

Farmers facing atrocities, injustice under BJP rule : Cong

New Delhi Feb 14 (UNI) The Congress while accusing the government of betraying the farmers on the guarantee of giving legal MSP, said that atrocities and injustice done to farmers by the current regime was never done by any government after independence.

Addressing a press conference at the AICC headquarters here, Congress leader Pawan Khara said, "During the election campaign in 2014, Modi made a false promise of giving MSP on the lines of the Swaminathan report to the farmers and became the Prime Minister."

"But PM Modi's lie came to light when an affidavit was filed in the Supreme Court with regards to MSP, in which the Modi government took a shameful 'U' turn and said that we cannot give this kind of MSP where the input cost is too high," Khara said.

He said the Prime Minister not only broke his promise but made full arrangements to stop the farmers demanding their right by putting in place barbed wire, nails, rubber bullets, tear gas from drones and cement walls."

The Congress leader said that even after two years when the Prime Minister apologised and withdrew all three farm laws, he promised of constituting a committee to find solution to the MSP issue. "But today it has been two years but no committee has been formed," Khara said.

He said Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge and Rahul Gandhi have taken a historic decision in Ambikapur on Tuesday of giving legal guarantee of MSP to the farmers. "As soon as the announcement was made, the entire ecosystem is spreading lies and propaganda on the MSP," Khara alleged.

Punjab 1st state to identify all 784 accidental-prone black spots: Bhullar

Chandigarh, Feb 14 (UNI): Punjab Transport Minister Laljit Singh Bhullar said on Wednesday that Punjab is the first state in the country to identify all 784 accidental-prone black spots and rectify over 60 percent of them with the latest engineering techniques.

Addressing the drivers of PRTC Roadways buses, trucks, and school buses, private bus operators, and taxi operators during the concluding ceremony of 'Road Safety Month' here at MAGSIPA, he said that so far, around Rs 700 crore has been incurred to rectify the black spots.

With the help of NHAI to further reduce the

mortality rate in road accidents. He said that the government is consistently working to save precious lives, for which various steps have been taken, such as establishing a dedicated Sadak Sukhya Force and installing CCTV cameras at junctions, use of speedos and alcho-meters, etc. He urged the drivers to use the safety belt as well as the rear belt in the case of taxis and other commuter vehicles.

Addressing the event, Director General Lead Agency Mr. R Venkat Raman informed that various activities were organized across the state during Road Safety Month,

which included cycle and two-wheeler rallies, affixing retro-reflective tapes to transport vehicles, nukkad talks with drivers, awareness campaigns on seat belts and helmets, and special drives against red light violations, over speeding and drunk driving, cleaning roadside vegetation, installing road signage, medical eye checkup camps for drivers, and identification of accident-prone spots. Besides this, walkathons, poster-making and quiz competitions, exhibitions, and lectures on road safety by NGOs and road safety experts were organized in collaboration with the school education, higher

education, and technical education departments. On this occasion, a workshop on 'Identification and Rectification of Accident Black Spots and its impact' were held, wherein the Road Owning Departments such as NHAI, PWD (B&R), Local Government, and Punjab Mandi Board presented compliance reports of initiatives taken during this month. ADGP (Traffic) AS Rai and Traffic Advisor Punjab Navdeep Asija also addressed the gathering.

About 400 first-aid kits were distributed to the drivers to be kept in vehicles. These kits were sponsored by Mr. Kamal Garg, IAS, MD MILKFEED.

ICGS Varaha makes port call in Mozambique

New Delhi, Feb 14 (UNI) : As part of the ongoing strategic overseas deployment to East Africa, marking a pivotal milestone in the ongoing diplomatic maritime engagements,

Indian Coast Guard Offshore Patrol Vessel (OPV) ICGS Varaha made a significant port call at Maputo Port, Mozambique, on Wednesday.

The visit to Maputo holds great significance as it reinforces bilateral relationships with key maritime agencies. These longstanding relationships are integral to ensuring the safety, security, and environmental sustainability of the

seas in the region while also addressing contemporary maritime challenges. The deployment of ICGS Varaha to East Africa exemplifies India's commitment to fostering warm and cordial relations with African countries.

The overarching goal is to promote friendly relations through maritime cooperation, aligning with India's maritime vision encapsulated in "SAGAR: Security and Growth for All in the Region" and the concept of "Global South."

During its three-day visit, the crew of ICGS Varaha will participate in a series of professional interactions in the fields of Marine Pollution Response (MPR), Maritime Search and Rescue (M-SAR), and Maritime Law Enforcement, including cross-deck

training, calls on various Mozambique Naval and maritime agency officials, sports fixtures, joint yoga sessions, tabletop exercises, and Passage Exercise (PASSEX) with the Mozambique Naval Forces, a Defense Ministry statement said here.

The visit of ICGS Varaha, an indigenously built offshore patrol vessel, to East African countries also aims to showcase Indian shipbuilding industry prowess and capabilities, furthering the concept of "Aatm Nirbhar Bharat."

Moreover, the National Cadet Corps (NCC) embarked onboard the ICGS ship and will be undertaking a beach cleanup drive in coordination with a local youth organization at

Maputo towards the government's initiative "Puneet Sagar Abhiyan" to provide it with international outreach. The collaborative efforts aim to further strengthen the ties between the Indian Coast Guard and their counterparts in Mozambique.

This overseas deployment aligns with the Indian Coast Guard's commitment to fostering bilateral relationships and enhancing international cooperation with foreign-friendly countries (FFCs).

Notably, before this visit, ICGS Varaha had made port calls to Mozambique, Kenya, demonstrating a seamless continuation of diplomatic maritime engagements in the African region.

CM Siddaramaiah moves SC over HC's refusal to quash criminal proceedings

New Delhi, Feb 14 (UNI) Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah on Wednesday moved the Supreme Court over the High Court's refusal to quash criminal proceedings against him for a protest march organised in Bengaluru on February 14, 2022.

He has challenged the order of the Karnataka High Court passed on February 6 last dismissing his plea to quash the criminal proceedings against him and for imposing a cost of Rs 10,000.

On February 6, The Karnataka High Court dismissed the petition filed by Chief Minister Siddaramaiah, Congress' State in charge Randeep Singh Surjewalia, and legislators Ramalinga Reddy and MB Patil, seeking to quash a criminal case registered against them in 2022 for alleged illegal march towards the residence of then Chief Minister Basavaraj Bommai, shouting slogans and demanding the resignation.

The High Court, however, failed to ascertain whether the prosecution of the petitioner would be legitimate in the given facts and circumstances, it contended. The plea also said the HC lost sight of the fact that the assembly did not lead to any violence or use of criminal force to present an imminent threat to the public at large or to the members of the then ruling dispensation or any public servant.

Channelise your energies into positive endeavours : Ghulam Nabi Azad to youth

Jammu, Feb 14 (UNI): Democratic Progressive Azad Party (DPAP) Chairman Ghulam Nabi Azad on Wednesday urged the youth of Jammu and Kashmir to 'channelise their energies into positive endeavours to contribute into betterment of the society.' Addressing a public gathering in Mandi tehsil of Poonch district, he stressed the importance of constructive engagement and community involvement as vital components in fostering a culture of peace, harmony, and progress.

He vehemently condemned the recent acts of violence perpetrated by Pakistan, resulting in the loss of innocent lives in Jammu and Kashmir. In a resolute stance against such heinous acts, the DPAP Chairman emphasized the need for

concerted efforts to counter terrorism and maintain peace in the region. Azad lamented the lack of vocal opposition from other party leaders on the issue of Article 370, highlighted DPAP's efforts in fighting against land eviction orders and securing the land rights of the people. He reassured the public that DPAP will continue to prioritize the protection of land rights and the implementation of job rights if elected to power. The former CM promised that his government, if elected, will work tirelessly to uphold the rights of the people, particularly in terms of land ownership and employment opportunities.
