CONG VS BJP YET AGAIN

After BJP's complaint, EC removes banners against Mandaviya in Rajkot

ADY after banner with pictures of Union Health and Family Welfare Minister Mansukh Mandaviya and Congress leader Lalit Vasoya, his Porbandar Lok Sabha contest rival, surfaced in Dhoraji town of Rajkot, the BJP on Wednesday lodged a complaint with the Election Commission (EC). After the ruling party claimed that the banners discriminated against its candidate, the District Electoral Officer (DEO) of Rajkot got the banners removed.

The fresh controversy ahead of the national elections has sparked yet another row with Vasoya claiming that the banners were put up by a 'BJP worker' upset over Mandaviya's candidature. Earlier, similar posters had surfaced in Vadodra against BJP MP Ranjan Bhat who later opted out of the Lok Sabha race.

The BJP in its complaint on

Wednesday the electoral officers alleged that the banners in Dhoraji discriminated against his candidate and attempted a "level playing field". "An attempt has been made to cause damage to BJP's candidate for Porbandar Lok Sabha seat and to give an advantage to his rival candidate by hoisting controversial banners in various parts of Dhoraji town on the night of March 25, 2024. Additionally, by hoisting these banners illegally, an attempt has

also been made to disturb social harmony of this area and by using the language used in it, an attempt has also been made to promote regional chauvinism," Ramesh Odedara, president of Porbandar district unit of the BJP, stated in his complaint.

The complaint also underlined that the banners bore no name of the printer or those who had it printed and hence in violation of the provisions of Section 127A of the Representation of People Act, 1950 as well as Section 17(1)(h) of the Indian Penal Code.

KD Lakhani (DEO) of Porbandar confirmed Wednesday that his office had received the complaint from the BJP. "However, the area falls in the jurisdiction of Rajkot DEO and therefore Rajkot DEO will take appropriate action," Lakhani said.

Rajkot DEO Prabhav Joshi said that his office too had received the complaint and taken cognisance of the matter. "We have received the complaint. We

have already removed the banners," said Joshi.

Labeling Mandaviya as an "imported candidate", the banners had four questions below the banners. "Who will be able to do our work over the next five years? Porbandar Lok Sabha demands a local candidate. Who can be that candidate? Porbandar Lok Sabha won't get along with an imported candidate. Who is he? Who will remain among the voters for the next five years?" read the questions, loosely translated from Gujarati.

While Vasoya is a resident of Dhoraji, Mandaviya is a native of Hanoi village in Palitana taluka of Bhavnagar district. He is presently a member of the Kaya Sabha. However, the BJP has fielded him from Porbandar. This is Mandaviya's maiden Lok Sabha contest.

Vasoya, who is president of the Rajkot district unit of Congress, has already fought three elections. He won the election to Dhoraji Assembly seat in

2017 by defeating Hari Patel of the BJP. However, he lost the 2019 Lok Sabha election to BJP's Ramesh Dhadi. Congress gave a ticket to Vasoya to seek re-election from Dhoraji seat in the assembly election in 2022. However, he was defeated by Professor Mahendra Padalia of the BJP.

Both Hari Patel and Prof. Padalia are residents of Rajkot and during his campaigns, Vasoya had sought to paint the BJP candidates as outsiders.

Meanwhile, Vasoya claimed that the banners were hoisted in Dhoraji, Upleta and some villages by BJP functionaries and that Congress had nothing to do with them. "The banners were hoisted by a press briefing worker who hails from Jetpur taluka as BJP workers are unhappy as the party has fielded a candidate who is not a local of this area. The posters were removed by some other BJP workers. We have nothing to do with this development," the Congress leader told *The Indian Express*.

NEARLY 1.6 LAKH political propaganda posters, banners and advertisements have been removed from government properties from March 15, when the Model Code of Conduct came into effect, till Wednesday, Chief Electoral Officer P. Bharathi said in Ahmedabad.

Additionally, 58,697 similar posters and advertisements were removed from private properties across the entire state during the same period, she said.

Cash worth Rs 1.16 crore has been seized so far by 756 flying squads operating in the state for monitoring and control of election expenditure, Bharathi stated during a press briefing Wednesday.

The squads have also seized items worth Rs 42.62 crore, including more than 1.94 lakh litre liquor worth Rs 7.37 crore, Rs 16.84 kg gold and silver worth Rs 11.44 crore, 52.26 kg of charas and ganja worth Rs 14 lakh, and other items, including motor

cars, motorcycles, cigarettes, lighters and inedible jaggery worth Rs 22.50 crore.

A total of 588 complaints have been received between March 16 and March 27 on the C-Vigi mobile app developed by the Election Commission where any citizen can file an online complaint about violation of the Model Code of Conduct from any place. All these complaints have been properly disposed off immediately as per the EC guidelines.

A total of 3,537 complaints have been received on the National Grievance Services

Portal, including 2,459 complaints related to voter identity cards, 249 about voter list, and 49 linked to voter slip, among others. In addition, 23 complaints—all of which have been disposed of—have been received on the helpline number of the Control Room operating at the Office of the Chief Returning Officer in these 11 days.

The office has received eight complaints related to the media, one about political parties and seven linked to other election commissions through post and e-mail.

According to an ECI notification dated March 19, the department of Electricity, BSNL, Railways, Doordarshan, All India Radio, state health department, aviation, long distance bus services, of the Gujarat State Transport Corporation, fire services, media personnel authorised by the poll panel for election day coverage, traffic police, and ambulance services have been asked to give a categorical response. Voters engaged in these jobs will be eligible to cast their vote through postal ballots.

CALLS ITS CLAIMS 'RECKLESS', DIRECTS GPCB TO INSPECT SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANTS

HC pulls up AMC for failure to cite plan for zero wastewater discharge into Sabarmati

THE GUJARAT High Court has reprimanded the Ahmedabad Municipal Commissioner after the civic body failed to provide clear roadmap on how to look to achieve the target of zero wastewater discharge into the Sabarmati river.

In an order dated March 22, the court also directed the Gujarat Pollution Control Board (GPCB) to inspect nine Sewage Treatment Plants (STPs) of the Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation (AMC) to check if the stipulated norms are being met while treating wastewater.

Providing a last opportunity to the AMC commissioner M. Theerarasan, to file an affidavit and offer to record a detailed roadmap with timelines for each step for the upgradation of existing STPs, the court has now posted the matter for the next hearing on April 12.

In the order made public earlier this week, the division bench of Chief Justice Sunita Agarwal and Justice Anurudha Mayee also took "strong exception" to the affidavit filed by the Additional Chief Engineer, Sewage Operations, AMC, that shows violation on the part of the AMC in submitting response

to our precise queries made after going through the affidavits filed on behalf of AMC prior to 10.11.2023."

The bench was left unimpressed by AMC's efforts after it was observed that "STP analysis reports of August, September, October 2023 brought on record... also do not indicate any remarkable progress made in the functioning of the STPs."

Currently, AMC has 16 STPs with a treatment capacity of 1,335 Million Litres Per Day (MLD) of sewage wastewater to tackle the 1,300 MLD domestic sewage generation by Ahmedabad. However, the city's sewage generation is expected to grow to around 1,610.37 MLD and 2,192 MLD by 2040 and

2055 respectively.

Meanwhile, the court inquired about the treatability capability or efficiency of the existing STPs as it was earlier established that the plants are working below par—some working at as low as 30 per cent efficiency. Noting that "there is no remarkable change in the treated sewage levels of the STP in the STP analysis reports" with the treated wastewater still not meeting the stipulated parameters as per the details provided in an affidavit dated March 14 filed by the Ahmedabad municipal commissioner, the court took objection to the commissioner's submission that the STPs are working "optimally". The court recorded in its order that

such a submission by the commissioner is "reckless" as "optimal" is synonymous with "ideally, perfectly, impeccably and flawlessly" whereas, the opposite of "optimal" is "inadequate, insufficient and unsatisfactory".

"Even from the dictionary meaning of the word 'optimal', it can be said that in view of the facts brought on the record of the affidavits dated 02.02.2024 and 14.03.2024, it was not possible for the Deputy Municipal Commissioner (Projects) and the Municipal Commissioner, Ahmedabad to make a statement that the STPs of the AMC are working optimally. We may further record that we are taking exception to this statement made by the officers of the AMC as we do not expect them to give us the figures of the existing performance of the existing STPs only," the court observed.

The bench also noted, "No accolades can be given in the fact that the existing STPs (7 in number) are not up to the mark and cannot meet the standards fixed by the NGT (National Green Tribunal) in 2015. About 7 years have gone by when the NGT has prescribed norms/standards for operating the STPs. There is no categorical plan forthcoming to meet each required standard in a phased and time bound manner so as to reach the target."

The court added that the way the AMC has responded to its orders dated August 18, 2021 and November 10, 2023 shows a lack of clarity among the civic body officials as well.

"Either they do not understand the meaning of 'road map' or they do not want to give a categorical and clear response to this court as to how they visualise or plan to achieve their objectives to upgrade the existing STPs, which are admittedly not meeting the standards prescribed by the NGT for domestic Sewage Treatment Plant," the bench said.

The court further took the municipal commissioner to task. "It is clear that the Municipal Commissioner, AMC has utterly failed to answer our queries and either he has no plans or he is avoiding to give a categorical roadmap... This approach in a Public Interest Litigation is highly deprecated. We take strong exception to the manner in which the Municipal Commissioner, AMC has responded to our queries... it seems that either he is insensitive or treats this petition as an adversarial litigation, as he is only trying to defend the action of the AMC and takes accolades in what has been done after his own motto congruence has been taken by this court in the present petition."

Ailing lioness that attacked three dies amid treatment in Amreli

AN AILING lioness that had attacked three people, including two forest officials, before being rescued in Amreli died Wednesday after treatment at an animal care centre, an official said.

While a post-mortem will be conducted to ascertain the exact cause of her death, G. Vaghela, assistant conservator of forest of Shetrunji Wildlife Division, said the big cat, aged over 12 years, was already unwell when it was rescued. The lioness' poor health might be the reason behind her death, Vaghela said. On March 23, this lioness had attacked and injured a security guard of a plastic manufacturing unit situated near Mitrayala Village of Jafrahad taluka, said Vaghela. The guard was referred to a nearby hospital and he is out of danger.

"Later, the sarpanch of Mitrayala village gave the location of that lioness to our staff and told them that the big cat looked ill and in distress. When our staff, who reached the spot in their four-wheelers, was trying to spot her using binoculars, the big cat suddenly charged towards them," said Vaghela. While driver Veera Vaghela and tracker Hareesh Pandya went inside their vehicle, the lioness broke its left window pane and attacked the two, he said. Pandya and Vaghela sustained injuries on the head, shoulder and hands, said Vaghela, adding that both were out of danger and injured under treatment. After attacking our staff, the lioness hid in the nearby bushes, he said.

AND WHEREAS by Gazette Notification No. S.O. 722 (E) dated 16th February, 2024 (published in the Gazette of India: Extraordinary Part II, Section 3 (ii)), in exercise of powers under sub-section (1) of Section 5 with sub-section (1) of Section 4 of the Act, the Central Government has constituted a Tribunal comprising Hon'ble Mr. Justice Parasuram Kumar Kaur, Judge of the High Court of Delhi, for adjudicating as to whether or not there is sufficient cause for declaring Students Islamic Movement of India (SIMI) as an "Unlawful Association" as required by sub-section (1) of Section 4 of the said Act.

NOW THEREFORE, a notice is hereby given under sub-section (2) of Section 4 of the Act and you are hereby called upon to show cause, within 30 days from the date of service of notice as to why your Association, declared as unlawful, be not adjudicated to be so and why an order conferring such declaration be not made under Section 4(3) of the Act.
