Tangedco invites staff, pensioners for deal on emoluments

AFTER a prolonged legal struggle, Tangedco has extended invitation to workers and pensioners' associations to enter into a tripartite agreement to safeguard employees' benefits. The utility has also issued a draft agreement and set a deadline until Wednesday for associations to offer feedback. Tangedco Chairman and Managing

Director Rajesh Lakhoni has given approval to the draft tripartite agreement.

The pact between the government, TNEB and its employees is aimed at ensuring secure pension, other benefits and favourable working conditions to employees.

While some associations see this as a positive move, a few unions have opposed it and called for a new draft

agreement.

A Sekkizhar, state general secretary of TNEB Employees Federation affiliated to United Trade Union Congress, said, "The recent approval by the state government to trifurcate Tangedco raises questions about how employee benefits will be managed under the new entities. There is a need to annual

Government Orders 6 and 7 dated January 24, 2024, before discussing the tripartite agreement."

R Murali Krishnan, legal advisor of BMS, highlighted that Government Order 100 issued by former chief minister M Karunanidhi

in November 2010 laid the groundwork for the tripartite agreement. However, he said

Tangedco's failure to address the inclusion of new companies in the agreement necessitates revision.

As regards pensioners' fund, Murali said, "Similar models in states like Kerala, Andhra Pradesh and Karnataka have failed. So, Tangedco should withdraw this initiative. The state government must directly take responsibility."

A senior Tangedco official

told TNIE, "We request all associations to sign the tripartite agreement as early as possible, as the interests of employees will be safeguarded. The deadline for the associations' opinion on the draft tripartite agreement is Wednesday. After that we will discuss with the government and implement it."

The official also denied commenting on the new companies.

Samba paddy procurement expected to match last year's figures, says minister

UNLIKE the case with kuruvai paddy procurement which recorded a decline this year as compared to the last due to monsoon failure, samba paddy procurement is expected to match last year's figures, Minister for Food and Civil Supplies R Sakkarapani said on Tuesday.

Speaking after a consultative meeting with farmers on samba procurement in delta districts,

the minister said as on date a total of 1,493 DPCs are functioning in Thanjavur; Tiruvarur; Nagapattinam, Mayiladuthurai and Cuddalore. Through the centres 6.08 lakh tonnes of paddy has so far been procured from about 95,000 farmers during the current procurement season he added.

On the demands put forth in the consultative meeting, the minister said farmers' demand of procuring about 1,000 tonnes per day in each DPC has been ac-

cepted. Similarly, the DPCs will be functioning on Sundays also.

To a question on alternative arrangements following decision of the FCI to not cover state governments under its Open Market Sale Scheme (OMSS), the minister said the government already entered into an agreement with the National Cooperative Consumers' Federation (NCCF) for supplying seven lakh tonnes of rice at the rate of ₹35.40 per kg which the latter has been doing.

If need arises, rice will be procured from other states, he said.

HP cops find body part along Sutlej

TWO days after Vetri Duraisamy (45), son of former Chennai mayor Saidai Duraisamy went missing after his car plunged into a river in Himachal Pradesh, the HP police said they have spotted some body parts along the banks of the Satluj river:

Himachal Pradesh DGP said the body parts resembling a human brain could be that of the missing victim. A statement from the DGP said nei-

ther the person already rescued nor the driver who died in the tragedy had any head injuries, hinting at the possibility that Vetri may have died.

The statement added a team of navy special divers have been requested to aid in the ongoing search operations by the Kinnaur police and that continuous efforts to search for Vetri is under way. NDRI, police and home guards continued their operations for the third day on Tuesday but with no results, and are expected to resume operations on Wednes-

day. Meanwhile, Saidai Duraisamy has offered a reward of ₹1 crore to anyone who finds his son and has asked local officials and residents to help spread the word. "There are many tribal settlements nearby and we're hoping that someone might come up with valuable information," said a source close to Duraisamy.

Vetri was involved in an accident on Sunday where the car he was travelling in rolled down from the highway into the Satluj river and has been missing since.

PUDUKKOTTAI: While many files seeking the premature release of Muslim prisoners have been sent to Governor RN Ravi, he has given assent to release only a few. There are more other pending files with the governor for which he is yet to give assent, said Minister for Law S Regupathy on Tuesday. On the Kodanadu murder-cum-heist case, the minister told media persons in Pudukkottai, "The case investigation will depend on the forensic report. According to us, the action taken by CM MK Stalin is the reason why the case has progressed so far."
