

Harni boat capsizes: Custody of 2 accused extended by 3 days

EXPRESS NEWS SERVICE VADODARA, FEBRUARY 5

A VADODARA court Monday extended the police custody of Nilesh Jain and Alpesh Bhatt — accused in the Harni boat capsizing case — by three days as the Special Investigation Team (SIT) sought an extension of eight days citing the duo were “unco-operative” in the probe.

The SIT told the court that it was yet to recover the mobile phones of all the accused that have “incriminating evidence” about the financial transactions between the partners from the profits earned from the Harni Lake Zone. Jain and Bhatt were reluctant to share information about financial transactions that were allegedly stored on their mobile phones, the SIT told the court.

Apart from co-accused Gopal Shah and Paresh Shah, it was Jain and Bhatt who “ran the show” at the Lake Zone, the police informed the court citing the remand application. “The four are the main accused, apart from Paresh Shah’s son Vatsal Shah, who is yet to be arrested... They are the ones who ran the Lake Zone. The police have learnt that the accused shared details of financial transactions with each other on WhatsApp and have refused to surrender their mobile phones... They have been misleading the police about the mobile phones and also the financial transactions. The cross-verification of the statements given by the four is also pending,” District Government Pleader Anil Desai said. The police custody of Gopal and Paresh were also extended on Saturday.

According to him, the police also informed the court that Gopal had purchased SIM cards from other states while on the run but “destroyed” them before

being apprehended. “Gopal Shah had acquired SIM cards in Maharashtra and Jharkhand, and it is a matter of probe in whose names the cards were procured... why were they destroyed and the location of their phones,” Desai said.

Meanwhile, the police teams continue to look for six other accused yet to be arrested, including Paresh Shah’s family — wife Nutan, daughter Vaishakhi, son Vatsal — and Dharmin Bathani, Dipen Shah and Dharmil Shah, all partners of M/s Kotia projects. Out of the 14 accused arrested so far, the police have the custody of four accused — Gopal Shah, Paresh Shah, Nilesh Jain and Alpesh Bhatt, while 10 others have been sent to judicial custody.

Meanwhile, leaders from the opposition Congress of the Vadodara Municipal Corporation (VMC) submitted a memorandum to the civic body Commissioner Monday seeking a compensation of Rs 50 lakh for the families of the deceased. “The central and state governments have given a total compensation of Rs 6 lakh to the victims but that is not enough. The VMC must own up to its faults and pay compensation to the families... We have submitted a memorandum seeking Rs 50 lakh. The Harni lake has to be a unique example of a civic body signing an MoU stating it has no responsibility towards incidents in its own property; it cannot be legal to say that,” said Congress leader Chandrakant Shrivastav.

UNNATURAL CAUSES BEHIND MOST FATALITIES


80% posts of permanent vets vacant amid increase in deaths of big cats

WITH THE state forest and wildlife department claiming that it is taking measures, including recruiting veterinary doctors, to curb the increase in the number of leopards and lions dying due to unnatural causes, data tabled in the Gujarat Assembly on Monday shows that nearly 80 per cent of sanctioned permanent posts for doctors in wildlife care centres are vacant.

In response to a question posed by Congress MLA from Vansda, Anantkumar Patel, the data showed that as of December 31, 2023, 14 of the 18 sanctioned permanent posts of doctors at wildlife care centres are vacant. These include centres at Bhavnagar, Junagadh, Gir Somnath and Amreli.

However, the state has employed 13 other veterinary doctors on contractual basis. These include five in Junagadh, two each in Bhavnagar and Gir Somnath and one each in Porbandar, Morbi,



Amreli and Banaskantha. The data also revealed that while more leopards are dying due to unnatural causes, leopard cubs dying due to natural causes have nearly doubled in a year. While Patel sought to know why veterinary officers are being appointed on contractual basis

without filling up the permanent posts, no specific reply was given except for the department stating the “till the veterinary officer (veterinary medical officer) Class 2 direct recruitment process is completed, the posts are filled on contract-basis, keeping in mind the importance of the work of res-



cue, treatment, maintenance, etc”. Responding to a starred question posed by Congress’ Danilinda MLA Shailesh Parmar about deaths of lions, leopards and their cubs, the data revealed that while 27 leopard cubs died due to natural causes in 2022, the toll rose to 52 till December 31, 2023. On the other hand, against 100 leopard deaths due to natural causes in 2022, the figure has seen a marginal decline to 93 in 2023. However, deaths of leopards due to unnatural causes rose to 59 in 2023 (as of December 31) compared to 42 such deaths in 2022. Lion deaths due to unnatural causes, too, have gone up — from seven in 2022 to 14 as on December 31, 2023. The government, listing the various measures it is undertak-

Health minister: No link between Covid vaccine, heart attack deaths

GUJARAT HEALTH Minister Rushikesh Patel Monday ruled out any relation between Covid-19 vaccine and deaths caused by heart attacks.

“This notion is totally baseless. Nearly 250 crore doses of COVID-19 vaccines were administered across the country. Heart attacks are not caused because of any side-effects of the vaccine. There is no relation between deaths due to heart attacks and the coronavirus vaccine,” he said in response to a question by Congress MLA Imran Khedawala during Budget session of the Assembly in Gandhinagar. Khedawala had sought to know the government’s stand on a popular notion that deaths due to heart attacks in recent times were due to some side-effects of the Covid-19 vaccine or any other medicine.

“It is possible people may have got infected with fibrosis (a serious lung disease) due to Covid-19, which might decrease the capacity of lungs due to blockages. Otherwise, there is no relation between heart attacks and the coronavirus vaccine,” Patel told the House.

Further, he added that as on February 4, there were 68 active Covid-19 cases in the state. The figures were revealed as the state government has stopped updat-

ing its Covid-19 figures on an online portal.

The minister stated that 80 patients, detected with the JN.1 sub-variant, have been treated so far till date. However, he added that JN.1 is a “very weak sub-variant”. Meanwhile, AAP MLA Hemant Ahir asked the health minister under what rule was it decided to convert the Community Health Centre (CHC) at Dhrol in Jamnagar to a sub-district hospital (SDH) when it is only 45 kms from the district headquarters. His constituency of Jamjodhpur is around 95 kms away from the district headquarters and yet, the CHC there has not been upgraded as an SDH, he said.

Emphasising that “when it comes to health and education, without being partisan, without thinking of AAP or Congress, works are done across Gujarat”, Patel said that an SDH is under consideration in Jamjodhpur. Patel went on to add that “both Dhrol and Jamjodhpur are in Gujarat” and the upgrade of Dhrol CHC to a SDH is being done as per parameters and policy considered for such upgradation of

health centres. Meanwhile, in response to a question by Patan Congress MLA Kiritkumar Patel, inquiring about pending dues to be paid to hospitals in Patan under the PMJAY scheme, the data tabled shows that dues worth Rs 16.47 crore are pending to be cleared across 79 health facilities, including PHCs, CHCs, government and private hospitals, as on date. Of the Rs 16.47 crore of pending dues, Rs 3.90 crore have been pending since six months, including CHCs in Sander and Varahi in Patan, and government-aided GMERS Hospital in Patan, along with 14 other health facilities. Dues worth Rs 42.78 lakh have been pending since a year, including at CHCs at Kakoshi and Kuvara in the district.

Ayurveda syrup deaths

Khedawala also quizzed about the action taken after four people died in November last year by allegedly consuming an ayurvedic syrup. In response, the Gujarat health ministry tabled a report stating that eight persons were arrested in the case and chargesheet has been filed. All the arrested are currently in judicial custody. Additionally, the syrup was seized from 12 spots across the state, according to the department, that include three paan parlours at Mehmedabad, two paan parlours and a hotel in Vadtal in Kheda, and a shop in Nadiad town. Governor’s address to House far from ground realities, says Chavda

CONGRESS LEGISLATIVE Party leader in the Assembly, Amit Chavda, on Monday took on the state BJP government on issues like pending elections to thousands of local self-governance institutes, fake people posing as government officials and opening offices as well as rising prices. Chavda spoke while taking part in a discussion on proposal to thank the Governor for his address to the House last Thursday. The proposal was moved by BJP MLA Naresh Patel.

Opposing the proposal, Chavda said the Governor’s address to the House is far from the ground realities and based on the information provided to him by the government. He claimed that because of the lack of employment and a policy to address it, of the 1.32 crore families in Gujarat, 72 lakh families have to stand in queue to get food.

“Earlier, we had heard of only fake degree, but now we have fake currency notes, fake CMO official, fake PMO official, fake MLA, fake PA, fake government officer, fake vigilance team, fake police, fake toll booth. As if fake rice and fake ghee were not enough, now fake syrup and fake liquor have become available in your regime. Fake is everywhere,” Chavda said.

ing to curb unnatural deaths of the animal, stated that it has “appointed veterinary officers for emergency treatment of wildlife animals such as lions in case of illness”.

The reply to another of Patel’s questions on utilisation of forest department’s budgetary allocation, shows utilisation of around 72-76 per cent of the funds in 2021-22 and 2022-23, until December 31, 2023. According to the department, reasons for non-utilisation of funds include “non-completion of recruitment process” of deputy section officer and office assistants in the two financial years.

Meanwhile, in response to a question posed by BJP’s Dhari MLA Jaysukhbhai Kakadiya on the expenses incurred in the last two years to develop tourist facilities at Ambardi lion safari park, the department said it has spent Rs 15.71 crore in two phases till December 31, 2023, including installing “sculptures of various animals”, 3D murals and line sculptures and interpretation centre, among others, at the park.

AMC issues municipal green bonds worth Rs 200 crore, oversubscribed by 6.8 times

THE AHMEDABAD Municipal Corporation (AMC), which on Monday issued the first municipal green bonds in Gujarat, saw the bonds worth Rs 200 crore oversubscribed by 6.8 times.

The AMC is the second municipal corporation after Indore in the country to issue municipal green bonds.

According to an AMC official, the municipal green bond was fully subscribed in less than four seconds of opening up for subscription. In all, 30 institutional investors have subscribed the bonds worth Rs 1,360 crore. One of the key investor included Gujarat State Financial Services, which subscribed bonds worth Rs 170 crore.

Municipal bonds are debt securities issued to raise capital, where in return, investors get the principal amount with interest.

The coupon rate — interest to be paid to investor by bond issuer AMC — for the tranche was pegged at 7.9 per cent.

While investors will receive the interest of 7.9 per cent, a civic official said that owing to an incentive of Rs 20 crore received by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs, the AMC will effectively be shouldering an interest rate of 5.9 per cent for the coupon rate.

The official added that AMC issued the bond after it identified “green projects” under AMRUT 2.0 scheme. Such projects also require green certification by specific agencies.

VMC Standing Committee nod for draft budget worth Rs 34 cr

THE STANDING Committee of the Vadodara Municipal Corporation (VMC) Monday approved the draft budget, presented by the Municipal Commissioner for the financial year 2024-25, with an increase of Rs 34 crore. The approved budget is now worth Rs 5,558 crore.

No “additional or increased taxes” have been levied on citizens in the budget and there is ‘special focus’ to improve traffic conditions in the city by building 15 overbridges and flyovers as well as installing new traffic signals, said Standing Committee Chairperson Dr Sheetal Mistry.

Dr Mistry also said the Standing Committee had recommended a ‘Green Audit’ to be carried out in the city to encourage planting of trees and a new plant was to be installed at the Gajrawadi slaughterhouse run by the civic body to eliminate the complaints by residents of the vicinity.

Following the Harni Boat tragedy on January 18 that killed 14 persons, including 12 students, Dr Mistry said the Standing Committee had also recommended that schools in the city should be asked to train students in swimming as well as training for fire safety by conducting mock drills.

The Vadodara Municipal Commissioner had presented to the Standing Committee a Rs 5,523-crore draft budget on January 29. The general board will now begin discussion on the budget from February 16.
