- 1 The above financial results have been reviewed by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors in their meeting held on 21st May 2024. The Statutory Auditors have carried out limited review of the same.
- 2 Deployment of rig Jindal Supreme with ONGC was delayed in 2020 on account of business disruption caused by COVID-19 pandemic. Thereafter, an amount of USD 1.704 mn was withheld by ONGC since 2020 against liquidated damages levied on the Company. In line with decision of Outside Expert Committee (OEC) to whom the matter was referred and to conclude this matter amicably, settlement agreement has been executed with ONGC. Consequently, USD 0.982 mn will be received in Q1 FY25 as per terms of settlement agreement. Balance amount receivable from ONGC has been written off, resulting in increase in other expenses in Q4 FY24.
- 3 Other Income includes a net foreign exchange gain of Rs 368.21 lakhs in Q4 FY24 (Rs. (103.51) lakhs in Q4 FY23) and Rs. 613.25 lakhs in FY24 (Rs. 2822.78 lakhs in FY23) on account of external commercial borrowing and others.
- 4 In consolidated accounts Sr. No. 7 above, there is a loss of Rs. 1500 lakhs in Q4 FY24. This has been caused by the Company's share of Rs. 5281.35 lakhs, under equity accounting method, of a one time provision for impairment made by joint venture, Discovery Drilling Pte. Ltd. against difference between book value and fair market value of its rig Jindal Pioneer classified as held for sale. This impairment does not impact the cash EPS of the Company which has increased in FY24 from last year.
- 5 The above results have been prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting standard (IND-AS) as prescribed under section 133 of the Companies Act 2013, read with the relevant Rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India.
- The Company's main business is "Drilling and Related Services". As such, there is no separate reportable segments as per Ind AS on "Operating Segment" (Ind AS-108).
- 7 The Board of Director's has recommended a dividend of Rs. 0.50 per share (10%) for the financial year ended 31st March 2024 on equity share of Rs. 5/-each (previous year Rs. 0.50/-per share)
- 8 The figures for the quarter ended 31st March 2024 and 31st March 2023 are the balancing figures between Audited figures for the full financial year ended March 31, 2024 and March 31, 2023 respectively and unaudited published year to date figures up to December 31, 2023 and December 31, 2022 respectively
- 9 Figures of the previous periods have been regrouped/ recast / reclassified wherever considered necessary.

#### **Basis for Opinion**

We also performed procedures in accordance with the Circular No. CIR/CFD/CMD1/44/2019 dated March 29, 2019 issued by the Securities Exchange Board of India under Regulation 33 (8) of the Listing Regulations, to the extent applicable.





#### Other Matter

The accompanying Statement includes the statements and other financial information, in respect of: Two joint ventures, whose financial statements include Group's share of net profit(loss) / total comprehensive profit(loss) of Rs. (4680) lakhs and Rs. (6295) lakhs for the quarter and for the year ended March 31, 2024, respectively net profit (loss)/ total comprehensive profit (loss) of Rs. (774) lakh and Rs. (1494) lakh for the quarter and for the year ended March 31, 2023 respectively, as considered in the Statement whose financial statements and other financial information have been audited by their respective independent auditors.

The independent auditor's report on the financial statements of these entities have been furnished to us by the Management and our opinion on the Statement in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of these joint venture is based solely on the reports of such auditors and the procedures performed by us as stated in paragraph above.

Bothjoint ventures are located outside India whose financial statements and other financial information have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in their respective countries and which have been audited by other auditors under generally accepted auditing standards applicable in their respective countries. The Parent Company's management has converted the financial statements of such joint venture located outside India from accounting principles generally accepted in their respective countries to accounting principles generally accepted in India. We have audited these conversion adjustments made by the Parent Company's management. Our opinion in so far as it relates to the balances and affairs of such joint venture located outside India is based on the report of other auditors and the conversion adjustments prepared by the management of the Parent Company and audited by us.

The Statement includes the results for the quarter ended March 31, 2024, being the balancing figures between the audited figures in respect of the full financial year ended March 31, 2024, and the published unaudited year-to-date figures up to the end of the third quarter of the current financial year, which were subjected to a limited review by us, as required under the Listing Regulation.
