At least 78 per cent parents in rural India want their daughters to be graduate: Survey

NEW DELHI, AUG 9 /--/ At least 78 per cent parents in rural India aspire to educate their daughters till graduation and beyond, according to a survey report. The "State of Elementary Education in Rural India-2022" report, based on the survey of 6,229 rural households from across 20 states, was released by Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan here on Tuesday evening. "Analyzing the gender distribution of the children, the findings indicate that parents exhibit a similar inclination for both their female and male children to pursue advanced education, including technical degrees, graduation, and post-graduation degrees. Parents of 82 per cent of boys and 78 per cent of girls want to educate their children to graduation and above," it said. The survey

revealed, out of the total dropped-out children, around one-fourth of male children discontinued their education during primary schooling. "Comparatively, the dropout rate at that stage was higher for female children, reaching 35 per cent. A higher proportion of both boys and girls dropped out of school after completing the primary school education (75 per cent for boys and

65 per cent for girls). "Non-availability of schools with higher sections within the village or nearby villages might have been a reason why these children were dropped out after the completion of the primary sections," it added. The survey found that a majority of children (62.5 per cent) are under the supervision of their mothers when it comes to their studies, while 49 per cent are supervised by their fathers.

Transforming Rural India Foundation (TRIF) and Sambodhi Pvt, with a vision to put forth data along with the right analytics and insights to stimulate action among stakeholders of rural India's development. The survey found that a majority of children (62.5 per cent) are under the supervision of their mothers when it comes to their studies, while 49 per cent are supervised by their fathers.

"This highlights the important role parents play in guiding and supporting their children's academic pursuits at home. Additionally, over 38 per cent of parents opt for private tutors to further enhance their children's education. It is often seen that in rural India supervision is often carried out by people other than the parents of children." For instance, 25.6 per cent of the children

study under the guidance of an elder sibling, 3.8 per cent are supervised by anganwadi workers, and 7.6 per cent are taught by community teachers. "Comparatively, 64 per cent of these children receive supervision from their mothers, while 50 per cent are supervised by their fathers. About 26 per cent of the children study under the supervision of a private tutor," the report added. The survey

also investigated the time spent on smartphone by children. "Overall, nearly 73 per cent of children utilize smartphones for less than two hours daily. Notably, older children tend to spend more time on their phones, with 25.4 per cent of children in class 8 and above dedicating two to four hours, in contrast to 16.8 per cent of children in classes 1 to 3," it added. Fire at shop in east Delhi's Gandhi Nagar, 21 tenders rushed

NEW DELHI, AUG 9 /--/ A major fire broke out at a plywood factory Wednesday morning in east Delhi's Gandhi Nagar area, officials said. According to fire officials, information about the blaze was received at 4.07 am, following which 21 fire tenders were rushed to the spot. The fire has been brought under control and cooling operation is underway, they said. "We received a call at 4.07 am about a fire in a plywood godown, following which we sent 3-4 fire tenders. At 5.29 am, it was declared as Make-6 category fire, and currently, 21 fire tenders are working to control the blaze. Fortunately, no injury has been reported so far," Rajendra Atwal, Divisional Officer, Central Division, had earlier said. A local said early action by authorities could have prevented fire from spreading. "The fire had broken out in Jagmohan Plywood. The fire tenders took more than one hour to arrive. We used our own fire extinguishers to try to control the blaze. The fire was restricted to one section of the premises, but later spread. It could have been controlled if fire tenders had rushed a little," alleged one Karandeep Singh. According to police, around at 3.55 am, a patrol team from Gandhi Nagar Police Station saw some smoke coming out from Jagmohan Plywood store, situated adjacent to police station. They tried to douse the fire with water and also made a PCR call. However, due to dry wood, fire spread quickly. A police officer said the plywood was taking time to cool off and the shop was completely gutted. Loss of property is yet to be ascertained, he said. Morning visuals of the fire showed people salvaging material from the shop. An MLA from the area said space has been allocated to set up a local fire station to give swift relief in such eventualities.(PTI)

Parliament passes Bill to set up national agency to fund research across universities

NEW DELHI, AUG 9 /--/ The Rajya Sabha on Wednesday passed the Anusandhan National Research Foundation Bill 2023 to set up a national agency to fund research across universities in the country. The Bill was passed by the Lok Sabha on Monday. It was passed by a voice vote in the Rajya Sabha in just 40 minutes after being taken up for consideration and passage. Only six members participated in the debate as the Opposition had earlier walked out of the House. Replying to the discussion for consideration and passage of the Bill, Science and Technology Minister Jitendra Singh termed it "history in the making" and said it is going to have long-term outcomes. As Opposition members were not present in the Upper House during the discussion and

passage of the Bill, Singh said the Government was looking forward to having more constructive inputs from them as well. Participating in the discussion on the Bill, Sujit Kumar of the BJD said: "The hope is that this Bill - NRF 2023 - will bring about an integrated, holistic and a perceptible change in the country's innovation landscape by tapping into universities, higher education and the private sector." Ayodhya Rami Reddy Alla of the YSRCP termed the Bill "transformative" and one that holds immense promise for India's future. "The establishment of NRF is going to give a new direction to reshape our nation's research innovation and entrepreneurial landscape," he noted. Kanakamedala Ravindra Kumar of the TDP also "wholeheartedly" sup-

ported the Bill. V Vijayasai Reddy, YSRCP, termed it a significant step forward in the direction of revamping the entire R & D ecosystem and said his party, therefore, supports the proposed legislation. Other members including G K Vasan (TMC (M) and M Thambidurai AIADMK also spoke on the features of the Bill. On 28 June, 2023 the Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, approved the introduction of the National Research Foundation (NRF) Bill, 2023 in Parliament. The approved Bill will pave the way to establish NRF that will seed, grow and promote Research and Development (R&D) and foster a culture of research and innovation throughout India's universities, colleges, research institutions, and R&D laboratories. The Bill, after approval in the Parliament, will establish the NRF, an apex body to provide high-level strategic direction of scientific research in the country according to recommendations of the National Education Policy (NEP), at a total estimated cost of Rs 50,000 crore during five years (2023-28). The Department of Sci-

ence and Technology (DST) will be the administrative Department of NRF which will be governed by a Governing Board consisting of eminent researchers and professionals across disciplines. Since the scope of the NRF is wide-ranging impacting all ministries - the Prime Minister will be the ex-officio president of the board and the Union Minister of Science & Technology & Union Minister of Education will be the ex-officio vice-presidents. NRF's functioning will be governed by an Executive Council chaired by the Principal Scientific Adviser to the Government of India. The NRF will forge collaborations among the industry, academia, and government departments and research institutions, and create an interface mechanism for participation and contribution of industries and state governments in addition to the scientific and line ministries. It will focus on creating a policy framework and putting in place regulatory processes that can encourage collaboration and increased spending by the industry on R&D. (PTI)

Govt committed to bring tribals into mainstream of development: Maharashtra CM

PALGHAR, AUG 9 /--/ Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde on Wednesday said the state government will renovate 250 ashram schools with modern facilities as he hailed tribals as freedom fighters and protectors of the environment. Addressing a function at Jawhar in Palghar district via video link to mark World Tribal Day, Shinde said his government was committed to working towards bringing tribals and the working-class people into the mainstream of development. Deputy Chief Ministers Devendra Fadnis and Ajit Pawar also addressed the gathering via a video link. "Tribals share a close relationship with the land and the environment. They have been protecting the rich natural resources, including forests, in the country for ages," the Chief Minister said, adding they also made considerable contributions to the freedom movement. He said it is the responsibility of all to bring tribal people into the mainstream of development. "Keeping this in mind, the government is working to provide them with education, employment, and health facilities. The government has decided to renovate 250 ashram shalas (boarding schools) in the state and transform them into model ashram schools," the Chief Minister said. He said the government will implement a scheme to ensure that tribal students get an education in renowned schools and become capable to crack entrance exams for engineering and medical



courses and IITs. To encourage higher education for tribals, 100 students are provided assistance to complete their PHDs, Shinde said. "In villages where 50 per cent of the population is of tribals, 17 different posts via direct recruitment will be filled from the local tribal population," the Chief Minister said. He told the gathering that forest rights claims of more than 1 lakh tribals were cleared till November-end last year. (PTI)
