#### INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

#### TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTOR OF TATVA CHINTAN PHARMA CHEM LIMITED

#### REPORT ON THE AUDIT OF CONSOLIDATED ANNUAL FINANCIAL RESULTS

#### Opinion

- We have audited the accompanying Consolidated Annual Financial Results of Tatva Chintan Pharma Chem Limited (hereinafter referred to as "Holding Company") and its subsidiaries (Holding Company and its subsidiaries together referred to as "the Group") for the year ended March 31, 2024, attached herewith, being submitted by the Holding Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ("Listing Regulations").
- 2. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the Consolidated Annual Financial Results for the year ended March 31, 2024:
  - i. includes the results of Tatva Chintan USA Inc. and Tatva Chintan Europe B.V. (Subsidiaries);
  - ii. are presented in accordance with the requirements of the Listing Regulations in this regard; and
  - iii. gives a true and fair view in conformity with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the applicable Indian Accounting Standards and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the consolidated net profit after tax and other comprehensive income and other financial information of the Group for the year ended March 31, 2024.

#### **Basis for Opinion**

3. We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing ("SAs") specified under Section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act"). We believe that the audit evidence obtained by us is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

The respective Board of Directors of the companies included in the Group are responsible for maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Group and its associate and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgements and estimated that are reasonable and prudent; and the design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the consolidated financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, which have been used for the purpose of preparation of the Consolidated Annual Financial Results by the Directors of the Holding Company, as aforesaid.
- 5. In preparing the Consolidated Annual Financial Results, the respective Board of Directors of the companies included in the Group are responsible for assessing the ability of the respective entities to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the respective Board of Directors either intends to liquidate their respective entities or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.
- 6. The respective Board of Directors of the companies included in the Group are also responsible for overseeing the financial reporting process of their respective companies.

#### Auditor's Responsibilities for the audit of the Consolidated Annual Financial Results

- 7. Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the Consolidated Annual Financial Results for the year ended March 31, 2024 as a whole is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of this Consolidated Annual Financial Results.
- 8. As part of an audit in accordance with SAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:
  - Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the Consolidated Annual Financial Results, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher





than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.

- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, Under Section 143(3)(i) of the Act, we are also responsible for expressing our opinion on whether the company has adequate internal financial controls with reference to financial statements in place and the operating effectiveness of such controls.

- 10. - 11. We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.
- 12. We also performed procedures in accordance with the circular No. CIR/CFD/CMD1/44/2019 dated March 29, 2019 issued by SEBI under Regulations 33(8) of the Listing Regulations, as amended, to the extent applicable.





#### **Other Matters**

13. The Consolidated Annual Financial Results include the results for the quarter ended March 31, 2024, being the balancing figures between the audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the published unaudited year to date figures up to the third quarter of the current financial year, which were subjected to limited review by us.

Our report on the Consolidated Annual Financial Results is not modified in respect of this matter.

14. The Consolidated Annual Financial Results dealt with by this report have been prepared for the purpose of filing with National Stock Exchange of India Limited and BSE Limited. These results are based on and should be read with the audited consolidated financial statements of the Holding Company for the year ended March 31, 2024 on which we have issued an unmodified audit opinion vide our report dated May 3, 2024.
