# Govt rejects Pandey's report on Bharti

Criminal Vijay Palande had alleged that IPS officer Deven Bharti had underworld connections

**MUMBAI:** The state government has rejected an inquiry report by IPS officer Sanjay Pandey (while he was DG Home Guards) into the allegations made by criminal Vijay Palande against IPS officer Deven Bharti. Palande had made several allegations against Bharti, claiming that he had underworld links.

Bharti is a 1994 batch IPS officer and is posted as the additional director general of the Maharashtra State Security Corporation. He has earlier served in crime branch and was joint commissioner (law and order) in Mumbai and was also the ATS chief.

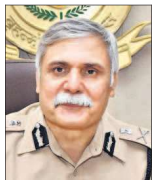
Palande is serving a life sentence in Talaja jail in Navi Mumbai after being convicted in several cases, including murder.

Sources in the state government said that after Palande made allegations, a probe was conducted and a report was sent to the then Director General of Police and then additional chief secretary (home) in 2020. The probe did not find Bharti guilty of underworld links.

A fresh inquiry was again initiated after Palande's then Home Minister Anil Deshmukh through his personal assistant

and the process of law was not followed. As such the reports by Pandey were rejected. The submission by Bharti was accepted by the department.

Vijay Palande is a criminal suspected to be linked to gangster Santosh Shetye. He was convicted for a double murder in 2002, jumped parole, allegedly chased his looks and killed two other men 10 years later in 2012.

Following murder of businessman Arun Tikki in April 2012, Palande was detained for questioning, as he was a tenant of one of Tikki's flats.

He was arrested for masterminding the murders of Tikki and Kaikad. Chief Secretary Manukumar Shrivastava and additional chief secretary (home) A M Limaye did not respond to messages sent by Tikki's correspondents. It says there is no merit in the allegations made by Palande

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# 'ONLY THE STATE ASSEMBLY CAN DISQUALIFY LEGISLATORS'

**MUMBAI:** With the Metro Line-2A, connecting Dahisar to DN Nagar, having stations with similar names, the Watchdog Foundation has requested the Mumbai Metropolitan Regional Development Authority (MMRDA) to change the names of these stations to avoid confusion.

According to the foundation, the MMRDA is trying to emulate the London Tube, which has three metro stations with similar names—Hounslow East, Hounslow West and Hounslow Central stations.

The three stations in London are situated in distinct areas and geographically separated regions and as such recognised

by the local postal authority. In Mumbai, the stations named as Malad, Oshiwara and Dahisar have the next stations named Lower Malad, Lower Oshiwara and Upper Dahisar, respectively," said Godfrey Pimenta of Watchdog Foundation.

A similar issue of naming stations away from their geographical location had risen during the inauguration of Metro Line

# RED-TAPISM HALTS HIRING OF ASSISTANT PROFESSORS

**MUMBAI:** While the state government of Maharashtra decided to fill up 75,000 vacant posts across departments to celebrate Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav, red-tapism continues to stall the recruitment of 8959 vacant posts of assistant professors in higher education.

The posts, which were approved before the start of Covid-19 pandemic, were kept on hold when the government machinery was focused on recruitments towards health department to fight the pandemic.

Last week, although the ban on recruitments were lifted across departments, the education department officials said the government resolution (GR) dated November 03, 2020, stopped recruitment stayed for the higher education department, the present GR dated October 31 does not mention their department.

Dr Dhanraj Mane, director, higher education, said the department will send a proposal to the government requesting them to lift the ban and allow recruitment. "The latest GR revoking the ban on recruitment was applicable for government offices. It is not applicable for non-government offices like colleges. We will send a proposal to the government requesting them to allow recruitment," he said.

The eligible candidates, who are waiting for the recruitment to start, have asked the government to fill up the posts at the earliest.

Speaking to HT, Dr Kushal M Mude, National Convener of All India NET and SET Teachers Organization, (AI-NASTO), said, "Delay in filling up the vacant posts will affect candidates' future promotions and career path. Also, the students-teachers ratio is getting affected. The department has taken teachers on contractual basis with low salary."

**Remuneration not respectable**  
He said the posts were finalised as per GR dated 23 November 2018. "We need to fill up these vacant posts on mission mode as many NET and SET qualified candidates are working on clock-hour basis in various institutes since last five years. It is said that after having higher education these candidates are not even getting a respectable remuneration. It is difficult for them to end survive in the city," said Dr Mude.

Prof Ramesh N Zade, President, National Forum for Quality Education emphasised that to maintain the standard and quality of education, government has to maintain a student-teacher ratio. "As on today, in Maharashtra, out of the total sanctioned posts of 31,815, around 15,000 posts are vacant in affiliated colleges," he said.

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# Advanced malware Drinik at I-T again

**MUMBAI:** A potent malware—Drinik—targeting Indian taxpayers in 2021 through a fake Income Tax (I-T) department website, has reportedly returned, but this time with advanced capabilities. The new variant has raised serious concerns because it loads the original I-T website, but at the same time also records every activity on the hacked device. Hence, everything that appears on the target device's screen is recorded and every key hit by the user is logged, all of which is communicated to the C2 server—a server from which malware receives all its commands. Drinik also slips into the call screening function of the hacker phone and disallows any incoming calls that the user may be getting for verification.

After the first login, Drinik redirects the victim to the fake version, where additional instructions lure the victims into entering their I-T account credentials, net banking login details, credit or debit card details and other data like PAN and Aadhaar numbers.

CRII has further found that in the latest version of the malware, the Threat Actor (TA) only targets victims with legitimate income tax site access, indicating that the TA has access to data of Indian income tax account holders. CRII is still investigating the TA behind the campaign.

# Advanced malware Drinik at I-T again

**How it works**  
The latest version of Drinik is also distributed via SMS but with a crucial difference: Opening the link in the message takes the victims to the actual I-T department website. As a result, no alarm are triggered in the device's anti-virus mechanism.

However, at the same time, Drinik also shows a dialog box, seeking certain access permissions from the user. As the user thinks this is necessary for the 'income tax refund', they end up granting the permissions. Once completed, Drinik activates the screen recording and keylogging feature.

Hence, everything that appears on the target device's screen is recorded and every key hit by the user is logged, all of which is communicated to the C2 server—a server from which malware receives all its commands. Drinik also slips into the call screening function of the hacker phone and disallows any incoming calls that the user may be getting for verification.

# Global warming turned 2022 into a 'chronicle of climate chaos'

### This year likely to be fifth or sixth hottest year on record

A CATASTROPHIC ACCELERATION in global warming unleashed "climate chaos" across the planet this year — a signal that the window to act is closing, the UN warned on Sunday.

Global temperatures in 2022 are likely to end about 1.15C above the average in pre-industrial times, making it the fifth or sixth hottest year on record, according to the provisional State of the Global Climate Report 2022 produced by the UN's World Meteorological Organization. High heat levels in 2022 were particularly worrying as they happened under the second consecutive year of La Niña conditions, which tend to help keep temperatures low.

"The latest State of the Global Climate report is a chronicle of climate chaos," UN Secretary-General António Guterres said in a statement as thousands of diplomats and leaders descended on Egypt for the opening session of the UN's annual climate summit, known as COP27. "Change is happening with catastrophic speed, devastating lives and livelihoods on every continent."

Concentrations of man-made greenhouse gas emissions responsible for warming the planet will continue to rise in the atmosphere this year after reaching record highs in 2021, the report said. Climate change has led to disasters from floods to heat and storms, causing thousands of deaths, forcing tens of thousands of people to migrate and throwing millions into acute food insecurity.

"People and communities everywhere must be protected from the immediate and ever-growing risks of the climate emergency," Guterres said. "We must answer the planet's distress signal with action — ambitious, credible climate action."

The UN is calling for government leaders meeting in Egypt's coastal resort town of Sharm el-Sheikh to agree to set up universal early warning systems within five years to help protect the planet's most vulnerable people from climate change-fueled extreme weather events.

The WMO's provisional report revealed that the melting of ice over land and seas around the world continued to accelerate in 2022, with the area covered by sea ice in Antarctica reaching a record low in February this year, almost 1 million square kilometers (247 million acres) below the long-term mean. The Arctic, by contrast, saw a moderate summer for sea-ice melt. —BLOOMBERG



## 2015 to 2022 likely to be the eight warmest years on record: WMO

THE GLOBAL mean temperature in 2022 is estimated to be 1.15 degree Celsius above the pre-industrial (1850-1900) average, likely making the eight years from 2015 the warmest on record, the World Meteorological Organisation said in a report on Sunday.

The report titled 'WMO Provisional State of the Global Climate 2022' released at the 27th Conference of Parties to the UNFCCC on Sunday stated that the rate of sea level rise has doubled since 1993 and has risen by nearly 10 mm since January 2020 to a new record high this year.

The past two-and-a-half years account for 10% of the overall rise in sea level

since satellite measurements started nearly 30 years ago, the report stated. The figures used in the provisional 2022 report are till the end of September this year. The final version will be issued next April.

"The global mean temperature so far in 2022 has been 1.15 degree Celsius above the 1850-1900 average. If the current anomaly continues to the end of the year, the analysis would place 2022 as either the fifth or sixth warmest year on record (from 1850), and in each case marginally warmer than 2021.

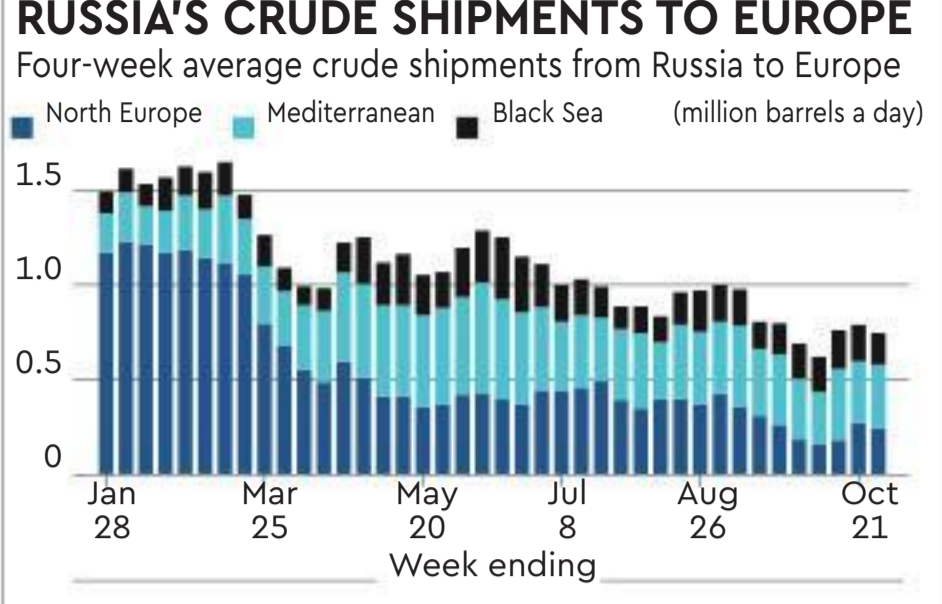
The eight years — 2015 to 2022 — are likely to be the eight warmest years on record," the report read. — PTI

# The world may need Russian oil output cut

THE WORLD'S ABOUT to lose a lot of Russian crude when European Union sanctions and a US-led price cap come into effect in 29 days. That may not be a bad thing. How big might the loss be? Perhaps much less than many fear.

EU countries will halt most seaborne imports of Russian crude on December 5, with pipeline flows to Poland and Germany to stop by the end of the year. Shipments to Europe are already down to half what they were before President Vladimir Putin sent his troops into Ukraine in February, with most of the rest diverted to China, India and Turkey.

Depending on how successful Moscow is at finding new buyers — a tanker of its crude has just discharged at the

Ruwais refinery in Abu Dhabi, potentially opening up a new outlet — the EU sanctions will cut flows by 700,000 barrels a

day, at most. The pipeline deliveries to Poland and Germany were running at about 650,000 barrels a day last year. So that would bring the total volume directly at risk to a maximum of about 1.35 million barrels a day.

The bigger worry is that bans on providing shipping, insurance and other services to the Russian oil trade could cut flows to non-European countries, where much larger volumes are at stake. But it is becoming more likely that they will simply drive the trade onto non-European vessels insured in Russia or the buying country.

The price cap — championed by the US — is meant to provide a safety valve, allowing purchasers to continue to access European vessels and insurance if the price

they pay for the cargo is below a yet-to-be-determined level.

I doubt it will have any real impact. The countries that have signed up to the cap have also banned purchases of Russian crude. Buyers that haven't come on board will be reluctant to do so. Russia has said repeatedly that it won't sell oil to countries that cap its prices and there are no penalties for shunning the US initiative.

Russia's remaining buyers may get marginal negotiating leverage, but that's conferred by the shrinking pool of refiners willing to process Moscow's crude, rather than by the cap. China, India and Turkey, now the biggest buyers of Russian crude, won't risk the trade to please Washington. —BLOOMBERG
