





Crop Prices- 2013 Vs Current Year






Current year during all stages of cropping cycle, Prices are lower than past; leading to lower sentiments which continued even in Rabi season

RURAL INCOME HITS A LOW

Income growth – a measure of how earnings increase or decrease – in rural areas has been stuck in the mid-to-low single digits in 2015 so far, well below the 20%-plus rates in 2011



INCOMES ARE BARELY RISING


- Since October 2014, rural wage growth has slowed from about 17% to about 3% currently
- The average daily rural wage for ploughing/ tilling in May 2015 was ₹272.87, only 3.3% higher than the wages paid in May last year.

FLOCKING BACK FROM TOWNS?


- Fewer opportunities in urban construction sector may be driving people back to villages
- More such people, in turn, are keeping rural wages from rising fast
- Roads and highways aren't being created fast enough to absorb armies of unskilled landless rural labourers

LOSING MONEY

Incomes have also eroded as minimum support prices (MSPs) haven't kept pace with rising input costs. Only a handful of crops are now profitable.











Dry Spells after initial rains impacted the crop health





Brazil Market



The Brazilian agrochemical market plunged in dollar terms by almost a quarter (23%) in 2015
