Independent Auditor's Report on Audit of Annual Standalone Financial Results and Review of Half yearly Financial Results

To

### Opinion

We have audited the accompanying statement of half yearly and year to date standalone financial results of Lex Nimble Solutions Limited ("the Company") for the half year ended March 31, 2024 and for the year ended March 31, 2024 ("Statement"), attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ('Listing Regulations').

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid statement:
