7. E-voting

- i) Pursuant to the provisions of Section 108 of the Companies Act, 2013 and Rule 20 of Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014 as amended by the Companies (Management and Administration) Amendment Rules, 2015 and Clause 35B of the Listing Agreement, the Company is providing the electronic facility to its members to exercise their right to vote at the AGM. The facility of casting the votes by the members using an electronic voting system from a place other than venue of the AGM ("remote e-voting") will be provided by National Securities Depository Limited (NSDL).
- ii) The facility for voting through ballot paper shall be made available at the AGM and the members attending the meeting who have not cast their vote by remote e-voting shall be able to exercise their right at the meeting through ballot paper.
- iii) The members who have cast their vote by remote e-voting prior to the AGM may also attend the AGM but shall not be entitled to cast their vote again.
- iv) The remote voting period begins from 9:00 a.m. on September 26, 2015 and ends at 5:00 P.M. on September 28, 2015. - xii) The Scrutinizer shall after the conclusion of voting at the AGM, first count the votes cast at the meeting and thereafter unblock the votes cast through remote e-voting in the presence of at least two witnesses not in the employment of the Company and shall make, not later than three days of the conclusion of the AGM, a consolidated scrutinizer's report of the total votes cast in favour or against, if any, to the Chairman or a person authorized by him in writing, who shall countersign the same and declare the result of the voting forthwith.
- xii) The results declared alongwith the report of the Scrutinizer shall be placed on the website of NSDL immediately after the declaration of result by the Chairman or a person authorized by him in writing and communicated to the stock exchanges.

DIRECTORS' REPORT TO THE MEMBERS

The directors submit their report and accounts for the financial year 2014-15.

OPERATIONS

During the year ended March 31, 2015, the sales and other income were Rs. 3,00,000/- against Rs.1,17,721 in the previous year ended 31st March 2014. The loss for the period under review was Rs. 18,225/- as against loss of Rs. 1,04,863/- in the previous year.

DIVIDEND

The directors do not recommend any dividend.

DIRECTORS

i) Retirement by rotation

In accordance with the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and Articles of Association of the Company, Mr V. K. Gupta retires by rotation and is eligible for reappointment.

ii) Declarations by Independent Directors

All Independent Directors have given declarations that they meet the criteria of independence as laid down under Section 149(6) of the Companies Act, 2013 and Clause 49 of the Listing Agreement.

iii) Board Evaluation

The board of directors has carried out an annual evaluation of its own performance, Board committees and individual directors pursuant to the provisions of the Act and the corporate governance requirements as prescribed under Clause 49 of the Listing Agreements.

The performance of the Board was evaluated by the Board after seeking inputs from all the directors on the basis of the criteria such as the Board composition and structure, effectiveness of board processes, information and functioning, etc.

The performance of the committees was evaluated by the board after seeking inputs from the committee members on the basis of the criteria such as the composition of committees, effectiveness of committee meetings, etc.

The Board and the Nomination and Remuneration Committee ("NRC") reviewed the performance of the individual directors on the basis of the criteria such as the contribution of the individual director to the Board and committee meetings like preparedness on the issues to be discussed, meaningful and constructive contribution and inputs in meetings, etc.

In a separate meeting of independent Directors, performance of non-independent directors, and performance of the board as a whole was evaluated, taking into account the views of non-executive directors. The same was discussed in the board meeting that followed the meeting of the independent at which the performance of the Board, its committees and individual directors was also discussed.

iv) Nomination & Remuneration Policy

The Board has, on the recommendation of the Nomination & Remuneration Committee, framed a Policy for selection, appointment and remuneration of Directors and Key Managerial Personnel. More details of the same are given in the Corporate Governance Report.

v) Board Meetings

During the year, five Board Meetings and four Audit Committee Meetings were convened and held. The details are given in the Corporate Governance Report. The intervening gap between the Meetings was within the period prescribed under Companies Act, 2013.

vi) Code of Conduct

The Board of Directors of the Company have adopted Code of Business Conduct & Ethics. All the members of the Board have affirmed compliance with the Code for the year ended 31st March, 2015 and a declaration to that effect signed by the Chairman of the Board is attached and forms part of this report.

vii) Code of Conduct for Prevention of Insider Trading

The Company has a Code of Conduct for Prevention of Insider Trading in the shares and securities of the Company. This Code, inter alia, prohibits purchase/sale of shares of the Company by Directors and employees while in possession of unpublished price sensitive information in relation to the Company.

b) Independent Director

No Independent Director shall hold office for more than two consecutive terms of upto a maximum of five years each, but such Independent Director shall be eligible for appointment after expiry of three years of ceasing to become an Independent Director, provided that the Independent Director shall not, during the said period of three years be appointed in or be associated with the Company in any other capacity, either directly or indirectly.

At the time of appointment of Independent Director, it should be ensured that number of Boards on which such Independent Director serves is restricted to seven listed companies as an Independent Director and three listed companies as an Independent Director in case such person is serving as a Whole-time Director of a listed company or such other number as may be prescribed under the Companies Act, 2013.

iii) Evaluation

The Committee shall carry out evaluation of performance of every Director, Key Managerial Personnel and senior management personnel at regular intervals.

iv) Removal

 - Trading of shares of the company has been suspended by the stock exchanges because of penal reasons.
