The respective Board of Directors of the companies included in the Group are responsible for

(34.00) lakhs for the quarter and year ended 31st March, 2024 respectively and net cash flow of Rs. (47.80) lakhs for the year ended 31st March 2024, as considered in the Consolidated financial results, which has been audited by the other auditor of that subsidiary Company. The independent auditor's report on financial statements of subsidiary have been furnished to us by Management and our opinion on the Consolidated financial results, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of subsidiary are based solely on the report of such auditor and the procedures performed by us are as stated in paragraph above.

Subsidiary which is located outside India whose financial statements and other financial information have been prepared in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in its respective country and which have been audited by other auditor under generally accepted auditing standards applicable in its respective country. The Holding Company's management has converted the financial statements of such subsidiary located outside India from accounting principles generally accepted in its respective country to accounting principles generally accepted in India. We have audited these conversion adjustments made by the Holding Company's management. Our opinion in so far as it relates to the balances and affairs of such subsidiary located outside India is based on the report of other auditors and the conversion adjustments prepared by the management of the Holding Company and audited by us.



Our opinion on the Consolidated financial results is not modified in respect of the above matter with respect to our reliance on the work done and the report of the other auditor.

ii) The Consolidated financial results include the results for the quarter ended 31st March, 2024 being the balancing figure between the audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the published unaudited year to date figures up to the third quarter of the current financial year prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in Indian Accounting Standard 34 "Interim Financial Reporting" which were subject to limited review by us.

Our opinion is not modified in respect of the above matter.
