- Framed and adopted by Hindalco in compliance with the provisions of Clause 49 of the Listing Agreements entered into by the Company with the Stock Exchanges.
- The Code applies to the Members of Board of Directors and Members of the Senior Management Team of the Company one level below the Board Members, viz. Manager & CEO, CFO and all Unit Heads, Presidents, Joint Presidents and all other executives having similar or equivalent rank in the Company and the Company Secretary of the Company
- The Company Secretary is the Compliance Officer for the purpose of this Code.
- The Code is effective from 1st January, 2006. The Board of Directors at its meeting held on 14th August, 2014 amended the Code to include point no.12 in Clause 3 being reference to duties of independent directors as set out in the Companies Act, 2013 read with the Schedules and Rules thereunder.

Environmental Stewardship: Example of Waste Management



Hindalco has become 1st first-ever company worldwide to achieve 100%* red mud utilisation at 3 out of its 4 refineries.

Solid Wastes:

- Inventory all hazardous and nonhazardous wastes
- Target: Follow mitigation hierarchy – Prevent, Reduce, Recycle, Dispose



Bauxite Residue (BR) Management Plan – 5R + 1S Approach

Reduce

 the quantity of BR/tonne of alumina through ore beneficiation

Rehabilitation

 of BRMAs that have exhausted their capacity

Redesign

 the alumina refining process to make BR quality more amenable to recycle, re-use

Targets are (i) reduce on-site storage by further increasing recycle to cement, construction (bricks, blocks, roads) and (ii) rehabilitate red mud areas – working with IUCN

Environmental Stewardship: Example of Water Management




Water consumption:

- Use of water balance as tool; alternative sources of water e.g. treated sewage
- Targets: Reduction in freshwater consumption, no groundwater use



Liquid Effluents:

- Segregate different types, focus on recycle, reuse
- Targets: Zero Liquid Discharge for a closed loop water management system



Use of water balance to drive reduction in fresh water consumption




Specific water consumption ~ 11.45 m3/ tonne of primary aluminium



- Zero liquid discharge status achieved at 11 of the 15 operational units.

Environmental Stewardship: Towards Decarbonization



CONS

PROS

- Aluminium is infinitely recyclable
- Life cycle of an aluminium product is a renewable "cradle-to-cradle"
- 95% less energy to recycle aluminium than to produce primary metal
- Light-weighting of transport offering reduction in vehicular GHG emissions
- Replace plastic packaging for food, pharmaceuticals

- Aluminium smelting is energy intensive (Al2O3 bond to be broken)
- Process GHG emissions PFCs + use of carbon as anode
- Need for continuous, reliable power traditional use of fossil fuels in India


