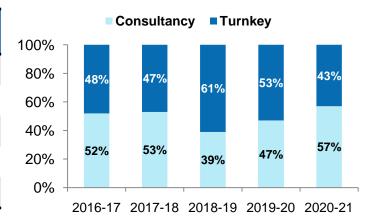

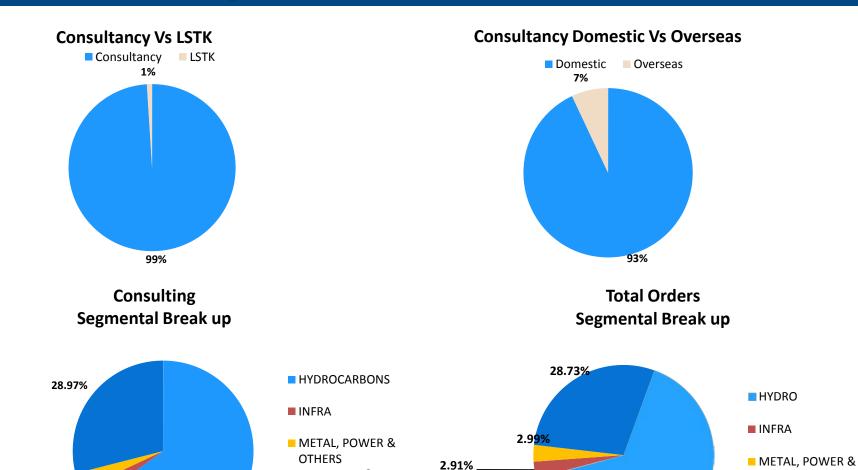

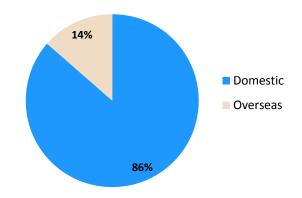

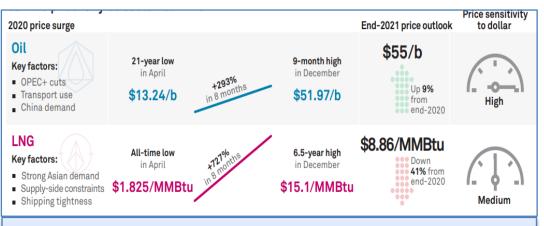

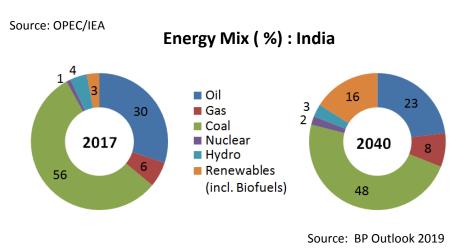

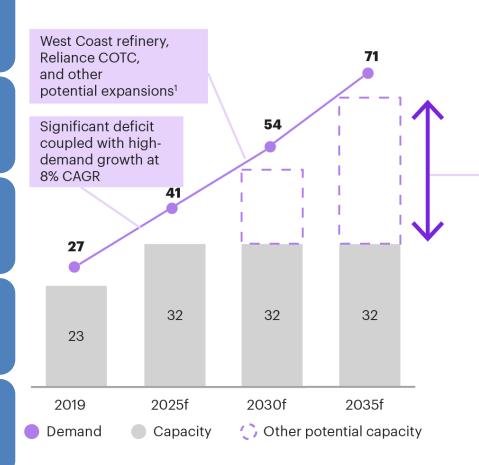

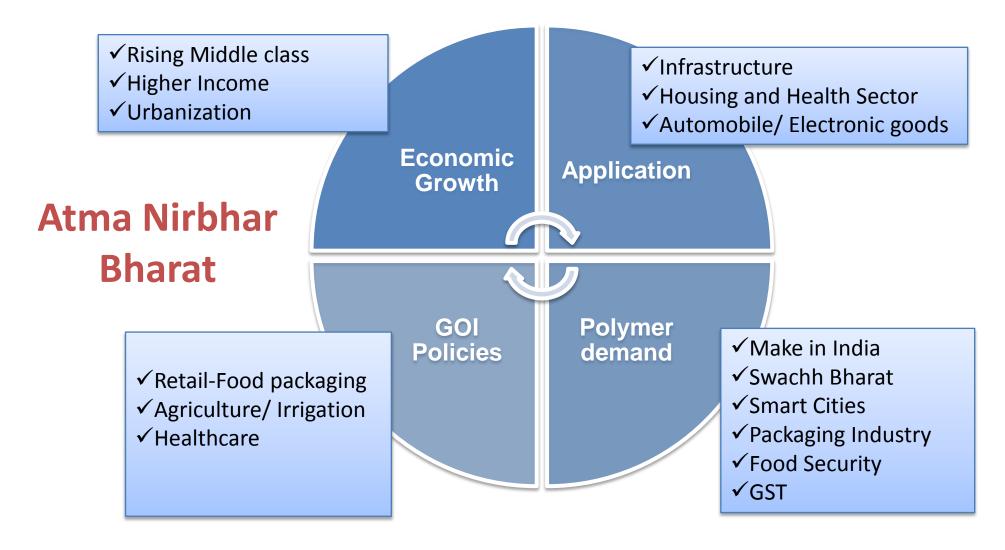
Petrochemicals supply and demand in India (million metric tons)

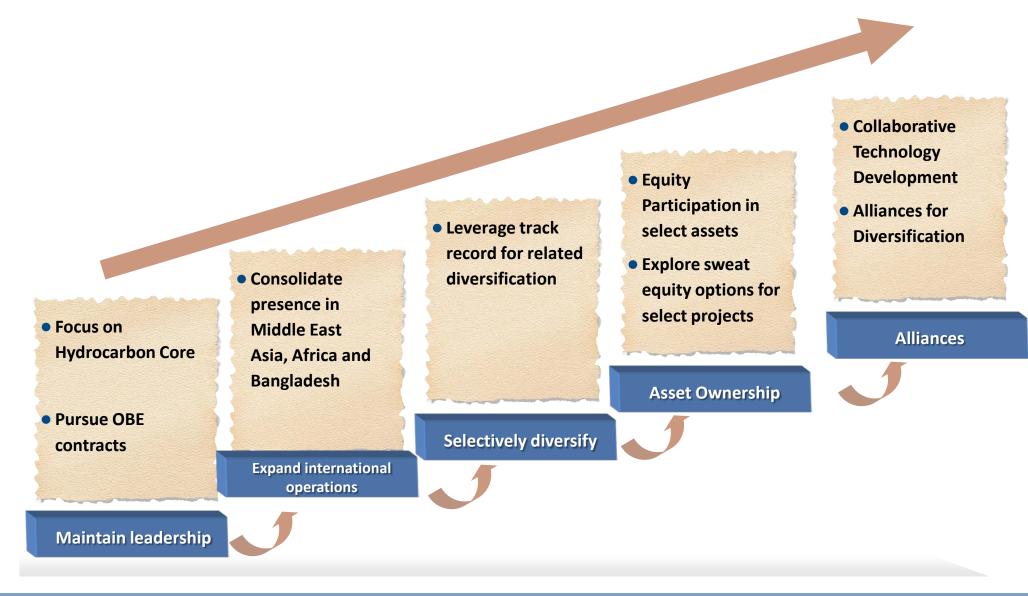
