OPINION

We have audited the accompanying Statement of Standalone Financial Results of M/s ARO GRANITE INDUSTRIES LIMITED ("the Company"), for the quarter and nine months ended December 31, 2023 ("the statement"), being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ("the Listing Regulations").
