## TO THE MEMBERS,

Your Directors have pleasure in presenting the Forty-Sixth Annual Report and the Audited Statement of Accounts of the Company for the year ended 31st March, 2010.

#### 1. FINANCIAL RESULTS

## 2. DIVIDEND

Your Directors have recommended a dividend of 125% amounting to Rs. 6.25 per share of Rs. 5.00 each as compared to a dividend of 100% (Rs. 5.00 per share) in the previous year.

#### 3. OPERATIONS

During the year under review, the net sales decreased from Rs. 685.10 crores in the previous year to Rs. 620.41 crores. Domestic sales marginally increased from Rs. 391.55 crores in the previous year to Rs. 403.96 crores in the year under review whereas the export turnover dropped sharply by 26% from Rs. 293.55 crores to Rs. 216.45 crores.

Sharp drop in price of Glyphosate, a major weedicide product of the Company, in the international market was the major reason for the fall in exports. In the domestic market, the sales offtake was higher. However, prices of several of the Company's products were significantly lower in comparison to the previous year. The lower sales realisation was, however, compensated by lower input costs and did not reduce profitability.

The Company's profit before tax in the year under review has increased to Rs. 57.19 crores from Rs. 44.60 crores in the previous year mainly for the reason that in the previous year the Company had an abnormal and large foreign exchange/derivative loss of Rs. 32.42 crores whereas in the year under review there is a foreign exchange gain of Rs. 0.30 crore.

#### 4. NEW PRODUCTS

During the year under review, the Company introduced a new rust fungicide in the international market. This product is proposed to be introduced in the domestic market as well. The Company also introduced an acaricide which is well received in the market. To meet the changing market requirements, the Company has been increasing its retail pack range and augmenting and modifying its packaging facilities. The Company continues its efforts at energy conservation and energy cost reduction.

#### 5. OUTLOOK

The agriculture sector in India continues to receive focused attention from the Central as also the State Governments. Crop failure last year and the resultant food shortages and food price inflation once again highlighted the importance of this sector for the country's economy. The private sector has been making significant investments in farming and rural sectors as these segments are seen as future growth drivers for the economy. Farmers are receiving attractive price for their produce and are able to spend on quality farm inputs. The Indian agriculture sector and the rural economy continue to grow at a steady and satisfactory pace. With one more near-normal monsoon forecast for the current year, the short-term outlook for the agrochemicals industry and your Company appears reasonably good. The Company continues to focus on growth of its branded products. Exports continue to remain the focus area of growth for your Company. The Company strives to make up for the ground lost in the year under review in the export arena. At the same time the Company remains conscious about the high credit risk associated with some geographies in the export markets. The Company continues to make efforts to explore and penetrate new export markets.

#### 6. TRANSFER OF SEEDS BUSINESS TO EXCEL GENETICS LIMITED

The Company transferred its seeds business as a going concern to Excel Genetics Limited (formerly, Harvest Inte-Agro Limited) with effect from 1st July, 2009 by transfer of fixed and current assets, liabilities and provisions, trade marks, copyrights, licences, registrations, contracts, etc. relating to the seeds business at book value. The services of employees of the seeds business were also transferred to Excel Genetics Limited. The Company acquired 75% stake in Excel Genetics Limited by subscribing to its 1,50,000 equity shares of Rs. 10/- each at par and it thus became the Company's subsidiary.

#### 7. SAFETY, HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENT

During the year, the Company made significant investment in upgrading effluent treatment facilities at its Bhavnagar Site. The Company continues to hold ISO-9001, ISO-14000 and ISO-18001 certifications which lead to a better working environment at manufacturing sites. The Company also continues to sustain its SA 8000 — Certification for Social Accountability for all its sites. Safety and fire fighting training programmes and mock drills are conducted regularly for the Company's employees. All the manufacturing sites of the Company are covered by safety audit.

#### 8. QUALITY

The Company continues to maintain ISO:9001-2008 Quality Management System for all its three manufacturing sites at Bhavnagar, Gajod and Silvassa and the quality of its products is maintained and upgraded to the applicable national and international quality standards. The Company continues to enjoy the reputation of a consistent and reliable quality supplier and has received appreciation and awards from many of its key customers.

#### 9. EDUCATION, LEARNING AND HUMAN DEVELOPMENT

Human Resource is considered as the most valuable business asset by the Company. Your Company continues to invest in people through training and developmental efforts and by providing its employees opportunities to learn and upgrade their skills and acquire knowledge in related and new areas. During the year under review, the Company conducted several training programmes and workshops on subjects like creating future leaders, team building and interpersonal relationship. The Company endeavours to ensure that it has requisite skills to meet with ever-changing and new business requirements.

Safety, health and caring for the environment have always been the focus of the Company. The Company vigorously pursues its initiatives for educating farmers and dealers in proper and safe handling and usage of its products. The Company continues to conduct programmes for providing the farmers with technical know-how and educating them on modern techniques of agriculture including crop management, soil management and judicious use of water, fertilisers and pesticides.

#### 10. SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

The Company maintains its tradition of supporting activities, organisations and projects contributing to a wide range of socio-economic, educational and health initiatives and rural community development. The Company has identified soil health management, a major concern for the farming community, as a special focus area. Rural health, water management, water salinity prevention are the areas receiving your Company's attention as a part of its social responsibility. Your Company also actively promotes youth and child development initiatives in rural areas. It also holds health check-up and blood donation camps and tree planting campaigns.

#### 11. INSURANCE

The Company continues to carry adequate insurance cover for all its assets against foreseeable perils like fire, flood, earthquake etc. and continues to maintain Consequential Loss (Fire) Policy and the Liability Policy as per the provisions of Public Liability Insurance Act.

#### 12. SUBSIDIARIES

Pursuant to Section 212 of the Companies Act, 1956, the Accounts of Excel Industries (Australia) Pty Ltd., Excel Industries (Europe) N. V., ECCL Investments and Finance Limited and Excel Genetics Limited, subsidiaries of the Company, are annexed.

#### 13. FIXED DEPOSITS

The Company has discontinued its Fixed Deposit Schemes. The amount of Fixed Deposits remaining unclaimed at the end of the year under review from out of the amount allocated to the Company pursuant to the Scheme of Arrangement with Excel Industries Limited is Rs. 3.59 lacs involving 33 depositors.

Mr. Gupte holds office up to the date of the ensuing Annual General Meeting of the Company. Mr. Gupte is also the Vice-Chairman of a prestigious trade association representing the agrochemicals industry. ## MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

#### 1. Industry Structure & Developments:

The Company is engaged in the business of agrochemicals comprising insecticides, weedicides, fungicides, fumigants and rodenticides. The Company's product basket also includes Soil Enricher, Bio-Pesticides and Plant Growth Promoters. During the year the Company transferred its seeds business to Excel Genetics Limited which is now a subsidiary company.

Among the agrochemicals, insecticides have dominated consumption pattern in India. However, its share is steadily declining year after year owing to introduction of genetically modified crops such as cotton and increasing consumption of weedicides and fungicides which are witnessing fast growth. Cotton crop used to be the single largest consumer of agrochemicals in India. However, with the advent of genetically modified cotton crop, the picture has drastically changed. Rice, wheat, soybean, pulses, plantation crops, fruits and vegetables have emerged as major consumers of agrochemicals. Food shortages and food price inflation seen across the world in past few years has brought focus on efficient and effective storage of food grains which can balance demand-supply gaps from year to year and provide for a stable price regime. This has brought about renewed focus on 'post-harvest crop protection products' like fumigants and rodenticides. These products are forging good growth in the past few years.

The fortunes of the agrochemicals industry are interwoven with the fortunes of agriculture. With the relatively slow pace of agricultural growth in India, the agrochemicals industry too is growing at a low rate.

The industry comprises of diverse players ranging from small and medium ones dealing in generic molecules to large multinationals with high-priced new generation molecules and patented products.

The industry has built up large capacities in India and has many manufacturers, especially in formulation business and has a fairly high level of competition. The seasonal nature of the business and the climatic uncertainties compel the industry to carry a large inventory for long periods. Domestic market has been attracting attention of multinationals who visualise good growth opportunity in the domestic market. The domestic industry has been witness to a steady increase in market share by new generation and patented molecules.

Supply of high quality products at competitive prices, development of new products/formulations and product registration are emerging as key success factors.

The domestic industry is continuously striving to increase exports by providing quality products at competitive prices with a view to ensure better utilisation of capacities as also to hedge against uncertain climatic conditions within the country. Over the years, India has emerged as a significant supplier of agrochemicals in the international market. Globally the agrochemicals business is stable and not growing much and this leads to intense competition, especially in generic molecules segment, which manifests in dropping prices and declining industry margins.

## 2. Opportunities and Threats:

Agriculture is the mainstay of rural economy and supports over two-thirds of the country's population. It continues to receive attention of the Central and State Governments through favourable agriculture policies, minimum support price for major produces, subsidies, developmental programmes and schemes and availability of credit and finance through various schemes.

With decent minimum support prices and attractive open market prices for several crops, the farmers are receiving remunerative price for their produce. With increasing purchasing power in hand, the farmers afford to spend on better farm inputs as well as for personal consumption. Private sector also visualises good growth potential for investment in agriculture and agro-based businesses. Rapidly developing food processing industry is helping in large measure the growth of the farming sector. Steady performance of the rural economy in the face of recent sluggishness in other segments of the country's economy is another factor attracting attention of the private sector to rural areas in general and to agriculture in particular.

With large food grain stocks being carried by the government organizations and the food processing industry, the demand for post-harvest crop protection chemicals is rising. Farmers have also acquired stock holding capacity and wait for right price in market. This also increases demand for such products.

All these factors point to reasonably good growth prospects for agriculture and, by logical extension, for the agrochemicals industry. Pesticides consumption in India is very low by the world consumption standard and there is scope for increasing the same by making their judicious use. Amongst the States also there are large variations in per acre pesticide consumption. All these factors underline untapped growth potential in the domestic market.

Genetically modified (GM) cotton crop now accounts for a large share of the cotton acreage in India. New varities of GM cotton seeds are being introduced which further increase GM cotton crop acreage. GM cotton has adversely impacted consumption of some insecticides which target cotton-specific pests. However, GM cotton crop does need protection against other pests and this opens up opportunity for some different variety of insecticides. Also a GM crop needs good nurturing to make it economically viable and this has opened opportunity for growth of weedicides and soil nutrients products.

The Company, with its vast experience in pest control practices, wide product range and efficient and effective distribution network, has been taking various steps like launching new products and formulations, introduction of combi-products, improving processes to enhance yield and quality and reducing costs in order to maintain its lead in the industry and stay competitive. In the year under review, the Company introduced an acaricide molecule in the domestic market and a new fungicide in the international market. The Company continues to offer new and innovative products for weed control. The Company's weedicide product range is gaining new markets and customers and to meet with the increasing market demand the Company has plans to expand production capacity for weedicides and their formulations.

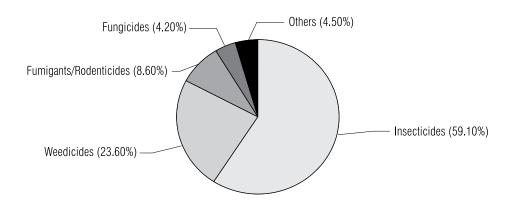
The Company's 'post-harvest crop protection products' are posting good growth in domestic and international markets. The Company has also been introducing new generation products and enlarging its product portfolio.

The Company strives at finding application of its products for the newer crops through field trials and thereby widen coverage for its existing products to more crops. The Company also markets bio technology products such as Soil Enricher, Bio-Pesticides and Plant Growth Promoters. These products, though small in market size, have niche market position and hold good growth potential. This product group is useful in the area of plant and soil nutrition, organic farming and soil health management — the areas of interest for your Company. The Company has a state-of-the-art soil health research laboratory to analyse soil composition and assess soil health and to develop products for soil rejuvenation and nutrition.

The export market continues to offer good growth opportunities to the Company. The Company has been strengthening its presence in the overseas market by exploring new markets, promoting existing and new products, especially branded products, protecting its existing product registrations and making investment in new product registrations. Product registration acts as an entry barrier in a new export market and it is vital to continue investing in new product registrations and protecting the existing ones. The Company continues to explore opportunity for its products in new geographies and makes concerted efforts for product registration in these countries with a view to entering new markets.

#### 3. Segment-wise performance and outlook:

The Company's domestic sales increased from Rs. 391.55 crores in the previous year to Rs. 403.96 crores in the year under review. Exports however reduced from Rs. 293.55 crores in the previous year to Rs. 216.45 crores in the year under review. Share of various product classes in the Company's sales turnover in 2009-10:



With increasing emphasis on agriculture in public policies, increasing purchasing power in the hands of farmers and near normal monsoon forecast, the current year outlook for the industry and the Company appears reasonably good.

A strong brand gives market depth and long term advantages in terms of strong and consolidated market position. Over the years, the Company has made sustained efforts at brand building. This has yielded good results and today branded products dominate the Company's sales turnover accounting for about two-thirds of the turnover. Branded products, however, require higher investment in inventories and book debt. The Company has a strong network of dedicated distributors and dealers many of whom have decades-long association with the Company. The Company has been quick in responding to changing demand for retail pack and has built up packaging facilities suitably.

The Company has been working closely with farmers, in India and several other countries, through its various programmes including 'Excel & Me' and 'Excel Kisan Mitra' and provides comprehensive package of products, services, knowledge and solutions to farmers. The Company has also set up phone helplines to provide help and advice to farmers on various farming subjects.

The initiatives taken by the Company in promoting Integrated Pest Management (IPM) and Integrated Crop Management (ICM) and its investment in brand promotion, developing closer ties with farmers and corporate image building are helping it in maintaining leading position in the industry. The Company's recent initiatives in soil health management are bringing it further closer to the farmers.

#### 4. Risks and Concerns:

In the last two decades, Indian economy has posted spectacular growth. However, the growth of agriculture sector which supports about 70% of the population but accounts for less than 25% of the GDP, is sluggish. This consequently limits growth prospects of the agrochemicals industry.

The agrochemicals industry is directly affected by climatic conditions. Again, different climatic conditions throw up different and complex needs and requirements and the demand for different molecules and products changes accordingly. All these factors point to a high degree of uncertainties and complexities.

The financial year 2009-10 had erratic monsoon and adverse climatic conditions in India. This resulted in low farm production leading to food shortages and high food price inflation. High food prices continue to remain a general cause of concern. In spite of unfavourable climatic conditions, the pesticides consumption in India grew, albeit at a low rate. Prices of several agrochemical products were significantly lower than in the previous year. The Company registered higher sales volumes for its mainline products. However, owing to reduced price realisation, the overall value of sales turnover in the domestic market grew by about 3%.

The Company's exports registered a sharp fall in 2009-10. Several markets, where the Company operates, had unfavourable climatic conditions which adversely impacted farming. Another main reason for export fall was a sharp reduction in the sales of Glyphosate Technical. Globally, this product was under extreme short supply in 2008-09 which drove up pricing and resulted in opportunity sales for the Company in 2008-09. However, the situation dramatically reversed in 2009-10 with a major reduction in global demand and a steep increase in global capacities and a resultant fall in prices. Besides this, the use of Endosulfan was under review in Brazil which temporarily affected the imports of the product into Brazil. However, this situation was successfully addressed by the Brazilian and international stewardship and end-user groups and the usage and imports of the product resumed in the last quarter of the year 2009-10.

Some of the developing countries in Asia, Africa and South America offer good export opportunities with attractive returns. However, exports to these countries also lead to higher exposure to credit and political risks, especially in the present times of economic slowdown.

Large capacity built up in the domestic industry leading to skewed demand — supply position and significant imports are leading to high competition, ultimately leading to undercutting of prices and gradually falling margins, high credit periods and receivables and the attendant costs and risks.

Over the years the Company has established strong brand image of its products with farmers in India and several other countries. Strong brand has its own perils and gives rise to risk of counterfeiting. Counterfeiting has twin hazards — loss of sales and damage to the brand and the Company's image. Of late, the Company has come across several instances of

counterfeiting of its products and availability in market of products deceptively resembling the Company's branded products. The Company is taking necessary measures to safeguard its brand, image and interests in the market place.

Availability of cheap spurious products in the market and the negative image created in the public mind through misinformation campaign about the adverse impact of pesticides on food, water, environment and human health continues to be a cause of concern for the industry.

Similarly, there is a systematic misinformation campaign to malign some generic molecules. The idea is to bring about restriction or prohibition on use of these molecules so as to create room for new, high-priced patented molecules. Electronic and print media also are being manipulatively used in such campaign which is based on false, unfounded and unsubstantiated allegations by vested interests.

The Company's leading product Endosulfan is under pressure with the European Union seeking an inclusion of the product under the Stockholm and Rotterdam Conventions. However, the product continues to receive support at these Conventions from India and other agriculturally important countries where Endosulfan is used extensively.

The Company is taking necessary measures to safeguard the environment in its area of operations and in educating dealers, farmers and users, in safe and correct use of pesticides. The Company is also working closely with some voluntary agencies in addressing the issues relating to soil and water management which are of prime importance to the farmers and the nation.

## 5. Internal control systems and their adequacy:

The Company has proper and adequate system of internal controls which ensures that all the assets are safeguarded against loss from unauthorised use or disposition and that all transactions are authorised, recorded and reported correctly. The Company has assigned internal audit function to professional firms of Chartered Accountants. Regular internal audits and checks are carried out to ensure that the delegated responsibilities are discharged effectively and that adequate internal control systems are in place and functioning. All major findings and suggestions arising out of internal audit are reported to and reviewed by the Audit Committee. The Management ensures implementation of these suggestions and reviews them periodically. A strong internal audit system and an effective Audit Committee of the Board have led to the further strengthening of the internal controls within the organisation.

#### 6. Financial Performance & Analysis:

The net sales reduced from Rs. 685.10 crores in the previous year to Rs. 620.41 crores in the year under review. The profit before tax however increased from Rs. 44.60 crores in the previous year to Rs. 57.19 crores in the year under review.

#### 7. Human Resource Development/Industrial Relations:

The Company ensures that it has adequate human skills commensurate with its requirements. The Company continuously strives to upgrade skills and competence of its human resources. Measures for safety, training, welfare and development of employees receive top priority. Industrial relations continue to be cordial and harmonious.

The employee strength of the Company on 31st March, 2010 was 1,218.

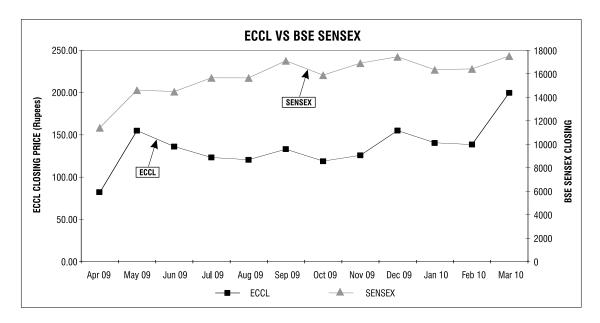

Re: Excel Crop Care Limited ('the Company')

- (i) (a) The Company has maintained proper records showing full particulars, including quantitative details and situation of fixed assets.
  - (b) All fixed assets have not been physically verified by the management during the year but there is a regular programme of verification which, in our opinion, is reasonable having regard to the size of the Company and the nature of its assets. As informed, no material discrepancies were noticed on such verification.
  - (c) There was no substantial disposal of fixed assets during the year.
- (ii) (a) The management has conducted physical verification of inventory at reasonable intervals during the year.
  - (b) The procedures of physical verification of inventory followed by the management are reasonable and adequate in relation to the size of the Company and the nature of its business.
  - (c) The Company is maintaining proper records of inventory and no material discrepancies were noticed on physical verification.
- (iii) As informed, the Company has not granted or taken any loans, secured or unsecured to or from companies, firms or other parties covered in the register maintained under section 301 of the Companies Act, 1956. Hence clauses 4(iii)(b) to 4(iii)(g) of the Companies (Auditor's Report) Order, 2003 (as amended) are not applicable to the Company.
- (iv) In our opinion and according to the information and explanations given to us, there is an adequate internal control system commensurate with the size of the Company and the nature of its business, for the purchase of inventory and fixed assets and for the sale of goods and services. During the course of our audit, no major weakness has been noticed in the internal control system in respect of these areas. During the course of our audit, we have not observed any continuing failure to correct major weakness in internal control system of the Company.
- (v) (a) According to the information and explanations provided by the management, we are of the opinion that the particulars of contracts or arrangements referred to in section 301 of the Act that need to be entered into the register maintained under section 301 have been so entered.

#### NOTES TO ACCOUNTS

#### 1. NATURE OF OPERATIONS:

Excel Crop Care Limited is a reputed Company in agro chemicals sector manufacturing technical grade and formulations of pesticides. The Company also markets agri inputs like soil enrichers, bio-pesticides and plant growth promoters. The Company has presence in both the domestic and international markets.

#### 2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

#### (a) Basis of Preparation:

The financial statements have been prepared to comply in all material respects with the Notified Accounting Standards by Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006 (as amended) and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 1956. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention on an accrual basis except in case of assets for which provision for impairment is made. The accounting policies have been consistently applied by the Company and are consistent with those used in the previous year.

#### (b) Use of estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the results of operations during the reporting period. Although these estimates are based upon management's best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results could differ from these estimates.

#### (c) Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses, if any. Cost comprises the purchase price and any attributable cost of bringing the asset to its working condition for its intended use. Borrowing costs relating to acquisition of fixed assets which takes substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use are also included to the extent they relate to the period till such assets are ready to be put to use.

#### (d) Depreciation:

- (i) In respect of Buildings, Plant and Machinery and Electrical Installations, on straight line basis in accordance with Section 205(2)(b) of the Companies Act. 1956, at the straight line rates specified in Schedule XIV to the Companies Act. 1956.
- (ii) Leasehold Improvements are depreciated on straight line basis over the lease period.
- (iii) In respect of additions to/deletions from the Fixed Assets, on pro-rata basis with reference to the date of addition/deletion of the assets except for assets costing Rs 5,000 or less which have been fully depreciated.
- (iv) In respect of all other Fixed Assets, on written down value basis in accordance with Section 205(2)(a) of the Companies Act, 1956, at the rates specified in Schedule XIV to the Companies Act, 1956.

### (e) Impairment:

- (i) The carrying amounts of assets are reviewed for impairment at each balance sheet date if there is any indication of impairment based on internal/external factors. An impairment loss is recognised wherever the carrying amount of an asset exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the greater of the asset's net selling price and value in use. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value at the weighted average cost of capital.
- (ii) After impairment, depreciation is provided on the revised carrying amount of the asset over its remaining useful life.
- (iii) A previously recognised impairment loss is increased or reversed depending on changes in circumstances. However the carrying value after reversal is not increased beyond the carrying value that would have prevailed by charging usual depreciation if there was no impairment.

#### (f) Intangible Assets and Amortisation:

- (i) Intangible assets are stated at cost less accumulated amortisation.
- (ii) Amortisation:

Data Registration expenses (including registration fees) are amortised on a straight line basis over a period of three years and computer software/licence fees and data compensation charges are amortised on a straight line basis over a period of four years.

(iii) Research and Development Costs:

Research costs (other than cost of Fixed Assets acquired) are charged as an expense in the year in which they are incurred and are reflected under the appropriate heads of accounts. Development expenditure incurred on an individual project is carried forward when its future recoverability can reasonably be regarded as assured. Any expenditure carried forward is amortised over the period of expected future sales from the related project, not exceeding ten years.

The carrying value of development costs is reviewed for impairment annually when the asset is not yet in use, and otherwise when events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying value may not be recoverable.

#### (g) Leased Assets

Leases where the lessor effectively retains substantially all the risks and benefits of ownership of the leased term, are classified as operating leases. Operating lease payments are recognised as an expense in the Profit and Loss account on a straight line basis over the lease term.

#### (h) Government Grants and Subsidies:

When the grant or subsidy relates to an expense item, it is recognised as income over the periods necessary to match them on a systematic basis to the costs, which it is intended to compensate. Where the grant or subsidy relates to an asset, its value is deducted in arriving at the carrying amount of the related asset.

#### (i) Investments:

Investments that are readily realisable and intended to be held for not more than a year are classified as current investments. All other investments are classified as long-term investments. Current investments are carried at lower of cost and fair value determined on an individual investment basis. Long-term investments are carried at cost. However, provision for diminution in value is made to recognise a decline, other than temporary, in the value of the investments.

#### (j) Accounting for Derivatives:

Derivative contracts, other than those covered under AS-11, are marked to market on a portfolio basis, and the net loss after considering the offsetting effect on the underlying hedge item is charged to the income statement. Net gains are ignored.

#### (k) Inventories:

Raw materials, containers, stores and spares	Lower of cost and net realizable value. However, materials and other items held for use in the production of inventories are not written down below cost if the finished products in which they will be incorporated are expected to be sold at or above cost. Cost is determined on a moving weighted average basis.
Finished goods and Work-in-progress	Lower of cost and net realizable value. Cost includes direct materials, labour and a proportion of manufacturing overheads based on normal operating capacity. Cost of finished goods includes excise duty. Cost is determined on standard costing basis.
Traded Goods	Lower of cost and net realizable value. Cost is determined on a moving weighted average basis.

Net realizable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less estimated cost of completion and estimated cost necessary to make the sale.

#### (I) Revenue recognition:

Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably measured.

#### Sale of Goods:

Revenue is recognised when the significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods have passed to the buyer. Gross turnover includes Excise Duty but does not include Sales Tax and VAT.

#### Interest

Revenue is recognised on a time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and the rate applicable.

#### Dividends:

Revenue is recognised when the shareholders' right to receive payment is established by the balance sheet date. Dividend from subsidiaries is recognised even if same are declared after the balance sheet date but pertains to period on or before the date of balance sheet as per the requirement of schedule VI of the Companies Act, 1956.

#### Royalty

Revenue is recognised on an accrual basis in accordance with the terms of relevant agreement.

#### Other Income:

Certain items of income such as insurance claims, overdue interest from customers and other benefits are considered to the extent the amount is ascertainable/accepted by the parties.

### (m) Foreign currency translations

Foreign currency transactions

### (i) Initial Recognition

Foreign currency transactions are recorded in the reporting currency, by applying to the foreign currency amount the exchange rate between the reporting currency and the foreign currency at the date of the transaction.

#### (ii) Conversion

Foreign currency monetary items are reported using the closing exchange rate on the Balance Sheet date. Non-monetary items which are carried in terms of historical cost denominated in a foreign currency are reported using the exchange rate at the date of the transaction; and non-monetary items which are carried at fair value or other similar valuation denominated in a foreign currency are reported using the exchange rates that existed when the values were determined.

#### (iii) Exchange Differences:

Exchange differences arising on the settlement of monetary items or on reporting monetary items of company at rates different from those at which they were initially recorded during the year, or reported in previous financial statements, are recognised as income or as expenses in the year in which they arise except those arising from investments in non-integral operations.

#### (iv) Forward Exchange Contracts:

The premium or discount arising at the inception of forward exchange contracts is amortised as expense or income over the life of the contract. Exchange differences on such contracts are recognised in the statement of profit and loss in the year in which the exchange rates change. Any profit or loss arising on cancellation or renewal of forward exchange contract is recognised as income or as expense for the year.

#### (n) Retirement and other employee benefits:

(i) Retirement benefits in the form of Provident Fund is a defined contribution scheme and the contributions are charged to the Profit and Loss Account of the year when the contribution to the fund accrues. There are no obligations other than the contribution payable to the Provident Fund Trust.

- (ii) Retirement benefits in the form of Superannuation Fund is a defined contribution scheme and the contribution is charged to the Profit and Loss account of the year when the contribution accrues. There are no obligations other than the contribution payable to the Superannuation Fund Trust.
- (iii) Gratuity liability is a defined benefit obligation and is provided for on the basis of an actuarial valuation on projected unit credit method made at the end of each financial year.
- (iv) Short term compensated absences are provided for based on estimates. Long term compensated absences are provided for based on actuarial valuation. The actuarial valuation is done as per projected unit credit method.
- (v) Actuarial gains/losses are recognised immediately to the profit and loss account and are not deferred.
- (vi) Payments made under the Voluntary Retirement Scheme are charged to the Profit and Loss account immediately.

#### (o) Tax Expense:

Tax expense comprises of current, deferred and fringe benefit tax. Current income tax and fringe benefit tax is measured at the amount expected to be paid to the tax authorities in accordance with the Income-tax Act, 1961 enacted in India. Deferred income taxes reflects the impact of current year timing differences between taxable income and accounting income for the year and reversal of timing differences of earlier years.

Deferred tax is measured based on the tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that there is reasonable certainty that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realised. In situations where the Company has unabsorbed depreciation or carry forward tax losses, all deferred tax assets are recognised only if there is virtual certainty supported by convincing evidence that they can be realised against future taxable profits.

At each balance sheet date the Company re-assesses unrecognised deferred tax assets. It recognises unrecognised deferred tax assets to the extent that it has become reasonably certain or virtually certain, as the case may be that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realised.

#### (p) Earning Per Share:

Basic earnings per share are calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders (after deducting preference dividends and attributable taxes) by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period.

For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the period are adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.

#### (q) Provisions

A provision is recognised when an enterprise has a present obligation as a result of past event; it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions are not discounted to its present value and are determined based on best estimate required to settle the obligation at the balance sheet date. These are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.

(r) Cash and Cash equivalents:

Cash and cash equivalents in the balance sheet comprise cash at bank and in hand and short-term investments with an original maturity of three months or less.

#### (s) Segment Reporting:

### Identification of segments:

The Company's operating businesses are organised and managed separately according to the nature of products and services with each segment representing a strategic business unit that offers different products and serves different markets. The analysis of geographical segments is based on the areas in which major operating divisions of the Company operate.

#### Segment Policies:

The Company prepares its segment information in conformity with the accounting policies adopted for preparing and presenting the financial statements of the Company as a whole.

### **AUDITORS' REPORT**

# The Board of Directors Excel Crop Care Limited

- 1. We have audited the attached consolidated balance sheet of Excel Crop Care Limited ('the Company') and its subsidiaries, associates and the joint venture (together referred to as 'the Group'), as at 31 March 2010, and also the consolidated profit and loss account and the consolidated cash flow statement for the year ended on that date annexed thereto. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Company's management and have been prepared by the management on the basis of separate financial statements and other financial information regarding components. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.
- 2. We conducted our audit in accordance with the auditing standards generally accepted in India. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
- 3. We did not audit the financial statements of certain subsidiaries, whose financial statements reflect total assets of Rs. 16,74.86 lacs as at 31 March 2010 and the total revenue of Rs. 11,80.60 lacs for the year then ended. These financial statements and other financial information have been audited by other auditors whose reports have been furnished to us, and our opinion is based solely on the report of other auditors.
- 4. The accompanying consolidated financial statements include the share of the Group's losses in two associate companies, Aimco Pesticides Limited and Kutch Crop Services Limited, of Rs. 66.83 lacs (Previous Year: Rs. 1,00.11 lacs) and Rs. 18.70 lacs (Previous Year: Rs. 4.81 lacs) respectively, determined based on the unaudited financial statements of those entities as at and for the year ended 31 March 2010. We are unable to comment on the impact of adjustments, if any, that may have been required to be made to the accompanying consolidated financial statements, had the financial statements of those associate companies been audited. (Refer Note No.1(c) in Schedule 'U'). Our audit report on the consolidated financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2009 was modified in respect of the matter stated above.
- 5. We report that the consolidated financial statements have been prepared by the Company's management in accordance with the requirements of Accounting Standards ('AS') 21, Consolidated Financial Statements, AS 23, Accounting for Investments in Associates in Consolidated Financial Statements and AS 27, Financial Reporting of Interests in Joint Ventures, notified pursuant to the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006 (as amended).
- 6. Subject to the matters stated in paragraph 4 above, based on our audit and on consideration of reports of other auditors on separate financial statements and on the other financial information of the components, and to the best of our information

and according to the explanations given to us, we are of the opinion that the attached consolidated financial statements give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India:

- (a) in the case of the consolidated balance sheet, of the state of affairs of the Group as at 31 March 2010;
- (b) in the case of the consolidated profit and loss account, of the profit for the year ended on that date; and
- (c) in the case of the consolidated cash flow statement, of the cash flows for the year ended on that date.

#### Consolidation:

(a) The consolidated financial statements comprise of the financial statements of Excel Crop Care Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Holding Company") and its subsidiary companies, joint venture and associates (hereinafter together referred to as "the Group"). - (b) The Holding Company has 50% ownership interest in M/s Multichem Industries, a partnership firm registered in India. The proportionate interest in the said entity as per the latest available Balance Sheet as at 31 March 2010 has been considered for preparation of the aforesaid consolidated financial statements.
- (c) For the purpose of preparation of consolidated financial statements, the investment of the Group in its associate companies are accounted for using the Equity Method. The Group has considered the effect of investment in associate companies viz. Aimco Pesticides Limited and Kutch Crop Services Limited on the financial position and operating results of the Group on the basis of unaudited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2010 of the said associates and in respect of investment of the Group in Excel Bio Resources Limited on the basis of audited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2010.

- (d) For the purpose of consolidation, the financial statements of each of the subsidiary companies and associate companies drawn upto the same reporting period viz. year ended 31 March 2010 have been considered.
- (e) Consolidated financial statements have been prepared in the same format as adopted by the Holding Company, to the extent possible, as required by Accounting Standard AS - 21 'Consolidated Financial Statements' notified under the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006 (as amended).
- (f) Changes have been made in the accounting policies followed by each of the subsidiaries and associates to the extent they were material and identifiable from their respective audited accounts to make them uniform with the accounting policies followed by the Holding Company.
  - Where it has not been practicable to use uniform accounting policies in preparing the consolidated financial statements, the different accounting policies followed by each of the Group companies are stated in Note No. 2 below, to the extent material.
- (g) Translation of the financial statements of foreign subsidiaries for incorporation in the consolidated financial statements have been done by using the following exchange rates:
  - (i) Assets and liabilities have been translated by using the rates prevailing as on the date of the balance sheet.
  - (ii) Income and expense items have been translated by using the average rate of exchange.
  - (iii) Exchange Difference arising on translation of financial statements as specified above is recognised as income or expense in the Foreign Currency Translation Reserve.
- (h) Goodwill arising on consolidation is tested for impairment as at Balance Sheet date.

### 2. Significant Accounting Policies:

The significant accounting policies followed by the Group in the consolidated financial statements are stated hereunder. In case the uniform accounting policy is not followed by each company in the Group, the same, as disclosed in the audited accounts of the said company, has been reproduced.

(a) Basis of Preparation:

The consolidated financial statements have been prepared to comply in all material respects with the Notified Accounting Standards by Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006 (as amended) and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 1956. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention on an accrual basis except in case of assets for which provision for impairment is made. The accounting policies have been consistently applied by the Group and are consistent with those used in the previous year.

### NOTES TO CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### (b) Use of estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the results of operations during the reporting period. Although these estimates are based upon management's best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results could differ from these estimates.

#### (c) Fixed Assets:

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses, if any. Cost comprises the purchase price and any attributable cost of bringing the asset to its working condition for its intended use. Borrowing costs relating to acquisition of fixed assets which takes substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use are also included to the extent they relate to the period till such assets are ready to be put to use.

#### (d) Depreciation:

- (i) In respect of Buildings, Plant and Machinery and Electrical Installations, on straight line basis in accordance with Section 205(2)(b) of the Companies Act, 1956, at the straight line rates specified in Schedule XIV to the Companies Act, 1956.
- (ii) In respect of all other Fixed Assets, on written down value basis in accordance with Section 205(2)(a) of the Companies Act, 1956, at the rates specified in Schedule XIV to the Companies Act, 1956.
- (iii) In respect of additions to/deletions from the Fixed Assets, on pro-rata basis with reference to the date of addition/deletion of the assets except for assets costing Rs.5,000 or less which have been fully depreciated.
- (iv) Leasehold Improvements have been depreciated on straight line basis over the lease period.

#### (e) Impairment:

- (i) The carrying amounts of assets are reviewed for impairment at each balance sheet date if there is any indication of impairment based on internal/external factors. An impairment loss is recognised wherever the carrying amount of an asset exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the greater of the asset's net selling price and value in use. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value at the weighted average cost of capital.
- (ii) After impairment, depreciation is provided on the revised carrying amount of the asset over its remaining useful life.
- (iii) A previously recognised impairment loss is increased or reversed depending on changes in circumstances. However, the carrying value after reversal is not increased beyond the carrying value that would have prevailed by charging usual depreciation if there was no impairment.

#### (f) Intangible Assets and Amortisation:

- (i) Intangible assets are stated at cost less accumulated amortisation.
- (ii) Amortisation of Expenses:

Data Registration expenses (including registration fees) are amortised on a straight line basis over a period of three years, Computer Software / licence fees and Data compensation charges are amortised on a straight line basis over a period of four years and Germ Plasm and Preliminary Expenses are amortised on a straight line basis over a period of five years by Excel Genetics Limited and ten years by ECCL Investments and Finance Limited.

### (iii) Research and Development Costs:

Research costs (other than cost of Fixed Assets acquired) are charged as an expense in the year in which they are incurred and are reflected under the appropriate heads of accounts. Development expenditure incurred on an individual project is carried forward when its future recoverability can reasonably be regarded as assured. Any expenditure carried forward is amortised over the period of expected future sales from the related project, not exceeding ten years.

The carrying value of development costs is reviewed for impairment annually when the asset is not yet in use, and otherwise when events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying value may not be recoverable.

#### (g) Leased Assets

Leases where the lessor effectively retains substantially all the risks and benefits of ownership of the leased term, are classified as operating leases. Operating lease payments are recognised as an expense in the Profit and Loss account on a straight line basis over the lease term.

#### (h) Government Grants and Subsidies:

### Excel Crop Care Limited:

When the grant or subsidy relates to an expense item, it is recognised as income over the periods necessary to match them on a systematic basis to the costs, which it is intended to compensate. Where the grant or subsidy relates to an asset, its value is deducted in arriving at the carrying amount of the related asset.

#### (i) Investments:

Investments that are readily realisable and intended to be held for not more than a year are classified as current investments. All other investments are classified as long-term investments. Current investments are carried at lower of cost and fair value determined on an individual investment basis. Long-term investments are carried at cost. However, provision for diminution in value is made to recognise a decline, other than temporary, in the value of the investments.

Derivative contracts, other than those covered under AS-11, are marked to market on a portfolio basis, and the net loss after considering the offsetting effect on the underlying hedge item is charged to the income statement. Net gains are ignored.

#### (k) Inventories

Raw materials, containers, stores and spares	Lower of cost and net realisable value. However, materials and other items held for use in the production of inventories are not written down below cost if the finished products in which they will be incorporated are expected to be sold at or above cost. Cost is determined on a moving weighted average basis.
Finished goods and Work-in-progress	Lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost includes direct materials, labour and a proportion of manufacturing overheads based on normal operating capacity. Cost of finished goods includes excise duty. Approximately 97% of the total finished goods inventory as on 31 March 2010 has been valued on standard cost basis.
Traded Goods	Lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is determined on a moving weighted average basis.

Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less estimated cost of completion and estimated cost necessary to make the sale.

#### (I) Revenue recognition:

Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Group and the revenue can be reliably measured.

Sale of Goods

Revenue is recognised when the significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods have passed to the buyer. Gross turnover includes Excise Duty but does not include Sales Tax and VAT.

Interes

Revenue is recognised on a time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and the rate applicable.

Dividends

Revenue is recognised when the shareholders' right to receive payment is established by the balance sheet date.

Royalty

Revenue is recognised on an accrual basis in accordance with the terms of relevant agreement.

Other Income

Certain items of income such as insurance claims, overdue interest from customers and other benefits are considered to the extent the amount is ascertainable/accepted by the parties.

### (m) Foreign currency translations:

Foreign currency transactions

#### (i) Initial Recognition

Foreign currency transactions are recorded in the reporting currency, by applying to the foreign currency amount the exchange rate between the reporting currency and the foreign currency at the date of the transaction.

### (ii) Conversion

Foreign currency monetary items are reported using the closing exchange rate on the Balance Sheet date. Non-monetary items which are carried in terms of historical cost denominated in a foreign currency are reported using the exchange rate at the date of the transaction; and non-monetary items which are carried at fair value or other similar valuation denominated in a foreign currency are reported using the exchange rates that existed when the values were determined.

### (iii) Exchange Differences

Exchange differences arising on the settlement of monetary items or on reporting monetary items of company at rates different from those at which they were initially recorded during the year or reported in previous financial statements, are recognised as income or as expenses in the year in which they arise except those arising from investments in non-integral operations.

### (iv) Forward Exchange Contracts

The premium or discount arising at the inception of forward exchange contracts is amortised as expense or income over the life of the contract. Exchange differences on such contracts are recognised in the statement of profit and loss in the year in which the exchange rates change. Any profit or loss arising on cancellation or renewal of forward exchange contract is recognised as income or as expense for the year.

#### (n) Retirement and other employee benefits:

Excel Crop Care Limited

(i) Retirement benefits in the form of Provident Fund is a defined contribution scheme and the contributions are charged to the Profit and Loss Account of the year when the contribution to the fund is due. There are no obligations other than the contribution payable to the Provident Fund Trust.

- (i) Retirement benefits in the form of Provident Fund is a defined contribution scheme and the contributions are charged to the Profit and Loss Account of the year when the contribution to the fund is due. There are no obligations other than the contribution payable to the Provident Fund Authority.
- (ii) Gratuity liability is a defined benefit obligation and is provided for on the basis of an actuarial valuation on projected unit credit method made at the end of each financial year.
- (iii) Compensated absences are provided for based on actuarial valuation. The actuarial valuation is done as per projected unit credit method.
- (iv) Actuarial gains / losses are recognised immediately to the Profit and Loss Account and are not deferred.

#### (o) Tax Expense:

Tax expense comprises of current, deferred and fringe benefit tax. Current income tax and fringe benefit tax is measured at the amount expected to be paid to the tax authorities. Deferred income taxes reflects the impact of current year timing differences between taxable income and accounting income for the year and reversal of timing differences of earlier years.

Deferred tax is measured based on the tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that there is reasonable certainty that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realised. In situations where the Company has unabsorbed depreciation or carry forward tax losses, all deferred tax assets are recognised only if there is virtual certainty supported by convincing evidence that they can be realised against future taxable profits.

At each balance sheet date the Company re-assesses unrecognised deferred tax assets. It recognises unrecognised deferred tax assets to the extent that it has become reasonably certain or virtually certain, as the case may be that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realised.

#### (p) Earnings Per Share:

Basic earnings per share are calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders (after deducting preference dividends and attributable taxes) by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period.

For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the period are adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.

#### (a) Provisions:

A provision is recognised when an enterprise has a present obligation as a result of past event; it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions are not discounted to its present value and are determined based on best estimate required to settle the obligation at the balance sheet date. These are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.

### (r) Cash and Cash equivalents:

Cash and cash equivalents in the balance sheet comprise cash at bank and in hand and short-term investments with an original maturity of three months or less.

### (s) Segment Reporting:

#### Identification of segments:

The Group's operating businesses are organised and managed separately according to the nature of products and services with each segment representing a strategic business unit that offers different products and serves different markets. The analysis of geographical segments is based on the areas in which major operating divisions of the Group operates.

#### Segment Policies:

The Group prepares its segment information in conformity with the accounting policies adopted for preparing and presenting the financial statements of the Group as a whole.

## **DIRECTORS' REPORT**

TO THE MEMBERS.

Your Directors present the Third Annual Report and the Audited Statement of Accounts of the Company for the year ended 31st March, 2010.

## 1. FINANCIAL RESULTS AND OPERATIONS

During the year under review the Sales Turnover was Rs. 198.05 lacs as against Rs. 9.34 lacs in the previous period. During the year the Company incurred a loss of Rs. 54.77 lacs after providing for depreciation and amortisation of intangible assets aggregating Rs. 21.40 lacs. In the previous period the loss after prior period adjustments was Rs. 2.30 lacs.

In view of the losses no dividend is recommended.

The financial year 2009-10 was challenging for the seeds industry due to unfavourable climatic conditions which adversely impacted seeds production as well as sales offtake. Several new players have entered the seeds business and the industry is witnessing large investments.

Your Company is focusing mainly on vegetables segment. The Company expects to make investments in research and production facilities in the next couple of years which is expected to lead to increase in the scale of its business operations.

### 2. ACQUISITION OF SEEDS BUSINESS AND ALLOTMENT OF SHARES

The Company acquired seeds business of Excel Crop Care Limited as a going concern with effect from 1st July, 2009. Accordingly, various assets, liabilities, trade marks, copyrights, licences, registrations, contracts, etc. pertaining to the said business were transferred to the Company at book value. The services of the employees of the seeds business of Excel Crop Care Limited were also transferred to the Company. On 10th August, 2009, the Company allotted at par 1,50,000 equity shares of face value of Rs. 10/- each to Excel Crop Care Limited and thereby became its subsidiary.

### 3. DIRECTORS

The Board of Directors appointed Mr. Ninad D. Gupte and Mr. J. R. Naik as Additional Directors of the Company on 24th September, 2009.

Mr. Ninad D. Gupte and Mr. J. R. Naik hold office up to the date of the ensuing Annual General Meeting of the Company. Notices in writing have been received from a member of the Company under Section 257 of the Companies Act, 1956, signifying its intention to propose Mr. Ninad D. Gupte and Mr. J. R. Naik as candidates for the office of Directors of the Company.

Mr. Ninad D. Gupte is a science graduate and holds a PGDBM degree equivalent to MBA from a reputed Institute. He has over 33 years of business experience. It would be in the interest of the Company that the Board of Directors continue to avail of the benefit of Mr. Ninad D. Gupte's experience and expertise.

Mr. J. R. Naik is a Chartered Accountant and has wide experience and expertise in the areas of accounting, audit, finance, taxation and corporate laws. It would be in the interest of the Company that the Board of Directors continue to avail of the benefit of Mr. J. R. Naik's experience and expertise.

Mr. Sunil Saraiya and Mr. Praful Saraiya resigned as Directors of the Company with effect from 14th December, 2009. The Directors place on record their deep appreciation of the valuable services rendered by Mr. Sunil Saraiya and Mr. Praful Saraiya during their tenure as Directors of the Company.

Mr. Paresh Saraiya, Director, retires by rotation at the ensuing Annual General Meeting of the Company and is eligible for re-appointment. The Board commends his re-appointment.

## 4. DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITY STATEMENT

Pursuant to Section 217(2AA) of the Companies Act, 1956, the Directors confirm that:

(a) in the preparation of the annual accounts, the applicable accounting standards have been followed and that no material departures have been made from the same;

#### NOTES ON ACCOUNTS

#### NATURE OF OPERATIONS:

Excel Genetics Limited is engaged in the business of production, procurement and distribution of seeds.

#### SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

#### (a) Basis of Preparation:

The financial statements have been prepared to comply in all material respects with the Notified Accounting Standards by Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006 and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 1956. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention on an accrual basis except in case of assets for which provision for impairment is made. The accounting policies have been consistently applied by the Company and are consistent with those used in the previous year.

#### (b) Use of estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the results of operations during the reporting period. Although these estimates are based upon management's best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results could differ from these estimates.

#### (c) Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses, if any. Cost comprises the purchase price and any attributable cost of bringing the asset to its working condition for its intended use. Borrowing costs relating to acquisition of fixed assets which takes substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use are also included to the extent they relate to the period till such assets are ready to be put to use.

#### (d) Depreciation

- (i) In respect of Plant and Machinery, on straight line basis in accordance with Section 205(2)(b) of the Companies Act, 1956, at the rates specified in Schedule XIV to the Companies Act, 1956.
- (ii) In respect of all other Fixed Assets, on written down value basis in accordance with Section 205(2)(a) of the Companies Act, 1956, at the rates specified in Schedule XIV to the Companies Act, 1956.
- (iii) In respect of additions to/deletions from the Fixed Assets, on pro-rata basis with reference to the date of addition/deletion of the assets except for assets costing Rs. 5.000/- or less which have been fully depreciated.

#### (e) Impairment:

- The carrying amounts of assets are reviewed for impairment at each balance sheet date if there is any indication of impairment based on internal/ external factors. An impairment loss is recognised wherever the carrying amount of an asset exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the greater of the asset's net selling price and value in use. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value at the weighted average cost of capital.
- (ii) After impairment, depreciation is provided on the revised carrying amount of the asset over its remaining useful life.
- (iii) A previously recognised impairment loss is increased or reversed depending on changes in circumstances. However, the carrying value after reversal is not increased beyond the carrying value that would have prevailed by charging usual depreciation if there was no impairment.

#### (f) Intangible Assets and Amortisation:

- (i) Intangible assets are stated at cost less accumulated amortisation.
- (ii) Amortisation:

Intangible Assets are amortised on a straight line basis over a period of five years.

(iii) Preliminary Expenses are amortised on straight line basis over a period of five years.

#### (g) Leased Assets

Leases where the lessor effectively retains substantially all the risks and benefits of ownership of the leased term, are classified as operating leases. Operating lease payments are recognised as an expense in the Profit and Loss account on a straight line basis over the lease term.

#### (h) Investments:

Investments that are readily realisable and intended to be held for not more than a year are classified as current investments. All other investments are classified as long-term investments. Current investments are carried at lower of cost and fair value determined on an individual investment basis. Long-term investments are carried at cost. However, provision for diminution in value is made to recognise a decline, other than temporary, in the value of the investments.

#### (i) Inventories:

Inventories are valued at lower of cost and net realisable value. However, materials and other items held for use in the production of finished goods are not written down below cost if the finished products in which they will be incorporated are expected to be sold at or above cost. Cost is determined on a First in, First out (FIFO) basis.

#### (j) Revenue recognition:

Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably measured.

#### Sale of Goods

Revenue is recognised when the significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods have passed to the buyer.

Revenue is recognised on a time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and the rate applicable.

#### (k) Foreign currency translations:

#### (i) Initial Recognition

Foreign currency transactions are recorded in the reporting currency, by applying to the foreign currency amount the exchange rate between the reporting currency and the foreign currency at the date of the transaction.

#### (ii) Conversion

Foreign currency monetary items are reported using the closing exchange rate on the Balance Sheet date.

#### (iii) Exchange Differences

Exchange differences arising on the settlement of monetary items or on reporting monetary items of company at rates different from those at which they were initially recorded during the year, or reported in previous financial statements, are recognised as income or as expenses in the year in which they arise.

#### (iv) Forward Exchange Contracts

The premium or discount arising at the inception of forward exchange contracts is amortised as expense or income over the life of the contract. Exchange differences on such contracts are recognised in the statement of profit and loss in the year in which the exchange rates change. Any profit or loss arising on cancellation or renewal of forward exchange contract is recognised as income or as expense for the year.

#### (I) Retirement and other employee benefits:

- (i) Retirement benefits in the form of Provident Fund is a defined contribution scheme and the contributions are charged to the Profit and Loss Account of the year when the contribution to the fund is due. There are no obligations other than the contribution payable to the Provident Fund Authority
- (ii) Gratuity liability is a defined benefit obligation and is provided for on the basis of an actuarial valuation on projected unit credit method made at the end of each financial year.
- (iii) Compensated absences are provided for based on actuarial valuation. The actuarial valuation is done as per projected unit credit method.
- (iv) Actuarial gains/losses are recognised immediately to the profit and loss account and are not deferred.

#### (m) Tax Expense:

Tax expense comprises of current and deferred tax. Provision for current tax is made on the basis of estimated taxable income for the current accounting year in accordance with the Income Tax Act. 1961 and Wealth Tax Act. 1957.

The deferred tax is measured based on the tax rates and tax laws enacted or substantively inacted at the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets and deferred tax liability are offset, if a legally enforceable right exists to set off current tax assets against current tax liability and deferred tax assets and deferred tax liability relates to the taxes on income levied by the same governing taxation laws. Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that there is reasonable certainty that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realised. In situation where the company has unabsorbed depreciation and carry forward tax losses, all deferred tax assets are recognised only if there is virtual certainty supported by convincing evidences that they can be realised against future taxable profits.

At each balance sheet date the Company re-assesses unrecognised deferred tax assets. It recognises unrecognised deferred tax assets to the extent that it has become reasonably certain or virtually certain, as case may be that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realised.

#### (n) Earning Per Share:

Basic earnings per share are calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders (after deducting preference dividends and attributable taxes) by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period.

For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the period are adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.

#### (o) Provisions:

A provision is recognised when an enterprise has a present obligation as a result of past event; it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions are not discounted to its present value and are determined based on best estimate required to settle the obligation at the balance sheet date. These are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.

#### (p) Cash and Cash equivalents:

Cash and cash equivalents in the balance sheet comprise cash at bank and in hand and short-term investments with an original maturity of three months or less.

#### (q) Segment Reporting:

The Company's operating businesses are organised and managed separately according to the nature of products and services with each segment representing a strategic business unit that offers different products and serves different markets. The analysis of geographical segments is based on the areas in which major operating divisions of the Company operate.

#### NOTE 1 - STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The directors have prepared the financial statements on the basis that the Company is a non-reporting entity because there are no users who are dependent on its general purpose financial statements. These financial statements are therefore special purpose financial statements that have been prepared in order to meet the requirements of the Corporations Act, 2001.

The financial statements covers Excel Industries (Australia) Pty Ltd. Excel Industries (Australia) Pty Ltd. is a Company limited by shares, incorporated and domiciled in Australia.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the mandatory Accounting Standards applicable to entities reporting to the Australian Securities and Investments Commission under the Corporations Act, 2001 and the significant accounting policies disclosed below, which the directors have determined are appropriate to meet the needs of the member. Such accounting policies are consistent with the previous year unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the following applicable Australian Accounting Standards:

AASB 101 : Presentation of Financial Statements:

AASB 107 : Statement of Cash Flows:

AASB 108 : Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors;

AASB 110 : Events after the Reporting Period;

AASB 1031 : Materiality;

AASB 1048 : Interpretation and Application of Standards.

No other Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

Reporting Basis and Conventions

The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs modified by the revaluation of selected non-current assets, and financial liabilities for which the fair value basis of accounting has been applied.

The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of this report are as follows:

#### **Accounting Policies**

#### Income tax

#### Current tax

Current tax is calculated by reference to the amount of income taxes payable or recoverable in respect of the taxable profit or tax loss for the period. It is calculated using tax rates and tax laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by reporting date. Current tax for the current and prior periods is recognised as a liability (or asset) to the extent that it is unpaid (or refundable).

#### Deferred tax

Deferred tax is accounted for using the comprehensive balance sheet liability method in respect of temporary differences arising from differences between the carrying amount of assets and liabilities in the financial statements and the corresponding tax base of those items.

In principle, deferred tax liabilities are recognised for all taxable temporary differences. Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is probable that sufficient taxable amounts will be available against which deductible temporary differences or unused tax losses and tax offsets can be utilised. However, deferred tax assets and liabilities are not recognised if the temporary differences giving rise to them arise from the initial recognition of assets and liabilities (other than as a result of a business combination) which affects neither taxable income nor accounting profit.

Furthermore, a deferred tax liability is not recognised in relation to taxable temporary differences arising from goodwill.

Deferred tax liabilities are recognised for taxable temporary differences arising on investments in subsidiaries, branches, associates and joint ventures except where the consolidated entity is able to control the reversal of the temporary differences and it is probable that the temporary differences will not reverse in the foreseeable future

Deferred tax assets arising from deductible temporary differences associated with these investments and interests are only recognised to the extent that it is probable that there will be sufficient taxable profits against which to utilise the benefits of the temporary differences and they are expected to reverse in the foreseeable future.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply to the period(s) when the asset and liability giving rise to them are realised or settled, based on tax rates (and tax laws) that have been enacted or substantively enacted by reporting date. The measurement of deferred tax liabilities and assets reflects the tax consequences that would follow from the manner in which the consolidated entity expects, at the reporting date, to recover or settle the carrying amount of its assets and liabilities.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset when they relate to income taxes levied by the same taxation authority and the Company Intends to settle its current tax assets and liabilities on a net basis.

#### **Foreign Currency Transactions and Balances**

Foreign currency transactions during the period are converted to Australian currency at the rates of exchange applicable at the dates of the transactions. Amounts receivable and payable in foreign currencies at balance date are converted to the rates of exchange ruling at that date.

The gains and losses from conversion of assets and liabilities, whether realised or unrealised, are included in profit from ordinary activities as they arise. The assets and liabilities of overseas controlled entitles, which are self-sustaining, are translated at year-end rates and operating results are translated at rates ruling at the end of each month. Gains and losses arising on translation are taken directly to the foreign currency translation reserve.

#### Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Inventories are supplied to the Company by its parent Company in India at normal "arm's length rates" inclusive of shipping costs and on-sold to the sole customer of the Company in Australia at "mark-up" rates. The Company only orders inventories

from its parent whenever there is an order from its sole customer in Australia. The Company does not hold or carry any inventories other than the inventories shipped from India and in transit for direct shipment to the customer in Australia. All risks for the inventories in transit and on-route to an Australian port are with the parent entity that supplies the inventories.

#### Cash and cash equivalents

For the purposes of the Cash Flow Statement, cash includes cash on hand, at banks and on deposit.

#### Revenue

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised (net of returns, discounts and allowances) when control of the goods passes to the customer. Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets. All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

#### Goina Concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis. Should the Company not make profits it would need to request additional financial support from shareholders or seek additional capital. The directors consider it appropriate to continue to prepare financial statements on a going concern basis as the Parent Company has agreed to provide financial support and there are reasonable grounds to believe the Company will be in a position to pay its debts.

#### **Comparative Figures**

Where necessary to facilitate comparison, comparative figures have been adjusted in some instances to comply with the current year's disclosure.

#### Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of the GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office (ATO).

In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of expense. Receivables and payables are stated with the amount of GST included.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included as a current asset or liability in the financial statement of the financial position.

Cash flows are included in the Cash Flow Statement on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities, which are recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO are classified as operating cash flows.

#### **Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments**

The directors evaluate estimates and judgments incorporated into the financial statements based on historical knowledge and best available current information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the Company.

#### Key Estimates

(a) Impairment

The Company assesses impairment at the end of each reporting period by evaluating conditions and events specific to the Company that may be indicative of impairment triggers.

#### **Adoption of New and Revised Accounting Standards**

During the current year the Company adopted some of the new and revised Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations applicable to its operations, which became mandatory.

The adoption of these standards has impacted the recognition, measurement and disclosure of certain transactions. The following is an explanation of the impact the adoption of these standards and interpretations has had on the financial statements of Excel Industries (Australia) Pty Ltd.

#### **AASB 101: Presentation of Financial Statements**

In September, 2007 the Australian Accounting Standards Board revised AASB 101 and as a result, there have been changes to the presentation and disclosure of certain information within the financial statements. Below is an overview of the key changes and the impact on the Company's financial statements.

#### Disclosure impact

Terminology changes — The revised version of AASB 101 contains a number of terminology changes, including the amendment of names of the primary financial statements.

Reporting changes in equity – The revised AASB 101 requires all changes in equity arising from transactions with owners, in their capacity as owners, to be presented separately from non-owner changes in equity. Owner changes in equity are to be presented in the statement of changes in equity, with non-owner changes in equity presented in the statement of comprehensive income. The previous version of AASB 101 required that owner changes in equity and other comprehensive income be presented in the statement of changes in equity.

Statement of comprehensive income — The revised AASB 101 requires all income and expenses to be presented in either one statement, the statement of comprehensive income, or two statements, a separate income statement and a statement of comprehensive income. The previous version of AASB 101 required only the presentation of a single income statement.

The Company's financial statements now contain a statement of comprehensive income. Other comprehensive income — The revised version of AASB 101 introduces the concept of 'other comprehensive income' which comprises of income and expenses that are not recognised in profit or loss as required by other Australian Accounting Standards. Items of other comprehensive income are to be disclosed in the statement of comprehensive income. Entities are required to disclose the income tax relating to each component of other comprehensive income. The previous version of AASB 101 did not contain an equivalent concept.

#### Segment Reporting

The Company operates in Australia, but it is controlled by a foreign public company domiciled in India. The principal activity of the Company is the import and distribution of chemical products around Australia.

The Financial Report is authorised for issue on 4 May, 2010 by the Board of Directors.

#### NOTES TO ACCOUNTS

#### NATURE OF OPERATIONS:

ECCL Investments and Finance Limited is established with the object of carrying on the business of Investment Company and financing activities. It has, however, not commenced commercial activities.

#### 2. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

#### (a) Basis of Preparation:

The financial statements have been prepared to comply in all material respects with the Accounting Standards notified by Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006 (as amended) and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 1956. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention on an accrual basis. The accounting policies have been consistently applied by the Company and are consistent with those used in the previous year.

#### (b) Use of estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the results of operations during the reporting period. Although these estimates are based upon management's best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results could differ from these estimates.

#### (c) Revenue recognition:

Interest

Revenue is recognised on a time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and the rate applicable.

#### (d) Amortisation:

Preliminary Expenses incurred in connection with incorporation of the Company are amortised on a straight line basis over a period of ten years.

#### (e) Earnings per Share:

Basic earnings per share are calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders (after deducting attributable taxes) by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year.

For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the year are adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.

#### (f) Tax Expense:

Income-tax expense comprises of current tax and deferred tax charge or credit.

Current Income-tax is measured at the amount expected to be paid to the tax authority in accordance with the Income-tax Act, 1961, enacted in India. Deferred Income-tax reflects the impact of current year timing differences between taxable income and accounting income for the year and reversal of timing difference of earlier years.

Deferred tax is measured based on the tax rate and the tax laws enacted or substantively enacted at the Balance Sheet date. The deferred tax charge or credit is recognised using current tax rates. Deferred Tax asset is recognised only if there is sufficient evidence that future taxable income will be available.

#### (g) Provisions:

A provision is recognised when an enterprise has a present obligation as a result of past event; it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions are not discounted to its present value and are determined based on best estimate required to settle the obligation at the balance sheet date. These are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimate required to settle the obligation at the balance sheet date.
