

Gujarat COVID-19 Update: 1035 new cases



Ahmedabad : Gujarat COVID-19 figures on Friday touched 1,78,683 as the state recorded 1,035 new cases. This is the first time after almost a fortnight that cases have crossed the 1000 level. The state has recorded over 1,300 cases for 26 days now while it has recorded over 1,400 cases for nine days so far. The state has carried out 51,534 tests in the last 24 hours. 1,321 patients were cured of COVID-19 in the state in the last 24 hours taking the recovery rate to 91.16%. The state has in all recorded 12,036 active cases of which 69 are on ventilator

support. So far 1,62,846 patients have recovered from the disease in the state. The state also saw four fatalities due to the disease. Of these, two are in Ahmedabad and one each in Bharuch and Surat. Of the total deaths in Surat and Ahmedabad, two were in AMC and one in SMC limits. With this, the Gujarat COVID-19 fatalities stand at 3,751. The addition of two fatalities reported in the past 24 hours has taken the death toll due to COVID-19 in Ahmedabad to 1,917. The death toll has increased to 860 in Surat, whereas it remains 209 for

Vadodara and 94 for Gandhinagar. Surat city saw 152 new cases being recorded while 58 were reported from the district. Similarly, the Ahmedabad Corporation area had 160 new cases while it was 15 in the district. Vadodara and Gandhinagar corporations respectively recorded 76 and 20 cases. Interestingly, the city limits of Gandhinagar had fewer cases than the district. The state has so far crossed over 1,200 cases per day 11 times. Gujarat has recorded over 1,100 cases 28 times, over 1,000 cases 22 times, over 900 cases 19 times and over 800 cases for six days. It has recorded more than 700 cases in a day five times so far. 51,534 tests were conducted in the last 24 hours as part of Gujarat COVID-19 with the number of tests per million per day now standing at 792.83. The state has tested over 63 lakh people for COVID-19 since the pandemic began.

Congress leader Shaktisinh Gohil tests



Ahmedabad : Congress leader Shaktisinh Gohil has tested positive for COVID-19. He tweeted about his status saying that he got himself an RT-PCR test in which he tested positive for COVID-19. Several Congress leaders including Ahmed Patel from the state have tested positive for the disease. Some of the other top political leaders from BJP and Congress who tested positive are Harsh Sanghvi, Bharatsinh Solanki, Kishor Chauhan, Nimaben Acharya, Jagdish Panchal, Ketan Inamdar, CJ Chavda, Imran Khedawala, Nirajan Patel, Kanti Kharodi, Geniben Thakor, Raghu Desai, Shankersinh Vaghela, Balram Thavani, Ramesh Ghadku, Amit Shah, Kirit Solanki among others.

Safety hazard: 542 schools in Ahmedabad lack fire NOC



Ahmedabad: Five hundred forty-two schools in Ahmedabad lack a fire NOC. This shocking figure came to light after the Education Department in Gujarat issued a notification asking schools to ensure that they have the mandatory NOC. Of the total 16,187 schools in the state, only 3,221 schools have a fire NOC. The situation prevails despite 22 children losing their lives in a fire in a tuition class in Surat 2.5 years ago. As schools lined up to get the NOC, it has emerged that higher secondary schools in Ahmedabad just 461 have a fire NOC. This means 542 schools lack a NOC. The education department had in a notification asked the schools to get the fire NOC within a fortnight. What is interesting is that many schools that are seeking NOC don't have buildings that are compliant with fire safety norms for schools. In all, 12,277 schools in the state have no NOC. Why fire department is finding it difficult to issue fire NOC? Fire department officials said that the education department should have checked for NOC before giving the schools permission to start functioning. Moreover while issuing the notification the education department should have asked the schools to ensure that their buildings are as per the Fire Safety Act before seeking the fire NOC. The official said schools are scrambling to get the NOC but the fire department can't issue the same until the structures are constructed to comply with School Fire Safety norms.

Court allows Hardik to travel outside Gujarat for 17 days



Ahmedabad : The Gujarat High Court on Friday partly allowed state Congress working president Hardik Patel's plea to travel outside the state and granted him permission to move outside the state for 17 days. The high court had on November 4 sought the itinerary of his plan to travel outside the state after he had sought a temporary modification of his bail condition, primarily on the ground that Patel was a "star campaigner" for the Congress in the Bihar Assembly polls, and required to travel to New

Delhi owing to legal consultation for the ongoing litigations at the Supreme Court. On Friday, the high court allowed Patel to travel outside the state between November 11 and December 2, but said he will not conduct or attend any rally and "not indulge himself into any political activity or shall not indulge into any kind of activity which would constitute any offence" during the period. Advocate Anand Yagnik, appearing for the Congress leader, submitted Friday Patel's itinerary to travel outside Gujarat before Justice

RM Sareen, who was seized of the matter. It stated that Patel planned to enjoy his first vacation with his wife in Rajasthan, and then perform the last rites of an uncle at either Haridwar or Devprayag. The court, in its order, recorded, "The applicant (Hardik Patel) is permitted to travel outside the local limits of Gujarat state from 11.11.2020 to 13.11.2020 i.e. Delhi for political reasons, from 18.11.2020 to 23.11.2020 i.e. Rajasthan for a vacation with his wife, from 24.11.2020 to 28.11.2020 i.e. Delhi for conferences with

advocates at Supreme Court and from 29.11.2020 to 01.12.2020 for Haridwar or Devprayag, at Uttarakhand, as the case may be depending upon the advice of elders and traditions that follows - for last rites of an uncle, as per the schedule submitted." The court further stated Patel would have to return to Gujarat on or before December 2, and since his itinerary reflected that he planned to be in the state between November 14 and 17, "no permission is granted for the said period of four days". Justice Sareen said, "In case of any change in the above schedule, for which permission has been granted by this court... the applicant shall inform the concerned police station and to the office of the public prosecutor." Patel, who was appointed working president of state Congress in July, Friday told The Indian Express, "I am yet to meet the (Congress) high command in (New) Delhi, so I have plans to meet them... There are also plans in Rajasthan and Maharashtra to hold discussions on the farm legislations with some local NGOs for the public... It was in a sedition case where a bail condition was once imposed that I cannot enter Gujarat (in July 2016, by the Gujarat High

Court) and then an Ahmedabad sessions court imposed a condition that I can't go out of Gujarat." The bail condition stipulating him to seek prior permission of the court before leaving the state was imposed on Patel in January after he was arrested for failing to appear before an Ahmedabad trial court in connection with an FIR filed in 2015 by the crime branch, wherein he was charged with sedition during the Patidar agitation. While granting him bail, the trial court had then imposed the condition that he would be required to seek prior permission of the court before leaving the local limits of Gujarat. The Congress leader had then submitted that he wanted to campaign for the party for the Bihar Assembly elections. In September, the lower court rejected his plea following which Patel challenged the decision before the Gujarat High Court. The final phase of polling for the Bihar state election will be held Saturday, while the first two phases of polling were held on October 28 and November 3.

Guj High Court grants bail to accused in loot & theft of 25,000 kg of pistachio

Ahmedabad: The Gujarat High Court has granted bail to two accused drivers involved in the theft and loot of 25,110 kg of pistachio worth Rs1.44 crore from a truck which was loaded from Adani Port, Mundra and was heading towards Mumbai. According to the police, Mayursinh Jadeja and Kuldeepsinh loaded 25,110 kg pistachio in their vehicles after the original truck driver (complainant) Lavkush Nishad, who was carrying the pistachio to Mumbai was abducted by some people at gunpoint from Anjar. They then took the pistachio to Ahmedabad. Advocate Utkarsh J Dave representing the petitioner submitted before the high court that the two men have not been named in the FIR and they were arrested based on a statement made by the other co-accused. As far as the role of the applicants were concerned, they were drivers who had delivered the stolen goods as instructed. Hence they should be released on bail. The Gujarat High Court while granting bail to both the accused observed that prima facie it is a fit case to exercise discretion and enlarge the applicants on regular bail. The court also ordered both the accused to deposit Rs10,000 each as personal bond with the trial court. Earlier Additional District Court, Anjar had rejected the bail application of both the accused because the investigation is at a crucial stage. No bills of the said goods (pistachio) were available from the accused and hence bail couldn't be granted to them. The two had then moved the high court. According to the FIR lodged with the Anjar Police Station, the complainant (original truck driver) had loaded his truck with 25,110 kg pistachio worth rupees Rs1.44 crore from Adani Port in Mundra. He was to deliver the same in Mumbai. When the truck reached Anjar, a white car blocked his way and he was kidnapped from his truck at gunpoint. They tied the complainant and took him with them in a car. A day later they released him near Mundra Bridge palya in Anjar and escaped. The driver then contacted his colleagues and company which traced the stolen trucks to Mithi Rohar Highway through GPS. When the truck was found the consignment had been stolen. The complainant (original truck driver who was abducted) worked as a driver with VRS logistics private limited.

Gujarat : LRD male aspirants submit memos, seek 'permission to die'

Ahmedabad : Several male aspirants for the Lok Rakshak Dal (LRD), an arm of the Gujarat Police, have begun to submit memorandums to district collectors across the state Friday seeking permission to exercise their 'right to die' after they were allegedly stopped from holding peaceful protests in connection with their demand for supernumerary posts for men in the recruitment process. The LRD male job aspirants have been protesting after the Gujarat government, in February, announced more than 2,000 supernumerary posts for women in LRD recruitment. Male aspirants are also demanding a similar number of supernumerary posts. On Friday, an aspirant from Banaskantha district, Suresh Gehlot, said, "We have submitted a memorandum to the district collector in Banaskantha Friday. We are seeking permission to die since the state government has not been allowing us to peacefully protest for our right." Gehlot has been "making statements that there is no agitation related to the government recruitment process in the state."

2 days after Pirana-Pipdaj fire kills 12, AMC seals six godowns for lacking fire NOC

Ahmedabad : Two days after a blast and fire in a textile factory at Revabhai Nanubhai estate in Pirana-Pipdaj brought down the structure killing 12 people and injuring several others, the AMC swung into action. It is inspecting warehouses and godowns of chemical factories and on Friday sealed six godowns in the south zone. All the six godowns were functioning without requisite permission and also lacked fire NOC. AMC's actions beg the question as to why the civic body waited for a tragedy to act against such warehouses storing hazardous chemicals. During the checking, AMC officials found several hazardous chemicals in both liquid and powder form in huge quantities being stored in these warehouses. Some of the chemicals that were found stored included

hydrogen peroxide, potassium, sodium hexanoate. They also recovered several drums with chemicals stored in them. A fire in a textile factory in Nanubhai Estate in Pirana-Pipdaj trapped 14 people killing 12 of them. Of the total deceased seven are men and five are women. The fire led to a blast in the boiler which also brought down the structure trapping 14 people inside. Six fire tenders were rushed to the spot. Later NDRF was also pressed into action and 21 people were rescued. 10 people were injured in the incident. Sources said that the factory did not have fire safety and that the owner is absconding. Gujarat chief minister Vijay Rupani announced a compensation of Rs4 lakh each for the deceased who died in the Pirana cloth factory fire incident on Wednesday.

Couple fights, abandons baby on ventilator at hospital in Jamnagar



Jamnagar : A husband-wife duo abandoned their one-month-old newborn at a hospital. The newborn was admitted to the GG Hospital in Jamnagar and put on a ventilator some days ago. Hospital authorities said that the couple had a fight about

medical expenses and then the duo in a fit of anger left the baby in the hospital. Doctors at the hospital said that at present an NGO has stepped in and the hospital has also pitched in to help fund the expenses of the baby's treatment. Doctors said that the newborn is responding

well to treatment and is on the mend. The hospital is now trying to trace the parents of the child who abandoned him in the hospital. Hospital sources said that the baby, born a month ago, was brought to the hospital as his health had started deteriorating.
