Angry minister

Mhow: Enraged by her mother's rebuke for using mobile phone instead of preparing for examination, a Class X girl committed suicide by hanging herself in the bathroom, the police said.

According to Manpur police, the deceased was identified as Rishika, daughter of Yashwant Verma. Station in-charge Arun Solanki said that the student was using her mobile late Thursday. Her mother Sanju Bai, who was present at home, told her daughter that there is an exam tomorrow so she should switch off her mobile and study. According to the mother, Rishika had failed the examination in the last session, this time she was appearing for the Class X examination for the second time and her daughter was very hot-tempered. The station in-charge said that the family members told the police that their daughter had become very angry and that she took this step due to her angry nature. Many teachers said that due to the increasing use of mobile phones among students, they are not able to study properly and also they remain under mental stress. Due to excessive use of mobile phones, the examination results of children in schools are being affected.

Unseasonal rain is likely to occur in many districts in the state in next 24 hours. Relief from rain with cold day like condition is expected after February 15.

The meteorological department has issued yellow alert for unseasonal rain in Narmadapuram, Betul, Harda, Dindori, Narsinghpur, Chhindwara, Seoni, Mandla and Balaghat district. Districts like Indore, Khandwa, Raisen, Jabalpur and Anuppur are also likely to receive rain.

Rain spell will continue till next mid-week next. Light storm may occur in Madhya Pradesh, Chhat-



tisgarh. Meteorological department officials attributed unseasonal rain activities to the combined influence of cyclonic circulation and anticyclone over central parts of India.

According to department officials, Rewa and Datia experienced cold day like condition in last 24 hours. On Saturday, Bhopal recorded day temperature of 24.7 degrees Celsius

while its night temperature was 11.1 degrees Celsius. Indore recorded day temperature 26.2 degrees Celsius while its night temperature was 13.1 degrees Celsius.

At present, cyclonic circulation exists over northern parts of Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, south-west Madhya Pradesh and neighbourhood. This feature will shift eastward in next 24

Nat'l level training on climate smart tech for soybean productivity held

Programme held at Indian Institute of Soybean Research

A three-day national-level training programme on Climate Smart Technologies to Enhance Soybean Productivity under Changed Climate was held at the city-based Indian Institute of Soybean Research. Over 80 scientists from across the country, Krishi Vigyan Kendra and input dealers from 11 states attended the training organised through hybrid mode. The participants were briefed about the state-of-the-art techniques available to face the conditions arising from climate change.

The programme was conducted under the National Food Security Mission-Frontline Demonstration, a scheme sponsored by the central government. The prime objective is to sensitise and educate field-level



staff and ground-level officials about the recent developments considering the climatic adversities being experienced on account of climate change.

Delivering the inaugural address Dr KH Singh, director, ICAR-IISR said that increased incidences of biotic factors (insects and diseases) as well as adverse climatic conditions like long dry spells and high temperature are being experienced in many parts of the country where soybean is grown as a major rainy season crop. He said that the institute has been successful in the development of soybean

varieties as well as production technologies and methods which are able to withstand adverse climatic conditions. According to him, sowing methods like Broad Bed Furrow/Ridge Furrow need to be promoted and disseminated on a larger scale. Dr SRK Singh, director, ICAR-Agricultural Technology Application Research Institute, Jabalpur an institution working for synthesising the research findings and technologies developed by research institutes for their assessment,

emphasised on dissemination and feedback mechanisms through the Krishi Vigyan Kendras operating at the district level. He promised that the Kendras would support the ICAR-IISR in demonstrating and disseminating the agronomic package and methods especially suitable under the changing climatic scenario.

During the plenary session, the course coordinators Dr Raghavendra, Dr Rakesh Kumar Verma and Dr Savita Kolhe thanked the scientists and extension staff of All India Coordinated Research Project operating at the State Agricultural Universities, extension professionals and input dealers working at the ground level for their active participation.

US Consulate General's team meets CM
