;
 - (b) The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Prohibition of Insider Trading) Regulations, 2015;
 - (c) The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Issue of Capital and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2009;

On the basis of our examination and representation made by the Company we report that during the period under review, the Company has generally complied with the provisions of the Act, Rules, Regulations, Guidelines etc. mentioned above and there are no material non-compliances that have come to our knowledge except non-compliance in respect of:

- a) 100% Promoters' holding of the Company is not in Demat form. However, it has been mentioned under Regulation 31(2) of SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, to have entire promoters' holding of the Company in Demat form only.
- b) The Company is in non-compliance with the Composition of Nomination and Remuneration Committee from 28th January 2021.
- c) During the year under review, the company has accepted resignation of Mr. Nanadlal Maheshwari, who was an independent director of the company, on 28th January, 2021. However, new independent director could not be appointed by the company within the prescribed time limit as mentioned in regulation 25(6) of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirement) Regulations, 2015.
- d) The company has not submitted Annual Secretarial Compliance Report for FY 2019-20 within time.
- e) The company failed to allot warrants convertible into equity shares of the Company within 15 days from the date of In-principle approval letter dated 08.02.2021.
- f) The Company has not renewed its license under Shops and Establishment Act during the year under review.

We Further Report that, there were no actions/ events in pursuance of:

- a) The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Issue and Listing of Debt Securities) Regulations, 2008;
- b) The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Delisting of Equity Shares) Regulations, 2009;
- c) The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Buyback of Securities) Regulations, 1998;
- d) The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Employee Stock Option Scheme and Employee Stock Purchase Scheme) Guidelines, 1999 and The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Share Based Employee Benefits) Regulations, 2014 notified on 28 October 2014

requiring compliance thereof by the Company during the period under review

We further report that the compliance by the company of applicable financial laws like direct and indirect tax laws like Income Tax Act, 1961, Goods and Service Tax Act, 2017 etc., and maintenance of financial records and books of account has not been checked/verified/reviewed in this Audit since the same have been subject to review by statutory financial auditor and other designated professionals.

We further report that the Board of Directors of the Company is duly constituted with proper balance of Executive Directors, Non-Executive Directors and Independent Directors at the end of financial year. The changes in the composition of the Board of Directors that took place during the period under review were carried out in compliance with the provisions of the Act except in few case as mentioned above.

Adequate notice is given to all directors to schedule the Board Meetings, agenda and detailed notes on agenda were sent in advance, except in few cases, and a system exists for seeking and obtaining further information and clarifications on the agenda items before the meeting and for meaningful participation at the meeting.

Decisions at the meetings of the Board of Directors of the Company were carried through on the basis of majority. There were no dissenting views by any member of the Board of Directors during the period under review.

We further report that there are adequate systems and processes in the company commensurate with the size and operations of the company to monitor and ensure compliance with applicable laws, rules, regulations and guidelines.

We further report that during the audit period there were no specific events / actions having a major bearing on the company's affairs.

ANNEXURE - C MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS REPORT

OVERALL REVIEW

The Ministry of Tourism has created a policy for development and promotion of caravan and caravan camping parks. On January 25, 2021, Union Tourism and Culture Minister Mr. Prahlad Singh Patel announced plan to develop an international-level infrastructure in Kargil (Ladakh) to promote adventure tourism and winter sports.

The Ministry of Road Transport and Highways has introduced a new scheme called 'All India Tourist Vehicles Authorisation and Permit Rules, 2021', in which a tourist vehicle operator can register online for All India Tourist Authorisation/Permit. This permit will be issued within 30 days of submitting the application.

The tourism & hospitality sector's direct contribution to GDP is expected to reach Rs. 12.68 trillion (US\$ 194.69 billion) in 2028. The Federation of Associations in Indian Tourism and Hospitality (FAITH) Chairman Mr. Nakul Anand, recently spoke at a conference on the India Tourism Vision Day stating that Indian tourism is estimated to contribute 9-10% to India's GDP on a direct and indirect basis.

International Tourists arrival is expected to reach 30.5 billion by 2028. e-Visa facility was offered to 171 countries as of March 2021.

In Union Budget 2020-21, the Government has allotted Rs.1,200 crore (US\$ 171.70 million) for the development of tourist circuits under Swadesh Darshan for Northeast. The Ministry of Tourism launched the NIDHI portal to understand the geographical spread of the hospitality sector, its size, structure and existing capacity in the country. NIDHI will serve as a common data repository for the Ministry of Tourism, State Departments of Tourism and Industry; this will enable the Central and State Governments to deliver better support and services including policies and strategies for the tourism sector. As of December 31, 2020, 34,399 accommodation units have been registered on the portal.

The launch of several branding and marketing initiatives by the Government of India such as 'Incredible India!' and 'Athiti Devo Bhava' has provided a focused impetus to growth.

Amid the relaxation provided by the government after the COVID-19 lockdown, the Indian Association of Tour Operators (IATO) has urged the government to finalise a roadmap for resumption of international flights and facilitate e-visas and tourist visas. The Indian Railway Catering and Tourism Corporation (IRCTC) runs a series of Bharat Darshan tourist trains aimed at taking people to various pilgrimages across the country. Subsequently in November end, India introduced a graded relaxation of its visa and travel restrictions for more categories of foreign

nationals and Indian nationals. Post the pandemic crisis, the government plans to tap into regional tourism by opening doors for South Asian country tourists. The Government is also making serious efforts to boost investment in the tourism sector. In the hotel and tourism sector, 100% FDI (Foreign Direct Investment) is allowed through the automatic route. A five-year tax holiday has been offered for 2-, 3- and 4-star category hotels located around UNESCO World Heritage sites (except Delhi and Mumbai). Government is planning to boost the tourism in India by leveraging on the lighthouses in the country. 71 lighthouses have been identified in India which will be developed as tourist spots. The lighthouses will feature museums, amphi-theatres, open air theatres, cafeterias, children's parks, eco-friendly cottages and landscaping according to its capacity. The Government of India also announced to develop 17 iconic tourist sites in India into world-class destinations as per Union Budget 2019-20. Ministry of Tourism launched Dekho Apna Desh webinar in April 2020 to provide information on the many destinations and the sheer depth and expanse of the culture and heritage of Incredible India. Until May 25, 2021, 86 webinars have been conducted under the series. On November 4, 2020, the Union Minister of State (IC) for Tourism & Culture Mr. Prahlad Singh Patel inaugurated the "Tourist Facilitation Centre" facility constructed under the project "Development of Guruvayur, Kerala" (under the PRASHAD Scheme of the Ministry of Tourism).

In May 2021, the Union Minister of State (IC) for Tourism & Culture Mr. Prahlad Singh Patel participated in the G20 tourism ministers' meeting to collaborate with member countries in protecting tourism businesses, jobs and taking initiatives to frame policy guidelines to support the sustainable and resilient recovery of travel and tourism. The Ministry of Tourism developed an initiative called SAATHI (System for Assessment, Awareness & Training for Hospitality Industry) by partnering with the Quality Council of India (QCI) in October 2020. The initiative will effectively implement guidelines/SOPs issued with reference to COVID-19 for safe operations of hotels, restaurants, B&Bs and other units. Ministry of Tourism has introduced the Incredible India Tourist Facilitator (IITF) and Incredible India Tourist Guide (IITG) Certification Programme, aimed at creating an online learning platform of well-trained tourist facilitators and guides across the country. The IITF concept is aimed to promote micro-tourism, i.e., tourism in less explored areas of the country.

- Policy support: Campaigns such as Swadesh Darshan, a theme-based tourist circuit was launched to harness the tourism industry's potential. Another new tourism policy focusing on developing medical, religious tourism and adding more destinations to the prevailing ones is also under consideration.
- Attractive opportunities: Government is providing free loans to MSMEs to help them deal with the crisis and revive the economy, including the tourism sector.

NOTE-31 : SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICES AND NOTES FORMING PART OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. CORPORATE INFORMATION:

Royale Manor Hotels and Industries Limited is a listed public limited company incorporated in 1991. Its shares are listed on Bombay, Madras and Calcutta Stock Exchanges. Company established first five star hotel of Ahmedabad and is primarily engaged in the business of Hotel & Restaurant.

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

2.1 Statement of Compliance:

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Ind AS as prescribed under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 and other provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 as amended from time to time.

2.2 Basis of preparation:

These financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) notified under the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015.

2.3 Accounting Estimates:

The preparation of these financial statements in conformity with the recognition and measurement principles of Ind AS requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions, that affect the reported balance of assets and liabilities, disclosure relating to contingent liabilities as at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of income and expenses for the years presented. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

2.4 Revenue Recognition:

Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably measured, regardless of when the payment is being made. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, taking into account contractually defined terms of payment and excluding taxes or duty. The Company assesses its revenue arrangements against specific criteria to determine if it is acting as principal or agent. The Company has concluded that it is acting as a principal in all of its revenue arrangements. The specific recognition criteria described below must also be met before revenue is recognized.

Value added tax (VAT) / Goods and Service Tax (GST) is not received by the Company on its own account. Rather, it is tax collected on value added to the commodity by the seller on behalf of the government. Accordingly, it is excluded from revenue.

Rooms, Restaurant, Banquets and Other Service:

Income from guest accommodation is recognized on a day to day basis after the guest checks into the Hotels and are stated net of allowances. Incomes from other services are recognized as and when services are rendered. Sales are stated exclusive of Goods and Service Tax (GST) and Value Added Taxes (VAT). Difference of revenue over the billed as at the year-end is carried in financial statement as unbilled revenue separately.

Sale of goods:

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognized when the significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods have passed to the buyer, sale of food and beverage are recognized at the points of serving these items to the guests. Sales are stated exclusive of VAT/ Goods and Service Tax (GST).

Interest income:

Interest Income is accrued on a time proportion basis using the effective interest rate.

2.5 Property, Plant & Equipment's:

Property, Plant & Equipment's has been recorded at actual cost inclusive of duties, taxes and other incidental expenses related to acquisition, improvement and installation. The Company depreciates property, plant & equipment's over their estimated useful lives using the SLM method. The estimated useful lives of assets are as under:

2.6 Impairment of Assets:

Assets are reviewed for impairment losses whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognized for the amount by which the carrying amount of the assets exceeds its recoverable amount, which is the higher of an asset's net selling price and value in use.

2.7 Investments:

Investments are in equity shares of unlisted company being Non-Current in nature, are stated at cost.

2.8 Foreign Currency Transactions:

Earnings in foreign currencies are recorded at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of transactions. Gain/Loss arising out of fluctuations in exchange rates is accounted for on settlement and the same is charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss. Payments in foreign currencies are recorded at the rates prevailing on the date of actual remittance.

2.9 Borrowing Costs:

Borrowing costs directly attributable to the acquisition or construction of an asset that necessarily takes a substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use are capitalized as part of the cost of the asset until such time that the assets are substantially ready for their intended use. Capitalization of borrowing costs is suspended and charged to profit and loss during the extended periods when the active development on the qualifying assets is interrupted. Qualifying fixed asset is an asset that necessarily takes a substantial period of time to get ready for their intended use or sale. All other borrowing costs are charged to Statement of Profit and Loss over the tenure of the borrowing.

2.10 Inventories:

Stock of food and beverages, stores and operating supplies are valued at lower of cost and net realizable Value. Cost includes cost of purchase and other costs incurred in bringing the inventories to their present location and condition, Cost is determined on a first in first out basis. Net realizable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business less estimated cost of completion and estimated costs necessary to make sale.

2.11 Employee Benefits:

Company accounts for leave encashment benefits on the basis of actuarial valuation. Further, contribution to the Gratuity Fund linked with Life Insurance Corporation of India is charged to Statement of Profit & Loss.

2.12 Taxes on Income:

Taxes on Income are accounted in the same period to which the revenue and expenses relate.

Provision for current income tax is made on the basis of estimated taxable income, in accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961 and rules framed there under.

Deferred tax is the tax effect of timing differences. The timing differences are differences between the taxable income and accounting income for a period that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods.

MAT credit is recognized as an asset only when and to the extent there is convincing evidence that the Company will pay normal income tax during the specified period.

2.13 Earnings Per Share (EPS):

Basic earnings per share are computed by dividing the profit/ (loss) after tax by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year. Diluted earnings per share is computed by dividing the profit/(loss) after tax by the weighted average number of equity shares considered for deriving basic earnings per share.

2.14 Contingencies and Provisions:

Provisions are recognized when the Company has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event, it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. The expense relating to a provision is presented in the statement of profit and loss net of any reimbursement.

Contingent liabilities are recognized only when there is a possible obligation arising from past events, due to occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events, not wholly within the control of the Company or where any present obligation cannot be measured in terms of future outflow of resources or where a reliable estimate of obligation cannot be made. Contingent assets are not recognized in the financial statements.

2.15 Statement of Cash Flows:

Cash flows are reported using the indirect method, whereby profit/(loss) before exceptional items and tax is adjusted for the effects of transactions of non-cash nature and any deferrals or accruals of past or future cash receipts or payments. The cash flows from operating, investing and financing activities of the Company are segregated based on available information.

2.16 Financial Instruments:

Financial Assets and Financial Liabilities are recognized when the Company becomes party to the contractual provisions of the financial instrument. Financial Assets are derecognized when the rights to receive benefits have expired or been transferred, and the Company has transferred substantially all risks and rewards of ownership of such financial asset. Financial liabilities are derecognized when the liability is extinguished, that is when the contractual obligation is discharged, cancelled or expired. Purchase or sale of financial assets that require delivery of assets within a time frame established by regulation or convention in the market place are recognized on trade date i.e. the date when the Company commits to purchase or sale the asset.

3. NOTES TO ACCOUNTS:-

- 3.1** Some of the Balances of sundry creditors, sundry debtors, loans & advances and other liabilities are subject to confirmation and reconciliation.
- 3.2** In the opinion of the Board of Directors, Current Assets, Loans & Advances are approximately of the value at which they are stated in the Balance Sheet, if realized in the ordinary course of business.
- 3.3** The Company operates in one segment i.e. Hotel business and within one geographical segment i.e. India.

- 3.4 The Company manages its capital to ensure that it will be able to continue as a going concern. The structure is managed to provide ongoing returns to shareholders and service debt obligations, whilst maintaining maximum operational flexibility.
- 3.5 The carrying amounts of trade payables, other financial liabilities, cash and cash equivalents, other bank balances, trade receivables and other financial assets are considered to be the same as their fair values due to their short-term nature.
- 3.6 The Company opines that no provision for expected credit loss is required.
- 3.7 There is no significant market risk or liquidity risk to which the Company is exposed.
