ORDINARY BUSINESS :

1. To receive, consider and adopt the Directors' Report and Audited Statement of Accounts for the year ended 31st March 2015.
2. To consider and if thought fit, to pass, with or without modification(s), the following Resolution, as an Ordinary Resolution:

“RESOLVED THAT pursuant to the provisions of Section 139 read with The Companies (Audit and Auditor) Rules, 2014, 142 and other applicable provisions, if any, of the Companies Act, 2013 and their corresponding rules and based on the recommendations of the Audit Committee, M/s. Pradeep Gupta, Chartered Accountants, Mumbai (Membership No. 048979), who have offered themselves for re-appointment and have confirmed their eligibility in terms of the provisions of Section 141 of the Companies Act, 2013 and Rule 4 of Companies (Audit and Auditors) Rules, 2014, be and are hereby re-appointed as Statutory Auditors of the Company, to hold office from the conclusion of the 33rd Annual General Meeting up to the conclusion of the 37th consecutive Annual General Meeting (subject to ratification by the members at every subsequent AGM) at a remuneration as may be decided by the Board of Directors of the Company.”

SPECIAL BUSINESS :

3. To consider and if thought fit to pass with or without modifications the following resolution as an ordinary resolution :

“RESOLVED THAT Pursuant to the provisions of Section 149 (read with the Rule 3 of the Companies (Appointment & Qualification of Directors) Rules 2014, 152 and all other applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 (the Act) and the Rules framed there under and Clause 49 of the Listing Agreement entered into with the Stock Exchanges (including any statutory modifications or amendments or re-enactment thereof for the time being in force) read with Schedule IV to the Act, Ms. Vandana N. Sahu (DIN : 07145984), who was appointed as an Additional Director of the Company at the Board meeting held on 29th March 2015 and who holds the office up to the date of this Annual General Meeting in terms of provision of section 161 of the Act, and in whose respect the Company has received a notice from a member under Section 160 of the Act, together with necessary deposit as mentioned in the said section, proposing the candidature of Ms. Vandana N. Sahu for the office of Director of the Company, be and is hereby appointed as Non-Executive, Independent Director of the Company for the period of 5 Years commencing from 29th March 2015 and is not liable to retire by rotation.”

4. To consider and if thought fit to pass with or without modifications the following resolution as an ordinary resolution :

“RESOLVED THAT pursuant to the provisions of Sections 2 (54), 196, 197, 203 read with Schedule V to the Act, and all other applicable provisions, if any, of the Companies Act, 2013 (the Act) the Company hereby approves appointment of Mr. Anil Kumar Purohit (DIN : 00082942) as Chairman & Managing Director of the Company, for a period of 3 years commencing from April 1, 2015 up to March 31, 2018 upon the terms and conditions as set out in the Explanatory Statement and the Agreement submitted to this meeting, which Agreement is hereby specifically sanctioned with liberty to the Board of Directors (hereinafter referred to as

“the Board” which term shall deemed to include any Committee of Directors for the time being authorized by the Board of Directors) to alter and vary the terms and conditions of the said appointment and/or Agreement in such manner as may be agreed to between the Board and Mr. Anil Kumar Purohit.”

“RESOLVED FURTHER THAT the Board be and is hereby authorized to do all such acts, deeds and things as may be necessary to give effect to this resolution.”

5. To consider and if thought fit to pass with or without modifications the following resolution as a Special Resolution :

“RESOLVED THAT pursuant to the provisions of Sections 5, 14 and other applicable provisions, if any, of the Companies Act, 2013, read with the Companies (Incorporation) Rules, 2014 (including any statutory modification(s) or re-enactment thereof, for the time being in force), rules and regulations made there under, the enabling provisions of the Memorandum and Articles of Association of the Company and subject to the requisite approvals, consents, permissions and/or sanctions as may be required, if any, the draft regulations contained in the Articles of Association submitted to this meeting and duly initialed be and are hereby replaced, altered, modified and revised as per the new set of Articles of Association, and the new set of Articles of Association be and is hereby approved and adopted as the Articles of Association of the Company in the place and in exclusion and substitution of the existing Articles of Association of the Company;

2. A MEMBER ENTITLED TO ATTEND AND VOTE AT THE MEETING IS ENTITLED TO APPOINT A PROXY TO ATTEND AND VOTE INSTEAD OF HIMSELF/HERSELF AND A PROXY NEED NOT BE A MEMBER OF THE COMPANY. The instrument of Proxy, in order to be effective, must be received at the Company's Registered Office not less than forty-eight hours before the Meeting.

In terms of Rule 19 of the Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014, a person can act as a proxy on behalf of the members not exceeding fifty and holding in the aggregate not more than ten percent of the total share capital of the Company carrying voting rights. A member holding more than ten percent of the total Share capital of those carrying voting rights may appoint a single person as proxy and such person shall not act as a proxy for any person or shareholder.

4. The Register of Directors and Key Managerial Personnel and their shareholding, maintained under Section 170 of the Companies Act, 2013 will be available for inspection by the Members at the Annual General Meeting.
5. A detail of Director seeking appointment / re-appointment in this Annual General Meeting is attached separately to the notice.
6. Corporate Members intending to send their authorized representatives to attend the meeting pursuant to Section 113 of Companies Act, 2013 are requested to send to the Company a certified copy of relevant Board Resolution together with their respective specimen signatures authorizing their representative(s) to attend and vote on their behalf at the meeting.

7. Relevant documents referred to in the accompanying Notice and in the Explanatory Statements are open for inspection by the Members at the Company's Registered Office on all working days (except Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays) between 11.00 A.M. to 1.00 P.M. up to the date of this Annual General Meeting.
8. Shareholders/Investors are advised to send their queries/complaints through the dedicated e-mail Id **blue.circl@gmail.com** for quick and prompt redressal of their grievances.
9. The Shares of the Company are mandated by the Securities & Exchange Board of India (SEBI) for trading in dematerialized form by all investors.
10. The identity/signature of Members holding shares in electronic/demat form is liable for verification with the specimen signatures furnished by NSDL/CDSL. Such Members are advised to bring the relevant identity card issued by appropriate authorities to the Annual General Meeting.
11. Members desirous of getting any information about the accounts of the Company, are requested to send their queries so as to reach at-least ten days before the meeting at the Registered Office of the Company, so that the information required can be made readily available at the meeting.

14. The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) vide Circular ref. no. MRD/DOP/CIR-05/2007 dated April 27, 2007 made PAN mandatory for all securities market transactions and off market/private transaction involving transfer of shares in physical form of listed Companies, it shall be mandatory for the transferee (s) to furnish copy of PAN Card to the Company/RTAs for the registration of such transfer of shares.
SEBI further clarified that it shall be mandatory to furnish a copy of PAN in the following cases:
 - a) Deletion of name of the deceased shareholder (s), where the shares are held in the name of two / more shareholders.
 - b) Transmission of shares to the legal heir(s), where deceased shareholder was the sole holder of shares.
 - c) Transposition of shares – when there is a change in the order of names in which physical shares are held jointly in the name of two or more shareholders.
15. In case of shares held in dematerialized form, the nomination/change in nomination should be lodged with their DPs.
16. Shareholders who have not en-cashed their dividend warrants for the dividends declared for the financial years 2009-10, 2010-11 and 2011-12 are requested to send a letter along with unclaimed dividend warrant, if any or letter of undertaking for issue of duplicate dividend warrant/demand draft. Pursuant to the provisions of Investor Education and Protection Fund (Uploading of information regarding unpaid and unclaimed amounts lying with companies) Rules, 2012, the Company has uploaded the details of unpaid and unclaimed amounts lying with the Company as on September 20, 2013 (date of last Annual General Meeting) on the website of the Company (www.bluecircleservices.com), as also on the website of the Ministry of Corporate Affairs.

17. In terms of Section 124 and 125 of the Companies Act, 2013, any dividend remaining unpaid for a period of seven years from the due date of payment is required to be transferred to the “Investor Education & Protection Fund” (IEPF). Members are requested to en-cash their Dividend Warrants promptly. It may be noted that once the unclaimed dividend is transferred to the IEPF as above, no claim shall lie with the Company in respect of such amount.

19. The Members who have not registered their email address, physical copies of Annual Report 2015 are being sent by the permitted mode.
20. The Notice for the 33rd AGM and instructions for e-voting, along with Attendance Slip and Proxy Form, is being sent by electronic mode to all those members whose email addresses are registered with the Company / Depository Participant(s) unless a member has requested for a hard copy of the same. Members are requested to bring copies of Annual Report to the Annual General Meeting. For members who have not registered their email address, physical copies of aforesaid documents are being sent by the permitted mode.
21. Members can opt for one mode of voting i.e. either by physical ballot or through e-voting. If Members opt for e-voting then do not vote by Physical Ballot or vice-a-versa. However, in case Members cast their vote both by Physical Ballot and e-voting, then voting done through e-voting shall prevail and voting done by Physical Ballot will be treated as invalid.
22. Explanatory Statement pursuant to Section 102 of the Companies Act 2013

ITEM NO. 3

The Board at its meeting held on 29th March 2015, appointed Ms. Vandana N. Sahu as Additional Director of the Company with effect from 29th March 2015, pursuant to Section 161 of the Companies Act, 2013.

Pursuant to Section 161 of the Companies Act, 2013, Ms. Vandana N. Sahu will hold the office up to the date of ensuring AGM. The Company has received Notice in writing under the provisions of Section 160 of the Companies Act, 2013 from the Member along with a necessary deposit proposing the candidature of Ms. Vandana N. Sahu for the office of the Director.

The Company has received from Ms. Vandana N. Sahu –

- Consent in writing to act as Director in Form DIR-2 pursuant to Rule 8 of the Companies (Appointment & Qualification of Directors) Rules, 2014 and;
- Intimation in Form DIR-8 in terms of Companies Appointment & Qualification of Directors) Rules, 2014, to effect that he is not disqualified under sub-section (2) of Section 164 of the Companies Act, 2013.
- A declaration to the effect that he and she meets the criteria of independence as provided in sub-section (6) of section 149 of the Companies Act, 2013

Further, the Board at its meeting held on 29th March 2015, also appointed (subject to approval of Members in AGM), Ms. Vandana N. Sahu as Non-Executive, Independent Director of the Company for a period of 5 Years commencing on following terms & conditions –

1. Remuneration – Company will make payment of Sitting Fees and such amount will be decided mutually, within prescribed limits, subject to maximum of ₹ 5000/- per meeting, apart from expenses to be incurred for attending meetings.
2. Period of Appointment – 5 Years commencing from 29th March 2015
3. The Appointment may be terminated by either party by giving one month notice in writing of such termination or as may be mutually agreed between the parties.

The resolution seeks the approval of members for the appointment of Ms. Vandana N. Sahu as Independent Director of the Company for a period of 5 years commencing from 29th March 2015 up to 28th March 2020 pursuant to Section 149 and other applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Rules made there under. Ms. Vandana N. Sahu will not be liable to retire by rotation.

In the opinion of the Board Ms. Vandana N. Sahu fulfills the conditions for their appointment as Independent Director as specified in the Companies Act, 2013 and the Listing Agreement and are independent of the management.

A copy of the draft letter of appointment setting out the terms and conditions of appointment of Ms. Vandana N. Sahu is available for inspection, without any fee, by the members at the Company's registered office during normal hours on working days up to the date of the AGM.

OVERVIEW OF ECONOMY

The Economy of India is the seventh-largest in the world by nominal GDP and the third largest by purchasing parity (The country is one of the G-20 major economies, a member of BRICS and a developing economy among the top 20 global traders according to the WTO).

According to the Indian Finance Ministry the annual growth rate of the Indian economy is projected to have increased to 7.4% in 2014-15 as compared with 6.9% in the fiscal year 2013-14. In an annual report, the IMF forecast that the Indian Economy would grow by 7.5% percent in the 2015-16 fiscal year starting on April 1, 2015, up from 7.2% (2014-15).

India was the 19th-largest merchandise and the 6th largest services exporter in the world in 2013; it imported a total of \$616.7 billion worth of merchandise and services in 2013, as the 12th-largest merchandise and 7th largest services importer. The agricultural sector is the largest employer in India's economy but contributes a declining share of its GDP (13.7% in 2012-13). Its manufacturing industry has held a constant share of its economic contribution, while the fastest-growing part of the economy has been its services sector which includes, among others, the construction, telecommunications, software and information technologies, infrastructure, tourism, education, health care, travel, trade, and banking industries.

PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS & OUTLOOK

The current financial year was a nightmare for the Company. The Company was mainly into the business of investment in Share & Securities and Small Cap sector performed badly during the financial year under review. The Company has invested into some of small cap companies and due to investigations initiated by several Regulatory Bodies, has forced Company to opt out of such investments. The Company has incurred huge losses on account of such sales and has lost significant portion of working capital which is to the tune of ₹ 1400 Crore.

Gross revenue from operations remained at ₹ 2708.56 Lac in comparison to last years' figure of ₹ 245.63 Lac. In term of Net Profit/(Loss), the Company has incurred a loss of ₹ 1629.71 Lac in comparison to last years' net profit of ₹ 14.87 Lac (after considering Extra-Ordinary Items).

The Company is in to the business of financing activities and investments activities in Capital Market till the time. Beside this, your Company is also into the Advisory Services for needs of financial assistance by Corporate Houses and HNIs. The Company is providing financing services from Banks and Finance Companies on commission basis.

The outlook for the current year is challenging mainly due to lack of sufficient working Capital as well as fear of non-performance by securities where Company has made an investments. Your Company is hopeful of coming out difficult time and will be able to recover from the shock.

DIVIDEND AND RESERVES

Due to losses incurred during the year, your Directors do not recommend any Dividend for the year under review.

During the year under review, no amount was being transferred to General Reserve.

SHARE CAPITAL

The paid up Equity Share Capital as on March 31, 2015 was ₹ 20.3470 Crore. During the year under review, the Company has not issued shares with differential voting rights nor granted stock options nor sweat equity. As on March 31, 2015, none of the Directors and/or Key Managerial Person of the Company hold instruments convertible in to Equity Shares of the Company.

FINANCE AND ACCOUNTS

Your Company prepares its financial statements in compliance with the requirements the Companies Act, 2013 and the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) in India. The financial statements have been prepared on historical cost basis. The estimates and judgments relating to the financial statements are made on a prudent basis, so as to reflect in a true and fair manner, the form and substance of transactions and reasonably present the Company's state of affairs, profits/(loss) and cash flows for the year ended 31st March 2015.

The Company continues to focus on judicious management of its working capital. receivables, inventories and other working capital parameters were kept under strict check through continuous monitoring.

There is no audit qualification in the standalone financial statements by the statutory auditors for the year under review.

PARTICULARS OF LOANS, GUARANTEES OR INVESTMENTS

Details of Loans, Guarantees and Investments, if any, covered under the provisions of Section 186 of the Companies Act, 2013 are given in the notes to the Financial Statements.

SUBSIDIARY COMPANY

Management Discussion & Analysis

MACRO ECONOMIC ENVIRONMENT

FY 2014-15 began with the much awaited Union Elections, which led to the formation of the new BJP-led NDA government at the Centre. This markedly improved business sentiment with visible enthusiasm in the economy. Introduction of certain domestic policies and the sudden and sharp drop in crude oil prices internationally has boosted the Indian economy, side lining significant vulnerabilities that it suffered in FY 2013-14. Further, inflation appears to have been contained with current account deficit within comfortable limits and increased inflows to the economy. There are also some signs of growth pick-up in recent months while attempts have been made to contain fiscal deficit.

There have been a few landmark developments in the monetary policy framework in FY 2015. RBI and the government finalized the monetary policy framework that targets CPI inflation at 4% (+/-) 2% for FY 2017 and beyond after aiming to bring inflation to below 6% by January 2016. Once every six months, RBI is required to publish documents explaining sources of inflation and inflation forecasts for the next 6-18 months. This agreement notes that RBI will have failed to meet the inflation target if inflation is more than 6% or if inflation is less than 2% for three consecutive quarters in FY 2016 and subsequent years. Further, with a view to ensure flexibility, transparency and predictability in liquidity management framework, RBI introduced a new structure for liquidity management on 5th September, 2014. RBI would provide up to 1% of NDTL as liquidity (a) 0.25% of individual banks NDTL to be provided under LAF and (b) remaining portion to be provided through frequent auction of variable rate 14-day term repos (4 times in a reporting fortnight).

REVIEW OF OPERATIONS

Gross revenue from operations remained at ₹ 2708.56 Lac in comparison to last years' figure of ₹ 245.63 Lac. In term of Net Profit/(Loss), the Company has incurred a loss of ₹ 1629.71 Lac in comparison to last years' net profit of ₹ 14.87 Lac (after considering Extra-Ordinary Items).

BUSINESS SEGMENT

The Company is mainly into the business of sole segment of Finance and Investments. The Company is doing the business of investing in to the Capital Market as well as lending money to Corporate and HNIs. Apart from above activities, your Company is also into the business of Advisory Services in accordance with the Accounting Standard 17 notified by Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules 2006.

OPPORTUNITIES

The Capital Markets have continued to scale record levels as euphoria has built up on the possible trajectory of the Indian economy. The markets seem to have priced in a favourable policy environment and a consequent increase in corporate performance in the coming years.

As is the case whenever there is a turn in the economy, capital markets take the lead as they price in future improvement in the macroeconomic fundamentals of the economy. The clear mandate given to the central government and the business friendly reforms expected as a result of this has raised the expectation of both domestic and foreign investors. Further, factors such as rising growth prospects, contraction in Current Account Deficit (CAD) as well as the recent stabilization of the rupee have all contributed to this positive sentiment. Investors have been betting heavily on the economy which has led to high growth of the capital markets. The SENSEX has witnessed a consistent rise in 2014 with a growth of around 40%, reaching record highs and crossing the 29,000 mark in January 2015.

On other front, Non-Banking Financial Companies (NBFCs) have rapidly emerged as an important segment of the Indian financial system. Moreover, NBFCs assume significance in the small business segment as they primarily cater to the credit requirements of the un-organised sector such as wholesale & retail traders, small-scale industries and

small borrowers at the local level. NBFC is a heterogeneous group of financial institutions, performing a wide range of activities like hire-purchase finance, vehicle financing, equipment lease finance, personal loans, working capital loans, consumer loans, housing loans, loans against shares and investment, etc. NBFCs are broadly divided into three categories namely (i) NBFCs accepting deposits from banks (NBFC-D); (ii) NBFCs not accepting/holding public deposits (NBFC-ND); and (iii) core investment companies (i.e. those acquiring share/securities of their group/holding/subsidiary companies to the extent of not less than 90% of total assets and which do not accept public deposits.)

The segment has witnessed considerable growth in the last few years and is now being recognised as complementary to the banking sector due to implementation of innovative marketing strategies, introduction of tailor-made products, customer-oriented services, attractive rates of return on deposits and simplified procedures, etc.

THREATS & CONCERNS

Banking & Capital Markets CEOs are more upbeat about the prospects for the global economy than any other sector (56% believing it will improve over the next 12 months). Their confidence is evident in the fact that more than half are planning to increase headcounts over the next 12 months, most by at least 5%.

However, Banking & Capital Markets CEOs see over-regulation as the biggest policy threat to growth. They would prefer regulations that are clear and designed for the long-term.

On other front, more than 70% of Banking & Capital Markets CEOs see cyber insecurity as a threat to growth, more than any other sector.

Success in this market demands leaders who can manage through uncertainty and complexity as they seek to deal with regulatory change while preparing for the future. This in turn demands a clear sense of who their key customers and markets are going to be in five years' time and what investments and changes will be needed to respond. It also requires a forward looking view on how regulation will interact with the other transformational trends in areas such as cost, returns and the ability to meet customer expectations.

HUMAN RESOURCES

The Company recognizes that its success is deeply embedded in the success of its human capital. During 2014-2015, the Company continued to strengthen its HR processes in line with its objective of creating an inspired workforce. The employee engagement initiatives included placing greater emphasis on learning and development, launching leadership development programme, introducing internal communication, providing opportunities to staff to seek inspirational roles through internal job postings, streamlining the Performance Management System, making the compensation structure more competitive and streamlining the performance-link rewards and incentives.

CORPORATE SUSTAINABILITY AND SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

The Company constantly strives to meet and exceed expectations in terms of the quality of its business and services. The Company commits itself to ethical and sustainable operation and development of all business activities according to responsible care and its own code of conduct. Corporate Social Responsibility is an integral part of the Company's philosophy and participates in activities in the area of education and health.

Board Independence

AUDIT COMMITTEE

 17. To look into the reasons for substantial defaults in the payment to the depositors, debenture holders, shareholders (in case of non-payment of declared dividends) and creditors;
 18. To review the functioning of the Whistle Blower mechanism;
 19. Approval of appointment of CFO (i.e., the whole-time Finance Director or any other person heading the finance function or discharging that function) after assessing the qualifications, experience and background, etc. of the candidate;
 20. Carrying out any other function as is mentioned in the terms of reference of the Audit Committee.

- The N&R Committee shall ensure that the candidate identified for appointment as a Director is not disqualified for appointment under Section 164 of the Companies Act, 2013.
- The N&R Committee shall consider the following attributes / criteria, whilst recommending to the Board the candidature for appointment as Director -
 - a. Qualification, expertise and experience of the Directors in their respective fields;
 - b. Personal, Professional or business standing;
 - c. Diversity of the Board.
- In case of re-appointment of Non Executive Directors, the Board shall take into consideration the performance evaluation of the Director and his engagement level.

Remuneration

The Non Executive Directors shall be entitled to receive remuneration by way of sitting fees, reimbursement of expenses for participation in the Board / Committee meetings. A Non Executive Director shall be entitled to receive sitting fees for each meeting of the Board or Committee of the Board attended by him, of such sum as may be approved by the Board of Directors within the overall limits prescribed under the Companies Act, 2013 and The Companies (Appointment and Remuneration of Managerial Personnel) Rules, 2014.

CEO & Managing Director - Criteria for selection / appointment

For the purpose of selection of the CEO & MD, the N&R Committee shall identify persons of integrity who possess relevant expertise, experience and leadership qualities required for the position and shall take into consideration recommendation, if any, received from any member of the Board.

The Committee will also ensure that the incumbent fulfills such other criteria with regard to age and other qualifications as laid down under the Companies Act, 2013 or other applicable laws.

Remuneration for the CEO & Managing Director

- At the time of appointment or re-appointment, the CEO & Managing Director shall be paid such remuneration as may be mutually agreed between the Company (which includes the N&R Committee and the Board of Directors) and the CEO & Managing Director within the overall limits prescribed under the Companies Act, 2013.
- The remuneration shall be subject to the approval of the Members of the Company in General Meeting.
- The remuneration of the CEO & Managing Director is broadly divided into fixed and variable components. The fixed component comprises salary, allowances, perquisites, amenities and retirement benefits. The variable component comprises performance bonus.

PERFORMANCE EVALUATION

Pursuant to the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and Clause 49 of the Listing Agreement, the Board has carried out the annual performance evaluation of its own performance, the Directors individually as well as the evaluation of the working of its Audit, Nomination and Remuneration and Stakeholders' Relationship Committees. NOTES AND ACCOUNTING POLICIES FORMING PART OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**Company Information**

Blue Circle Services limited (referred to as “Company”) has been incorporated on February 22, 1983 vide CIN L74140MH1983PLC029378 having registered office at Office No. 33, Basement, Mona Shopping Centre, J. P. Road, Near Navrang Cinema, Next To ICICI Bank, Andheri (W), Mumbai-400 058.

The Company is in the business of Investments Activities in Shares & Securities and engaged in treasury operations by way of providing funding solutions to clients by way of providing Loans as well as to cater its services for financial arrangements from Banks & Financing Companies to its Clients.

1. Significant Accounting Policies General**1.1 Basis of accounting and preparation of financial statements**

These financial statements have been prepared to comply in all material aspects with applicable accounting principles in India, the applicable Accounting Standards prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ('Act') read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014, till the Standards of Accounting or any other addendum thereto are prescribed by Central Government in consultation and recommendation of the National Financial Reporting Authority, the existing Accounting Standards notified under the Companies Act 1956 (the Act) shall continue to apply. Consequently, these financial statements are prepared to comply in all material aspects with the Accounting Standards notified under sub section (3C) of section 211 of the Act {Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006} and other relevant provisions of the Companies Act 2013.

All assets and liabilities have been classified as current or non-current as per the Company's normal operating cycle and other criteria set out in the Schedule III to the Companies Act, 2013. Based on the nature of products and the time between acquisition of assets for processing and their realization in cash and cash equivalents, the Company has ascertained its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of current/non-current classification of assets and liabilities.

1.2 Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the generally accepted accounting principles require judgment estimates and assumptions to be made that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities, revenues and expenses and disclosure of contingent liability on the date of the financial statements and results of operations during the reporting year end. Differences between the actual result and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known/materialize. Management believes that the estimates used in the preparation of financial statements are prudent and reasonable. Future results could differ from these estimates.

1.3 Cash Flow :

Cash flow statement has been prepared in accordance with the “indirect method” as explained in the prescribed Accounting Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.

1.4 Fixed Assets :

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost of acquisition, including any attributable cost for bringing the assets to its working condition for its intended use, less accumulated depreciation and impairment loss.

1.5 Depreciation and Amortisation of Tangible Assets :

Depreciation on tangible assets is calculated on a pro-rata basis on the Written Down Value Method at the rates prescribed under Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013 with the exception of the following:- assets costing ₹ 5,000/- or less are fully depreciated in the year of purchase.

1.6 Revenue Recognition :

Revenue is recognized to the extent it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably measured. The following specific recognition criteria must also be met before revenue is recognized

- a) Revenue from sales is recognized when significant risk and rewards in respect of ownership of the products are transferred, recovery of the consideration is reasonably certain. Revenue from sale of goods includes excise duty, sales tax and is net of returns.
- b) Income from advisory services is recognised on accrual basis.
- c) Profit / loss earned on sale of investment are recognised on trade date basis. Profit/Loss on sale of Investment is determined on basis of FIFO cost of the investment sold.

Other Income Recognition

Interest on investments and Loans and Advances is booked on a time proportion basis taking into account the amounts invested or loan given and the rate of interest.

Dividend income is recognized when the right to receive payment is established.

1.7 Foreign Currency Transactions:

Foreign currency transactions are recorded in the books at exchange rates prevailing on the date of the transaction. Exchange differences arising on foreign exchange transactions settled during the period are recognized as income or expense in the profit and loss account of the same period.

Foreign currency assets and liabilities are translated at the period end rates and the resultant exchange differences, are recognized in the profit and loss account.

1.8 Borrowing Cost :

Borrowing Costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition or construction of qualifying assets are capitalized as the cost of the respective assets until the time all subs activities necessary to prepare the qualifying assets intended use are complete. Other Borrowing Costs are charged to the Profit and Loss Account in the period in which they are incurred.

1.9 Retirement and other Employees benefits :

All employee benefit obligations payable wholly within twelve months of the rendering the services are classified as Short Term Employee Benefits. Such Benefits are estimated and provided for in the period in which the employee renders the related service.

Post Employment Benefits

1. P.F. and E.S.I.C Scheme is not applicable to the company.
2. Gratuity is accounted when an employee works for more the 6 months.

1.10 Inventories

Inventories are measured at lower of the cost and net realizable value. Cost of inventories comprises all costs of purchase (net of input credit) and other costs incurred in bringing the inventories to their present location and condition. Costs of consumable and trading products are determined by using the First-In First-Out Method (FIFO).

1.11 Investments

Investments that are readily realisable and are intended to be held for not more than one year from the date, on which such investments are made, are classified as current investments. All other investments are classified as non-current investments.

Long-term Investments are carried individually at cost less provision for diminution, other than temporary, in the value of such Investments.

Current investments are carried individually at the lower of cost and fair value. Costs of investments include acquisition charges such as brokerage, fees and duties.

1.12 Accounting for taxes on Income :

- a) Income tax comprises the current tax and net change in deferred tax assets, which are made in accordance with the provisions as per the Income Tax Act, 1961.
- b) Deferred Tax resulting from timing differences between accounting income and taxable income for the period is accounted for using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted as at the balance sheet date. The deferred tax asset is recognized and carried forward only to the extent that there is reasonable certainty that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax asset can be realized.
- c) The differed tax has not been recognized in financial statement during the year under review.

1.13 Leased Assets :

Assets acquired on leases where a significant portion of the risks and rewards of the ownership are retained by the lessor, are classified as Operating Leases. The rental and all other expenses of leased assets are treated as revenue expenditure.

1.14 Provisions

The Company recognizes a provision when there is a present obligation as a result of a past event that probably requires an outflow of resources and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

1.15 Contingent Liabilities :

A contingent liability is disclosed there is a possible obligation that arises from past events whose existences will be confirmed by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events beyond the control of the Company or a present obligation that is not recognized because it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation.

1.16 Impairment of Assets :

The Company assesses at each balance sheet date whether there is any indication that an assets may be impaired. If any such indication exists, the Company estimates the recoverable amount of the asset. If such recoverable amount of the asset or recoverable amount of the cash generating unit to which the assets belongs is less than the carrying amount, the carrying amount is reduced to its recoverable amount. The reduction is treated as impairment loss and is recognized in the profit and loss account. If at the balance date there is an indication that if a previously assessed impairment loss no longer exists, the recoverable amount is reassessed and the assets is reflected at the recoverable amount.

1.17 Cash and cash Equivalents :

The Company considers all highly liquid financial instruments, which are readily convertible into cash and have original maturities of three months or less from the date of purchase, to be cash equivalents.

1.18 Segment Information :

- a) The Company's business segments are identified around products in which company deals.
- b) The accounting policies used in the preparation of the financial statements of the Company are also applied for segment reporting.
- c) Segment revenues, expenses, assets and liabilities are those, which are directly attributable to the segment or are allocated on an appropriate basis. Corporate and other revenues, expenses, assets and liabilities to the extent not allocable to segments are disclosed in the reconciliation of reportable segments with the financial statements.
- d) Figures in brackets are in respect of the previous year.

- e) Segment Revenues, Results and Other Information: The Company is operating in single segment vide finance and investments, thus segment reporting is not applicable to the Company for the year under review.

1.19 Segment Reporting:

The company operates in Trading activity of Commodity and Shares and is carrying financing activities as well as advisory services for financial arrangements or arrangements of loans, which is only identifiable reporting segment under AS-17 Segment Reporting issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.

1.20 Earnings per Share:




