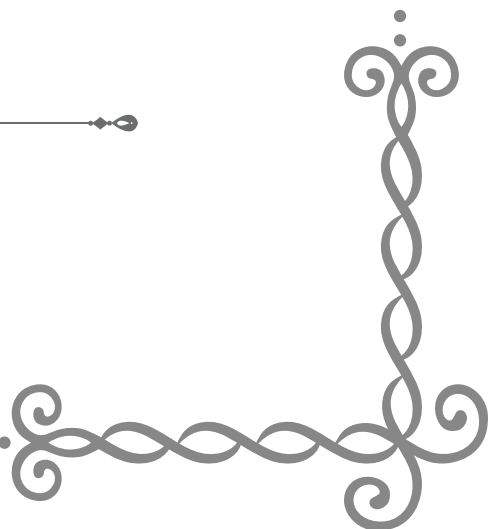

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 108 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 20 of the Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014, and Regulation 44 of the SEBI (Listing Obligation and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 executed by the company with the BSE, the company is pleased to provide members the facility to exercise their right to vote at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) by electronic means and the business may be transacted through e-voting services provided by Central Depository Services Ltd (CDSL).

A member may exercise his votes at any General Meeting by electronic means and company may pass any resolution by electronic voting system in accordance with the Rule 20 of the Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014.

During the e-voting period, members of the company holding shares either in physical form or dematerialised form, as on the cutoff date i.e., December 24, 2020 may cast their votes electronically.

Once the vote on a resolution is cast by a shareholder, the shareholder shall not be allowed to change it subsequently. A copy of this notice has been placed on the website of the Company and the website of CDSL.

Ms. Priya Paranjape who is not in employment of the Company, has been appointed as the Scrutinizer to scrutinize the e-voting process in a fair and transparent manner.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT PURSUANT TO SECTION 102 OF THE COMPANIES ACT, 2013

The following explanatory Statement set out all material facts relating to the Special business mentioned in the accompanying notice

Item No.3

The net worth of the Company as per the latest audited financial statements has been Rs. 61,44,29,670 (Sixty-one Crore Forty-Four Lakhs Twenty-Nine Thousand Six Hundred Seventy). The total liabilities of the Company as per the latest audited financial statements of the Company have been Rs. 105,52,88,476 (one hundred Five Crore Fifty-Two Lakhs Eighty Eight Thousand Four Hundred Seventy Six). The Board of Directors of the Company are of the opinion that the Company's state of assets may not be sufficient enough to pay off the debts and liabilities of the Company. The Board of Directors is also of the opinion that the business operations and opportunities of the Company may not be sufficient to service the cost of finance that is incidental to the debts raised by the Company. The Board of Directors of the Company place on record the intention of the Company to resolve the issue of servicing of debts incurred by the Company and also mentions that the means at the disposal of the Company, through which the debts of the company could be serviced or settled, are limited.

In light of the abovementioned background, the Board of Directors have considered the process of filing a suo-motu application under Section 10 of the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016 for initiating Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process (CIRP) with the Hon'ble Bench of National Company Law Tribunal, Mumbai. The Board of Directors has considered this process to be in the interest of the stakeholders of the Company and shall help the Company to lessen the burden of debts and service the stakeholders of the Company in a better manner.

The Board of Directors seeks the support of the shareholders of the Company and wish to carry this motion and pass this motion with Special Majority.

The Board of Directors also mentions that none of the Directors of the Company is interested in passing of this resolution, except in the capacity of the member of the Company.

2. Brief description of the Company's working during the year/State of Company's affair

The Company's operations have been discontinued due to possession of factory taken over by Edelweiss Asset Reconstruction Company limited. Therefore income from operations was Nil. The Loss was ₹ 2,49,21,154/- as compared to loss of ₹ 2,36,85,298/- during the previous financial year.

3. Dividend

Due to the loss incurred during the year, the Board of Directors of your Company does not recommend any dividend for the Financial Year 2019-2020.

4. Reserves

Due to loss incurred during the year the amount is not transferred to reserves.

5. Share Capital

The paid up capital of the Company as on 31st March, 2020 was ₹ 19,09,40,500. During the year under review, the Company has not issued shares with differential voting rights, sweat equity shares and shares under Employees Stock Option Scheme.

6. Directors and Key Managerial Personnel

In accordance with the provisions of the Act and the Articles of Association of the Company Mr. Chandrakant Joshi, Director retire by rotation at the forthcoming Annual General Meeting and being eligible, offer himself for reappointment.

The Company has received declarations from the Independent Directors of the Company confirming that they meet criteria of independence as prescribed both under the act and SEBI (Listing Obligation and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 2 (51) and 203 of the Act, the Key Managerial Personnel of the Company are Mr. Chandrakant Joshi, Managing Director, Mr. Chetan Kothari, Chief Financial Officer and Ms. Kajal Solanki, Company Secretary.

M/s. R.V. Panamburkar & Associates Chartered Accountants appointed as Auditor of the Company, for a term of 5 (five) consecutive years, at the Annual General Meeting held on 29th September, 2017.

The notes on financial statements referred to in the Auditor's Report are self-explanatory and do not call for any further comments.

12. Auditors' Report:

Our replies to the Auditors' qualifications are as follows:

1. The company was tried to come out from this situation by negotiating with Edelweiss Asset Reconstruction Company Limited. But due to financial crisis the Company could not pay its secured Term Loan and EARC has sold assets in the month of May, 2020.
2. The Company could not find any PE investor and could not settle the dues with Edelweiss Asset Reconstruction Company Limited. Therefore ARC sold assets in the month of May, 2020 in order to recover their dues. Since the negotiations with the lenders are in process; the Company is still going concern.
3. The company is incurring losses and unable to pay any dues. the management is of the opinion that these uncertainties cast significant doubt about the company's ability to continue as a going concern.
4. Due to severe financial crisis, company has requested lenders to waive off interest on loans and therefore no interest provision has been made.

13. Secretarial Audit Report

In terms of Section 204 of the Act and Rules made there under, M/s. Sadashiv Kharmate & Associates, Company Secretaries, Practicing Company Secretary have been appointed Secretarial Auditors of the Company. The report of the Secretarial Auditors is enclosed as Annexure II to this report. The report is self-explanatory .

14. Vigil Mechanism/Whistler Bowler Policy :

MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION & ANALYSIS REPORT

Industry structure and developments:

India being the second-largest producer of fruits and vegetables, facilitates the fruit and vegetable processing industry in acquiring its primary resources. Canning, dehydration, pickling, provisional preservation, and bottling are some of the methods used in fruit and vegetable processing which help increase the shelf life of seasonal fruits and vegetables.

The ongoing corona virus pandemic is a public health emergency with grave implications for the population of the world. India, as part of the global community, has been adversely impacted by ongoing health crisis. The CoVID-19 pandemic is spreading throughout the world, including India, which led to nation-wide lockdown from March 25, 2020. Consequently, revenues and the profitability have been adversely affected in over.

Data compiled by the government-owned Agricultural and Processed Food Products Export Development Authority (APEDA) showed a 16 per cent decline in India's fruit and vegetable exports at \$1 billion for the period between April 2019 and January 2020, from \$1.19 billion for the same period the previous year.

Opportunities and Threats.

Agricultural Sector is a backbone of India's economy .It provides major employment opportunities to the rural population and consequently it provides a large domestic market for manufactured goods.

Stockpiling canned and frozen fruit and vegetables

Due to Covid impact the demand for canned beans, fruit and vegetables. All canneries around the world have large orders for smaller retail can sizes. But, the demand for bigger cans (5-15 kg) for the foodservice sector has decreased due to the closures of restaurants. Producers of fresh products have had many order cancellations, forcing them to redirect products to processing.

Fruit juice sales have also increased. The majority of bottling companies are focusing on the production of orange and apple juice, as exotic ingredients are hard to source. From an importers point of view, major ingredients, such as frozen concentrated orange juice were also being 'panic bought'. Frozen berries were also in higher demand (and had higher prices as a result) because of the idea that they strengthen the immune system.

Labour force shortage

In several major producing areas, labour is not available. Limitation of movement is one of the main reasons, but also fear of infection by workers. For example, in the Philippines, people are locked in their houses. This has stopped the production and delivery of desiccated coconut and dehydrated bananas.

Thailand is another example. There, companies harvested pineapples earlier than usual due to fears that they would not have enough workers. This resulted in lower quality products. In India, due to lack of buses and trains, workers cannot travel and harvest yields. Also, India cannot process (imported) cashew nuts due to the foreign border closure. This is already resulting in a price increase.

Supply chain issues

The logistics sector reported problems in finding enough truck drivers, the restrictions on sea transporters and a lack of air freight Ocean freight is facing a shortage of containers, which is a major problem for exporters from developing countries

Some of the major challenges faced by juice manufacturers in India include the reluctant attitude displayed by local farmers towards fruit farming, current volatility in prices of fruits and the lack of storage facilities for fruit based products.

Segment-wise or product-wise performance.

As there is n production in the factory due to discontinued operation there is no discussion on segment wise or product wise performance.

Outlook

Edelweiss Asset Reconstruction Company Limited (EARC) who is in the possession of all the Assets of the Company that they have entered into an Agreement for sale of assets of the Company to third Party under private treaty. The management of the Company is considering various options to revive the Company. The Company have confidence that in spite of many difficulties comes across industry will perform better in view of its strong fundamentals and its activity turn into better progress which meets expectations of investors.

Risks and concerns.

There are very wide fluctuations in the price, quality and quantity of raw material produced and is also widely dependent on the environment factors like rainfall and other crop conditions. Exchange rate risks on export of goods are the primary risks associated with the business of the Company.

Due to discontinued operation company is facing cash crunch difficulties in the company.

The Company has put in place an adequate system of internal controls commensurate with the size and nature of operations to ensure that the transactions are properly recorded, authorized and the assets are continuously monitored and safeguarded. The internal control system is backed up by well documented policies, guidelines and procedures. The adequacy and effectiveness of the Internal Control Department is reviewed by the Audit Committee of the Board which recommends control measures from time to time.

The financial statements have been prepared in compliance with the requirement of the Companies Act, 2013 and Indian Accounting Standards in India.

3. The uncertainties and facts mentioned above cast significant doubt upon company's ability to continue as a going concern.
4. The company has not made the provision for interest on deposit as the company has requested some of the lenders to waive off some part of their interest on loan.

Adverse Opinion

NOTES ON ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st MARCH, 2020**1- SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES****1.1 Basis of preparation of Financial Statements:**

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Accounting Standards notified under the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2016 as amended by Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2018 and other relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013. Financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention on accrual basis, except for certain financial instruments which are measured at fair value.

1.2 Use of Estimates:

The preparation of financial statements requires the management of the Company to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported balances of assets and liabilities and disclosures relating to the contingent liabilities as at the date of the financial statements and reported amounts of income and expenses during the year. Examples of such estimates include provisions for doubtful receivables, employee benefits, provision for income taxes, the useful lives of depreciable fixed assets and provision for impairment. Future results could differ due to changes in these estimates and the difference between the actual result and the estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known/ materialize.

1.3 Discontinued Operations:

IND AS 105 requires non-current asset and assets of a disposal group classified as held for distribution separately from other assets in balance sheet. It also requires that the liabilities of a disposal group should be classified as held for distribution separately from other liabilities in balance sheet. As the company operates in single segment i.e. Processing of fruit products and has discontinued the operations since 1 April 2017, all the assets and liabilities except Property Plant and equipment should be considered as held for distribution from April 1, 2017.

Property Plant and equipment are not classified as held for sale as they are no longer in control of management (Possession by Edleweiss Asset Reconstruction Company.)

1.4 Property Plant and Equipment, Depreciation and Amortization**a) Property Plant and Equipment:**

Property Plant and Equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation/ amortisation. For this purpose cost comprises of cost of acquisition and all costs directly attributable to bringing the asset to the present condition for its intended use.

The company is unable to ascertain the fair value of the plant on date of transition as the only plant being depreciated and other assets and equipments there under are in the possession of CDR lenders.

Event occurring balance sheet date :

As per the communication received from Edelweiss Asset Reconstruction Company the Assets of the company has been sold to the private entity as on 27/04/2020.

b) Method of Depreciation:

In respect of property plant and equipment acquired during the year, depreciation/ amortization is charged on a straight line basis so as to write-off the cost of the assets over the useful lives and for the assets acquired prior to 1st April, 2014, the carrying amount as on 1st April, 2014 is depreciated over the remaining useful life based on an evaluation.

1.5 INVESTMENTS:

Investments that are readily realizable and intended to be held for not more than a year are classified as current investments. All other investments are classified as long term investments. Long term investments are carried at cost as there is no certain information available to measure fair value. Provision for diminution in value of long term investment is made only if such a decline is other than temporary.

1.6 PROVISION AND CONTINGENT LIABILITIES:

The Company recognizes a provision when there is a present obligation as a result of a past event that probably requires an outflow of resources and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. Provisions are not discounted to present value and are determined based on best estimate required to settle the obligation at the Balance Sheet date. A disclosure for a contingent liability is made when there is a possible obligation or a present obligation that may, but probably will not, require an outflow of resources. Where there is possible obligation or a present obligation that the likelihood of outflow of resources is remote, no provision or disclosure is made.

1.7 GOVERNMENT GRANTS/ SUBSIDY:

Grants/Subsidy related to revenue is credited to Statement of Profit & Loss on accrual basis.

1.8 REVENUE RECOGNITION:

Sales and Other Income -

The Company recognizes the sale of goods when the significant risks and rewards of ownership are transferred to the buyer, which is usually when the goods are dispatched to the customers.

Interest Income and other items are accounted on Accrual Basis.

1.9 INVENTORIES

Finished goods stock is valued at lower of cost or net realizable value and stock of raw material is valued at cost.

1.10 TAXES

Tax expense comprises of Current Income Tax and Deferred Tax. Deferred income taxes are recognized using the liability method on temporary differences between the financial statement determination of income and their recognition for tax purposes. The effect of deferred tax assets and liabilities of a change in tax rates is recognized in income using the tax rates and tax laws that have enacted or substantively enacted by the Balance Sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognized and carried forward only to the extent that it is probable that future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realized.

1.11 IMPAIRMENT OF PROPERTY PLANT AND EQUIPMENT.

Although there are significant indications that impairment is required but the company is unable to estimate asset's current fair value as the premises are under possession of Edelweiss Asset Reconstruction Company lenders and hence out of bounds to the management of the company. Hence no impairment has been provided for.

1.12 TRADE RECEIVABLES

Trade receivables are recognized initially at fair value and subsequently measured at amortized cost using the effective interest method, less provision for impairment, if any.

1.13 FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

(i) Financial Assets

A. Initial recognition and measurement

All financial assets are recognized initially at fair value plus, in the case of financial assets not recorded at fair value through profit or loss transaction costs that are attributable to the acquisition of the financial asset. Purchase and sale of financial assets are recognized using trade date accounting.

B. Subsequent measurement

a) Financial assets carried at amortized cost (AC)

A financial asset is measured at amortized cost if it is held within a business model whose objective is to hold the asset in order to collect contractual cash flows and the contractual terms of the financial asset give rise on specified dates to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding.

b) Financial assets at fair value through other comprehensive income (FVTOCI)

A financial asset is measured at FVTOCI if it is held within a business model whose objective is achieved by both collecting contractual cash flows and selling financial assets and the contractual terms of the financial asset give rise on specified dates to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding.

c) Financial assets at fair value through profit or loss (FVTPL)

A financial asset which is not classified in any of the above categories are measured at FVTPL.

C. Other Equity Investments

All other equity investments are measured at fair value, with value changes recognized for those equity investments for which the Company has elected to present the value changes in 'Other Comprehensive Income'.

D. Impairment of financial assets

The Company recognizes loss allowances using the expected credit loss (ECL) model for the financial assets which are not fair valued through profit or loss. Loss allowance for trade receivables with no significant financing component is measured at an amount equal to lifetime ECL. The amount of expected credit losses (or reversal) that is required to adjust the loss allowance at the reporting date to the amount that is required to be recognized is recognized as an impairment gain or loss in profit or loss.

(ii) Financial liabilities

A. Initial recognition and measurement

All financial liabilities are recognized at fair value and in case of loans, net of directly attributable cost. Fees of recurring nature are directly recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss as finance cost.

B. Subsequent measurement

(i) Trade and other payables:

These amounts represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the company prior to the end of financial year which are unpaid. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition. Trade and other payables are presented as current liabilities unless payment is not due within 12 months after the reporting period. They are recognised initially at their fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

(ii) Loans and borrowings:

After initial recognition, interest-bearing loans and borrowings are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the EIR method. Gains and losses are recognised in profit or loss when the liabilities are derecognised as well as through the Effective Interest Rate (EIR) amortisation process. The EIR amortisation is included as finance costs in the statement of profit and loss. This category generally applies to borrowings.

1.14 OFFSETTING FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

Financial assets and liabilities are offset and the net amount is reported in the balance sheet where there is a legally enforceable right to offset the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or realise the asset on a net basis or realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously. The legally enforceable right must not be contingent on future events and must be enforceable in the normal course of business and in the event of default, insolvency or bankruptcy of the Company or the counterparty.

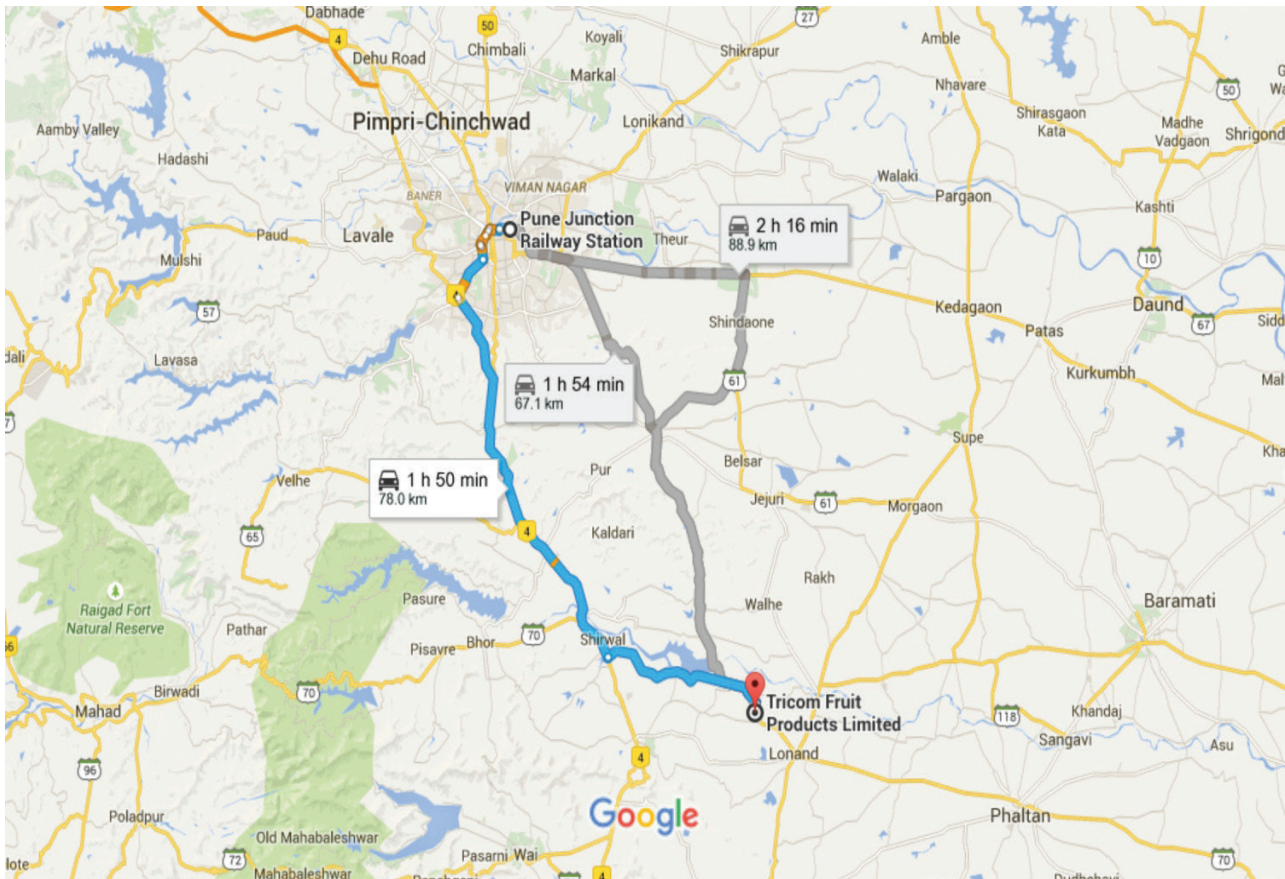
