Notes:

- The Group continued its operations during lockdown due to outbreak of COVID-19 as electricity generation is regarded as one of the essential services by the Government. The Group's substantial generation and transmission capacities are tied up under medium to long term power purchase / transmission agreements, which insulates revenue of the Group under such contracts. The notices of applying force majeure clauses under the power supply agreements from some of the customers have been responded under legal advice that the prevailing situation is outside the ambit of force majeure clause. This position has also been further supported by clarification from Ministry of Power that the DISCOMs will have to comply with obligation to pay fixed capacity charges as per the power purchase agreement. Merchant power sale has witnessed lower demand due to economic slowdown, and consequential impact on tariff. Based on the assessment, the Management does not expect any medium to long-term impact on the businesses of the Group. The Group has evaluated the possible effects on the carrying amounts of property, plant and equipment, goodwill, inventory, loans, receivables and debt covenants basis the internal and external sources of information and determined, exercising reasonable estimates and judgements, that the carrying amounts of these assets are recoverable. Having regard to above, and the group's liquidity position, there is no uncertainty in meeting financial obligations in the foreseeable future.
- For the year ended March 31, 2020, exceptional items comprise write back of contingent consideration of ₹ 177.48 crore being no longer payable and an additional loss allowances of ₹116.02 crore on a loan, pursuant to debt resolution agreement entered into with the party on January 2, 2020.
- The Group has only one reportable operating segment i.e. 'Power Generation'.
- In respect of the hydro power plants of the Group, due to seasonal nature, the financial results may not be comparable with the previous / subsequent quarters and periods.
- The consolidated results have been reviewed by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors at their respective meetings held on July 31, 2020. The Statutory Auditors of the Company have carried out a limited review of the results for the quarter ended June 30, 2020.

Punjab govt to begin development works in residential societies

IN WHAT can be said to be a major relief to the people living in residential societies in Mohali, the Punjab government Friday decided to undertake development works in all residential societies of the city at its own level. The government has also sanctioned a fund of Rs 2.10 crore.

Punjab Health and Family Welfare minister, Balbir Singh Sidhu, said that the funds have been sanctioned by the Local Bodies department. He said that the department had issued instructions to the Municipal Corporation (MC) and approved these development works under Section 82 (3) of the Punjab Municipal Corporation Act, 1976.

The minister further said following this decision, various development works will be carried out at Darshan Vihar Society, United Cooperative Society, Pancham Society, SBI Colony, Housefed, Guru Tegh Bahadur Complex, SCL Society, Joginder Vihar, Jalvayu Vihar Society, Commando Complex, Police Colonies, Army Flats, Ivory Tower and Mayfair, at a total cost of over Rs two crore.

"The work estimates have been chalked out. This fund will be utilised for internal works of the societies like parks, internal roads, LED street lights, interlock tiles," he said, adding, that this was the first time ever that the government was going to carry out the internal development work of residential societies at its own level.

With the Punjab government's decision, people living in residential societies are expecting to be equal development of all areas under the Municipal Corporation and no area will be deprived of development works.

Sidhu said that he had been raising this issue with the government for a long time so that the city could be developed as a model city by providing equitable development.

Food delivery boy killed in hit and run accident

A FOOD delivery boy was killed in a road accident in Zirakpur. Police registered a case on Friday and initiated a probe. The accident took place when a car had hit the bike.

According to the police, the victim was identified as Ramesh Kumar, a resident of Sirsa district in Haryana. The victim was going from VIP road towards the main road in Zirakpur. While he was about to take the main road, a rashly driven car hit his bike leaving him seriously injured.

Ramesh Kumar was taken to a local hospital where he was declared dead by the doctors.

2 vegetable vendors robbed early in morning, case filed

UT cops' salary accounts be audited by CAG: Police dept

A fact-finding probe has already indicted six policemen in the case, including former police official Balwinder Kumar, the then Salary Branch in-charge

THE CHANDIGARH police department has recommended a special audit of the UT police personnel's salary accounts by the office of Comptroller of Auditor General (CAG) at Sector 17, in view of the embezzlement of lakhs of rupees from the government funds into the salary accounts in the last three years.

The audit was recommended for the period of last 10 years. The Chandigarh police department has around 6,500 personnel.

The recommendation was made to the UT's Finance department by the office of SP (Crime) Manoj Kumar Meena, who is probing the scandal. The finance department accepted the recommendation and forwarded it to CAG. The UT police have also initiated the process of recovering the surplus credit amount in the salary accounts of at least 79 police personnel.

The embezzlement of government funds was detected in

February, when 40 salary accounts of police personnel were found to have credited huge money with fake entries of inflated conveyance allowances and ration/food allowances, among others. In some cases, salary account holders were allegedly not aware of the arrival of money in their accounts.

Sources said, "During investigation, the suspected salary accounts increased from 40 to

79. Most of these salary accounts are of constables and head constable (HC) rank police personnel. They expressed ignorance about the money credited into their accounts, despite not submitting any medical bills, TA/DA forms etc. So far, police investigation suggests the scandal was going on for the last three years."

SP Manoj Kumar Meena said, "The process of recovery of money from at least 79 salary accounts has started. We have recommended a special audit from CAG as well. I cannot divulge the exact loss of the government funds. The process of special audit can be started anytime. Investigation pertaining to forgery, cheating, embezzlement and criminal conspiracy is also going on."

DGP Sanjay Baniwal is supervising the probe. A fact finding probe had already indicted six policemen, including a former cop Balwinder Kumar, who was then posted as the in-charge of salary branch.

The five other accused policemen, including HC Mukesh

Kumar, Yogender, Ved Parkash, constable Rajbir, Jatinder and woman constable Usha Devi were also attached with the salary branch.

Subsequently, an FIR under charges of forgery, embezzlement and Prevention of Corruption Act (PC) Act, 1988, was lodged at PS 3.

Section Officer Jagdeep Singh Shrewat had been heading the salary branch when the embezzlement was unearthed.

Assistant Controller (Accounts & Finance) Sudhir Parashar conducted an internal probe in the matter, concluding that an in depth probe was required against members of the salary branch including its in-charge Balwinder Kumar.

He mentioned in the report, "The salary of Section Officer Jagdeep Singh Shrewat for the entire tenure of in the police department checked and nothing was found overpaid."

The probe officer maintained, "Role of two previous section officers -Jaspal Singh and Ravinder Kumar - need to be verified in details."

UT resident alleges demand of graft for property registration

A Chandigarh resident has alleged that he was asked to pay Rs 10,000 for registration of his property. A complain in this regard was lodged with DC.

Complainant Sanjeev Kochar said that on July 2, he and two others went for property registration to a lawyer assigned by the company from where they had purchased their flats. Kochar said in the complaint that after the registrations were done and the files were handed over to them, the lawyer sought a fee of Rs 16,300 separately from each of them.

"While the other two negotiated minor reductions in the lawyer's fee and paid up, I refused

to pay the illegal gratification. He asked me to preset before the sub-registrar lest the latter will think that the lawyer has pocketed the money meant for him," the complainant said.

He further alleged that since the practice of taking illegal gratification by the sub-registrar has been happening so fearlessly and openly, and the general impression being created among the victims and the public would be of collusion at higher levels, the complaint should be treated as a fit case for disproving this impression as false and unfounded.

Kochar was asked to record his statement before Mohali SDM Jagdeep Sehgal on Thursday. He said that the SDM asked him to file an affidavit and also ask the other two to do the same.

HC asks UT schools' body to submit proposal about fees for consideration

IN THE resumed hearing of the petition filed by the Independent Schools Association Chandigarh (ISAC), along with seven private schools, over the collection of fees from students, the Punjab and Haryana HC on Friday asked the petitioner and the schools to submit a proposal regarding the fee to be charged from the students.

The matter is now scheduled for hearing on August 14.

The petitioner association on Friday sought that the order passed for the Punjab and Haryana private schools be applicable to them as well. On this, the Court asked the petitioner schools to submit the fee proposed to be charged from students, for consideration.

ISAC and seven private schools of Chandigarh had moved high court pleading to quash the UT administration order that directs private schools to reschedule the last date to deposit fees and funds for session 2020-21.

Two juveniles apprehended for stabbing a 16-year-old

TWO JUVENILES were apprehended on Friday for stabbing a 16-year-old boy during a friendly football match at a small public park in Dadu Majra Colony, on Thursday evening.

The victim is admitted at PGIMER and his condition is stated to be stable. The victim and the apprehended juveniles were known to each other.

"The victim and the two juveniles were members of opposite teams. The victim was performing better than the two. The two were looking to take the ball from him during the match and a verbal altercation broke out in this melee. One of the juveniles attacked the victim with a sharp-edged weapon in his stomach. The other juvenile kicked and punched him," said sources.

The police control room was informed about the incident. By the time the police reached the spot, the victim had been rushed to PCI by his family members. Police sources said the victim recorded his statement, disclosing the identity of two juveniles.

Police said the two juveniles were sent to Juvenile Home- 25. The victim and apprehended juveniles are school dropouts. An FIR was lodged in this connection.

MLA Gian Chand demands probe into property tax notices being sent to P'kula residents despite payment

TAKING COGNIZANCE of the notices being issued to Panchkula residents despite the due payments of property tax, local MLA and Haryana Legislative Assembly Speaker Gian Chand Gupta has asked the matter be investigated by authorities.

Gupta raised the issue in a meeting with Urban Local Bodies Director Amit Aggarwal at the Legislative Assembly Secretariat. He said that despite payment of property tax, notices are being served to residents. "This indicates serious irregularities which should be investi-

gated by appropriate authorities. Along with this, I have given instructions to give two more months for deposit of property tax payment to people who received such notices."

The notices have mostly been served to people belonging to the economically weaker section and those living in Ashiana flats, even though the government has exempted properties up to 50 square yards from such taxes.

The matter came to light after a complaint was received from the residents that notices are being served to the people by the Urban Bodies Department, despite payment of property tax. In many such cases, when property owners went to the depart-

ment's office with their receipt of payment, the officials said they hold no record of it.

Gupta also asked Amit Aggarwal, director general of the Urban Bodies Department, to revise the advertisement rates in public places in the city. He said that due to high rates, businessmen are not willing to spend on advertisements, due to which most of the hoardings remain vacant. He said that the advertisement rates in Panchkula have been fixed on the lines of metropolitan cities like Delhi and Gurugram, which is not rational. Advertising rates should be rationalised so that the Municipal Corporation may earn better revenues.

CASH DEPOSIT ON COUNTERS NOT BEING RECORDED

Property tax is paid to the Urban Bodies Department in three ways. Most people deposit cash at the department's office through banks. Others have also started making online payments. It has been observed that people depositing cash in the offices are facing most issues. It is feared that while people are facing problems, there is also a possibility of economic loss.

Mohali police registers six immigration fraud cases at Phase I, Matour

AT LEAST six cases of immigration fraud were registered by Mohali district police at different police stations on Friday. The cases were registered at Phase I and Matour police stations. The areas under the jurisdiction of both the police stations are notorious for immigration frauds.

While four cases were registered at Phase I PS, two were filed at Matour PS.

One of the cases was registered against Rajbir Singh Sidhu on the complaint of Himachal Pradesh (HP) resident Pankaj Kumar. Kumar alleged that the accused owner of immigration firm, Best Visa Consultancy, at Phase VI had taken Rs 2.71 lakh from him to send him abroad. However, he neither sent him abroad nor returned his money.

Police booked Rajbir Sidhu under sections 406 (criminal breach of trust), 420 (cheating) of the IPC and sections 10 and 14 of Immigration Act at Phase I PS.

In another case filed at the same PS, Kharar resident Sandeep Singh has been accused of fraud by complainant

Jasbir Singh. Jasbir alleged that he had give Rs 6 lakh to the accused to go abroad but the accused cheated him.

In a similar case, complainant Vishal Pathania alleged that he had given Rs. 2.5 lakh to accused Mohit Kumar to go abroad but the accused cheated him.

An immigration fraud case was also filed against Karan Kumar by complainant Pankaj Bansal, who alleged that the accused had taken Rs 60,000 from the complainant on the pretext of sending him abroad but did not send him abroad and also failed to return the money.

Matour police booked Gaurav, who ran an immigration firm Sheff Head Consultant for Services on the complaint of Fatehgarh Sahib resident Singara Singh, who alleged that the accused had taken Rs 30,000 from him to send his son abroad and failed to send him abroad or return his money.

In the other case filed at Matour PS Manjeet Kaur was accused of duping Surinder Singh of Navagaon to the tune of Rs 89,000 on the pretext of sending the complainant abroad.
