MCA vide its aforesaid MCA Circulars, had advised the companies to take all decisions requiring members' approval, other than items of ordinary business or business where any person has a right to be heard, through the mechanism of postal ballot / e-voting in accordance with the provisions of the Act and rules made thereunder, without holding a general meeting that requires physical presence of members at a common venue. The Postal Ballot Notice is being sent only by email to all those Members whose names appear on the Register of Members / List of Beneficial Owners as received from National Securities Depository Limited ("NSDL") and Central Depository Services (India) Limited ("CDSL") as on Friday, 23rd February, 2024 (the "Cut-off date") and who have registered their email addresses in respect of electronic holdings with the Depository through the concerned Depository Participants and in respect of physical holdings with the Company's Registrar and Share Transfer Agent, M/s. CB Management Services (P) Limited ("RTA").

As per the MCA Circulars, hard copy of Postal Ballot Notice along with Postal Ballot Forms and pre-paid business envelope will not be sent to the shareholders for this Postal Ballot and shareholders are required to communicate their assent or dissent through the remote e-voting system only and consequently no physical ballot forms will be accepted by the Company.

For this purpose, the Company has availed the services of National Securities Depository Limited ("NSDL") to provide remote e-voting facility to the Members of the Company. The instructions for e-voting are appended in this Postal Ballot Notice.

The Board of Directors of the Company has appointed Mr. Ashok Kumar Daga, Practicing Company Secretary, having Membership No. FCS 2699 and CP No. 2948 to act as a Scrutinizer to conduct the Postal Ballot voting process in a fair and transparent manner and he has communicated his willingness to be appointed as a Scrutinizer.

The Scrutinizer will submit their report to the Chairman of the Company or, in his absence, any person of the Company, duly authorized by the Board for the purpose, after completion of scrutiny of Postal Ballots in a fair and transparent manner.

Step 1: Access to NSDL e-Voting system

A) Login method for e-Voting for Individual shareholders holding securities in demat mode

In terms of SEBI circular dated December 9, 2020, on e-Voting facility provided by Listed Companies, Individual shareholders holding securities in demat mode are allowed to vote through their demat account maintained with Depositories and Depository Participants. Shareholders are advised to update their mobile number and email Id in their demat accounts in order to access e-Voting facility.

Adanis plan ₹60K cr boost to augment airports biz

Capex separate from ₹18K crore announced for Navi Mumbai Airport Phase-I

New Delhi, 10 March

The Adani group is planning to invest ₹60,000 crore in its seven existing airports over the next five to 10 years to enhance their capacity and revenue-generating potential.

Adani Airports Holdings (AAHL) Chief Executive Officer Arun Bansal said ₹30,000 crore will be spent on the 'airside' in the next five years, while another ₹30,000 crore will be allocated to the 'cityside' in the next five to 10 years at its seven existing airports: Mumbai, Ahmedabad, Lucknow, Mangaluru, Guwahati, Jaipur, and Thiruvananthapuram.

The capital expenditure (capex) of ₹60,000 crore does not include the ₹18,000 crore allocated for the Phase-I development of the Navi Mumbai airport, scheduled to commence operations by March 2025, clarified Bansal.

'Airside' refers to the secure area of the airport accessible only to passengers with boarding passes, while 'cityside' or 'landside' is the public area of the airport accessible to anyone.

"It is a huge amount, but Adani Enterprises Ltd (AEL) will support it through internal accruals. We are a startup operating under AEL, so AEL will fund it for us," he said during a press briefing after Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the new terminal at the Lucknow airport on Sunday. Concerning the cityside of its existing airports, the Adani group aspires to create integrated cities, including hotels, convention centres, retail outlets, and food and beverage establishments, noted Bansal. Bansal explained the reasons for the five-10-year timeline for cityside development.

"Cityside development requires environmental clearance, land clearance, etc. At some of our airports, our lands have

been encroached for different purposes, so we need to get it cleared. We need to get the master plan approved by the Airports Authority of India (AAI). Once all that is done, we will expedite. Wherever the approvals are available, we are starting at a small scale... If these approvals come faster, we will do it in the next five years," he said.

He highlighted that there is no limitation on funding for cityside development, but rather a limitation on the availability of all the required approvals to initiate work. Bansal explained that all Adani-run airports were, at some point, away from the city, but this is no longer the case.

In cities like Ahmedabad and Jaipur, there are limited options for weekend getaways. However, due to the central location of the airports within these cities, there is ample opportunity for cityside development, he noted.

The capex plan for the phase one development of the Navi Mumbai airport is ₹18,000 crore.

"It will be ready by March 2025. We have already started planning the construction of Terminal 2 and the second runway (under Phase II development) there. The budget for Phase II development has not been worked out yet. We are working on the master plan. We will provide the quantum of investment for the Phase II development in the next couple of months," he said.

In 2022, the Adani group unveiled its plans for cityside development at its airports, including establishing aquaria at five locations, Legoland theme parks at three locations, and virtual reality parks at five locations. It also plans to set up rainforest cafés at five locations and Madame Tussauds wax museums at two locations. Twenty-one hotels — six five-star, 10 four-star, and five three-star hotels — will be developed in a 5.1 million square feet area. Six hospitals with 2,200 beds, multiplexes with a total of 66 screens, and nine food and beverage zones will also be developed, according to the announcement.

No change in reserve price of expensive spectrum bands

The reserve price for two of the most expensive bands — 800MHz and 900MHz — in the spectrum auction on May 20 has not been changed by the government.

In all the eight spectrum bands the government is putting up for auction, the reserve prices for the Delhi telecom circle are the highest, followed by Mumbai, with Kolkata a distant third. The Department of Telecommunications (DoT), through a notice released on Friday, announced that telecom players would have until April 22 to submit bids for the auction, which will feature all the available spectrum in 800MHz, 900MHz, 1800MHz, 2,100MHz, 2,300MHz, 2,500MHz, 3,300MHz, and 26GHz bands.

The government, however, seems to have resisted raising the reserve prices for the usually sought-after spectrum bands in key telecom circles. This rings true for Delhi, Mumbai, and Kolkata, which are considered by the DoT as 'metro circles' owing to their strategic and economic importance, and population among India's 22 telecom circles.

For the 800MHz band, Delhi had a reserve price of ₹479 crore per MHz, followed by Mumbai (₹468 crore) and Kolkata (₹153 crore). This was the same

reserve price in Delhi has gone up 12 per cent to ₹251 crore, up from ₹224 crore, the prices for Mumbai (₹196 crore) and Kolkata (₹80 crore) have remained the same. There has been no change in reserve prices in the 2,300MHz and 2,500MHz bands as well.

The government has set a cumulative reserve price of ₹96,317.65 crore for the 10,523.15MHz of spectrum put up for auction. Meanwhile, in the last round of auctions ended on August 1, 2022, the government had put up nearly 7 times more spectrum (72,098MHz). Of this, 51,236MHz or 71 per cent of the total was sold with the total bid amounting to ₹1.5 trillion. The pricey but super-efficient 700MHz band has been kept out of the bidding for the upcoming auction.

Witnessing bidding for the first time in 2022, large chunks of spectrum in the band were picked up by Reliance Jio for an estimated ₹39,270 crore. Before this, the band had gone unsold in two successive auctions due to high prices. In 2022, reserve prices in the band were cut by 40 per cent. The successful bidders will be allowed to make payment in 20 equal annual instalments, duly protecting the net present value at the interest rate of 8.65 per cent, the DoT has said. There will also be no spectrum usage charges for the spectrum acquired in this auction.

'Shut OLY Auto due to focus on profitable growth'

After buying OLY India last year, the country's leading auto portal CarTrade aims to continue its trend of profitable growth of 20 to 30 per cent in the coming quarters, Executive Director and Chief Financial Officer ANEESHA MENON tells Anjali Singh in a video interview. Edited excerpts:

How does CarTrade plan to maintain its market leadership in the auto portal space?
We have a leadership position in key segments such as consumer auto portals, used-car classifieds, and vehicle auctions. Our dominance in the consumer group is unparalleled, especially in the auto portal segment. We have strong brand recall value as we have acquired several brands over the past 8 years, such as CarWale, and BikeWale, with the most recent one being OLY, which was completed last year. The acquisition of OLY has helped us add around 30 million monthly active users (MAUs), taking the total MAUs to 70 million.

Our focus remains on profitable growth and our recent performance, including a 48 per cent revenue growth in December, resulting in a profit after tax of nearly ₹22 crore for the continuing operations.

How much revenue do the acquired entities contribute? How did profitability compare

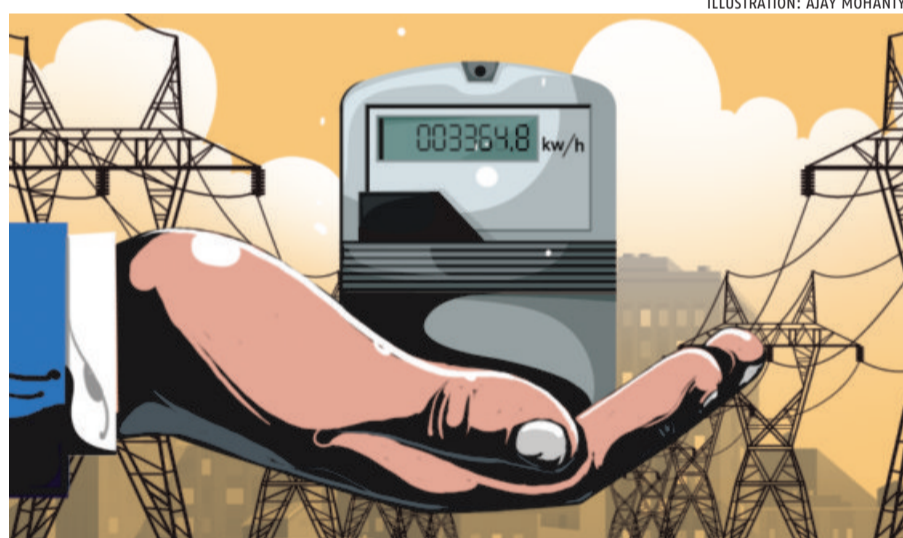
before and after the acquisitions?
The acquisition of OLY resulted in a 45 per cent increase in CarTrade's overall revenue for the third quarter. Currently, each of CarTrade's three business segments (CarTrade, Shriram Automall, and OLY) contribute roughly equally to total revenue, with OLY contributing approximately 31 per cent. Prior to the acquisition, CarTrade's quarterly profitability was ₹19 crore. The OLY acquisition added ₹10.47 crore, bringing the total segmental profit to ₹29.78 crore, marking a 54 per cent increase.

Why did you shut down your OLY business?
We acquired OLY India, a major classifieds platform in the country, in 2023. We were particularly interested in the OLY.in brand. However, the deal also included OLY Autos, a used car buying and selling business that was

losing money. Due to our focus on profitable growth, we decided to shut down OLY Autos after a quick analysis. We found that the unit economics, meaning the cost to acquire a customer, were broken and couldn't be fixed easily. Additionally, the high competition in the used car market made it a race to the bottom.

₹2.5 trn smart metering play has Adani, Tatas walking different paths

Tata Power and Adani Energy Solutions, the country's two major private distribution companies, have adopted different approaches when it comes to the ₹2.5 trillion smart metering business.

India aims to install 250 million smart meters under multiple schemes nationwide. According to industry executives, when calculated at the cost of meter plus maintenance revenue of ₹1,000 each, it offers a market size of ₹2.5 trillion.

Despite the revenue opportunity, not everyone is excited. "City circles are where we are interested. We are not very aggressive in this market as we understand the difficulties of it," Sanjay Kumar Banga, president, transmission and distribution vertical, Tata Power, told Business Standard.

In July, Tata Power won an order to install and maintain 1.86 million meters in Chhattisgarh, with a combined worth of ₹1,744 crore. Tata Power's rival in the private city power distribution business, Adani Energy Solutions, has a bigger plan for smart metering. In an investor presentation in January, Adani Energy Solutions noted it had an under-construction pipeline of ₹25,100 crore in smart metering for nine contracts and 21.1 million meters and a 21 per cent share of the market. Adani Energy Solutions did not comment on new queries sent to the company on Thursday.

In August, Anil Sardana, managing director for Adani Energy Solutions had told this newspaper that 5-6 private players in the power distribution business were best suited to deploy smart meters. In its latest presentation, the company noted the segment offers a high Ebitda (earnings before interest, taxes, depreciation, and amortisation) margin possibility to an early mover.

Banga said it was a segment where only companies with deep pockets would compete. "Revenue trickles in only once the meters are installed. In case there is any installation delay, it can eat into margins, as meters will be sitting idle at godowns."

Phone making up 21 times to ₹4 trn in 10 yrs

Mobile phone manufacturing in value terms jumped 21-fold to ₹4.1 trillion in India in the last 10 years as government policy measures like production-linked incentives played a critical role in attracting global players to boost local production, the India Cellular and Electronics Association said in a statement. India now produces 97 per cent of its total mobile phone demand locally and 30 per cent of total production in FY24 is meant for exports. PTI

he explained. The segment has attracted new players such as GMR Power and Urban Infrastructure with plans both for distribution and smart metering. The company in July received a letter of Intent (LOI) to deploy 7.56 million pre-paid smart meters across Uttar Pradesh with a total contract value of ₹7,593 crore.

While Tata Power is expected to be selective in third-party smart meter deployment, the company aims to have 100 per cent smart meter coverage for its Mumbai power distribution circle by 2025. Overall, the company targets to ensure 70 per cent of its distribution income is from businesses that have smart metering installed, to be met next year. Tata Power is spending a total capex of ₹760 crore to increase smart metering coverage across its distribution business in Odisha, New Delhi and Mumbai.
