He said that India provides approximately 60% of the global vaccine supply, accounts for 20-22% of generic exports and serves over 200 countries through its pharmaceutical exports. Numerous Indian organizations have played a pivotal role in promoting innovation and entrepreneurship that act as a landscape for innovative mind and ultimately boosts health sector. The minister said that the government is providing funding, mentoring, incubation space etc, and acts as a bridge between academia and industry, to ensure timely delivery of products to essential commercial ventures". The Minister also said, "currently, local production faces significant challenges as it seeks to address the critical issue of translating research into product development. Capacity building in research stands out as a formidable barrier. During his visit, Mr. Khuba also met the Minister of Public Health of Surinam Dr. Amar N. Ramadhin and discussed about quality health care. He also visited Endinhow to take part in Kamnada Rajyotsava 2023 Celebrations of Shrigandha Holland Kannada Balaga.

Witnesses participation of over 14,000 women from various parts of country

Throughout the campaign, women delved deeper into the sphere of water infrastructure, receiving expert guidance on water quality testing protocols, and performed these tests themselves. This knowledge will further empower them to ensure the highest standards of water purity for their communities, reflecting a profound sense of ownership and responsibility towards water infrastructure.

Centre urges manufacturers of white goods to start warranty or guarantee period from date of installation

The Department of Consumer Affairs has urged manufacturers and sellers of white goods to revise the warranty or guarantee policy to reflect its commencement from the date of installation rather than the date of purchase. In a letter addressed to industry and retail associations and manufacturers of white goods, Shri Rohit Kumar Singh, Secretary, Department of Consumer Affairs has strongly advised manufacturers of white goods such as such as refrigerators, air conditioners, washing machines etc. to revise the warranty or guarantee policy in the sale of white goods to consumers, to reflect its commencement from the date of installation rather than the date of purchase. White goods typically involve installation by trained technicians, and until they are correctly installed on the premises, consumers are unable to use such goods. It is observed that this practice leads to a reduction in the total warranty period which a consumer would have normally enjoyed from the time he could use the product after its installation. This issue is further accentuated in case of purchases made through e-commerce where additional time is involved in the delivery of the product. Initiating the warranty or guarantee period when consumers are unable to use the product constitutes an unfair trade practice under the Consumer Protection Act, 2019 and a contract imposing such terms which causes significant change in the rights of consumer is an unfair contract under the Act. The letter highlights the importance of strengthening the trust between businesses and consumers, emphasized by the Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi at the Business 20 (B20) Summit India 2023 held in New Delhi on 27.08.2023. During the Summit, Hon'ble PM called on businesses to shift their focus to 'consumer care', which will enable automatic resolution of many issues related to consumer rights. He emphasized that a profitable market can be sustained when there is a balance in the interests of producers and consumers. As the festive season begins, there will be a concomitant increase in consumer footfalls in the market, which means a bustling period for businesses.

Banchha Nidhi Pani gets additional charge as GSHSEB chairman

Ahmedabad: The state government on Monday gave the additional charge of chairman of Gujarat Secondary and Higher Secondary Education Board (GSHSEB) to Banchha Nidhi Pani, a 2005-batch IAS officer. Pani is currently the state commissioner of technical education. The previous GSHSEB chairman, A.J. Shah, resigned on October 17, eight months before the end of his extended term on June 30, 2024. Shah was first given the charge of GSHSEB chairman in 2016-17 when he was the commissioner of Higher Education. The government had extended his term after he retired from service. His term as the board's chairman was extended five times. Shah's sudden resignation has sparked a flurry of speculation in the education department.

Among other transfers made by the state government on Monday, Rajkesh Kumar J. is commissioner, Bureau of Public Enterprises, has been transferred and appointed as secretary, GER (Gujarat Electricity Regulatory Commission), relieving Roopwant Singh of the additional charge. Vijay Kothari, who is on deputation to the state government, has been appointed MD, Gujarat State Financial Services, relieving J. P. Gupta of the additional charge.

Lanxess third-quarter sales fell 26.7 percent to 1,601 billion euros

Ahmedabad, In the third quarter of 2023, LANXESS' business figures were again influenced by the persistently weak economy. Sales amounted to EUR 1,601 billion, down 26.7 percent on the previous year's figure of EUR 2.185 billion. EBITDA moderate expectations fell by 50.4 percent from EUR 240 million to EUR 119 million. The main reasons for this development were the low demand from nearly all industries and customers' ongoing albeit diminishing inventory reduction. The associated reduction in sales volumes and high idle costs led to declining earnings, especially in the Specialty Additives and Advanced Intermediates segments. The Consumer Protection segment saw only a comparatively moderate earnings decline. The Group's EBITDA margin pre-exceptions was 7.4 percent, against 11.0 percent in the prior-year quarter. Net income declined to minus EUR 131 million in the third quarter compared with EUR 80 million in the prior-year quarter. (1-7)

GANDHINAGAR: The state government on Monday said that Gujarat ranks first in the country in number of CNG stations, with more than 1,000. The government said of the total 5,899 CNG stations in the country, 17% are in Gujarat. The statement said Gujarat also ranks first in the country in coverage of domestic piped natural gas (PNG) and industrial gas connections. As of July 2023, there were 1,002 CNG stations in Gujarat, in all 33 districts, the statement said. Gujarat is followed by Uttar Pradesh with 819 CNG stations, Maharashtra with 778 and the National Capital Region (NCR) with 480. Tn Delhi Environment Minister Gopal Rai has requested the Indian government to allow only CNG, electric, and BS VI-compliant vehicles in Delhi-NCR to tackle vehicular pollution. Rai expressed concerns about the expected decline in air quality due to Diwali festivities and stubble burning in neighboring states. He suggested convening an emergency meeting with NCR states to address the issue. Currently, only electric, CNG, and BS VI-compliant diesel buses are permitted to operate between Delhi and nearby cities and towns. Pollution levels in Delhi have remained high, with air quality classified as 'severe plus'. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has inaugurated Gujarat's first heritage train, which will transport tourists from Ekta Nagar to Ahmedabad, allowing them to visit the Statue of Unity. The train consists of three coaches designed to resemble a steam locomotive and will run as a weekly service on Sundays. The journey will take approximately three and a half hours, with no stops along the 182-km route.

HC pulls up govt for inaction

Ahmedabad: The Gujarat high court on Monday came down heavily on the state government, criticizing its secretaries for not following court directives and only making efforts to file affidavits. Justice Nikhil Kariel reprimanded senior officials for failing to resolve the issue of inadequate payments to people employed under the government scheme 'Skill of Vocational Training Institute in Tribal Areas', floated by the Centre to prevent tribals from taking to arms in underdeveloped areas of central India. The court expressed disappointment with the government's failure to properly implement its directives, which included holding meetings and making decisions under the guidance of the chief secretary and the tribal development department's secretary. The court emphasized that while the government officials may not prioritize tribal development, the employment generation scheme was designed to enhance national security, and the court would see to it that the nation's security is not compromised. The HC rejected the affidavit filed by the joint secretary of the tribal development department and posted further hearing on November 9. The Supreme Court has directed the governments of Delhi, Punjab, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, and Rajasthan to file affidavits outlining the measures they have taken to control air pollution.

Shilaj rape-dacoity: Accused was absconding in NDPS case



Ahmedabad: The Ahmedabad rural police team investigating the alleged gang rape and robbery at an apartment building in Shilaj on Friday has found that one of the five suspects was involved in a narcotics offence in Punjab and was shown as absconding in that case.

Five security guards of the posh 12-storeyed building burst into the ninth-floor apartment of a 41-year-old woman real estate developer, molested her, and raped her 19-year-old domestic worker in the early hours of Friday.

All five were nabbed on the highway in Palampur by a team of Banaskantia local crime branch on Friday.

The accused are Amritpal Singh (34), Manjit Singh (23), Rahul Singh (23), Hariom Thakur (18) and Sukwinder Singh (23).

An investigator said that they have asked for more details from the police of the states the accused persons are from.

"We found that the Punjab police had accused Amritpal of peddling psychotropic substances in 2016. He evaded his arrest in that case, which is still pending," said an officer of Ahmedabad rural police.

The officer said Manjit was accused in various cases of assault in Punjab.

AMC looks for large retail players for riverfront shops

Ahmedabad: The Sabarmati Riverfront Development Corporation Limited (SRFDCL) authorities are looking for large retail players, and not small players, to set shop at the newly constructed riverfront parking complex.

In its latest tender, the corporation has decided to rent out 16 shops at the riverfront multi-level parking. Instead of renting out the shops individually, the SRFDCL has divided them into two parcels of eight shops each, and invited bids for both parcels.

Only businesses with an annual turnover of Rs 5 crore or returns of at least 15% are eligible to participate in the tender. The shops are located at the newly constructed seven-storeyed multi-level parking facility beside the SVP

Hospital. The facility was constructed for Rs 60 crore and has been opened as public space since September 8.

The SRFDCL invited bids for renting out 16 shops of the parking lot for nine years on November 3. "In the tenders, we have set the condition that the company should be running a departmental store or a supermarket, a food brand or a fashion store," said a senior SRFDCL official.

The official said, "The units must have three years of experience in operating any of the above types of businesses in a space of at least 10,000 square feet."

The parking lot has a skywalk that connects the Atal Birla and the event ground. "Right now, the parking lot can accommodate 1,000 two-wheelers and 700 four-

wheelers. The parking fees are Rs 10 for two-wheelers and Rs 20 for four-wheelers for up to two hours, and Rs 30 for two-wheelers and Rs 40 for four-wheelers for more than two hours. For more than four hours, the fee is Rs 50.

The River Navigation Department in Panaji has fixed toll and monthly pass rates for 18 ferry routes, including charges for two-wheelers and four-wheelers.

The department defended the decision, stating that the revenue generated is necessary to modernize the ferry service, which currently costs between Rs 40-50 per year. The rates, which have been signed by the Captain of Ports and will be published in the extraordinary gazette, will be applicable to routes such as Old Goa-Piedade and Panaji-Betim.

All's not well with groundwater plan

Ahmedabad: The Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation (AMC) has set itself a target of 2026 for stopping use of groundwater and moving completely to the Narmada water supply. There is also pressure from the Central Ground Water Board (CGWB) to curtail the city's dependence on wells due to environmental concerns. However, tenders worth Rs 8.5 crore approved by the AMC for new borewells in the last six months belie these claims.

One reason for sinking borewells is that with the population in the city's enlarged limits reaching 72 lakh, the AMC needs to supply 1,725 million litres per day (MLD) of treated drinking water, up from 1,500 MLD currently.

"We use groundwater only in emergencies, but plan to end this dependence by 2026," a senior AMC official said.

The AMC will commission 24 new pumping stations, for which an additional supply of 125 MLD will be required. We have sought an additional quota of 125 MLD from the water resources department," said a senior AMC official.

The AMC has been criticized for its decision to draw 110 MLD from borewells even though it has the capacity to treat and deliver 1,725 MLD of water. The AMC defended its decision saying it will only make borewells operational in areas where there are pressure problems and will close them once the issues are resolved.

The AMC also said it will seal 598 borewells by 2026. In July, AMC approved 21 more borewells at a cost of Rs 6.49 crore and in October it approved a contract to dig borewells at a cost of Rs 2 crore for its parks.

The CGWB issued notices to the AMC in February for not getting no objection certificates (NOCs) for its borewells.

It was ordered to apply for the board's approval of all its 598 borewells.

The AMC said it is trying to obtain these NOCs, but it is unclear when this will be completed. The CGWB and the Institute of Seismic Research also warned that over-exploitation of groundwater can cause a fall in the water table, land subsidence and salinity ingress.

Trio usurp two plots of cops's mother

Rajkot: A 61-year-old woman's two plots of land were allegedly usurped by three people including a husband-wife duo who also took away Rs 12 lakh from here on the pretext of documents.

The woman Mancha Karpada, whose son is a policeman, lodged a complaint against Jagjit Toliya and his wife Gayatri, and Chandu Makwana with the Jetpur city police station.

Police have arrested Makwana. The woman, who owns two plots in Jetpur town, stated in her complaint that about five months ago Makwana lured her with an offer to construct several houses on her land saying that a leopard has been killing chickens in the village for the past few days," said Ravindra Bhivsan, husband of Nadagkhadi sarparch Sita.

The population of Nadagkhadi is 1,285 and in the recent past no major leopard attack was reported in the village. "It is possible that due to the harvesting season, the leopards have moved out of the farmlands," said a forest official.

On September 10, an 11-year-old boy was killed by leopard in Anrod village of Mangrol taluka in Surat district. Mahesh Vasava was out with his friend for cattle grazing when the leopard attacked him. On October 14, an elderly woman was killed by a leopard in Sakkpor village of Chikhli taluka in Navsari district. Chhaya Patel was out to answer the nature's call when the leopard attacked her. The forest department officials in Bengaluru had defended their actions in the recent killing of a leopard that had strayed into the city. They stated that all safety measures were followed during the four-day operation and shooting the leopard was a last resort to ensure the safety of the public.

BSc student forced to brand herself ends life

Rajkot: A 19-year-old BSc student, allegedly unable to endure the physical torture inflicted by a man whom she had married in the court a year ago. Police arrested 24-year-old Akash Shihora, a resident of Botad town after the deceased's grandfather filed a complaint based on the suicide note recovered from her room. On Sunday evening, the student, Archana Talsaniya, who was studying in the third year of microbiology, was found hanging in her hostel room on the third floor of the Shantabes Gajera Shaikshankik Sankul. Investigation officer Prashant Lakkad said, "Shihora told us that they were in a relationship for about eight years and got married in court a year ago. Their families were not aware of this." Shihora is a mattress maker in Botad while the girl is also a native of the same town where her father has a mobile phone recharge shop.

In the suicide note, Talsaniya wrote that she was taking the extreme step as she was fed up with her life. She said Akash used to force her to brand herself and she had to get marks on her body. The note stated that Akash even forced her to brand herself in "private" places on her body, threatening to make her objectionable photos viral on social media if she did not do so. A 16-year-old student from a private college in Hyderabad died by suicide allegedly due to pressure from faculty to improve his academic performance. In a suicide note, he mentioned that the college staff, including the principal and vice-principal, had exerted pressure on him to get better marks. The family filed a complaint, leading to a case of abetment of suicide being registered against the college authorities.

Death of seven: Deceased's business partner arrested

Surat: In an important breakthrough in the murder of six family members and suicide by a 37-year-old man, the police arrested his business partner who was allegedly pressuring the victim to take Rs 25 lakh bills for the goods he supplied.

The special investigation team (SIT) formed to probe the horrifying incident of October 28 arrested Indupal Sharma, a plywood businessman and the partner of Manish alias Shantu Solanki. Solanki, who was in the carpentry business, had administered poison to his wife, three children, and parents, and even strangled his mother and daughter to ensure they died. He then hanged to death at their house in Siddheswar Apartments in the Palanpur Jakatnaka area. Sharma came under the police radar after the SIT found another note in the account books seized from Solanki's house. In the note, Solanki had written that Sharma had sent him bills of Rs 25 lakh for immediate payment before Diwali. He was also pressuring him to take bank loans to invest in their business. He did so as his own CIBIL score was poor and his applications were rejected by the bank, said police.

In the earlier note recovered by the police, Solanki had stated that a person close to the family was harassing him. Deputy commissioner of police (zone 5) RP Barot told TOI: "As Sharma was insisting on immediate payment of Rs 25 lakh, Solanki came under extreme mental pressure. Sharma then pressured him to take loans from the bank to pay his bills and then invest in his plywood business. We called Sharma and the family members of Solanki. On confirming the facts, we arrested Sharma."

Gandhi Smruti Bhavan project launched in city

Surat: After a long wait, work for the new Gandhi Smruti Bhavan started on Wednesday. The foundation stone laying ceremony on the ground was attended by veteran theatre artist Yazdi Karanjia among other theatre personalities. Due to high costs, the Surat Municipal Corporation's attempts to invite bidders had failed to garner interest in the past.

After this, the civic body increased the budget and recently the contract was awarded for Rs 55 crore.

The auditorium is being developed on the concept of green building. With a seating capacity of 886 people, the bhavan will be developed in two years. Recently, the city's theatre artists raised concerns over the absence of an auditorium in place of Gandhi Smruti Bhavan for a long period. The old structure was built in 1980 and was declared dangerous in 2019. After keeping it closed for almost two years it was demolished.

SMC left open the third phase of Chikwadi Varachha Waterworks flyover bridge on

Sharma, a native of Ganganagar in Rajasthan, lives in Riddhi-Siddhi Apartment on Althan-Bhatar Road. He owns a firm named Nidhi Plywood in partnership with Solanki.

Adajan police inspector RB Gojia said: "During the questioning of nearly 100 witnesses, the details written in the notes were confirmed. Based on the complaint lodged by Solanki's brother-in-law

Ghanshyam Parmar, who booked Sharma for abatement for suicide."

Solanki had taken up carpentry work at around 25 sites and had nearly 35 carpenters and labourers working for him. In an emotional suicide note, Solanki had written that he had always done good to all people, but nobody cared to return the favours. He had refrained from naming anyone for the suicide.

Wednesday. The bridge has been developed at the cost of Rs 49 crore and was inaugurated by Union minister Darshana Jadhav.
