WOMAN'S MURDER IN MANALI

Yellow stain on accused's shirt led to arrest

WOMAN'S KIN SAID ACCUSED BLACKMAILED HER FOR MONEY

A yellow stain on the shirt of the man, who hacked his girlfriend to death at a hotel in Manali on Wednesday, led to his arrest. The Manali police told Free Press that accused had left the bag behind, which contained the body of 26-year-old Sheetal Kaushal, before fleeing. The hotel staff told police that man was wearing a white shirt, which had a yellow stain on left side, which might have occurred after food dropped on his shirt while having meals. The police sealed all the borders of the hill station and succeeded in arresting him within a few hours on Wednesday night. Manali DSP KD Sharma told Free Press that accused Vinod Thakur (23), a native of Haryana, had befriended Sheetal Kaushal three years ago on social media. With no photographs of the accused and defunct hotel CCTV cameras, the police were dependent merely on yellow stain as a clue.

Sheetal's mother on accused

Victim Sheetal Kaushal's mother told Free Press that Thakur visited Bhopal earlier to meet Sheetal. She added that Sheetal went missing from her house in Shahpura on May 5. She had taken Rs 10,000 with her, and did not tell anyone about it. Sheetal was going. "Later, we learnt about the incident over the phone, which was a shocker for all of us. She had told her brother Rohit once that Vinod had been blackmailing her to extort money from her," she did not want to be named. Sheetal's father Kalish Kaushal had lodged a missing person complaint at Shahpura police station about her.

Duo visited Manali for second time: Kullu SP

Superintendent of police Dr Kartikay Gokulchandran told Free Press that this was the second time that the duo had visited Manali. The accused has not revealed the exact reason behind killing the woman, he said. He said the post-mortem was carried out in presence of Sheetal's father and two brothers who reached Manali on Friday.

Fire at Salkanpur temple complex leaves 10 shops gutted

Fire brought under control, no human casualty reported

No human casualty was reported but more than 10 shops were gutted in the fire, said the police. No damage to the temple, which was closed at the time of incident, has been reported so far. According to police station in-charge Rajesh Kabara, the fire broke out in one of the shops at the temple complex of Salkanpur Devichand in Sehore district. Locals spotted the flames around 9:30 pm. The temple closes off around 7:30 pm. Police and fire brigade were alerted about the blaze on the temple premises. Fire fighters reached the spot within half an hour on receiving the information. The shopkeepers initially tried to control the fire by pouring water from buckets but finally the fire brigade doused the blaze. As per preliminary investigations, a short circuit is suspected to have led to the fire in one of the shops and then it spread to other shops. Local shopkeepers told media persons that the fire started from a shop around 9:30 pm and within a short span it spread to nearby shops. It was impossible to climb down the stairs because of the blaze and so firefighters threw water from the balconies of the above and brought the flames under control.

Proper maintenance of grids is crucial, Tomar to subordinates

Madhya Pradesh West Zone Electricity Distribution Company managing director Amit Kumar Friday directed officials to do proper maintenance of grids, days after a major fire broke out in a grid at Sangam Nagar power station plunging many colonies into dark for several hours during the sweltering night. "With the scorching heat prevailing, special attention should be laid towards grid maintenance, alongside a dedicated focus on uninterrupted power supply to hospitals and water sources," he said addressing the officials of all 15 circles under the West Zone through a video conference. Emphasizing the need for proactive steps, Tomar stressed on the importance of minimizing power disruptions during the rains. He urged superintending engineers across all 15 districts in Madhya Pradesh to ensure effective preparations for impending monsoon by the end of May. Summarizing the progress of RDSS' project initiated in January, he asked for timely revenue collection and grievance redressal. The meeting also included a comprehensive review of the progress on ongoing projects, including the power sector, since January Tomar outlined directives concerning revenue collection, efforts to mitigate line loss, and prompt resolution of complaints. Chief general manager Rinkesh Kumar Vaishya, director Punit Dubey, SACs, and chief engineer SR Banamke, superintendent engineer (Indore city) Manoj Sharma, and superintendent engineer (Indore rural) shared their thoughts during the conference as well.

The 58-year-old mother of slain Punjabi rapper Sidhu Moosewala, who conceived a child through In-Vitro

Fertilization (IVF) technique, has given hope to many childless couples aged 50 plus to go for the treatment to fulfill their desire for parenthood. The late singer Moosewala's parents had thought stated that they used the IVF facility abroad as women accessing ART facilities in India are mandated to be aged 21 to 50 years by law. As per the law, women under 50 and men 55 years of age or younger are eligible for IVF treatment in India.

Since the doctors do not entertain any couple failing to meet the age requirements, some of the 'over-aged couples' have resorted to obtaining false affidavits about age to qualify for IVF treatment. Assisted reproductive technology (ART) procedures or procedures address fertility it can include artificial insemination, in-vitro fertilisation (IVF) and surrogacy and other related treatments or procedures. Guddi Bai (name changed) aged 58 years came all the way from Mandla near Jabalpur to get a surrogate to Bhopal for IVF treatment in a private hospital.
