**SAHARANPUR (UP):** A 52-year-old man and his daughter were killed when their motorcycle was hit by a truck on a national highway here on Monday, police said. Adesh Kumar and his 25-year-old daughter were returning to their village when the accident occurred near Phandpuri, Superintendent of Police (Rural) Suraj Rai said. While Kumar died on the spot, his daughter sustained severe injuries and was taken to a hospital where doctors declared her brought dead, Rai said. The truck driver fled the scene leaving the vehicle behind, he added.

## Man offers namaz at shopping complex

**MEERUT (UP):** A video showing a man offering namaz allegedly at a shopping complex here surfaced on social media, prompting police to launch an investigation. Earlier, a similar incident at recently inaugurated Lulu Mall in Lucknow had sparked a major controversy, forcing police to make arrests for offering prayers in an "unauthorised manner". Meerut Circle Officer (CO) Devesh Singh told PTI that the veracity of the video is being ascertained. District convener of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) IT cell, Digvijay Singh, had tweeted the purported video, claiming namaz was offered at S2S Square Complex located on Garh Road. The Meerut police in a tweet said the Nauchandi police station incharge has been asked to investigate the matter.

## 'Over 12k teaching posts vacant in KVVs'

**NEW DELHI:** Over 12,000 teaching positions are vacant in Kendriya Vidyalayas across the country while over 9,000 teachers have been engaged on contractual basis, according to the education ministry. The maximum vacant teaching positions are in Tamil Nadu (1,162), Madhya Pradesh (1,066) and Karnataka (1,006). The statistics were shared by Union Minister of State for Education, Annapurna Devi, in response to a written question in Lok Sabha. "There are 12,044 teaching posts and 1,332 non-teaching posts lying vacant in Kendriya Vidyalayas across the country. The vacancies arise due to transfer, retirement from time to time," Devi said.

# Partha fit, stable: AIIMS

The ED presented the AIIMS Bhubaneswar medical report before the Calcutta High Court which stated that Bengal minister Partha Chatterjee, who was arrested in the School Service Commission (SSC) recruitment scam case, is "fit and stable". Partha Chatterjee's medical report also said the Bengal minister doesn't need hospitalisation. Presenting medical reports to HC, ED said Partha was "taking advantage" of his position to stay in a state-run hospital. "He is fit and can be taken into custody," ED said. AIIMS Bhubaneswar medical report stated though Partha suffers from chronic diseases, he "does not need immediate hospitalisation". This was corroborated by AIIMS executive director Ashutosh Biswas.

Undercurrent of friction between the BJP and the JD(U) became more apparent on Monday when Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar skipped the oath-taking ceremony of president Droupadi Murmu in Delhi. Defending Kumar's absence, Janata Dal-United parliamentary board chief Upendra Kushwaha asserted that the chief minister is not bound to attend all the events. JD(U) had supported Murmu's candidature in the presidential poll. When Murmu visited Patna for the poll campaign, Nitish Kumar had pledged his party's support to her. "Going to an oath ceremony is just a formality. It is not necessary to attend every event. Since he had a lot of commitments here in Bihar, he could not make it the national capital for the oath-taking ceremony. It is not a big issue. People should avoid paying attention to it," Kushwaha said.



# Oppn must keep country above political interests, says PM

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday expressed concern over the increasing tendency in political organisations to put their ideologies above that of the country's, and said that parties should be mindful of the fact that opposing a rival or an individual should not go against the nation's best interests. "The tendency of putting ideologies and personal interests before that of the country's is gaining momentum, the prime minister warned.



"Many a times, opposition parties place obstructions before the government because they could not implement decisions when they were in power. Now, when these [initiatives] are implemented, they oppose. It is the duty of all political parties to be mindful that opposing a party or a person does not become a voice against the country," he said. Most political parties, particularly the non-Congress ones, have fulfilled this thought of keeping the country first in true spirit, he said, adding that non-Congress parties followed the principle of support and coordination. "Terminating the swearing-in of India's 15th President Droupadi Murmu as a big day for democracy, Modi said that after Independence, this is the first time a tribal woman will lead the country. Underlining the importance of social justice, the prime minister said this is testament to the fact that all sections of society get equal opportunities. "Unless the Dalits, tribals, women, and the physically challenged are empowered, the country cannot move ahead. We need to embrace social justice and accept the essence of it to serve society," Modi said.

Union Minister and leader of House Piyush Goyal asserted in the Rajya Sabha the sitting arrangement was made as per the protocol, and no disrespect was shown to the post Kharge holds.

**'₹15,477cr spent to lay 2,088 km rd along border with China in 5 yrs'** The government constructed 2,088 kms of roads in areas bordering China in the last five years with an expenditure of Rs 15,477 crore, the government said on Monday. In total, the government spent Rs 20,767 crore in constructing 3,595 kms of border roads during the period that included those in areas along the frontiers with Pakistan, Bangladesh and Myanmar, according to the details provided in Lok Sabha. MoS for Defence Ajay Bhatt said the government constructed 2,088.57 kms of road along the border with China by incurring an expenditure of Rs15,477.06 crore. According to the details provided by him, Rs4,242.38 crore was spent to construct 1,336.09 kms of road along the border with Pakistan, while an expenditure of Rs882.52 crore was incurred to build 151.15 kms road along the frontier with Myanmar in the last five years.

# Just retired Kovind gets plum retirement benefits

**NEW DELHI:** Ram Nath Kovind, who demitted office on Monday after serving as India's 14th President, moved into a fully furnished bungalow in Lutyens' Delhi which will be his home for the rest of his life, during which he will be entitled to a monthly pension of Rs 2.5 lakh. Kovind is also entitled to secretarial staff comprising a private secretary, a personal assistant and two peons, and office expenses up to Rs 1 lakh per annum. According to The President's Emoluments And Pension Act, 1951, uploaded on <https://legislative.gov.in/>, the retired president is entitled to free medical atten-

dance and treatment, and to the highest class travel anywhere in India, accompanied by one person, by air, rail, or steamer. The President of India gets a salary of Rs 5 lakh every month. A former President who demits office either after expiration of his term or by resignation gets a pension at the rate of 50 per cent of the emoluments of the President per month for the rest of his or her life, according to the Act. Kovind, as per the laid down pro-

cedure, is entitled to a Type-VIII bungalow and has been allotted 12-Janpath, which was occupied by Ram Vilas Paswan till his death and later by his son Chirag Paswan before he had to vacate in March this year. The former President will have Congress chief Sonia Gandhi, who lives at 10 Janpath, as his new neighbour. According to the 1951 Act, a retired President will, for the rest of his or her life, be entitled to the use of a furnished residence (including its maintenance) without payment of rent, two telephones (one for internet and broadband connectivity), one mobile phone with national roaming facility, and a car, or allowance to avail a car.

motu cognisance of a media report that "poor quality of food" is being served to the prisoners in Begusarai Jail, it said. Besides, on the quality of food, the report should also include the status of other basic facilities for the prisoners in other jails of the state, it said. According to the media report, the matter came to the notice when a prisoner, lodged in the Begusarai Jail, approached the Secretary, District Legal Services Authority, it added.

# DGCA conducts spot checks on 48 SpiceJet aircraft

Aviation regulator DGCA conducted 53 spot checks on 48 SpiceJet aircraft between July 9 and July 13 and it did not find any major safety violations, Minister of State for Civil Aviation V K Singh said Monday. "However, as a safety measure, the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) ordered SpiceJet to use certain identified aircraft (10) for operations only after confirming to the regulator that all reported defects/malfunctions are rectified," Singh said in his written reply in Rajya Sabha.

SpiceJet planes were involved in at least eight technical malfunction incidents in the 18-day period starting June 19, following which the DGCA had on July 6 issued a show-cause notice to the airline, stating



that "poor internal safety oversight" and "inadequate maintenance actions" had resulted in degradation of safety margins. Just three days after issuing the notice, the regulator started conducting spot checks on SpiceJet planes, Singh stated. The spot checks were completed on July 13. "A total of 53 spot checks were carried out on 48 aircraft which did not find any major significant finding or safety violation," he mentioned. The DGCA's safety oversight process involves series of successive follow up steps which includes communication of observations or

findings to the airlines for taking corrective action, review of corrective action taken by the airlines for taking a decision, and initiating enforcement action consisting of warning, suspension, cancellation or imposition of financial penalty to the person or the airline involved, he noted.

In its notice to SpiceJet on July 6, the regulator had said that the airline has failed to "establish safe, efficient and reliable air services" under the Aircraft Rules, 1937. "The review (of the incidents) transpires that poor internal safety oversight and inadequate maintenance actions (as most of the incidents were related to either component failure or system-related failure) have resulted in degradation of the safety margins," the notice added. The regulator gave airline three weeks to respond to the no-

findings. The DGCA had on July 19 started a 2-month-long special audit of all Indian carriers after its spot checks earlier this month found that insufficient and unqualified engineering personnel are certifying carriers' planes before their departure, officials said.

Meanwhile, in aviation, everything depends on the air traffic control and with one mistake anything can happen, the Bombay High Court remarked on Monday while hearing a plea on dangers to aircraft by high-rises near Mumbai airport. A division bench of Chief Justice Dipankar Datta and Justice M S Karnik was hearing a public interest litigation filed by advocate Yashwant Shenoy, seeking action against construction of buildings above the prescribed height limit in the vicinity of the city airport.

## Just retired Kovind gets plum retirement benefits

NEW DELHI

Ram Nath Kovind, who demitted office on Monday after serving as India's 14th President, moved into a fully furnished bungalow in Lutyens' Delhi which will be his home for the rest of his life, during which he will be entitled to a monthly pension of Rs 2.5 lakh. Kovind is also entitled to secretarial staff comprising a private secretary, an additional private secretary, a personal assistant and two peons, and office expenses up to Rs 1 lakh per annum.

According to The President's Emoluments And Pension Act, 1951, uploaded on <https://legislative.gov.in/>, the retired president is entitled to free medical attendance and treatment, and to the highest class travel anywhere in India, accompanied by one person, by air, rail, or steamer. The President of India gets a salary of Rs 5 lakh every month.

A former President who demits office either after expiration of his term or by resignation gets a pension at the rate of 50 per cent of the emoluments of the President per month for the rest of his or her life,

according to the Act. Kovind, as per the laid down procedure, is entitled to a Type-VIII bungalow and has been allotted 12-Janpath, which was occupied by Ram Vilas Paswan till his death and later by his son Chirag Paswan before he had to vacate in March this year.

The former President will have Congress chief Sonia Gandhi, who lives at 10 Janpath, as his new neighbour. According to the 1951 Act, a retired President will, for the rest of his or her life, be entitled to the use of a furnished residence (including its maintenance) without payment of rent, two telephones (one for internet and broadband connectivity), one mobile phone with national roaming facility, and a car, or allowance to avail a car.

The law says that the spouse of the President is entitled to get a family pension at the rate of 50 per cent of what a retiring President gets, for the rest of her/his life, in case the president dies in office, or resigns, or demits office after the end of the term. The spouse is also entitled to medical attendance and treatment free of charge for the rest of his or her life.



## UP CM showers petals on 'Kanwariyas'

Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Monday undertook an aerial survey of the ongoing Kanwar Yatra in western part of the state and showered petals on Kanwariyas, an official spokesperson said. The Kanwar Yatra is being taken out in the state after a gap of two years. Earlier, it was suspended due to the coronavirus pandemic. During the yatra, Shiva devotees collect water from the Ganga and offer it to the deity at temples back home.

According to a report from Baghpat, Shiva devotees were accorded a grand welcome by the chief minister and district officials. Flowers were showered on the Kanwariyas by Adityanath from his helicopter; a senior official said in Baghpat. The CM's helicopter reached the Siddhpeeth Parshurameshwar Purnamahadev temple in Baghpat in the afternoon and made four rounds of the temple complex. Flowers were showered on the Kanwariyas from the helicopter amidst chants of "Har Har Mahadev". Baghpat DM Rajkamal Yadav and SP Neeraj Jadaun rode in an open car and showered flowers on Kanwariyas. A video of it was also shared on social media.

## Congress MLA's comment stirs controversy in K'taka

Congress leader and MLA B Z Zameer Ahmed Khan's remarks about Muslims outnumbering Vokkaligas in Karnataka has stirred a controversy, with it now taking the shape of "community politics." Vokkaliga leaders from the ruling BJP hit out at Khan for his remarks by projecting it as an attempt to belittle the politically dominant community, even as Congress leaders tried for damage control while expressing reservations against the comments made.

There are reports that Nirmalanandanatha swamiji, a prominent Vokkaliga seer, has conveyed his unhappiness to Congress leaders in this regard. Khan, who is considered to be a close confidant of Congress Legislature Party leader Siddaramaiah, while reacting to party's state President D K Shivakumar's attempt to consolidate the Vokkaliga community, had recently said that nobody can become the Chief Minister with support from just one community.

"No one can become CM with support from one community, everyone will have the desire (to become CM) that's not wrong...it is possible (to become CM) only by taking all communities together? I too have a desire to become CM, my community's percentage is more than that

of Vokkaligas. Is it possible for me to become CM, just with the support of my community? Not possible," Khan said.

Shivakumar, who is a Vokkaliga, had recently called on the community, which forms a major vote-bank in the old Mysuru or southern Karnataka region, to support his Chief Ministerial bid. Shivakumar and Siddaramaiah have been engaged in a political one upmanship for months now, as both are Chief Ministerial aspirants in the event of Congress coming to power in the state after 2023 Assembly polls.

Though Siddaramaiah has been maintaining that the party's newly elected legislators and high command will decide on who will be the Chief Minister, his loyalists including Khan have been openly making statements in favour of their leader, ignoring warnings of disciplinary action, leaving the party virtually divided.

Khan's statement that Muslims outnumber Vokkaligas in the state, while trying to make a case for Siddaramaiah as CM face, has now led to a controversy and has drawn criticism. Expressing his displeasure over Khan's statement, Congress leader and Vokkaliga leader from Mandya Cheluvarayaswamy said, "unnecessary mentioning" about the community was not right.

## SFI protests for second day over Bengal jobs scam

KOLKATA

CPI(M) student wing SFI on Monday staged a protest for the second consecutive day demanding the arrest of all those involved in the school jobs scam in West Bengal. Around 100 members of the Students' Federation of India (SFI) blocked the arterial College Street-M G Road Crossing for some time and raised slogans against the ruling TMC, holding it responsible for de-

priving eligible candidates of getting jobs.

A number of the protesters were Presidency University students, besides those of other neighbouring institutions such as Surendranath, Bangabasi and Jaipuria colleges. SFI had staged a similar protest at Seal-dah station on Sunday during which they beat drums and raised slogans demanding that the Enforcement Directorate (ED) bring to book all those who are involved in the scam.

State minister Partha Chatterjee and his associate Arpita Mukherjee have been arrested by the ED in connection with its probe into the appointment scam in which teaching jobs in state government-sponsored and aided schools were allegedly offered in lieu of money. A large sum of money has purportedly been found in the flat of Mukherjee, while Chatterjee was the then state education minister when the scam took place.

## SC dismisses plea on lawyers' summer dress

NEW DELHI

The Supreme Court on Monday refused to entertain a plea seeking exemption for lawyers from wearing black coats and gowns in the apex court as well as high courts across the country during summer. A bench of Justices Indira Banerjee and V Ramasubramanian said it cannot entertain the plea under Article 32 and asked the petitioner to approach the Bar Council of India (BCI) with his grievance.

The top court also granted liberty to lawyer Shailendra Mani Tripathi to approach the top court again if the BCI does



not act on his plea. The petitioner withdrew the plea and the matter was dismissed as withdrawn. Senior advocate Vikas Singh appeared for the petitioner. The plea has sought a direction to state bar councils to amend their rules and decide the time period when lawyers would be exempted

from wearing black coats and gowns depending upon the fact as to when the summer peaks in the particular state.

Wearing coats during torrid summer makes it difficult for lawyers to move from one court to another, it said. Lawyers' dress code is governed by the Bar Council of India Rules under the Advocates Act, 1961, and they make it mandatory for an advocate to wear a black coat with a white shirt and a white neck-band. Under the rules, wearing an advocate's gown is optional except when the lawyer is appearing in the Supreme Court or in a high court.

## STUBBLE BURNING MENACE

# Punjab, Delhi plan cash incentive for farmers

NEW DELHI

The Aam Aadmi Party governments in Punjab and Delhi plan to provide cash incentive to farmers in the border state for not burning stubble and have requested the Centre to share the cost, officials have said. Paddy straw burning in Punjab and Haryana is a major reason behind the alarming spike in air pollution levels in the national capital in October and November. Farmers set their fields on fire to quickly clear off the crop residue before cultivating wheat and potato.



Punjab generates around 20 million tons of paddy straw annually. "We have prepared a proposal to provide a cash incentive to farmers who desist from burning paddy straw. The plan is that the Centre should bear 50 per cent of the cost and Punjab and Delhi will contribute 25 percent each," a senior Punjab government official said. "Del-

hi will share the cost since smoke from farm fires impact air quality in the national capital," he said.

"The proposal has been sent to the Centre. Once it is approved, it will be tabled before the Punjab cabinet," the official said. He said the Punjab and Delhi governments will implement the scheme even if the Centre doesn't agree. Delhi government is yet to offer a comment on the proposal. Farm machinery is provided to farmers for in-situ management of stubble at a subsidised rate under a centre-sponsored scheme.

# Covid leading cause of maternal deaths

RTI data reveals 29 of 197 maternal deaths attributed to Covid-19 in 2020, increased to 43 of 190 in 2021; pregnant women with comorbid issues more prone to virus, complications

Covid-19 was the major reason behind most maternal deaths across Mumbai in 2021 compared to 2020. A Right to Information filed by activist Chetan Kothari data reveals that 29 of 197 (14.7 per cent) maternal deaths attributed to Covid-19 in 2020 increased to 43 of 190 maternal deaths or (22.63 per cent) in 2021. Earlier, haemorrhage, sepsis, and TB had been the leading cause of death. However, the doctors believe that there is a need for awareness related to vaccination among pregnant women who are more susceptible to contracting Covid-19.

The other major causes of maternal death in 2021 were - Haemorrhage (21 deaths), Sepsis (22 deaths), TB (16 deaths), Heart Disease (9 deaths), Anaemia (4 deaths) & High BP (3 deaths). However, 32 maternal deaths in 2019 and 18 maternal deaths in 2020 were due to haemorrhage.

"The data showed that in the last three years, 71 maternal deaths were caused due to haemorrhage. This is preventable if the haemoglobin level of women is built properly by regular, timely Ante-natal check-up (ANC), which sometimes females avoid.

In case, a female bleeds a lot during delivery, then she can be saved by blood transfusion, provided adequate blood is available in time. Time and again, serious matters of blood shortage have been highlighted. These deaths are indirectly, to a certain extent, the result of such deaths," said a senior doctor.

A senior gynaecologist from the civic-run hospital said, "Covid-19 leads to health complications in pregnant women as it adds complications of lungs and other organs in a small percentage."

"During pregnancy, the immunity level decreases, which makes them more susceptible to the infection. So, women with comorbid health issues develop complications. Many

found out they had Covid at the time of delivery," she said.

Moreover, there should be detailed studies to understand if the basic aetiology of maternal deaths has changed, as sepsis, haemorrhage, and hypertension have been some of the most common causes, and those continue to be formidable.

Dr Pratima Thamke, consultant obstetrician & gynaecologist, Motherhood Hospital, Kharghar, said, "Pregnant women have higher chances of getting infected with Covid-19, and should get vaccinated as per doctor's advice. The vaccine doesn't lead to Covid infection. It is safe for pregnant women and their babies too.

"Vaccination can allow the mother to build antibodies that can even offer protection to the babies. Various studies suggest that the vaccine doesn't lead to any complications during pregnancy or impact the baby, fertility, or change menstruation. Pregnant ladies should not skip vaccination at all," she said.

## 2 from Kopri succumb to Swine flu

Swine flu cases in Maharashtra seem to be on the rise, with two patients from Kopri in Thane succumbing to the infection last week. These are the first deaths due to the H1N1 virus in the city informed officials from the Thane Municipal Corporation (TMC).

"There have been 20 positive cases of Swine Flu in Thane city till date with two deaths. Babita Hate, 72, was admitted to Mahavir Jain Hospital after she fell ill on July 9. She tested positive for H1N1 on July 14 and was shifted to the Parking Plaza dedicated Covid-19 health centre after her condition deteriorated, where she succumbed to the infection after having a heart attack." TMC's deputy medical officer, Smitali Humraskar said. She added that the other patient - Jyoti Raja Bajaj, 51 - fell ill on July 12. She complained of fever, vomiting and cough. On July 13, she tested negative for Covid but positive for H1N1 on July 14. She succumbed to the infection on July 18 at a Thane healthcare centre.

## Kissing incident: Shilpa Shetty seeks dismissal of plea

Actor Shilpa Shetty has sought dismissal of a plea challenging the order of a magistrate court in Ballard Pier that had discharged her in January this year in an obscenity case involving American actor Richard Gere.

The complaint was filed against her at Alwar police station in Rajasthan by a person in 2007, in connection with the incident where Gere had kissed her on stage during a charity event in Delhi. As per the apex court's orders, the case was transferred to a Mumbai court. Magistrate Ketaki M Chavan of the Ballard Pier court had called her a victim of the act of Gere and gave her a clean chit in January this year.

However, in April, the Alwar police approached the sessions court against the magistrate's order and stated in its plea that the magistrate had erred in discharging

Shilpa and that her act of kissing or allowing to be kissed in a public place amounted to obscenity. It had said that if the court peruses the FIR, it will find that a prima facie case is made out against her.

On Monday, in her reply through advocate Prashant Patil, Shilpa said that she is a victim of malicious proceedings and harassment by the complainant; that she is an artist and has always acted responsibly in public. She said the complainant is approaching the court for cheap publicity and that the only allegation against her is that she did not protest while being kissed, but this does not make her a conspirator or perpetrator of any crime.

## Phone tapping: MHA seeks to dispose of plea against State

Following the transfer of the case concerning phone tapping by former Rashmi Shukla to the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) last week, the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) that had challenged an order of a magistrate court that was in favour of the state, on Monday sought before a sessions court to dispose of its plea.

The state was probing the 'leak' of confidential information pertaining to corruption in police transfers and postings in the state. The alleged leak took place during the tenure of Shukla when she was heading the State Intelligence Department.

On December 28 last year, a city magistrate court had di-

rected the MHA to hand over documents and devices the state had sought from it, within 10 days. Among the devices sought is suspected to be a pen drive that then leader of opposition Devendra Fadnis had given to the MHA. Fadnis had sought a CBI probe into the matter and said in a press conference that he had given information regarding the Maharashtra police transfer racket to the Union Home Ministry. The MHA then approached the sessions court against the order on January 13, 2022.

On Monday, special public prosecutor Shriram Shirsat told a court that the MHA wants to withdraw the plea since the matter is transferred to the CBI and that the plea be disposed of. Special Judge RN Rokade asked why the plea is being withdrawn and that it can be decided on merits. The court will hear the matter on Tuesday.

## Nirav's bro-in-law can't travel to Hong Kong: HC

The Bombay High Court (HC) on Monday refused to grant urgent permission to Maiank Mehta - brother-in-law of fugitive diamondaire Nirav Modi - for travel to Hong Kong, after the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI), which is probing the case, contended that it is having a hard time extraditing Modi, who is the main accused.

However, a division bench of justices Revati Mohite-Dere and Sharmila Deshmukh also restrained the CBI from taking any coercive action against Mehta till August 23 while asking him to appear before the central agency for investigation.

The HC was hearing an appeal filed by the CBI against the order of the special court trying cases registered under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) allowing Mehta to travel back to his residence in Hong Kong. Earlier, Mehta was an accused in the Enforcement Directorate (ED) case against Modi. He and his wife Purvi (Modi's sister) agreed to cooperate and give the information they had against Modi. Follow-

ing this they were granted pardon by the PMLA court trying the ED case. After Mehta got permission for travel to Hong Kong, the CBI opposed the same contending that he was still an accused in case registered by them and hence he cannot travel abroad.

Mehta's counsel Amit Desai contended that he has been extending all cooperation to the investigating agency. He urged the court to permit Mehta to travel to Hong Kong for one-two weeks since his family is there and he has been in India for over 10 months now. "We have come with clean hands and want to participate in the investigation. He has been asking (the CBI) since 10 months whether he should go (to Hong Kong). He has written to all the officers (of the CBI). They never acknowledge the letters," said Desai.

Seeking permission for at least temporary travel, Desai said, "His family is in Hong Kong. One parent, who is in Hong Kong had a fall recently and there was no one to look after the parent. However, he could not go. He also wanted to go for his child's graduation ceremony; it's an emotional issue."

## Currency notes have tactile features to aid visually challenged: RBI to HC

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on Monday informed the Bombay High Court that it has included several tactile features in currency notes so that visually impaired can easily identify the same.

A division bench of Chief Justice Dipankar Datta and Justice M S Karnik was hearing a petition filed by the National Association of the Blind (NAB), claiming that the new currency notes and coins posed difficulty for the visually impaired to identify and distinguish them.

Uday Warunjikar, advocate for NAB, told the court that earlier the notes and

coins were of different sizes and hence were easily identifiable.

"The RBI after the filing of this plea developed a

mobile application which could be used by visually impaired people," he told the court.

Senior counsel Venkatesh Dhond, appearing for the RBI, informed the court

that apart from developing the application, the RBI had also consulted with several associations working for the visually-impaired people.

"The RBI has developed several tactile features in the currency notes, including identification marks and raised lines," said Dhond.

The Rs 100 note has a triangle and four raised lines, Rs 500 note has a circle and five lines and the Rs 2,000 note has a rectangle and seven lines, Dhond further informed the court.

The court noted that the problems raised in the petition are serious and asked the petitioner to file an affidavit giving further suggestions.

## NMMC BEGINS TRIAL RUNS

# Industries to get treated water soon

The Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation (NMMC) began trial runs to supply recycled water to industrial units from the tertiary level sewage treatment plant (STP) in Koparkhairane. The work on another tertiary level STP plant in Airoli is also in the final stage. Civic chief Abhijit Bangar has directed officials to start the actual supply within a month to the industrial units situated in the Trans Thane Creek (TTC) industrial area.

The work of laying a separate pipeline to supply recycled water to industrial units is in the final stage. Of the total 53.134 km, the work of the 49.3 km pipeline from Vashi and Koparkhairane STP has been completed.

Bangar inspected the ongoing works of the STPs and pipeline and directed offi-

cials to speed up the installation of mechanical and electrical equipment in the tertiary treatment plant at Airoli. He further asked the officials to ensure that the project is executed promptly to start supplying treated water to industrial units.

According to senior civic officials, more than 30 industrial units have shown interest to buy treated water from the

NMMC, which according to them is cheaper than they are getting water from MIDC.

At present, the industrial units in the TTC area get water from the MIDC at Rs 22.50 per cubic meter and a total of 50 MLD of water is supplied per day. However, the civic body will provide water with tertiary level treatment at Rs 18.50 per cubic meter. The civic body expects to churn out around

Rs 494 crore in the next 15 years for the supply of treated water to industrial units.

The newly-constructed two civic body tertiary level STPs in Koparkhairane and Airoli will recycle around 42 and 49 MLD wastewater daily.

For the last several years, the NMMC has been planning to utilise the treated water. However, so far, recycled water has been used only in gardens, parks, and playgrounds in Nerul and Belapur wards. When the civic body had set the STPs in the city, it claimed that recycled water can be used for potable purposes, too. However, the civic body could not get buyers.

On the other hand, the Central government was pushing for recycling and using sewage water. As a result, the NMMC has set up two state-of-the-art wastewater treatment plants at Airoli and Koparkhairane under the Central government's Amrit Mission.

**VI. FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS**

- Assuming full acceptance, the maximum consideration payable under this Open Offer shall be ₹10,96,57,600/- (Rupees Ten Crores Ninety Six Lakhs Fifty Seven Thousand Six Hundred Only).
- As a security for the performance of its obligations under Regulation 17 of the SEBI (SAST) Regulations, the Acquirers have opened an Escrow Account with Kotak Mahindra Bank Limited having its registered office and branch at 27 BKC, 3rd Floor, Plot No C-27, G Block, Bandra Kurla Complex, Bandra (E) Mumbai - 400051 (hereinafter referred to as the "Escrow Bank") in the name and style "Acrow India Limited Open Offer Escrow Account" (the "Escrow Account") pursuant to an escrow agreement dated July 19, 2022 between the Manager, the Escrow Bank and the Acquirers ("Escrow Agreement") and have deposited an amount of ₹2,76,00,000/- (Rupees Two Crores Seventy Six Lakhs Only) being more than 25% of the consideration payable under this Open Offer (assuming full acceptance). Further, in order to ensure that the funds that are payable to the Public Shareholders who validly tender in the Open Offer are managed more efficiently, the Acquirers have opened a Special Escrow Account with the Escrow Bank in the name and style "Acrow India Limited Open Offer Special Escrow Account" under the Escrow Agreement, for the purpose of Regulation 21 of the SEBI (SAST) Regulations ("Special Escrow Account"). The Manager to the Open Offer has been authorized by the Acquirers to operate and realize the monies lying to the credit of the Escrow and the Special Escrow Account, in accordance with the SEBI (SAST) Regulations.
- In case of any upward revision in the Offer Price or the size of this Offer, the value in cash of the Escrow Amount shall be computed on the revised consideration calculated at such revised offer price or offer size and any additional amounts required will be funded by the Acquirers, prior to effecting such revision, in terms of Regulation 17(2) of the SEBI (SAST) Regulations.
- The Open Offer obligations shall be met by the Acquirers through Internal sources and no borrowings from any bank and/or financial institutions are envisaged.
- Rajesh Agrawal, Chartered Accountant (Membership No: 101090) of M/s Rajesh Agrawal & Co, Chartered Accountants, having Firm Registration no. 147072W has vide certificate dated July 03, 2022 certified that all the Acquirers have adequate financial resources to fulfill all the obligations under SEBI (SAST) Regulations.
- Based on the aforesaid financial arrangements and on the confirmation received from the Escrow Banker and the certificate received from Chartered Accountant, the Manager to the Open Offer is satisfied about the ability of the Acquirers to implement the Open Offer in accordance with the SEBI (SAST) Regulations. The Manager to the Open Offer confirms that the firm arrangement for the funds and money for payment through verifiable means are in place to fulfill the Open Offer obligation.

**VII. STATUTORY AND OTHER APPROVALS**

- As on date of this DPS, to the best of the knowledge of the Acquirers, there are no statutory or other approvals required to complete this Open Offer except the approvals required by the NRIs and OCBs, FPIs, QFIs and FIs as given below in point 4. If any statutory approvals are required or become applicable prior to completion of the Open Offer, the Offer would be subject to the receipt of such statutory approvals.
- The Acquirers will have the right not to proceed with the Open Offer in accordance with Regulation 23 of the SEBI (SAST) Regulations. In the event of withdrawal of the Offer, a public announcement will be made (through the Manager to the Offer) stating the grounds and reasons for the withdrawal of the Open Offer in accordance with Regulation 23(2) of the SEBI (SAST) Regulations, within 2 (two) Working Days of such withdrawal in the same newspapers in which the DPS has been published and such public announcement will also be sent to the Stock Exchange, SEBI and the Target Company at its registered office.
- There are no conditions in the underlying agreement i.e. SPA dated July 19, 2022 between the Selling Shareholders and the Acquirers, the meeting of which is outside the reasonable control of the Acquirers, and in view of which the Open Offer might be withdrawn under Regulation 23 of the SEBI (SAST) Regulations.
- Holders of Equity Shares who are persons not resident in India, including NRIs and OCBs, FPIs, QFIs and FIs, must obtain all requisite approvals required to tender the Equity Shares held by them pursuant to the Open Offer (including without limitation, the approval from the Reserve Bank of India ("RBI") or any other regulatory body) and submit such approvals, along with the other documents required in terms of the Letter of Offer. Further they will be required to submit the previous approvals that they would have obtained for holding the Equity Shares, to tender the Equity Shares held by them pursuant to the Offer, along with the other documents required to be tendered to accept the Offer. In the event such approvals are not submitted, the Acquirers reserve the right to reject such Equity Shares tendered in the Offer.
- Where any statutory approval extends to some but not all the Eligible Equity Shareholders, the Acquirers shall have the option to make payment to such Eligible Equity Shareholders in respect of whom no statutory approvals are required in order to complete this Offer.
- Subject to the receipt of statutory and other approvals, if any, the Acquirers shall complete all procedures relating to payment of consideration under this Open Offer within (10) ten Working Days from the date of expiry of the Tendering Period to those Eligible Equity Shareholders whose documents are found valid and are in order and are accepted for acquisition by the Acquirers.
- In terms of Regulation 18(11) of the SEBI (SAST) Regulations, the Acquirers shall be responsible to pursue all statutory approvals required by it, in order to complete the Open Offer without any default, neglect or delay, including RBI approval under FEMA regulations for Equity Shares tendered by non-resident shareholders. In case of delay in receipt of any statutory approval, SEBI may, if satisfied that delayed receipt of the requisite approvals was not due to any willful default or neglect of the Acquirers or the failure of the Acquirers to diligently pursue the application for the approval, grant extension of time for the purpose, subject to the Acquirers agreeing to pay interest to the Eligible Equity Shareholders as directed by the SEBI, in terms of Regulation 18(11) of the SEBI (SAST) Regulations.

**IX. PROCEDURE FOR TENDERING THE EQUITY SHARES IN CASE OF NON-RECEIPT OF LETTER OF OFFER**

- Subject to paragraph (4) of Part VII (Statutory and Other Approvals) of this DPS, all the Public Shareholders (except the Acquirers and Sellers), holding Equity Shares in dematerialized form or physical form, registered or unregistered, are eligible to participate in this Open Offer at any time during the Tendering Period of this offer.
- A Letter of Offer specifying the detailed terms and conditions of this Open Offer along with Form of Acceptance-Cum-Acknowledgement will be mailed/dispached to all the Public Shareholders whose names appear in the register of members of the Target Company at the close of business hours on the Identified Date.
- Persons who have acquired Equity Shares but whose names do not appear in the register of members of the Target Company on the Identified Date, or unregistered owners or those who have acquired Equity Shares after the Identified Date, or those who have not received the Letter of Offer, may also participate in this Open Offer by submitting an application on the plain paper giving details regarding their shareholding and confirming the consent to participate in this Open Offer as per the terms and conditions of this Open Offer as set out in this DPS and to be set out in the LOF. In the alternate, such Public Shareholders may apply in the Form of Acceptance Cum Acknowledgement in relation to the Open Offer that would be annexed to the LOF, which may also be obtained from the SEBI website (www.sebi.gov.in) or from the website of Bigshare Services Private Limited ("Registrar to the Open Offer") at www.bigshareonline.com. The application along with all the other relevant documents required to be submitted shall be sent only to the Registrar to the Open Offer at the address mentioned below, so as to reach the Registrar to the Open Offer during business hours on or before the date of closing of the Tendering Period together with the depository participant ("DP") name, DP ID, account number together with a photocopy or counterfoil of the delivery instruction slip in 'off market' mode duly acknowledged by the DP for transferring the Equity Shares of the Target Company, to the special depository account ("Escrow Demat Account") opened for the purpose of Open Offer. Any form of acceptance in respect of Dematerialised Equity Shares not credited to the Escrow Demat Account on or before the closure of the Tendering Period is liable to be rejected.
- Accidental omission to dispatch the LOF to any person to whom the Open Offer is made or the non-receipt or delayed receipt of the LOF by such person shall not invalidate this Open Offer.
- The Public Shareholders who tender their Equity Shares in the Open Offer shall ensure that the Equity Shares are fully paid-up, and are free from liens, charges, and encumbrances. The Acquirers shall acquire the Open Offer Shares that are validly tendered and accepted in the Open Offer, together with all rights attached thereto, including the rights to dividends, bonuses and rights offers declared thereof in accordance with the applicable law, and the terms set out in the PA, this DPS and the Letter of Offer.
- BSE shall be the Designated Stock Exchange for the purpose of tendering Equity Shares in the Offer.
- The Open Offer will be implemented by the Acquirers through Stock Exchange Mechanism made available by BSE i.e. the Acquisition Window as provided under the SEBI (SAST) Regulations and SEBI circular CIR/CFD/POLICY/CELL/1/2015 dated April 13, 2015 issued by SEBI as amended by SEBI circular CFD/DCR/2016/131 dated December 9, 2016 and SEBI Circular SEBI/HO/CFD/CMD/CIR/P/2021/615 dated August 13, 2021 along with BSE notices no. 20170202-34 dated February 02, 2017, notice no. 20170210-16 and 20170210-23 dated February 10, 2017 and notice no. 20210819-1 dated August 19, 2021. As per the SEBI circular SEBI/HO/CFD/CMD/CIR/P/2021/615 dated August 13, 2021, a lien shall be marked against the Equity Shares of the shareholders participating in the tender offers. Upon finalisation of the entitlement, only accepted quantity of Equity Shares shall be debited from the demat account of the shareholders. The lien marked against unaccepted Equity Shares shall be released. The detailed procedure for tendering and settlement of Equity Shares under the revised mechanism is specified in the Annexure to the said circular.
- The Acquirers have appointed Keynote Financial Services Limited ("Buying Broker") as its broker for the Open Offer through whom the purchases and settlement of Open Offer shall be made during the Tendering Period. The contact details of the Buying Broker are as mentioned below:

9) All Public Equity Shareholders who desire to tender their Equity Shares under the Open Offer would have to approach their respective Stock Brokers ("Selling Broker"), during the normal trading hours of the secondary market during Tendering Period.

10) Separate Acquisition Window will be provided by the BSE to facilitate placing of sell orders. The Selling Brokers can enter orders for investors having Equity Shares in physical and demat form.

11) The Selling Broker would be required to place an order/bid on behalf of the Public Shareholders who wish to tender their Equity Shares in the Open Offer using the Acquisition Window of the BSE. Before placing the bid, the concerned Public Shareholder/Selling Broker would be required to transfer the tendered Equity Shares to the special account of Clearing Corporation of India Limited ("Clearing Corporation"), by using the settlement number and the procedure prescribed by the Clearing Corporation.

12) The cumulative quantity tendered shall be displayed on the exchange website throughout the trading session at specific intervals by the Stock Exchange during Tendering Period.

13) In the event the Selling Broker is not registered with any of the Stock Exchanges, then that Eligible Equity Shareholder can approach the Buying Broker and tender the Equity Shares through the Buying Broker, after submitting the details as may be
